

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 3, 2026, marks a definitive shift in the regional security architecture as the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) transition from border skirmishes to a coordinated military campaign dubbed "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" (Repelling Oppression) against Pakistan. Following Pakistani airstrikes that reportedly targeted civilians in Khost, Paktika, and Kunar, the IEA Ministry of Defense claims to have [retaliated against major military installations](#) including the Nur Khan base in Rawalpindi and the 12th Corps in Quetta. The Taliban leadership is leveraging these hostilities to consolidate domestic legitimacy, framing the conflict as a "national and religious obligation" while reporting the [neutralization of over 100 Pakistani personnel](#) and the seizure of dozens of border outposts. This military escalation is coupled with a sharp rhetorical pivot, characterizing the Pakistani government as a "mercenary

regime" and a proxy for Western interests, specifically the United States.

Simultaneously, the IEA is navigating a rapidly destabilizing broader Middle East. Foreign Minister Amir Khan Muttaqi has engaged in high-level [diplomatic consultations with Iranian officials](#) following reported US and Israeli strikes on Tehran. The IEA's vocal condemnation of these strikes, combined with reports of Iranian retaliatory attacks on US bases in the Persian Gulf and the [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#), suggests a burgeoning strategic alignment between Kabul and Tehran against a common set of adversaries. Domestically, the administration is attempting to project a "business as usual" image despite the mobilization, launching a [national tree-planting campaign](#) and reporting significant growth in trade with Central Asian republics—a clear attempt to mitigate the economic fallout from the total severance of trade routes with Pakistan.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Initiation of Operation Rad-ul-Zulm:** The IEA has formally launched a counter-offensive against Pakistani forces following a series of cross-border airstrikes. Military spokesmen claim that [17 additional Pakistani posts](#) were captured in the last 30 hours, with cumulative Pakistani casualties allegedly exceeding 150.
- **Regional War Escalation:** External news segments report massive Iranian rocket attacks on US military bases in the UAE, Kuwait, and Bahrain, alongside the [targeting of oil facilities](#) in Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and Oman. The US Embassy in Riyadh was reportedly attacked, signaling a total breakdown of regional stability.

- **Domestic Mobilization and Civil Unrest:** Large-scale public demonstrations have been orchestrated in Samangan, Baghlan, and Kunduz, where citizens and [religious scholars declared support](#) for the IEA's "retaliatory strikes." In Ghor, "Special Forces" units publicly pledged to [join the front lines](#) to defend "territorial integrity."
- **Economic Pivot to Central Asia:** The Ministry of Industry and Commerce reported a [77% increase in exports](#) to Central Asian countries in 2025, signaling a strategic effort to bypass the Pakistani transit route, which has become unreliable due to political and military tensions.
- **Anti-Narcotics and Criminal Crackdown:** Amidst the war footing, the Takhar Police Command reported the [arrest of nearly 1,000 individuals](#) for crimes including human trafficking and gambling, while seizing "thousands of kilograms" of narcotics over the past year.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Defense Architecture

- The IEA has deployed anti-aircraft systems around Kabul and other major cities to counter Pakistani aerial incursions. Residents are being told [not to panic](#) at the sound of anti-aircraft fire, which is framed as a defensive measure.
- Military analysts on state media are emphasizing the "superior morale" of the Mujahideen compared to the "mercenary" nature of the Pakistani army, citing the [defeat of past empires](#) (British, Soviet, US) as a historical precedent for the current conflict.

- Claims of [shooting down Pakistani drones](#) in Parwan and Logar provinces suggest an improving, albeit basic, electronic warfare or localized air defense capability.

International Relations & Bloc Politics

- The IEA is positioning itself within an anti-Western/pro-Iran bloc. Foreign Minister Muttaqi's [condemnation of US/Israeli actions](#) reflects a move away from the "neutrality" often claimed in the early post-2021 period.
- Engagement with the United Kingdom remains transactional; the British Special Envoy for Afghanistan, Richard Lindsay, held a [video conference with the IEA](#) to discuss the "political situation," though the IEA continues to warn that Pakistan's choice of war will have "consequences."
- The anniversary of the [Doha Agreement](#) (Feb 29/March 1) is being used as a propaganda tool to highlight the "victory over the US" and the current regime's "unbreakable" status.

Economic Security & Infrastructure

- The IEA is pushing for "self-sufficiency" through agricultural investment. The [19 million tree campaign](#) is framed as a "Sadaqah Jariyah" (ongoing charity) to boost the national economy and ecological resilience.
- Prison governance is being reformed into a labor-based model; in Pul-e-Charkhi, inmates are [trained as tailors](#) and paid for their work, which the administration claims serves the dual purpose of "reform and service."

- Trade statistics show a [43% increase in imports](#) from Central Asia, totaling over \$2 billion, as the administration seeks to stabilize supply chains for fuel and essential goods.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activities have focused on wartime mobilization, judicial proceedings for captured assets, and environmental directives. Press events have been dominated by the Ministry of Defense and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs regarding the conflict with Pakistan and the regional crisis involving Iran.

BILLS & POLICIES DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **National Reforestation Directive:** A policy mandating the planting of [19 million saplings](#) across all 34 provinces to enhance environmental and economic self-sufficiency.

- **Ministry of Defense Briefing:** Spokesman Mufti Enayatullah Khwarazmi provided [updates on captured posts](#) and enemy casualties, emphasizing the successful targeting of Pakistani Corps headquarters.

- **Takhar Police Annual Report:** Officials presented a [one-year achievement summary](#) detailing the arrest of nearly 1,000 criminal suspects and a significant reduction in crime rates due to community cooperation.

- **Daikundi Humanitarian Aid Distribution:** The Ministry of Refugees reported the distribution of [food and cash aid](#) to over 4,700 returned and needy families in the province.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Proxy Regime" Narrative

A recurring theme across all transcripts is the delegitimization of the Pakistani state. IEA spokespersons and analysts consistently refer to the "Lahore and Islamabad rulers" as [slaves to US interests](#). Regional Instability and Global Conflict Convergence

The simultaneous reporting of IEA-Pakistan border wars and a massive Iran-US-Israel conflict suggests a coordinated or at least mutually reinforcing set of escalations. The IEA's mention of [US drones launching from Pakistani soil](#) to strike Iranian targets reinforces their narrative that Pakistan is the primary enabler of Western military power in the region. This convergence is forcing a strategic choice upon Kabul: full alignment

with Tehran. The reported [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#)—a move that would devastate global energy markets—is reported by IEA media with a tone of factual inevitability, reflecting a regime that views global chaos as an opportunity to solidify its own local position.

Domestic "Sacrifice" as Governance

The IEA is using the conflict to reinforce a martial social order. Rallies in Samangan and Baghlan are not just displays of support; they are used to re-indoctrinate the population into the "Mujahideen" identity. Speakers emphasize that [defense is a red line](#) and that the blood of women and children killed in airstrikes must be avenged. This effectively redirects any internal dissatisfaction toward an external enemy, using the "martyrdom" of civilians to fuel [military recruitment](#) and ideological loyalty.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a continued intensification of cross-border artillery and rocket fire. If IEA claims of striking [Rawalpindi and Quetta](#) are accurate, a significant Pakistani conventional response (likely heavy airstrikes or a localized ground incursion) is imminent. The border will remain closed to all commercial traffic, leading to immediate price spikes in southern Afghanistan. IEA will likely increase "Rad-ul-Zulm" propaganda to maintain domestic fervor as casualties rise.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Afghanistan will likely formalize a "security understanding" with Iran, potentially including intelligence sharing or fuel subsidies in exchange for supporting Iran's regional posture. The [pivot to Central Asia](#) for trade will accelerate, but infrastructure

bottlenecks (Salang Pass, limited rail) will prevent it from fully replacing the Pakistani route. Internal stability may be tested if the war of attrition drains the IEA's financial reserves.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The Durrand Line may effectively cease to exist as a managed border, devolving into a permanent "grey zone" of conflict. This could lead to a structural realignment where the IEA actively supports [Baloch and Pashtun separatist movements](#) within Pakistan to weaken their adversary from within. Regional powers like China and Russia will be forced to choose between a collapsing Pakistan and an increasingly militant, Iranian-aligned Afghanistan.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic channels should prioritize de-escalation between Kabul and Islamabad, as a full-scale war could trigger a [refugee crisis](#) that dwarf previous waves, especially with the targeting of returnee camps.
- Monitor the potential for IEA-branded "retaliatory" terrorism against Western interests, given the rhetoric linking [Pakistan's military actions](#) to US "orders."
- Assess the impact of the [Strait of Hormuz closure](#) on humanitarian aid logistics; fuel costs for NGOs in Afghanistan will likely triple within weeks.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Discontinue reliance on the "Karachi to Kabul" transit corridor; all logistics should be re-routed through [Uzbekistan or Turkmenistan](#) immediately, despite higher costs.
- **Energy Volatility:** The regional conflict involving Iran, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE will likely lead to [global oil shortages](#). Mining and infrastructure projects in Afghanistan dependent on imported fuel should secure 6-month reserves.
- **Security Standards:** Personnel in major Afghan cities face increased risks from "collateral damage" due to [Pakistani airstrikes](#) and IEA anti-aircraft fire; evacuation plans should be updated for all non-essential staff.
