

GLOBAL ENERGY SHOCKS AND
DOMESTIC INSTABILITY
FOLLOWING THE JANUARY 3
"RESET."

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 3, 2026, marks a critical inflection point for Venezuela as the administration of Acting President Delcy Rodríguez navigates the dual pressures of a localized Middle East war and the internal "reset" triggered by the events of January 3. Following the reported "kidnapping" or sequestration of Nicolás Maduro and Cilia Flores exactly two months ago, the current government has shifted toward a pragmatic [Realpolitik alignment](#) with the United States. This shift is driven by the global energy crisis resulting from the U.S.-Israeli military offensive against Iran, which has neutralized the Iranian leadership and closed the Strait of Hormuz, threatening to push oil prices toward \$200 per barrel. Venezuela is positioning itself as a [reliable energy supplier](#) to the West, leveraging its

massive reserves to secure the lifting of sanctions and the inflow of foreign capital.

Domestically, the government is attempting to stabilize a fractured social order through the implementation of a massive [Amnesty Law](#), which has already seen thousands of citizens released or their legal statuses normalized. However, this stability is fragile, evidenced by nationwide "faith of life" marches demanding information on the whereabouts of sequestered leaders and a growing public health crisis involving a [Yellow Fever outbreak](#) that has mandated internal travel restrictions. Internationally, the Mobile World Congress 2026 in Barcelona serves as a backdrop for the rapid evolution of AI and 6G technologies, which Venezuela is eyeing as tools for economic modernization and state efficiency.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The "January 3 Reset" and Maduro's Status

- Public mobilizations occurred across 25 states to mark the two-month anniversary of the [sequestration of Nicolás Maduro](#) and Cilia Flores by foreign forces.
- Deputy Francisco Arias Cárdenas characterized the events as an "inevitable reset" and praised Maduro's [dignified refusal](#) to leave the country before his capture.
- The Delcy Rodríguez administration is maintaining constitutional continuity while managing a [delicate dialogue](#) with almost all political sectors except those deemed "extremist" or interventionist.

The Middle East Conflict and Global Energy Shock

- The U.S. and Israel have conducted intensive strikes on Tehran, hitting the [presidential office](#) and intelligence centers; Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei is reported dead.
- The Strait of Hormuz remains closed, and the Iranian Revolutionary Guard has threatened to target any [economic center](#) in the region if attacks continue.
- Global oil prices are spiking, with the [Brent crude](#) trading significantly higher, and analysts predicting prices could hit \$200-300 if the conflict persists.
- Venezuela is seeing an [increase in production](#) and export interest, with major operators like Trafigura and Vitol moving millions of barrels of Venezuelan crude.

Amnesty and Institutional Reform

- The "Amnesty Law for Democratic Coexistence" has processed [over 14,000 requests](#), resulting in more than 6,000 full releases or normalization of status.
- The government is proposing radical reforms to the [Labor Law](#), including the elimination of retroactivity for benefits and changes to the "inamovilidad" (job security) status to spur productivity.
- New laws for [gender parity](#) in public and private office (50% men, 50% women) and the "Acceleration of Administrative Procedures" are moving through the National Assembly.

Public Health Emergency: Yellow Fever

- A significant Yellow Fever outbreak has been confirmed with [36 cases in 22 municipalities](#) across four states (Barinas, Lara, Aragua, and Portuguesa).
- The Ministry of Health has made [vaccination mandatory](#) for all travelers moving toward the affected states, requiring a dose at least 10 days prior to travel.
- Over 1,000 vaccinators have been deployed in border states like Apure to create [sanitary alcabalas](#) (checkpoints).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Geopolitical Power Dynamics

The global shutdown of Middle Eastern supply routes has elevated Venezuela's strategic importance. PDVSA has recently signed [new supply contracts](#) with U.S.-based entities to guarantee the flow of crude. Acting President Rodríguez is explicitly using this [leverage to demand](#) the total lifting of all U.S. sanctions, framed as "diplomacy of peace."

- OPEC+ has agreed to an [increase in production](#) of 206,000 barrels per day starting in April to stabilize the market.
- Venezuelan heavy crudes are being sold at [full market price](#) for the first time in years, bypassing the previous "heavy discounts" necessitated by sanctions.

Investment Climate & Labor Reform

The Rodríguez administration is signaling a pro-business pivot. The Association of Supermarkets (ANSA) and Consecomercio are pushing for a ["Labor Constituent"](#) to reform the Organic Labor Law, which they claim

hinders investment. This includes adopting a "5+2" work week and a [modern retirement system](#) where employers, workers, and the state contribute.

- Inversion risk in Venezuela has [decreased by 890 points](#) in February, though it remains among the highest in Latin America.
- New "Socioeconomic Protection" legislation is being debated to replace the previous [Price Control Laws](#), favoring market-driven pricing and administrative conciliation over judicial coercion.

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

The Mobile World Congress 2026 highlights the push toward [autonomous devices](#) and "AI as an agent" that can anticipate user needs. Venezuela is attempting to integrate these advances into its [healthcare systems](#) for rapid decision-making in critical environments and is expanding fiber optic networks in communal "production niches."

- Huawei and Xiaomi have launched [autonomous mobile devices](#) that use 6G connectivity, which is being tested for broader European and Asian markets.
- The Venezuelan government is encouraging [blockchain traceability](#) for cryptoassets to combat corruption and manage commercial operations like imports.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The National Assembly is currently an engine of "New Era" legislation, focusing on state capacity, economic deregulation, and social pacification. The legislative agenda is prioritized around attracting foreign investment in the gold, diamond, and "rare earth" sectors.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Amnesty Law for Democratic Coexistence:** Already in effect, this law is the primary vehicle for [social normalization](#), despite excluding those accused of high treason or common violent crimes.
- **Law for Gender Parity in Public and Private Office:** A proposed mandate for a [50/50 gender split](#) across all leadership positions in the nation.
- **Reform of the Organic Hydrocarbons Law:** Designed to make the sector [more competitive](#) and allow for greater foreign private equity in operations.
- **Law for the Protection of Socioeconomic Rights:** A replacement for the Fair Price Law, moving toward [market pricing](#) and reducing the number of criminal classifications for business owners from 15 to 5.
- **Acceleration of Administrative Procedures Law:** A deregulation effort to [remove bureaucratic hurdles](#) for new businesses and state permits.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Amnesty Commission Press Conference:** Deputy Jorge Arreaza provided a [balance of 14,000+ solicitudes](#) processed, noting that while the law doesn't cover military personnel, the military justice system is concurrently releasing officers involved in political events.
- **PSUV Mobilization (Caracas):** Leaders Nahum Fernández and Carmen Meléndez led marches to demand the [release of Maduro](#), framing his absence as a foreign kidnapping.

- **ANSA National Presentation:** Business leaders proposed a [remodel of the Labor Law](#) to end the retroactivity of social benefits, arguing it is the only way to significantly increase worker salaries in a high-inflation environment.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Pragmatic Pivot (Realpolitik) The most striking trend is the Rodríguez administration's rapid pivot toward the United States despite the "Jan 3" incident. The rhetoric has shifted from anti-imperialist defiance to ["mutual interest"](#) and "cooperation." This is facilitated by the U.S. need for oil to replace Iranian and Middle Eastern barrels. The Venezuelan government is using this moment to "reset" its entire economic model, moving away from state-centric controls and toward [competitive fiscal regimes](#) that appeal to Western energy majors like Chevron, Shell, and Repsol.

Institutional Cleaning & Pacification The Amnesty Law is more than a legal instrument; it is a strategic tool to lower the political temperature. By releasing over [6,000 individuals](#), the government is attempting to neutralize the radical opposition's primary grievance. Concurrently, the transition of Tarek William Saab from [Attorney General to Ombudsman](#) signals a shuffling of the "Old Guard" to make way for new figures in the power structure, though critics argue this undermines real institutional independence.

The Fragmentation of the Opposition The recognition of figures like Enrique Márquez by the [U.S. Congress](#) suggests that Washington is diversifying its portfolio of Venezuelan allies. The "radical" wing led by Maria Corina Machado is being increasingly

sidelined in favor of "center-left" or "moderate" figures who are willing to [participate in the stability process](#) rather than seek an immediate rupture. This fragmentation allows the Delcy administration to pick and choose its interlocutors, strengthening its hand in the short term.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks) Expect a continued spike in domestic fuel and food prices as the [Middle East shock](#) filters through global supply chains. The Yellow Fever outbreak will likely lead to more [mandatory vaccination zones](#), potentially impacting internal logistics and tourism during the upcoming Holy Week. The March 8 "Communal Consultation" will serve as a test of the government's ability to mobilize its base in Maduro's absence.

Medium Term (1-6 Months) If oil prices stabilize above \$100, Venezuela will see a significant [revenue windfall](#) that Rodríguez will likely direct into two newly created "Sovereign Funds" to subsidize public services and potentially raise public sector wages before any talk of new elections. The [reform of the Labor Law](#) will be the next major flashpoint for social unrest or business jubilation.

Long Term (1-5 Years) Venezuela is on a trajectory toward a "Vietnamese" or "Chinese" model—authoritarian political control paired with [liberalized economic markets](#). The outcome of the Jan 3 "kidnapping" incident will eventually require a formal resolution; either Maduro's return or a [managed succession](#) that solidifies Rodríguez's position as the permanent leader of a post-sanctions Venezuela integrated into the Western energy orbit.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The U.S. and its allies should prepare for a [long-term energy partnership](#) with the Delcy Rodríguez administration, prioritizing stability over immediate democratic transition due to the global energy emergency.
- Diplomatic efforts should focus on ensuring the [transparency of the Amnesty Law](#) process to prevent the creation of a "revolving door" of political prisoners.
- Regional health organizations must support Venezuela's [Yellow Fever containment](#) to prevent the virus from spreading across highly porous borders with Colombia and Brazil.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Energy majors should capitalize on the [new legal framework](#) (CPP contracts) which offers greater control over exports and currency management, though political risk remains moderate.
- The logistics and retail sectors should monitor [Labor Law reforms](#) closely; the end of benefit retroactivity would fundamentally change the cost of doing business in Venezuela.
- Technology firms specializing in [AI and autonomous systems](#) will find a receptive market in Venezuelan state enterprises looking to modernize infrastructure with limited human capital.
