TALIBAN-PAKISTAN BORDER WAR ERUPTS



Following Pakistani airstrikes (19 Afghan civilians killed), IEA launches "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" (Repelling Oppression). IEA claims deep strikes (Rawalpindi, Quetta), 100+ Pakistani soldiers killed, 25 outposts captured. Domestic "National Unity" narrative.

IEA alleges coordinated "project" to destabilize Islamic world during Ramadan.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS & KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Decapitation & Retaliation
Massive Tehran strike; near-total wipeout of Iranian military command. IRGC attacks bases. U.S. threat of force.

IEA-Pakistan Offensive
"Rad-ul-Zulm": Transition to offensive. Strikes deep into Pakistan. IEA shutdown of 2 Pakistani drones; captures equipment.

Geopolitics & Diplomacy

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT & RECOMMENDATIONS

FORESIGHT (Short to Long Term)

- 1-4 Weeks (Short Term):** Intense internal power struggles in Tehran. Sporadic retaliatory strikes. IEA-Pakistan conflict likely expands to full-scale conventional war. Mass displacement.
- 1-6 Months (Medium Term):** Afghanistan accelerates diplomatic/economic tilt to Russia/China (BRICS). Pakistan may face internal collapse or military coup.
- 1-5 Years (Long Term):** Potential Iranian collapse leads to refugee crisis & decentralized militants. "Grave of Empires" narrative cemented if IEA forces stalemate/concession; formal re-evaluation of Durand Line possible.

- International Policy:** Intelligence gap from Iranian decapitation; focus on preventing nuclear C2 failure. Regional powers (China, Russia) must mediate IEA-Pakistan conflict. Humanitarian agencies prepare for significant needs.

REGIONAL STABILITY FRACTURES FOLLOWING DECAPITATION OF IRANIAN LEADERSHIP AND ESCALATING TALIBAN-PAKISTAN BORDER WAR

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 2, 2026, marks a transformative and violent inflection point for regional security as two major conflicts converged to threaten the existing order in Central and South Asia. The most significant development is the reported assassination of Iran's Supreme Leader, Ali Khamenei, along with several members of his immediate family and the top echelon of Iran's military and security apparatus, in a joint U.S.-Israeli strike. This event has decapitated the Islamic Republic's leadership, claiming the lives of Defense Minister Aziz Nasirzadeh, IRGC Ground Forces Commander Mohammad Pakpour, and Chief of Staff Abdulrahim Mousavi. Iran has responded by striking 27 U.S. and Israeli installations across the Middle East, while U.S. President Donald Trump has issued a stern warning against further escalation. The Taliban government has officially condemned the strikes as a violation of sovereignty, though it is simultaneously

signaling a strategic pivot toward Central Asian trade routes to mitigate the inevitable economic fallout from an Iranian collapse.

Simultaneously, the simmering tension between the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) and Pakistan has erupted into an overt border war. Following Pakistani airstrikes that reportedly killed 19 Afghan civilians, the IEA launched "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" (Repelling Oppression), conducting unprecedented retaliatory strikes deep into Pakistani territory. The IEA claims to have struck major military hubs in Rawalpindi and Quetta, killed over 100 Pakistani "mercenary" soldiers, and captured 25 border outposts. This escalation is being leveraged domestically by the Taliban to foster a narrative of "National Unity," with state media broadcasting a surge of public rallies across various provinces in support of the armed forces. The coincidence of the strikes on Iran and the Afghan border has led some Taliban officials to allege a coordinated "project" aimed at destabilizing the Islamic world during the month of Ramadan.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Decapitation of Iranian Leadership:** A massive strike in Tehran has resulted in the death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, his daughter, son-in-law, and grandchild, alongside a [near-total wipeout](#) of the Iranian military high command, including the Minister of Defense and the head of the IRGC Ground Forces.
- **IEA-Pakistan Border War:** Under the banner of "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm," Taliban forces have transitioned from defensive posture to [offensive operations](#), targeting the Nur Khan base in Rawalpindi and the 12th Corps in Quetta in response to Pakistani violations of Afghan airspace.

- **Retaliatory Iranian Strikes:** In the wake of the leadership vacuum, the Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) reportedly launched [attacks on 27](#) U.S. and Israeli military bases throughout the Middle East.
- **Domestic Mobilization in Afghanistan:** State media reported widespread [public demonstrations](#) and rallies in provinces including Balkh, Herat, Baghlan, and Jawzjan, where citizens expressed readiness to join the fight against Pakistani "militias."
- **U.S. Threat of Force:** President Donald Trump has publicly warned that any further Iranian action will be met with a [harsh response](#), asserting that the U.S. is prepared to use its full power.
- **Anniversary of the Doha Agreement:** Amidst the regional chaos, the IEA commemorated the 2020 Doha Agreement as the [foundational victory](#) that ended "20 years of occupation" and established the current Islamic system.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitical Power Dynamics & International Relations

- Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi engaged in [emergency diplomacy](#) with Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi, expressing condolences for the "sorrowful" death of Khamenei while condemning U.S.-Israeli aggression.
- The IEA is framing the conflict with Pakistan as a struggle against a "mercenary" regime that is acting as a [proxy for Western interests](#), specifically British and American intelligence.

- Former U.S. envoy Zalmay Khalilzad stated that the Pakistani military has a [flawed analysis](#) of Afghanistan and that their demands are "illogical," urging a diplomatic path to resolve the "Khwarij" (IS-K) presence.

Economic Security & Supply Chains

- The Ministry of Economy has downplayed the economic risk of the Iranian crisis, stating that the IEA has successfully [diversified trade routes](#) toward Central Asia to reduce dependence on any single neighbor.
- Despite regional turmoil, the Ministry of Public Works reported a [33% increase](#) in rail transit over the past 11 months, emphasizing the resilience of the Afghan transit corridor.
- Domestic investment continues in the energy sector, with the Azizi Energy Group reportedly signing contracts for [1,000 megawatts](#) of electricity production.

National Security & Security Architecture

- The Ministry of Defense confirmed the shutdown of [two Pakistani drones](#), one in Parwan and one in Nangarhar, signaling increased anti-aircraft capabilities among Taliban units.
- A high-level ideological campaign has been launched to define the [qualities of a Mujahid](#), emphasizing sacrifice, devotion, and obedience to the "Amir-ul-Momineen" during times of war.
- Security forces are reportedly [conducting offensive maneuvers](#) across the "Durand Line," capturing military equipment and munitions from fleeing Pakistani troops.

Food & Water Security

- To ensure stability during the conflict, the IEA initiated the transfer of [300 tons of wheat](#) to provincial silos to assist needy families and maintain food reserves.
- A major water supply project was [inaugurated in Shibergan](#), Jawzjan, providing house-to-house water access for over 225 families.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity was largely focused on war-footing directives and the codification of nationalistic sentiment, with significant emphasis on financial transparency in trade and humanitarian distribution. State officials used public forums to reinforce the legality of "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" under both Islamic Sharia and international law regarding the right to self-defense.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **Fixed Tax Plan for Trading Companies:** The Economic Commission's technical committee approved a plan to implement a [fixed tax](#) on trading and importing companies at customs points to simplify revenue collection and support the national treasury.
- **Unfinished Foreign-Funded Projects Assessment:** A committee was tasked with [evaluating and prioritizing](#) incomplete infrastructure projects previously funded by international organizations to determine state-led completion paths.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **64th Anniversary of Kabul Times:** At a commemorative event, Deputy Minister of Culture Atiqullah Azizi alleged that the [coordinated attacks](#) on Afghanistan and Iran were part of a unified foreign project.
- **Ministry of Defense Press Briefing:** Spokesperson Enayatullah Khwarazmi provided updates on [border operations](#), claiming the capture of 25 Pakistani posts and the successful neutralization of aerial threats.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of Iranian Regional Hegemony

The reported assassination of Ali Khamenei and his top generals represents more than a tactical strike; it is a decapitation of the "Axis of Resistance." The IEA's reaction—condemning the attack while simultaneously highlighting "alternative trade routes"—suggests the Taliban is preparing for a "post-Islamic Republic" reality. By moving to [Central Asian transit](#), Kabul is attempting to firewall its fragile economy from the anticipated internal chaos and civil war likely to follow such a massive leadership vacuum in Tehran. The fact that the Iranian Foreign Minister, Abbas Araghchi, was still in a position to take a call from Muttaqi suggests the state has not completely dissolved, but the loss of the Supreme Leader and the heads of the Army and IRGC Ground Forces suggests a catastrophic breakdown in command and control.

The Evolution of the IEA from Insurgency to Conventional Border Force

The conflict with Pakistan has forced the Taliban to demonstrate the effectiveness of its "Unified Forces." The rhetoric has shifted from guerilla warfare to defending "territorial integrity" and "national sovereignty." The ability to shoot down [sophisticated drones](#) and strike deep into Pakistan (Quetta and Rawalpindi) indicates a significant advancement in technical capability and intelligence. This "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" is being used to settle the "Durand Line" dispute through force, with state media explicitly referring to the border as a ["fictional and imposed"](#) line that will no longer be respected if Pakistan continues its aggression.

Information Warfare and the "Project" Narrative

A recurring theme across multiple broadcasts is the assertion that Pakistan is not an independent actor but is executing a ["project given by others"](#) (specifically the U.S. and UK). By linking the Pakistani strikes on Afghanistan to the Israeli strikes on Iran, the Taliban is constructing a narrative of a global "Zionist-Crusader" conspiracy against Islamic nations during Ramadan. This serves a dual purpose: it delegitimizes the Pakistani government in the eyes of its own religious population and solidifies domestic Afghan support for the Taliban as the only force capable of standing up to "superpowers."

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect intense internal power struggles in Tehran as the remaining IRGC elements and political factions vie for succession. This may lead to sporadic and uncoordinated [retaliatory strikes](#) against U.S. assets.

- The IEA-Pakistan border conflict is likely to expand into a full-scale conventional war if the IEA continues to hold and [occupy Pakistani outposts](#).
- Mass displacement is probable along the Durand Line, with the IEA reporting Pakistani forces targeting [refugee camps](#) in Kunar.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Afghanistan will likely accelerate its diplomatic and economic tilt toward Russia and China (via the [BRICS framework](#)) to replace Iranian and Pakistani trade corridors.
- Pakistan may face internal collapse or a military coup if the "Rad-ul-Zulm" operation continues to inflict high casualties and territorial losses on the Pakistani Army, which is already facing [internal political strife](#).

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The potential collapse of the current Iranian governance structure could lead to a massive refugee crisis and the rise of decentralized militant groups across the Afghan-Iranian border, requiring a [new security architecture](#) for the region.
- The "Grave of Empires" narrative will be further cemented in the IEA's ideology if they successfully fight the Pakistani military to a standstill or territorial concession, potentially leading to a formal [re-evaluation of the Durand Line](#) in international forums.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The decapitation of Iranian leadership creates an unprecedented intelligence gap; diplomatic efforts should focus on preventing a nuclear command-and-control failure within the Iranian military.
- Regional powers (China, Russia) must be engaged to mediate the IEA-Pakistan conflict before it destabilizes the broader South Asian nuclear theater.
- Humanitarian agencies should prepare for a significant increase in needs as Pakistani "militia" tactics reportedly target [civilian residential areas](#) and refugee centers.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Supply chains through the Port of Chabahar (Iran) and Karachi (Pakistan) are now high-risk; logistics firms should prioritize the [Central Asian "Alternative Routes"](#) through Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan.
- Investment in Afghan minerals and energy remains speculative due to the border war, though the IEA's move toward a [fixed tax regime](#) suggests an attempt to create a predictable fiscal environment despite the conflict.
- The rapid advancement in Taliban [drone-neutralization capabilities](#) indicates a shifting technology landscape on the battlefield that could impact regional security dynamics for private contractors.
