Following a High Security Council meeting, Algeria launches the National Cybersecurity Strategy 2025-2029 to insulate data and services. 

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ALGERIA FORTIFIES DIGITAL SOVEREIGNTY AND REGIONAL ENERGY INFLUENCE AMID GLOBAL OIL MARKET SHOCKS AND HEIGHTENED CROSS-BORDER TENSIONS

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The Algerian government, under President Abdelmadjid Tebboune, has signaled a significant shift toward centralized digital control and regional energy dominance. A high-level meeting of the High Security Council culminated in the publication of the [National Cybersecurity Strategy 2025-2029](#), a five-year framework designed to safeguard "digital sovereignty" and critical infrastructure. This initiative aligns with the state's broader push for rapid digital transformation across all public institutions, moving to insulate Algerian data and services from evolving cyber threats during a period of high regional instability.

Simultaneously, Algeria is projecting its technical expertise into the Sahel, specifically through Sonelgaz's [training of Nigerien engineers](#) for a new power plant project. This "South-South" cooperation is a strategic move

to secure influence in Niger as a primary energy partner. Domestically, the state is accelerating large-scale infrastructure projects, including the 500-bed Tizi Ouzou University Hospital and the [Eastern Mining Railway](#) to facilitate phosphate exports. These efforts are intended to demonstrate state capacity and economic resilience in the face of a global energy market rocked by military escalations in the Gulf and the resulting closure of the Strait of Hormuz.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Launch of the 2025-2029 National Cybersecurity Strategy**
 - The Ministry of National Defense's Information Systems Security Agency released a comprehensive framework for [national cyber resilience](#) approved by President Tebboune.
 - The strategy focuses on protecting digital infrastructure and ensuring the [sovereignty of national data](#) as the country moves toward full digital administration.
- **Global Energy Crisis Linked to Hormuz Closure**
 - Brent crude surged to [\\$81.82 per barrel](#) following military escalations and the closure of the Strait of Hormuz.
 - Experts warn that prolonged disruption could drive [oil prices past \\$100](#) and severely impact European gas markets.

- **Algeria-Niger Energy Partnership Expansion**

- Sonelgaz is hosting a delegation from Niger's NIGELEC for [advanced technical training](#) in Adrar.
- This cooperation supports the construction of a [40MW power plant](#) in Niamey, cementing Algeria's role as a regional energy provider.

- **Acceleration of Strategic Infrastructure**

- The Eastern Mining Railway project is progressing with the [construction of 10 bridges](#) to link phosphate mines to international markets.
- The Tizi Ouzou University Hospital has reached [60% completion](#), utilizing local materials and modern technical management systems.

- **Escalation of Anti-Moroccan Rhetoric**

- State-aligned reporting highlighted "scandals" of the Moroccan "Makhzen," citing [human rights violations](#) and economic failure.
- Protests in Morocco against "normalization with Israel" were framed as [evidence of internal collapse](#) and popular rejection of current Moroccan policy.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Cybersecurity and Digital Sovereignty The Algerian presidency has elevated cybersecurity to a primary national security pillar. The [National Strategy 2025-2029](#) is not merely a technical document but a "roadmap" for preserving "national digital sovereignty." By centralizing this through the Ministry of National Defense, the state is asserting control over the digital transition, ensuring that the shift toward e-governance does not

create vulnerabilities that could be exploited by foreign entities or non-state actors. This is a critical move as the administration attempts to modernize state capacity while maintaining tight security over communication channels.

Energy Security and Regional Influence

Algeria is leveraging its energy infrastructure and technical expertise to project power in the Sahel. The [training of NIGELEC engineers](#) and the deployment of Sonelgaz experts to Niamey serve as "soft power" tools to stabilize Niger and tie its development to Algerian interests. This regional pivot is increasingly important as global energy markets face volatility. While the [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#) threatens global supply, Algeria's position as a Mediterranean energy hub allows it to potentially fill gaps in European demand, provided it can maintain domestic production and regional stability.

Critical Infrastructure and Economic Diversification

The state is prioritizing the [Eastern Mining Railway](#) to break its reliance on hydrocarbons by facilitating the export of phosphates. The engineering challenges—including the construction of a 43km section and [multiple technical bridges](#)—reflect a commitment to high-capital strategic projects. Furthermore, the reassignment of the [Route 2 project in Illizi](#) to new contractors indicates an intolerance for delays in southern development, where infrastructure is vital for both economic integration and border security.

Domestic Stability and Social Order

The government is targeting youth engagement as a preventative measure against civil unrest. The launch of a [national program for young leaders](#), aimed at training 1,000 individuals across the country, is a structured attempt to co-opt emerging talent into state-led development initiatives. This social

engineering is balanced with a heavy emphasis on cultural identity, as seen in the promotion of the [Museum of Islamic Civilization](#) and the celebration of Rai music as [UNESCO-recognized heritage](#), reinforcing a unified national narrative during a time of economic transition.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on the executive implementation of the 2025-2029 National Cybersecurity Strategy and the restructuring of infrastructure contracts to ensure project delivery. Public announcements emphasized the legal framework for "digital sovereignty" and the acceleration of the transformational youth leadership program.

- **National Cybersecurity Strategy 2025-2029:** A comprehensive framework published by the Ministry of National Defense, aimed at [securing state digital assets](#) and infrastructure between 2025 and 2029.
- **National Program for Young Leaders:** A new policy initiative by the Ministry of Youth and Sports to [train 1,000 young leaders](#) in leadership and project management across 18 provinces.
- **Contractual Reassignment Policy:** The local government in Illizi exercised powers to [replace underperforming contractors](#) on the Route 2 project, setting a precedent for strict adherence to "contractual deadlines" in the south.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Digital Fortress Narrative Algeria is moving beyond reactive cybersecurity into a proactive, state-controlled digital ecosystem.

By framing cybersecurity as "sovereignty," the Tebboune administration is signaling that digital space is a [new frontier of national defense](#). This aligns with a global trend of "internet balkanization," where states seek to decouple their critical services from international vulnerabilities. In the Algerian context, this also provides a mechanism for greater state oversight of the "cyber space," which the High Security Council identifies as a [source of various threats](#).

Energy as Diplomatic Currency The Sonelgaz-Niger partnership illustrates a shift from purely transactional energy exports to a model of [integrated regional development](#). Algeria is using its technical "know-how" to fill the void left by departing Western powers in the Sahel. By building power plants and [training foreign engineers](#) in Adrar, Algeria is creating long-term dependencies that favor its strategic alignment, particularly against Moroccan efforts to expand their own influence in the region.

State Capacity and "Deadlines" There is a pervasive emphasis on meeting "contractual deadlines" across all sectors, from the [Tizi Ouzou hospital](#) to the [Illizi road network](#). This reflects a broader governance trend of "performance-based legitimacy," where the state attempts to prove its efficacy through the completion of massive, visible public works. The use of [1,400 workers](#) on a single hospital site and the 24/7 mobilization on [railway bridges](#) suggests a mobilization of resources akin to a wartime economy.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks) Algeria will likely see a significant [revenue windfall](#) from the surge in oil and gas prices caused by the Strait of Hormuz crisis. However, this will be

tempered by increased insurance costs for Mediterranean shipping. Domestically, expect a rollout of [new cyber-regulations](#) for public institutions as the 2025-2029 strategy begins its first phase of implementation. Heightened border patrols are probable as tensions in the Gulf could embolden regional non-state actors.

Medium Term (1-6 Months) The [Niger-Algeria power project](#) will reach key construction milestones, potentially leading to a deeper military-security pact as Algeria protects its investments in Niamey. The Eastern Mining Railway will become a focus for [foreign investors](#) looking to secure phosphate supplies as global fertilizer markets remain tight. Tensions with Morocco may escalate into more frequent "diplomatic skirmishes" as Algiers continues to amplify Moroccan internal unrest.

Long Term (1-5 Years) Algeria's push for "digital sovereignty" will likely lead to the creation of a [nationalized cloud infrastructure](#), reducing the role of Western tech firms in government operations. The successful completion of the mining rail network could transform the eastern highlands into a [global hub for raw material processing](#), fundamentally altering Algeria's rentier-state profile. If the leadership program succeeds, a [new generation of state-aligned technocrats](#) will emerge to manage these modernized sectors.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The international community should recognize Algeria's growing role as a [stabilizing energy partner](#) for the Sahel, potentially channeling development aid through Algerian-led technical programs.
- Diplomatic engagement must account for Algeria's new [cybersecurity posture](#), which may complicate data-sharing agreements and international law enforcement cooperation.
- Monitor the Hormuz crisis's impact on Algerian [natural gas pricing](#) mechanisms, as Algiers may seek to renegotiate long-term contracts with European buyers.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- The [Eastern Mining Railway](#) presents opportunities for industrial logistics and mineral processing firms, provided they can navigate strict state oversight.
- Cybersecurity firms may find a lucrative market in providing [specialized defensive tools](#) that align with the 2025-2029 strategy, particularly for "resilience" in the energy and banking sectors.
- Investors in southern Algeria must prepare for [strict contractual enforcement](#) and potential disruption from the state's aggressive timeline for infrastructure completion.
