DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On March 3, 2026, Morocco and the international community faced a significant escalation in geopolitical risk as the conflict between Israel, the United States, and Iran entered its fourth day. The most critical development is the [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#) by Tehran, a move that has paralyzed approximately 20% of global oil consumption and 83% of liquefied natural gas destined for Asian markets. This "black swan" event has triggered an immediate spike in energy prices, with oil trading between \$85 and \$90 per barrel and [Qatari gas exports](#) coming to a halt. Experts warn of a looming "stagflation" crisis reminiscent of the 1970s if the maritime blockade persists, threatening to derail regional growth and force central banks to maintain high interest rates indefinitely.

Morocco is responding to this external volatility by fortifying its domestic state capacity and diplomatic standing. The Kingdom officially launched the [military](#)

[service census](#) for the 2026 cohort, targeting youth between 19 and 25 to bolster national defense and social cohesion. Simultaneously, Morocco secured major diplomatic victories regarding the Sahara issue, with [Finland and Belgium](#) reaffirming support for the Moroccan Autonomy Plan. This was underscored at the United Nations in Geneva, where a [bloc of 40 countries](#) formally supported Morocco's full sovereignty over its southern provinces, signaling a narrowing path for separatist narratives in international forums.

Internally, the Kingdom is emphasizing "Tamaghrabit" (Moroccan identity) as a tool for national resilience and soft power. This narrative is being driven through the [Directorate of Royal Archives](#), which is utilizing historical documents and AI-driven digitization to authenticate Morocco's territorial claims and historical depth. As Ramadan approaches, the state is also managing delicate religious and social logistics, from finalized [Haji costs](#) and mosque inaugurations to the scientific standardization of [moon sightings](#) to prevent the sectarian or technical confusion seen in other parts of the Islamic world.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Middle East War and Energy Blockade**
 - Israel and the US conducted heavy strikes on Tehran, targeting [Mehrabad Airport](#) and leadership councils, while Iran retaliated against US interests in the Gulf.
 - The closure of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) has disrupted the transit of 20 million barrels of oil per day.
 - Economists forecast a shift from "geopolitical anxiety" to [structural economic disruption](#), with immediate impacts on global shipping and aviation sectors.
- **Diplomatic Breakthroughs on Sahara Sovereignty**
 - Finland's Foreign Minister described the [Moroccan Autonomy Plan](#) as a "serious and credible" basis for a final solution.
 - Belgium reaffirmed its clear support for the plan, framing the Sahara within the framework of [Moroccan sovereignty](#) and territorial unity.
 - A collective statement by 40 nations at the UN in Geneva confirmed that the Sahara issue is a political dispute solely under [UN Security Council](#) jurisdiction, rejecting external interference.
- **National Security and Military Readiness**
 - The Ministry of Interior opened the census for [compulsory military service](#), running from March 2 to April 30, 2026.
 - The process includes members of the Moroccan diaspora, who are encouraged to register through [consular records](#) to fulfill their national duties.

- **Regional Development in Southern Provinces**

- The Dakhla-Oued Ed-Dahab region approved projects for a new [Data Center](#) and an Higher School of Technology to train engineers in new sciences.
- Investment in [ecological parks](#) and health infrastructure in Guelmim-Oued Noun reached 144 million dirhams.
- Airline connectivity to [Laayoune and Dakhla](#) has expanded to 34 weekly flights, significantly boosting economic integration.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Risk The disruption of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) is the primary threat to Morocco's economic stability in the short term. The transition from growth-oriented policies to [crisis management](#) is evident as regional markets face capital flight toward "safe havens" like gold. Morocco's reliance on imported energy makes it vulnerable to the [50% increase in gas prices](#) observed following the Qatari export suspension.

Digital Sovereignty and AI in Governance Morocco is integrating advanced technology into its archival and historical defense. The [Directorate of Royal Archives](#) is adopting AI for the [restoration of damaged documents](#) and automated classification to counter historical revisionism regarding the Sahara. This "information warfare" strategy aims to maintain [informational sovereignty](#) while using digital tools to detect forged historical maps or treaties.

National Identity as Statecraft (Tamaghrabit) The state is actively promoting the concept of [Tamaghrabit](#) as a unique cultural identity that combines Islamic,

African, and Mediterranean elements. This is used to maintain [diaspora loyalty](#), which translated into 120 billion dirhams in remittances last year, a critical pillar of Morocco's financial resilience. The newly created [Mohammedia Foundation](#) for Moroccans Abroad will serve as a hub for mobilizing the diaspora's technical expertise, particularly in sectors like [defense manufacturing](#) and vaccine production.

Religious Governance and Social Order

The state is meticulous in standardizing religious practice to ensure social stability during Ramadan. This includes the [scientific regulation of moon sightings](#) to avoid the "confusion" and "contradiction" seen in other Islamic nations. Additionally, the [Hajj Royal Committee](#) has finalized costs and logistics for 19,500 pilgrims, ensuring transparency through a [refund system](#) for overcharged citizens.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative and administrative activity centered on military service, regional development contracts, and religious pilgrimage protocols. National and regional bodies met to formalize budget allocations and security measures in response to both scheduled annual cycles and emergent regional crises.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Military Service Census Directive:** A Ministry of Interior decree establishing the legal period for [census registration](#) (March 2 to April 30, 2026) for 19-25 year olds.

- **Regional Development Agreements (Dakhla):** Approval of partnerships with the Ministry of Higher Education for [technological schools](#) and the Ministry of Health for medical staff housing.
- **Guelmim Infrastructure Funding:** Approval of a 144 million DH package for [recreational and ecological parks](#) across four provinces.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Royal Hajj Committee Meeting:** Finalized the 2026 Hajj cost at [63,021 dirhams](#) and announced direct flights from 19,500 pilgrims to Medina.
- **UN Human Rights Council (Geneva):** A 40-country bloc issued a [joint statement](#) supporting Morocco's territorial integrity and its role as a "reliable partner" for the EU.
- **Directorate of Royal Archives Press Briefing:** Dr. Bahija Simou presented evidence of sovereignty over [Eastern Sahara](#) through maps, treaties, and bay'ah (allegiance) documents.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of History Morocco is moving beyond diplomatic rhetoric to "archival lawfare." By centralizing and digitizing millions of documents from [French, Spanish, and Italian](#) archives, the Kingdom is building a legal-historical case for its sovereignty that is difficult to challenge in international courts. This includes proof of administrative acts (tax collection, [judicial appointments](#)) in territories now under dispute, effectively using the past as a strategic asset for modern geopolitical positioning.

Countering "Ideological" Sighting There is a concerted effort to separate religious practice from political whim through the use of [astronomical science](#). By training religious scholars to understand the [lunar conjunction](#) and the difference between "impossible" and "possible" sightings, the state is insulating its calendar from the errors that plague its neighbors. This scientific rigor is presented as a hallmark of Moroccan "exception" and a guard against [intellectual confusion](#) in the Ummah.

Total State Mobilization The simultaneous launch of [military service registration](#) and the expansion of university infrastructure in the [Southern Provinces](#) suggests a model of "Developmental Security." The state is not just defending borders with troops but by creating "poles of excellence" in Dakhla and Laayoune to integrate the youth into a high-tech economy, thereby mitigating the risk of social unrest or separatist recruitment.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect immediate inflationary pressure in Morocco as the [Hormuz closure](#) impacts global supply chains. The government may need to implement temporary energy subsidies or transport controls. Domestic focus will remain on the [military census](#), with high turnout expected as a show of national unity during the regional war.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): If the blockade of the Strait of Hormuz continues, Morocco will likely accelerate its [energy diversification](#) and "Blue Economy" projects in the south. Diplomatic momentum on the Sahara will lead to more European nations (potentially Nordic countries) following

[Finland's lead](#) in supporting the autonomy plan, further isolating the Polisario Front.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Morocco is positioning itself as a ["Rising Country"](#) (pays émergent) by leveraging its diaspora and technological investments. The integration of [AI in archiving](#) and historical research will become a model for other post-colonial states seeking to re-establish their identity. The military service will likely evolve into a professionalized pipeline for the burgeoning [domestic defense industry](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The international community must prioritize the [reopening of the Strait of Hormuz](#) to prevent a global systemic collapse; Morocco's stability as a regional hub is contingent on this maritime security.
- Diplomatic entities should recognize Morocco's [archival evidence](#) as a legitimate basis for settlement in the Sahara dispute, shifting the focus from decolonization rhetoric to historical sovereignty.
- Regional allies should support Morocco's [Mohammedia Foundation](#) as a bridge for technology transfer and security cooperation.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Risk:** Investors must hedge against [sustained high oil prices](#) and potential gas rationing in the MENA region due to the Iran-Israel conflict.

- **Investment Opportunity:** The southern provinces, particularly [Dakhla and Laayoune](#), represent a high-growth sector for education, data centers, and renewable energy, supported by strong state incentives.
- **Supply Chain Resilience:** Shipping companies should prepare for long-term [rerouting away from the Gulf](#), making Morocco's Atlantic ports (like Tanger Med and Dakhla Atlantic) more critical as transit hubs.
