## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 2, 2026, marks a seismic shift in global geopolitics following the confirmed "decapitation strike" against Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei by a joint US-Israeli operation. The strike, which utilized high-precision tracking and low-cost suicide drones, has thrown the Iranian regime into a precarious [succession crisis](#) currently managed by a three-man interim council. While Iranian-American communities celebrated the news, the immediate aftermath has been characterized by a violent Iranian retaliatory campaign involving missile strikes on US bases in Erbil, Bahrain, and Kuwait, alongside indiscriminate drone attacks on European military facilities in the region. The resulting closure of the Strait of Hormuz has sent shockwaves through global energy markets, with oil prices surging toward a

potential [peak of \\$150 per barrel](#) if the blockade persists.

Domestically, Taiwan is experiencing intense second-order effects from the Middle Eastern conflict. The Taiwan Stock Exchange (TAIEX) suffered historic intraday volatility, plunging over 800 points at the opening bell before a massive buy-in from domestic investors, fueled by the "AI armory" narrative, led to a partial recovery. Amidst this financial turbulence, the Taiwanese government is grappling with a new "Taiwan Independence" sanctions list released by Beijing, targeting high-level officials and prominent business figures. Simultaneously, the country is transfixed by the "most luxurious auction in history," as the state liquidates billions in assets—including a fleet of 33 supercars—seized from the [notorious Prince Group fraud case](#).

The convergence of these events suggests a world entering a period of extreme "kinetic diplomacy" where traditional deterrence has been replaced by preemptive strikes. The "EV Winter" in the West, caused by subsidy cuts and economic uncertainty, contrasts sharply with the aggressive expansion of AI-driven "Robotaxis" by Tesla, Waymo, and Zoox, which are now officially entering public service in major US cities. As the World Baseball Classic (WBC) 2026 approaches, the contrast between the celebration of international sport and the [looming specter of regional war](#) highlights a deeply fractured global reality.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### • Decapitation of Iranian Leadership and Retaliation

- US and Israeli forces successfully targeted Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, destroying the Revolutionary Guard and Police headquarters in [heart of Tehran](#).
- Iran launched "Operation Revenge," targeting US F-15s and regional bases, leading to at least [three confirmed US military deaths](#) and civilian casualties in Israel.
- The Strait of Hormuz is effectively closed, with over 250 tankers and cargo ships [stranded in surrounding waters](#).

### • Taiwan Market Volatility and AI Resilience

- The TAIEX saw an intraday swing of nearly 700 points, testing the 35,000-point mark as investors [rushed to buy the dip](#) in AI-related stocks.
- Analysts describe the Taiwan semiconductor supply chain as the ["armory" of the AI era](#), providing a buffer against geopolitical shocks.

### • The Prince Group Asset Liquidation

- The Taipei District Prosecutors Office held a massive auction of 33 supercars seized from the Prince Group, totaling over [5 billion TWD in assets](#).
- A Ferrari "LaFerrari" (King of Horses) sold for a record-breaking [135 million TWD](#), while a Porsche 918 Spider fetched 56 million TWD.

### • Global Civil Unrest and Protests

- Violent anti-US and anti-Israel protests erupted in Pakistan, Turkey, and Iraq, resulting in at least [23 deaths in Pakistan](#) alone.
- Anti-war sentiment is rising in the US, with polls showing only 25% of Americans [support the air strikes](#) due to fears of rising fuel prices and military casualties.

### • Aviation and Tourism Paralysis

- Dubai and Abu Dhabi airports have suspended most operations, leaving over [20,000 travelers stranded](#) in the UAE.
- Taiwan's Tourism Administration reports 76 tour groups (over 2,000 people) are [currently impacted by the flight cancellations](#) in the Middle East.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### AI and Technology Policy

- 2026 is being hailed as the "explosive growth year" for autonomous transportation, with [Tesla, Alphabet, and Amazon](#) all launching public Robotaxi services.
- The MWC 2026 exhibition in Barcelona showcased the first "Robot Phone" from Honor, featuring a [flexible 3D camera](#) and integrated multimodal AI.

### Energy Security

- Taiwan's Ministry of Economic Affairs is preparing to convene emergency meetings as the [Hormuz blockade](#) threatens 40% of the nation's natural gas and 25% of its oil supply.

- International analysts warn that Brent crude could reach [\\$120 to \\$150](#) if regional stability is not restored within 48 hours.

### **National Security & Defense Procurement**

- The KMT is proposing a 350 billion TWD special regulation for military procurement, though internal disputes remain over the [total budget scale](#), with some members pushing for 600-800 billion.
- The US government is reportedly pressuring Taiwan to adopt a "commercial sale" model rather than Foreign Military Sales (FMS) to [speed up deliveries](#).

### **Legal Warfare (Lawfare)**

- Beijing has updated its "Taiwan Independence Die-hard" list, adding 12 new names including Interior Minister Liu Shih-fang and Legislator Puma Shen, [accusing them of being "accomplices"](#).
- Taiwanese officials have dismissed the list as "cognitive warfare" and an attempt to [create "red terror"](#) within democratic institutions.

### **Succession & Stability**

- Iran is being managed by a [temporary leadership council](#) consisting of President Pezeshkian, Judiciary Chief Ejei, and Alavi, with a new Supreme Leader expected within days.
- Reza Pahlavi, son of the late Shah, has signaled readiness for a [regime transition to democracy](#), emphasizing the importance of the first 100 days.

## **LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP**

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Legislative activity today focused heavily on national security and cross-strait legal

defenses in response to Beijing's latest sanctions and the heightened global threat environment. Parliamentary debates centered on the specific wording of military procurement bills and the legal standing of government officials targeted by foreign lists.

### **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Military Procurement Special Regulations:** A proposed 350-billion TWD framework for rapid defense acquisition; debate continues over whether to include [penalty clauses for delivery delays](#) by US manufacturers.
- **Taiwan Independence Die-hard Sanctions Response:** Legislative discussion on how to support officials and civilians named in the [PRC's "accomplice" list](#), with calls to categorize these actions as illicit cognitive warfare.

### **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Presidential Audience with US Semiconductor Association:** President Lai Ching-te emphasized that Taiwan-US cooperation in AI and advanced chips has [surpassed traditional models](#), forming a "common interest" alliance.
- **KMT Military Procurement Presser:** Party Chairman Eric Chu and defense lawmakers met to discuss the [budgetary scale](#) of upcoming defense bills, navigating internal pressure to increase spending toward 900 billion TWD.
- **Mayor Chiang Wan-an & Mayor Hou Yuih at Sewage Plant Transfer:** A rare joint appearance by the mayors of Taipei and New Taipei, used to project [unity in local governance](#) amidst national political tensions.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Decapitation Strike as a Standard Policy Tool

The elimination of Khamenei suggests the US administration has shifted from "containment" to "active disruption" of the Iranian axis. The use of [precision intelligence and suicide drones](#) indicates that the "Operation Infinite Fury" was the culmination of years of deep infiltration into the Iranian security apparatus. This sets a new, more aggressive precedent for dealing with state-sponsored proxy networks.

**AI as the New "Safe Haven" Sector** Despite a massive global conflict, the Taiwan stock market's recovery demonstrates that [AI-related infrastructure](#) (CPO, PCB, and semiconductors) has replaced traditional safe havens for many investors. The market narrative has transitioned from seeing AI as a luxury tech trend to seeing it as the ["essential weaponry"](#) of modern national power, which maintains value even during kinetic warfare.

### The "EV Winter" and the Return of Pragmatism

While AI transportation (Robotaxis) is booming, the broader consumer Electric Vehicle (EV) market is entering a "winter." Major manufacturers like Stellantis and Ford are [slashing production and jobs](#) due to subsidy cuts and consumers returning to fuel-efficient internal combustion or hybrid vehicles. This reflects a [correction in the green transition](#) as economic reality and high energy costs set in.

### Cognitive Warfare and the "Red Terror"

The PRC's expansion of its "independence" list to include "accomplices" and "die-hard elements" is a clear attempt to use lawfare to [intimidate Taiwan's civil society](#). By targeting business leaders like Robert Tsao alongside politicians, Beijing aims to sever the financial

and intellectual support structures for Taiwanese sovereignty, creating what local officials call a ["red terror" environment](#).

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect extreme volatility in global energy prices as the Hormuz crisis remains unresolved. Domestic civil unrest in Pakistan and Iraq is likely to worsen, potentially requiring [international evacuations](#). In Taiwan, the government will likely announce energy conservation measures if the "Orange" travel warning and blockade of the Gulf [persist beyond a week](#).

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The Iranian succession process will likely result in a hardline military-clerical compromise, potentially leading to more sophisticated asymmetric attacks on global shipping. In the US, the [approaching mid-term elections](#) will be dominated by the "Trump Tariff" vs. inflation debate, as the administration attempts to use foreign policy wins to offset high domestic prices.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The successful decapitation of the Iranian leadership may lead to a fundamental fracturing of the "Resistance Axis," forcing proxies like Hezbollah to find new patrons. Taiwan's successful [integration into the US AI supply chain](#) will solidify its position as an indispensable tech hub, but at the cost of being permanently targeted by Beijing's expanding legal and cognitive warfare tactics.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Governments must secure alternative energy transit routes that bypass the Persian Gulf, as the [vulnerability of the Strait of Hormuz](#) is now a demonstrated reality.
- Diplomatic efforts should focus on stabilizing the Iranian transition to prevent a total state collapse that could [trigger a massive refugee crisis](#) into Europe and Turkey.
- Counter-cognitive warfare units should be established to protect democratic officials from [extraterritorial legal intimidation](#) by authoritarian regimes.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- Investors should pivot from consumer EV manufacturers to [autonomous service providers](#) (Robotaxi fleets), which show higher resilience and state support.
- Supply chain managers must account for a "new normal" of [extremely high air-freight costs](#) as regional airspace remains contested or closed.
- The semiconductor and AI hardware sectors in Taiwan remain strong, but companies must [diversify physical footprints](#) to mitigate the risk of regional kinetic spillover.
