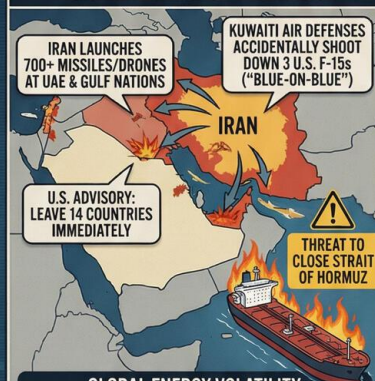

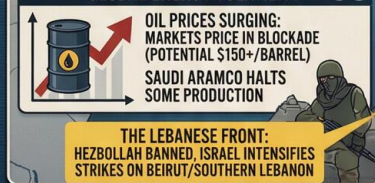

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## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 2, 2026, marks the third day of a massive, multi-front military offensive led by the United States and Israel against the Islamic Republic of Iran, dubbed "Operation Epic Fury." The conflict reached a critical inflection point following a **decapitation strike** that reportedly killed Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and 49 other high-ranking Iranian officials. While the Trump administration maintains the objective is the [destruction of ballistic](#) and nuclear capabilities, the death of the top leadership has created a power vacuum in Tehran and prompted widespread calls for regime change from both U.S. and Israeli officials. Despite initial "America First" messaging, the war has rapidly expanded to involve Hezbollah in Lebanon and has drawn retaliatory strikes

against U.S. allies and assets in Kuwait, the UAE, and Bahrain.

Global energy markets are experiencing extreme volatility as Iran threatens to close the [Strait of Hormuz](#), with reports of the IRGC threatening to set fire to any shipping entering the waterway. In Washington, a constitutional crisis is brewing as the administration bypassed Congressional approval for the strikes, leading to bipartisan demands for a [War Powers Resolution](#) vote. Domestically, Croatia has moved to reinforce its own state capacity, initiating a new cycle of **military conscription** for the 2007 generation amidst heightening regional and global tensions.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **The Decapitation of the Iranian State:**
  - The U.S. and Israel executed synchronized strikes against the [entire Iranian leadership](#) while they were gathered in a single location, believing they were undetectable.
  - Ayatollah Khamenei's wife reportedly [died from injuries](#) sustained during the initial attacks on the leadership compound.
  - The U.S. military is currently focusing on "annihilating" the Iranian Navy and degrading its [ballistic missile manufacturing](#) sites.

## • **Regional Retaliation and "Blue-on-Blue" Incidents:**

- Kuwaiti air defenses accidentally shot down [three American F-15](#) fighter jets due to a failure in friend-or-foe identification during an Iranian drone swarm attack.
- Iran has launched nearly [700 missiles and drones](#) at the UAE and other Gulf nations in the last 48 hours.
- The U.S. State Department has issued an urgent advisory for all citizens to [leave 14 countries](#) in the Middle East immediately.

## • **The Expansion of the Lebanese Front:**

- Israel has intensified strikes on Beirut and southern Lebanon after Hezbollah declared it would [avenge Khamenei's death](#).
- The Lebanese government has taken the historic step of [banning Hezbollah's military](#) and security activities as illegal, calling for the group to surrender its weapons.

## • **Croatian Domestic Crises:**

- The "Selotep" (Scotch Tape) scandal has emerged at the [Dubrava Education Center](#), with allegations that a student with special needs had his mouth taped shut by staff.
- Social workers in Split and Kastela have entered a ["white strike"](#) refusing new cases to protest staff shortages and administrative overloads.
- Conscription has begun for [800 recruits](#), with a significant percentage (55%) being volunteers, including 82 women.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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**Energy Security:** Global oil prices are surging as markets price in a potential total blockade of the Persian Gulf. Croatian analysts warn that the [closing of Suez](#) or Hormuz would create a permanent shock to European inflation. Saudi Arabia's Aramco has reportedly [halted some production](#) in the Gulf due to security risks. Croatia's Janaf pipeline remains a critical [strategic asset](#) for Central European energy independent of Russian influence.

**Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics:** In the U.S., the Texas Republican primary has become a **proxy war** between "old style" Republicans like John Cornyn and the "maga base" represented by Ken Paxton and Wesley Hunt, a race that could [cost \\$100 million](#) in a runoff alone. In Croatia, the ruling coalition faces internal strife as the DP's Josip Dabro is under investigation by [the State Attorney \(DORH\)](#) for allegedly singing Ustasha songs, prompting a "mini-crisis" of governance.

**Security Architecture:** The U.S. has repositioned the **USS Gerald R. Ford** carrier strike group and mobilized [National Guard units](#) from Vermont and Virginia for "Operation Absolute Resolve." The administration is leveraging **B-2 bombers** to penetrate deep Iranian mountain fortifications. However, U.S. public confidence is low, with polls showing [60% of Americans](#) do not trust the President's plan for Iran.

**State Capacity & Labor:** Croatian social services are reaching a breaking point. The **white strike** in the social welfare sector highlights a [lack of institutional stability](#). Simultaneously, educational unions are threatening "union actions" due to the government's [failure to communicate](#) on signed agreements from June 2025.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity today focused heavily on executive overreach and the legality of the expanding Middle East war. While the administration claims broad authority under **Article 2** and existing **AUMFs**, Congressional leaders are mobilizing to reassert their constitutional role in declaring war.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **War Powers Resolution:** Bipartisan efforts in both the House and Senate to force a [formal vote](#) to limit additional military action against Iran.
- **AUMF (Authorization for Use of Military Force) Reform:** Debates on whether the [2001 authorization](#) covers a preemptive/preventive strike on a sovereign state like Iran.
- **Croatian Conscription Policy:** Activation of service obligations for [novices born in 2007](#) who do not have conscientious objections.

### HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Pentagon Press Briefing:** Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth and General Dan Kane provided the first on-camera update, stating the U.S. will [end the war](#) on its own terms.
- **Gang of Eight Briefing:** National Security Advisor Marco Rubio briefed top Congressional leaders on [imminent threats](#) that allegedly necessitated the preventive strikes.
- **Hillary Clinton Testimony:** A chaotic session where Clinton was questioned on [Epstein-related allegations](#) and "Pizza Gate" conspiracies, interrupted by Lauren Boebert taking unauthorized photos.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**Decapitation vs. Regime Change:** There is a profound messaging disconnect between the White House and the Department of Defense. President Trump has publicly encouraged the [Iranian people to rise up](#) and overthrow their government, whereas Defense Secretary Hegseth and Marco Rubio have explicitly stated this is **not a regime change war**. This "muddled message" complicates the strategic goal; if the U.S. kills the leadership but denies the goal of regime change, it risks a perpetual state of "gritty" and "difficult" warfare against ideologically committed [lower-echelon remnants](#) who have no centralized authority to negotiate with.

**The End of "American Exceptionalism" in Diplomacy:** The U.S. decision to strike Iran without notification to allies or Congress signals a shift toward a **unilateralist security posture**. U.S. Senator Chris Coons noted that the administration has [defunded civil society](#) programs that would typically support a transition to democracy, suggesting the "America First" strategy favors raw destruction over nation-building. This is mirrored in the Middle East, where Gulf allies feel [intense pressure](#) and vulnerability as they absorb the retaliatory brunt of a war they did not initiate.

**Lawfare and Toxic Domestic Politics:** In Croatia, the focus remains on **symbolic "lawfare"** and historical grievances. The political focus on the [Thompson concert](#) in Rijeka and the "Ustasha/Partizan" debates in the Sabor are seen by critics as a **toxic distraction** from critical issues like pension reform and [digitalization](#). This trend suggests that even as global war looms, local political actors remain incentivized to utilize "high-

click" historical controversies over substantive governance.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a major ground offensive by Israel into [southern Lebanon](#) to clear the Hezbollah threat permanently. The U.S. "big wave" of strikes, as [foretold by the President](#), will likely target remaining IRGC ground assets and energy infrastructure inside Iran. Refugee waves toward Europe are likely to begin as the "decapitated" Iranian state fails to provide basic services [to its 90 million citizens](#).

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Global recession is highly probable if oil remains above \$150/barrel. The [Indo-Pacific powers](#) (China/India) will likely be forced to intervene diplomatically or militarily to secure energy routes, potentially creating friction with the U.S.-Israeli axis. In the U.S., the War Powers Resolution could [fracture the GOP](#), as isolationists and interventionists clash over the cost of the war.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** A structural realignment of the Middle East is inevitable. If the Iranian regime collapses, the [Hezbollah-Hamas-Houthi axis](#) will lose its primary sponsor, potentially leading to a period of fragmented "warlordism" across the Levant. For the EU, the ["last bastion of democracy"](#) may face an existential crisis of social cohesion if mass migration from a collapsed Iran combines with internal extremist political surges.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- The EU must immediately coordinate with Cyprus to finalize [repatriation protocols](#) for the thousands of European citizens stranded in the Gulf.
- NATO and EU maritime forces must prepare for **escort missions** in the Red Sea and Gulf of Oman as the [threat to merchant shipping](#) escalates.
- Diplomatic channels should be opened with the [remnants of the Iranian bureaucracy](#) to prevent a total state collapse that would trigger a humanitarian catastrophe.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Companies relying on the Lobito corridor or African agriculture should note the [Angolan banana trade](#) as a potential technological bridge, but be wary of diverted transport costs due to Middle East naval blockades.
- **Energy Hedging:** Diversify energy reliance toward Central European hubs like [Croatia's Janaf](#), which may become the primary artery for non-Russian, non-Gulf crude in the event of a total Hormuz closure.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Monitor [labor unrest in Croatia](#) and the Balkans; persistent strikes in social and educational sectors may signal a broader decline in state administrative capacity affecting business licensing and local operations.
