

OPERATION EPIC FURY ESCALATES INTO A MULTI-FRONT REGIONAL WAR, DESTABILIZING GLOBAL ENERGY MARKETS AND STRANDING OVER 100,000 RUSSIAN NATIONALS IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 2, 2026, marked a catastrophic escalation in the Middle East as the joint US-Israeli "Operation Epic Fury" against Iran entered its third day. What was initially framed as a precision campaign has rapidly devolved into a multi-front regional war. Following the reported assassination of Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, the conflict has expanded to include a [ground invasion of Lebanon](#) by the Israel Defense Forces (IDF) and massive Iranian retaliatory strikes against US and UK military installations in Kuwait, Bahrain, Qatar, and Cyprus. Reports indicate heavy casualties, including the death of Khamenei's wife and a strike on a [girls' school in Minab](#) that killed at least 165 people, mostly children. US President Donald Trump has signaled that the operation, previously estimated to last four weeks, may now [extend much longer](#) as the

US targets Iran's nuclear and ballistic missile infrastructure.

The economic consequences are immediate and severe. Global oil prices have surged, and the [Strait of Hormuz](#) is effectively paralyzed, with hundreds of tankers suspended and Qatar Energy halting LNG production. Domestically, Russia is facing a significant humanitarian and logistical crisis, with approximately [100,000 tourists stranded](#) across the UAE and other regional hubs due to the total closure of airspace. While the Kremlin maintains contact with Tehran and regional monarchies, calling for de-escalation, Russian military forces have leveraged the global distraction to seize [three settlements](#) in the Kharkiv and Donetsk regions. Simultaneously, the FSB has conducted a massive sweep against Ukrainian-linked "simbox" fraud centers, highlighting a heightened domestic security posture during the international crisis.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Expansion of Operation "Epic Fury":** US President Trump and Israeli leadership have intensified strikes, hitting over [1,000 targets](#) in Iran within 48 hours. The campaign now explicitly targets the Iranian leadership and nuclear facilities. Trump has indicated a willingness to consider [ground troop deployment](#) if the "sinister regime" does not collapse under air strikes.

- **Iranian Retaliation and Regional Contagion:** Iran has responded with "Epic Rage," utilizing hypersonic and ballistic missiles to target US bases. The IRGC claims to have inflicted [560 casualties](#) on US personnel in Bahrain alone. Strikes have also hit the [UK's Akrotiri base](#) in Cyprus and a French naval base in Abu Dhabi, drawing European powers into active combat roles.
- **Lebanese Front and Ground Incursion:** The IDF has launched a [ground offensive](#) into Lebanon to push Hezbollah forces back from the border. Beirut has faced its most intense bombardment in two years, with strikes targeting Hezbollah infrastructure and leadership in response to their support for Tehran.
- **Global Energy and Trade Paralysis:** The conflict has triggered a "Middle Eastern fever" on markets. Oil prices spiked by [nearly \\$10 per barrel](#) in a single day. The suspension of shipping through the Strait of Hormuz threatens 20% of global oil and LNG trade, leading to [force majeure](#) declarations by major energy exporters like Qatar.
- **Russian Humanitarian Crisis:** Russia has begun emergency [evacuation flights](#) for the 100,000 citizens stuck in the region. The first flights from Abu Dhabi and Oman arrived in Moscow early March 3, but tens of thousands remain in shelters and underground parking lots in Dubai as commercial [air traffic remains halted](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Stability: The war has directly compromised the world's most critical energy transit corridor. With [20% of maritime trade](#) in oil and gas under threat, analysts warn that Brent crude could hit [120](#)

[dollars per barrel](#) if infrastructure damage persists. Russia, while benefiting from higher oil revenues, faces systemic risks to its civil aviation and tourism sectors. [Global stock markets](#) have plummeted, with airline and travel stocks bearing the brunt of the volatility.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics and Bloc Politics: The crisis has forced a realignment of regional powers. While Saudi Arabia and the UAE have publicly called for peace, leaked reports suggest they [privately urged](#) the US to hit Iran. Meanwhile, Russia and China have solidified a [strategic alliance](#) in the UN Security Council, condemning the US-Israeli "unprovoked aggression." China is reportedly providing Iran with [satellite intelligence](#) to assist in targeting US assets.

Domestic Stability and Cybersecurity (Russia): The FSB and Investigative Committee have neutralized a major Ukrainian intelligence operation, seizing over [54,000 sim-cards](#) and shutting down 100 "simbox" centers. These centers were allegedly used to [coordinate terrorist acts](#), including the Crimean Bridge bombing. This crackdown emphasizes Russia's focus on preventing internal destabilization while its primary diplomatic and military attention is diverted by Middle Eastern and Ukrainian fronts.

Technology Policy and Defense Innovation: In the Ukraine theater, Russian forces are increasingly deploying [robotic platforms](#) equipped with machine guns and grenade launchers to minimize personnel risk. Domestically, new [mandatory tracking rules](#) for civilian drones have taken effect, aimed at identifying "friend or foe" in increasingly crowded and contested airspace.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The Russian government has focused on rapid-response social measures and aviation safety regulations to mitigate the impact of the Middle Eastern war and the ongoing special military operation.

• BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Social Pension Indexation:** Prime Minister Mishustin announced the indexation of social pensions for [4 million citizens](#), including veterans and orphans, effective April 1.
- **Drone Operation Rules:** New regulations require all civilian drones over 250g to be [fitted with tracking devices](#) (simboxes/transponders) to ensure "digital sky" transparency and security [safety standards](#).

• HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Putin-Arlov Meeting:** A working session on the [development of the Amur region](#), focusing on record soybean harvests and investment in the Vostochny Cosmodrome and gas sectors.
- **Regional Forums:** The "Shoulder to Shoulder" forum in Pskov discussed [rehabilitation for veterans](#) and legal protections for their families.
- **Crisis Briefing:** Presidential Press Secretary Peskov confirmed Russia is in [constant contact](#) with Tehran and Persian Gulf leaders to negotiate a ceasefire.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of Precision Warfare: "Operation Epic Fury" has abandoned the veneer of surgical strikes. The death of Khamenei's wife

in a bunker-buster attack and the [171 civilian casualties](#) in a school strike signal a shift toward total war aimed at regime decapitation. This trend is mirrored in Iran's response, which targets civilian airports (Ben Gurion) and commercial [energy hubs](#) in the Gulf, effectively holding the global economy hostage to stop the military onslaught.

The Fragmentation of Allied Consensus:

While the US leads the charge, the "coalition" is fragile. NATO has [distanced itself](#) from direct involvement, while Spain and Norway have [denied use of their territory](#) for strikes. This indicates a deep rift in Western security architecture, where the US and Israel act unilaterally, leaving European partners to manage the resultant energy crisis and refugee threats.

The "Roboticization" of Conflict:

From the Iranian drones hitting [British bases in Cyprus](#) to the Russian "Courier" robots on the [Dnieper front](#), autonomous systems have moved from niche roles to primary combatants. The reliance on electronic identification for [civilian drones](#) highlights a new reality: the battlefield and the civilian sphere are now technologically inseparable, requiring constant biosurveillance and signal tracking.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a catastrophic rise in energy prices as Qatar and Saudi Arabia halt exports due to [Hormuz blockage](#). The humanitarian crisis for Russian tourists will intensify as [evacuation logistics](#) struggle with fuel shortages and rerouted flight paths. High risk of secondary terror attacks in the US and Israel as " sleeper cells " mentioned by Iranian media are activated.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The potential for a [Venezuelan-style regime change](#) in Iran exists, but is likely to result in a protracted insurgency rather than a прагматичный (pragmatic) new leadership. European economies may face a [deep recession](#) caused by the doubling of natural gas costs, potentially weakening their support for the Ukrainian front.

Long Term (1-5 Years): A permanent restructuring of Middle Eastern alliances is likely. If Iran survives as a functional state, its [military cooperation with Russia and China](#) will likely formalize into a mutual defense pact. This would cement a "Three-Polar World," where the US, Russia/China, and a fragmented Europe compete for dwindling resource security and regional influence.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The US-Israeli decapitation strategy against Iran may create a [power vacuum](#) that allows non-state extremist groups to thrive, similar to post-2003 Iraq.
- Diplomatic efforts must prioritize the [unblocking of Hormuz](#) to prevent a global inflationary spiral that could destabilize developing nations.
- The inclusion of "Ukrainian experts" in [British regional operations](#) suggests a globalization of the Ukraine conflict, with far-reaching implications for future peace negotiations.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Sector:** Extreme volatility in oil/gas necessitates immediate hedging. Companies dependent on [LNG transit from Qatar](#) should seek alternative supply chains via North America or Africa.
- **Cyber/Security:** The FSB crackdown on [simbox networks](#) indicates that telecommunications firms must enhance vetting for "rented" communication hubs used for large-scale fraud and coordination.
- **Aviation/Tourism:** The [rerouting of flights](#) through Central Asia and the 2-hour increase in flight times to the Gulf will permanently increase operational costs and reduce demand for luxury travel in the MENA region.
