DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 2, 2026, marks a transformative and perilous escalation in global geopolitics as the United States and Israel execute "Operation Epic Fury," a massive military offensive against the Islamic Republic of Iran. This campaign follows the confirmed assassination of Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, an event that has plunged the region into a state of total war. President Donald Trump has framed the operation as [retribution for decades of belligerence](#), asserting a timeline of four to five weeks to neutralize Iran's nuclear and ballistic capabilities. However, the lack of clear intelligence regarding an "imminent" Iranian first strike has drawn sharp criticism from Congressional leaders, who suggest the administration may be navigating without a coherent post-conflict stabilization plan.

The immediate consequences are felt most acutely in global energy markets and maritime logistics. Iran has responded by

closing the Strait of Hormuz, effectively [choking 20% of the world's oil supply](#) and driving Brent crude prices toward the \$100 per barrel threshold. Retaliatory strikes by the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) and its proxies have targeted critical infrastructure across the Persian Gulf, including a Saudi Aramco refinery and a British airbase in Cyprus. Simultaneously, Israel has launched an offensive into Southern Lebanon to eliminate Hezbollah threats, further widening the front and causing mass civilian displacement in Beirut.

For Bosnia and Herzegovina, the conflict presents a dual crisis: a surge in domestic inflation and a diplomatic emergency as hundreds of citizens remain [stranded in the UAE and Qatar](#) due to closed regional airspace. As the country marks its Independence Day, the contrast between celebrations of past sovereignty and the current threat of global instability is stark. Analysts warn that if the conflict is not contained within the predicted four-week window, the resulting energy crisis and potential for a wider regional war could trigger a global economic depression and fundamental shifts in the "America First" foreign policy doctrine.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Execution of Operation Epic Fury and the Decapitation of Iranian Leadership

- The U.S. and Israel have struck hundreds of targets across Iran, claiming to have [annihilated the Iranian Navy](#) and neutralized key ballistic missile manufacturing sites.

- The death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei has left Iran under the control of a temporary council currently deliberating on a successor amidst [ongoing military strikes](#).
- Secretary of State Marco Rubio defended the preemptive nature of the strikes, arguing that waiting for an Iranian response to Israeli actions would have resulted in [unacceptably high American casualties](#).

Total Closure of the Strait of Hormuz and Global Energy Shock

- Iran has banned all maritime traffic through the Strait of Hormuz, leading to a [25% spike in European gas prices](#) and an 8% rise in U.S. crude in a single night.
- The Saudi Aramco refinery at Ras Tanura was hit by a drone, forcing the [closure of the facility](#) and halting the export of 550,000 barrels per day.
- Economic analysts in Bosnia warn that fuel prices may soon exceed 3 KM per liter, potentially [triggering severe food inflation](#).

Expansion of the Northern Front in Lebanon

- Israel has initiated a heavy air and ground offensive against Hezbollah, citing the group's attempts to [avenge Khamenei's death](#).
- Lebanese officials report at least 31 dead and 150 wounded in recent strikes on Beirut, while the Israeli military warns of [long days of fighting](#) ahead.

Regional Retaliation and Collateral Damage

- The IRGC launched ballistic missiles at Israeli premier Netanyahu's office and targets in Haifa, though Israel [dismissed these claims](#) as false news.
- Three U.S. fighter jets were downed over Kuwait due to [identification errors](#) by Kuwaiti forces during intense drone and missile activity.
- A drone strike targeted the British Akrotiri airbase in Cyprus, representing a [direct threat to European territory](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security

- Global energy indices rose by 3.5%, with Western giants like Shell and BP seeing [5% stock increases](#) as they track rising oil prices.
- Bosnia and Herzegovina faces a critical shortage of natural gas supplies as the conflict [disrupts traditional transport routes](#).

National Security & Diplomatic Engagement

- The U.S. administration is facing internal pressure after acknowledging there were [no intelligence indicators](#) that Iran planned to attack first.

- Agricultural crises in Semberija and Laktasi have forced dairy farmers to [dump thousands of liters of milk](#) due to market instability and lack of state protection.

Domestic Stability & Civil Unrest

- In Serbia, five farmers were arrested following a [protest blockade](#) at the Badovinci border crossing, reflecting growing regional economic frustration.
- The UAE government has agreed to cover [hotel costs for tourists](#) stranded by the sudden closure of regional airports.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity in Washington is dominated by debates over the War Powers Act and the legal justification for a preemptive war. In Sarajevo, the focus remains on the EU Reform Agenda as a mechanism for economic survival during the global crisis.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **War Powers Resolution:** Members of Congress are preparing to vote on resolutions to [limit the President's authority](#) to continue the Iran campaign without explicit authorization.
- **EU Growth Plan/Reform Agenda:** Bosnia is currently accessing funds worth up to 976.6 million euros, contingent on [implementing structural reforms](#) and public service improvements.

- **Rubio Briefing to the Gang of Eight:** Secretary Rubio claimed the administration complied with the law by [notifying Congressional leadership](#) 48 hours after hostilities began.
- **Hillary Clinton Oversight Testimony:** Clinton appeared before the House Oversight Committee to [deny links to Jeffrey Epstein](#) and accuse Republicans of "political theater."
- **UK Prime Minister Statement:** The PM clarified that the UK was not involved in the initial strikes but would [defend regional allies](#) against Iranian drone attacks.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of "Never-Ending Wars" Logic

Fragmentation of Regional Alliances

While the U.S. claims to have the support of Arab leaders, the [accidental downing of U.S. jets](#) by Kuwaiti forces and the direct strikes on Gulf hubs like Dubai suggest a chaotic and uncoordinated security environment. The Gulf states are "caught in the middle," facing both the risk of Iranian retaliation and the economic fallout of the U.S. campaign, leading to an [anxious and uncertain](#) diplomatic posture.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a massive surge in [oil and gas prices](#) as the Hormuz closure remains in effect, likely leading to fuel rationing in smaller economies like Bosnia.
- Retaliatory "phase two" strikes from the U.S. are anticipated to be [even more punishing](#), potentially targeting the Iranian interior and remaining nuclear facilities.
- High risk of further "friendly fire" incidents in the congested airspace over the Persian Gulf.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The U.S. Mid-term elections will be heavily influenced by the success or failure of this campaign; a protracted war could [cost Trump his majority](#) in Congress.
- Hezbollah may launch a full-scale missile campaign against central Israel, prompting a [larger Israeli ground invasion](#) of Lebanon.

- Potential for "boots on the ground" if air strikes fail to secure nuclear material in mountainous regions.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- A structural shift in Iranian governance; if the regime collapses, a power vacuum could lead to [radical hardliners or civil war](#) if a transition plan is not implemented.
- Accelerated diversification of energy routes away from the Persian Gulf, with increased focus on Arctic and Mediterranean resources.
- A permanent realignment of the "BRICS" bloc as China and Russia seek to [guarantee the security](#) of their remaining energy partners.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Prioritize the [reopening of maritime corridors](#) through international naval coalitions to prevent a global inflationary spiral.
- Establish clear de-confliction protocols with regional partners (Kuwait, UAE) to prevent further [accidental engagements](#) of allied aircraft.
- Engage the temporary Iranian council through neutral mediators (Oman/Qatar) to explore [exit ramps](#) before the conflict becomes a regional "forever war."

For Private Sector/Investors

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Diversify away from reliance on Persian Gulf logistics. The closure of Hormuz suggests that "just-in-time" delivery models are [highly vulnerable](#) to regional conflict.
- **Energy Hedging:** Businesses should hedge against [prolonged high energy costs and potential gas shortages in the European market through 2026](#).
- **Investment Opportunity:** [Increased demand for missile defense technology](#) and autonomous maritime security solutions as regional actors seek to harden their infrastructure.
