

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 2, 2026, marks a seismic shift in global geopolitics following the confirmed death of Iranian Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei in a joint US-Israeli military operation dubbed "Operation Epic Fury." The strike, which targeted a high-level security meeting in Tehran, has not only decapitated the Iranian leadership but also prompted immediate and violent retaliation from Iran and its proxies. Hezbollah has officially entered the conflict, launching heavy strikes against northern Israel, while Iran has targeted US assets and allied infrastructure across the Persian Gulf, including Oman, the UAE, Qatar, and Saudi Arabia. The conflict has reached European soil through a missile strike on a British military base in Cyprus,

significantly elevating the risk of a broader international escalation.

The economic fallout is immediate and severe. The de facto blockade of the Strait of Hormuz, through which 20% of the world's oil and liquefied natural gas flows, has caused oil prices to surge by over 8% and European gas prices to jump by 35%. Global logistics are in disarray as major shipping lines like MSC and Maersk suspend transit through the region. Domestically, Spain is emerging as a primary voice of dissent within the West; Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez and Foreign Minister José Manuel Albares have explicitly condemned the military intervention and refused to allow the use of Spanish bases at Rota and Morón for offensive operations, creating a sharp rift with the "E3" powers (UK, France, Germany) who have signaled their intent to support the US offensive.

In Barcelona, the 20th anniversary of the Mobile World Congress (MWC) opened under a cloud of uncertainty. While the event remains a massive economic driver, travel disruptions caused by the closure of major air hubs in Dubai, Doha, and Abu Dhabi have prevented many Asian and Middle Eastern delegates from attending. The day's proceedings were further complicated by local labor unrest and a high-profile Senate appearance by former Prime Minister José Luis Rodríguez Zapatero regarding the "Koldo case," illustrating the intense pressure on the Spanish government as it navigates both a domestic political minefield and a historic foreign policy crisis.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

• **The Decapitation of the Iranian Regime:**

- Operation "Epic Fury" successfully targeted Ayatollah Khamenei and 30 high-ranking military officials during a [security council meeting](#) in Tehran.
- US President Donald Trump justified the strike as a preemptive measure to prevent Iran from finalizing its [nuclear weapons capability](#).
- A transitional council comprising President Masoud Pezeshkian and top judicial figures has taken [interim control](#) of the state.

• **Regional Escalation and Proxies:**

- Hezbollah has initiated a second front from Lebanon, resulting in Israeli retaliatory [bombings in Beirut](#) that killed at least 31 people.
- Iran launched 550 missiles toward Israel and targeted Gulf monarchies for their perceived [complicity in the US-Israeli strikes](#).
- A British base in Cyprus (Akrotiri) was struck by Iranian drones, marking an [attack on European territory](#).

• **Global Energy and Logistics Crisis:**

- The Strait of Hormuz is functionally closed to commercial traffic, leading to an immediate [8% spike in oil prices](#).
- European natural gas futures rose 35% following the [closure of a major Qatari plant](#) and general instability in the Gulf.
- Dubai, Doha, and Abu Dhabi airports have suspended flights, stranding [thousands of travelers](#), including MWC congressmen.

• **Diplomatic Schism in Europe:**

- The UK, France, and Germany (E3) issued a joint statement supporting military [intervention to protect interests](#).
- Spain has broken ranks, with Minister Albares summoning the Iranian ambassador to demand a ceasefire while [rejecting US use of Spanish bases](#).
- French President Macron announced an [expansion of the French nuclear arsenal](#) in response to the proliferation risks.

• **Mobile World Congress 20th Anniversary:**

- The 2026 edition opened with 100,000 expected visitors but faced immediate [delegate cancellations](#) from Asia due to air space closures.
- The 20-year retrospective highlights the shift from simple mobile phones to [ubiquitous AI and connected systems](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security: The war has exposed the fragility of European energy supplies. Spain, while less dependent on Qatari gas than central Europe, is facing [inflationary pressure](#) as global prices react to the Hormuz blockade. The Spanish government is attempting to guarantee [supply continuity](#) despite the 35% jump in gas prices. Analysts warn that if the conflict lasts weeks, Western countries will exhaust [strategic oil reserves](#).

Succession & Stability: In Iran, the "Assembly of Experts" (90 clerics) is tasked with selecting a [new Supreme Leader](#) within the week. However, internal dissent is visible; while state TV shows mourning, [celebrations were reported](#) in cities like Karaj. Experts suggest the regime is in a fight for [survival](#).

[against both external threats and internal contestation](#).

Coalition Cohesion: The EU is facing a "crisis of unity." The UK has authorized the US to use [British bases for defensive purposes](#), while Spain has explicitly [barred US strikes from its territory](#). This division undermines the "Voice of Europe" that Minister Albares claimed should be one of [balance and moderation](#).

Technology Policy & AI: The MWC continues to push the narrative of AI as a tool for "intelligent connectivity," but the war has redirected focus toward [cyberwarfare and cognitive warfare](#). Ethical debates at MWC now involve the risk of AI-led [decision-making in autonomous military systems](#).

Domestic Stability (Spain): Beyond the war, the Spanish government faces a crisis in the textile sector, with 42 layoffs at a Belgian-owned plant in [Sant Boi de Lluçanès](#), sparking local protests. Additionally, the [Koldo corruption commission](#) continues to dog the ruling party as former leaders are called to testify.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day was dominated by high-level diplomatic maneuvers and emergency executive actions rather than traditional parliamentary bill debates, reflecting a "state of exception" due to the conflict.

PRESS EVENTS & HEARINGS:

- **Donald Trump Address:** In a 6-minute recorded message, Trump admitted there would be [US casualties](#) but insisted the operation would continue until all objectives—denuclearization and destruction of Iran's [ballistic capability](#)—were met.
- **Spanish Ministry of Foreign Affairs:** Minister Albares formed a [crisis cabinet](#) to monitor the 20,000 Spaniards in the region and reiterated that Spain would not participate in [unilateral military actions](#) outside the UN framework.
- **British Parliament:** Prime Minister Keir Starmer defended the decision to allow US use of UK bases in Cyprus as [specific and limited defensive measures](#).
- **Spanish Senate (Koldo Commission):** Former PM Zapatero testified, [denying any intermediation](#) in the rescue of Plus Ultra airlines.
- **Iranian State Media:** Announced the activation of the [constitutional succession mechanism](#) and vowed "all-out war" against those who targeted the Supreme Leader.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Fragmentation of the Liberal Order: The conflict highlights a fundamental breakdown in international law. While President Trump ignores the [US Congress](#) and UN Charter, Spain's Albares clings to the [UN framework](#) as a shield against entanglement. The E3's willingness to bypass collective EU foreign policy to align with Washington suggests the "Atlanticist" alliance is being prioritized over [European strategic autonomy](#).

The Weaponization of the Global Commons: The immediate closure of the Strait of Hormuz and major air hubs (Dubai/Doha) demonstrates how regional conflicts now [paralyze the global economy](#) instantly. The MWC is a microcosm of this; what should have been a celebration of global tech integration has become a [logistics nightmare](#), highlighting that "digital sovereignty" is meaningless if physical [supply chains and transit routes](#) are severed.

Statecraft by Omission: President Trump's rhetoric alternates between claiming a [complete destruction of Iranian nuclear sites](#) and warning that they were [almost ready for a bomb](#). This inconsistency suggests "Operation Epic Fury" may be as much about [opportunism as it is about strategy](#), mirroring the problematic US interventions in Iraq and Afghanistan.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a humanitarian crisis in Tehran and Beirut as bombings intensify. A spike in [consumer energy prices](#) in Europe will begin to affect transport and heating costs. Iranian retaliation will likely shift toward [asymmetric warfare](#), including cyberattacks on Western financial systems and infrastructure to bypass the US military's [aerial superiority](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The risk of [civil war in Iran](#) is high as the regime's internal legitimacy is tested. A protracted "war of attrition" in the Persian Gulf will force Europe to [reconfigure its energy imports](#) toward the US and Africa, likely leading to a permanent increase in energy costs. Diplomatic pressure on Spain to align with the E3 will create [internal friction within the Sánchez government](#).

Long Term (1-5 Years): The decapitation of the Khamenei regime could lead to a [total reconfiguration of Middle Eastern power](#). If the regime collapses, a power vacuum similar to post-invasion Iraq is likely, potentially birthing new [radical insurgencies](#). Conversely, if the regime survives through Russian/Chinese support, the region will be permanently [divided into hard military blocs](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Governments should prepare for a [long-term diplomatic freeze](#) with Iran and its proxies.
- The EU must urgently address the [E3-Spain divide](#) to prevent a total collapse of the Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP).
- Security architectures must be hardened against [retaliatory cyber-strikes](#) on critical infrastructure.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Logistics and supply chain managers should permanently [reroute maritime freight](#) around the Cape of Good Hope, anticipating a multi-month closure of the Persian Gulf.
- Energy-intensive industries in Europe must hedge against [persistent high gas prices](#) and potential state-led rationing.
- The tech sector should prioritize [resilient, satellite-based communication](#) (like Open Cosmos) over vulnerable subsea or terrestrial links in conflict zones.
