



LITHUANIA SIGNAL A GLOBAL
SHIFT TOWARD SYSTEMIC
INSTABILITY

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 2, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in global security as a massive U.S.-Israeli military campaign against Iran transitioned from targeted strikes to an overt effort at regime change. The confirmed death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, following waves of "Vabank" operations initiated by the Trump administration, has triggered immediate Iranian retaliation against U.S. and Allied assets across the Middle East, including [drone strikes on British bases in Cyprus](#) and the paralysis of the Hormuz Strait. This escalation has caused immediate shocks to global energy and aviation markets, with oil prices surging and diesel costs projected to rise by up to 20% in the immediate term. The conflict has now expanded to multiple fronts, with Israel mobilizing over 100,000 reservists for a potential [ground operation in Lebanon](#) against Hezbollah.

Domestically, Lithuania is navigating a parallel crisis of governance and institutional integrity. The Special Investigation Service (STT) has intensified probes into high-level political figures, including Social Democratic leader Gintautas Paluckas and former Prime Minister Saulius Skvernelis, regarding [potential illicit enrichment](#) and corruption. These investigations coincide with a controversial legislative push by the ruling coalition to restrict independent journalists and media owners from the national broadcaster (LRT), a move decried by critics as an attempt to [marginalize popular watchdogs](#) ahead of upcoming elections. This convergence of regional war, domestic lawfare, and the fourth anniversary of the full-scale invasion of Ukraine highlights a state of "permacrisis" where external security threats and internal political instability are increasingly intertwined.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **The Fall of the Iranian Teocracy:** Following intense Saturday strikes, Iranian state television confirmed the [death of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#). A temporary three-person council including President Pežeškianas has taken control, though real power is shifting toward Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) generals. [Monarchist factions in the U.S.](#), led by the son of the former Shah, are actively lobbying to fill the power vacuum.

- **Regional Conflict Contagion:** Retaliatory strikes have hit U.S. bases in Kuwait, Bahrain, and the UAE. The [Hormuz Strait remains paralyzed](#), and shipping insurance rates have made the region nearly impassable for commercial vessels. Aviation routes between Europe and Asia are in a state of chaos as multiple [Middle Eastern countries closed their airspace](#).
- **Lithuanian Political Corruption Crisis:** The STT has questioned PM candidate Gintautas Paluckas as a [special witness](#) in an illicit enrichment case. Simultaneously, former PM Skvernelis and MP Starkevičius are embroiled in a corruption probe involving the [Plant Products Service](#), leading to a collapse in potential coalition trust between the Social Democrats and other opposition parties.
- **Media Governance and Independent Journalism:** A legislative working group led by Juozas Olekas is moving to [limit LRT appearances](#) for individuals who own or lead other media outlets, specifically targeting figures like Andrius Tapinas and Edmundas Jakilaitis. This is occurring as the [Lithuanian Journalists' Union faces exposure](#) over substantial debts to its former leader's children.
- **Ukraine War Fourth Anniversary:** Analysts observe that the war has entered a [stagnant phase of attrition](#), with Western aid increasingly unreliable. The U.S. recently [refrained from supporting a resolution](#) on Ukraine's territorial integrity, signaled a shift in Washington's commitment under the current administration.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitical Power Dynamics & Regional Influence The U.S. and Israel have

fundamentally altered the Middle Eastern balance of power by pursuing "regime change" through decapitation strikes. However, the lack of an [on-the-ground democratic opposition](#) suggests the vacuum may be filled by even more radicalized military elements of the IRGC. The expansion of conflict to [EU member Cyprus](#) through drone strikes on British Sovereign Base Areas demonstrates the inability of traditional borders to contain this new phase of warfare.

Energy Security & Economic Resilience

The blockading of the Hormuz Strait has turned a regional war into a global economic crisis. European diesel prices are [surging by 20%](#) in wholesale markets, with retail prices lagging only by days. While some analysts suggest markets have "already priced in" the strike, others warn that [prolonged closure of shipping lanes](#) will lead to double-digit inflation across the Eurozone.

Corruption & Rule of Law Lithuania's political landscape is being reshaped by STT investigations. The status of Gintautas Paluckas as a [special witness](#) just as the Social Democrats lead in polls creates a "Lawfare" dynamic, where judicial processes significantly influence electoral outcomes. This is mirrored in the [historical reflection on judicial caras \(czars\)](#) and the struggle to reform the High Court against political interference.

AI & Technology Policy New research conducted with LRT participation shows that [30% of AI-generated news citations](#) contain significant factual errors or hallucinations, particularly regarding quotes and recent events. This highlights a growing [threat of automated disinformation](#), even as Lithuanian scientists launch the "Atspara" (Resilience) project to use AI for detecting propaganda techniques.

Domestic Stability & Social Order Public health concerns are rising as Lithuania enters a period of environmental and social stress. Experts warn of [imminent spring flooding](#) in the Šilutė region, while medical professionals emphasize the [30% reduction in heart disease risk](#) achievable through proper sleep and work hygiene—a difficult standard to maintain during national security alerts.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity on March 2 centered on media control and national broadcaster reform, alongside broader debates on the constitutional limits of presidential war powers in the U.S.

- **LRT Governance Reform (The "Skardžius Amendment"):** A proposal to [ban journalists with outside media interests](#) from hosting LRT programs. The amendment requires LRT board approval for any outside "faces" to appear on air, a move critics argue gives politicians direct editorial control.
- **Ukraine Financing & Sanctions:** Hungary continues to [veto a 90 billion euro loan](#) to Ukraine, despite the critical need for funds as the war of attrition continues into its fifth year.
- **U.S. War Powers Resolution:** Debate intensified in the U.S. Congress over whether the President [violated the Constitution](#) by initiating a massive war with Iran without prior congressional authorization.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **STT Press Briefing:** Investigators provided details on the [VIP interrogation club](#), noting that former ministers and mayors are being questioned regarding wealth that exceeds their documented income.
- **Trump State of the Union:** An unusually long [48-minute address](#) focused on "historic" economic wins and the "regime change" operation in Iran, punctuated by Democratic protests and the ejection of an MP for a [racism-related protest](#).
- **Civil Defense Training:** The Lithuanian Riflemen's Union (Šauliai) conducted [survival and first-aid training](#) for high schoolers, emphasizing the necessity of civilian preparedness in a high-threat environment.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Fragmentation of the Liberal Order The U.S. administration's shift toward unilateral "Vabank" foreign policy has left European allies in a state of reactive confusion. While [Germany cautiously supports](#) the strikes on Iran, [Spain and the EU leadership](#) remain critical, citing violations of international law. This split within the "coalition of the willing" suggests that European defense autonomy is no longer a luxury but a necessity as U.S. priorities shift toward isolationism or unilateralism.

The Professionalization of "Lawfare" In Lithuania, the use of the STT and judicial investigations has become a primary tool of political combat. The timing of investigations into [Paluckas and Skvernelis](#) indicates that the judicial process is being leveraged to

"greideruoti" (grade/clear) the political field. This is further complicated by the [history of the "untouchables"](#) in the judiciary, where the reform process initiated years ago remains incomplete and subject to reversal.

The Vulnerability of Critical Information Infrastructure The LRT governance debate reveals a trend toward state-managed information. By attempting to [remove independent voices](#) from the public broadcaster, the state risk creating a "Soviet-style" media environment where the LRT mission is [narrowed to official opinion](#). This occurs simultaneously with the rise of [unreliable AI news tools](#), leaving the public vulnerable to both state control and technological misinformation.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect [gasoline and diesel prices](#) to rise significantly at Lithuanian pumps as the wholesale market spike trickles down. This will likely spark fresh protests or "pasipinigavimas" (price gouging) by retailers.
- The security situation for [2,000 Lithuanians in the Middle East](#) will deteriorate; despite current government hesitation, a coordinated EU evacuation plan is likely to be triggered if Iranian retaliatory strikes on civilian infrastructure in the UAE and Qatar continue.
- Potential for a [ground war in Lebanon](#) as Israel mobilizes to secure its northern border against Hezbollah.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The power struggle in Iran will intensify. The [temporary council](#) is likely to be challenged by the IRGC, potentially leading to a military dictatorship that is more aggressive than the previous clerical regime.
- In Lithuania, the STT probes will reach a climax before elections. If [Paluckas is formally charged](#), the Social Democrats may face a leadership crisis, reshuffling the entire parliamentary map.
- Budgetary impacts from energy shocks will force the Lithuanian government to reallocate funds, potentially delaying [support for solar energy](#) despite green energy goals.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The collapse of the 1979-era Iranian clerical system may lead to a [monarchical or military-nationalist restoration](#), fundamentally changing the geopolitics of the Persian Gulf for decades.
- A permanent shift in NATO's internal dynamics. If the U.S. continues to [paralyze NATO's Ukrainian response](#) through isolationist policy, a "European Pillar" within or alongside NATO will likely become the primary security architect for the Baltics.
- The integration of [AI-driven "Atspara" systems](#) will become standard in national defense, turning information warfare into a battle of competing algorithms.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Prioritize the creation of a "European Emergency Supply Chain" for fuels to mitigate the [prolonged closure of the Hormuz Strait](#).
- Demand immediate clarification on the [status of nuclear facilities](#) in the Middle East, as the IAEA warns of accident risks amidst the confrontation.
- Advocate for an independent [audit of media governance](#) in Lithuania to ensure that LRT reforms do not violate the European Media Freedom Act.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Re-route all sea-bound logistics away from the Middle East. Shipping costs through [Istanbul and alternative hubs](#) are the only viable paths for the next quarter.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Closely monitor the [LRT "L Ž S" debt scandals](#) and media ownership laws; companies with exposure to the Lithuanian media market may face sudden changes in the "influencer" and advertising landscape.
- **Investment Opportunity:** Despite the crisis, there is high demand for [energy storage \(kaupikliai\)](#) and independent power generation in the Baltics, with the government allocating [millions in new support](#) for those who diversify away from the grid.
