## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 3, 2026, marks a seismic shift in global stability as the fifth day of the U.S.-Israeli military campaign against Iran, dubbed "Operation Eternal Fury," has escalated into a comprehensive regional conflict with catastrophic economic consequences. The conflict has moved beyond surgical strikes to include the reported neutralization of Iran's air and naval capabilities, though the cost has been the fracture of global energy supply chains. Following Iranian retaliatory strikes on Qatari LNG facilities and threats to the Strait of Hormuz, global oil prices surged 8% in a single session, while Asian markets, led by Taiwan and South Korea, experienced historic sell-offs. South Korea was forced to trigger circuit breakers, and Taiwan's Taiex plummeted 771 points, losing over 1,000 points in 48 hours.

Domestically, the Taiwan government is grappling with the convergence of this

external shock and a contentious internal legislative battle over a TWD 1.25 trillion Defense Special Ordinance. While the administration projects confidence in energy reserves—claiming three months of natural gas stability—the suspension of Qatari production threatens long-term power pricing and industrial output. Simultaneously, a significant shift in European security policy has emerged, with French President Emmanuel Macron announcing a historic expansion of France's nuclear arsenal, signaling a move toward "strategic autonomy" as the U.S. remains bogged down in a Middle Eastern "black swan" event. The day's events suggest a permanent transition away from the post-Cold War security architecture toward a more volatile, multipolar nuclear age.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### Operation Eternal Fury: Escalation to Total Regional War

- The U.S. and Israel have struck over 1,700 targets in Iran, including the [capital of Tehran](#), effectively neutralizing Iranian air detection, air forces, and naval assets. [President Trump claimed](#) that Iranian combat power has been "reduced to zero," though the conflict has sparked a massive refugee crisis in Lebanon and Syria. [Ground troop deployment](#) remains an active consideration, with U.S. War Secretary Hegseth stating that while goals cannot be achieved overnight, the U.S. intends to avoid a prolonged occupation like Afghanistan.

- Iranian proxies have retaliated by launching drone strikes against [U.S. Embassies in Riyadh](#) and Amman, and targeting civilian infrastructure in Bahrain and Saudi Arabia. Regional flight paths have been completely [cleared of commercial traffic](#), with Dubai International Airport—the world's busiest—facing indefinite closure.
- Uncertainty surrounds the status of Iran's nuclear program; while Iranian officials claim [Natanz was targeted](#), the IAEA has yet to confirm direct hits on nuclear fuel facilities [based on radiation monitoring](#).

### Global Energy Shock and Market Contagion

- International oil prices reached [eight-month highs](#) after Qatar Energy suspended LNG production following [Iranian strikes on gas processing](#) facilities. Qatar, which supplies 82% of its output to Asia, has left major economies like Taiwan and South Korea vulnerable to imminent energy shortages.
- Taiwan's stock market faced a "Great White Shark" sell-off, with the [Taiex dropping 771.44 points](#) to close at 34,323, losing the 35,000-point support level. Financial analysts noted that [trading volume exceeded TWD 1 trillion](#) for four consecutive days as panic selling hit memory and panel stocks, even as AI-sector assets attempted to hold ground.

### European Strategic Pivot: The Macron Nuclear Doctrine

- In a historic policy reversal, French President Macron announced that France will [increase its nuclear warhead](#) count for the first time since 1992. Citing the need for European independence in a "nuclear age," Macron [offered to deploy nuclear-capable aircraft](#) to allied nations and invited European partners to participate in joint exercises.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Energy Security & Critical Infrastructure

- Taiwan's Ministry of Economic Affairs claims that [short-term natural gas supplies](#) are secure for March, but acknowledges that if the Hormuz Strait blockade continues into April, [emergency procurement from Australia](#) or cargo-swaps with Japan and South Korea will be required.
- The maritime insurance market has begun [canceling war-related coverage](#) for vessels entering the Persian Gulf, effectively halting a significant portion of global energy shipping.

### National Security & Defense Policy

- The Taiwan government is pushing for a [TWD 1.25 trillion Defense Special Ordinance](#), which the administration argues is necessary to prove Taiwan's commitment to the U.S. alliance. President Lai warned that [failure to pass the bill](#) by March 15 would be interpreted by Washington as a lack of seriousness regarding regional security.

- U.S. drone technology has evolved, with the deployment of [Locus "suicide drones"](#) costing only \$10,000 each, demonstrating a new "high-attrition" model of warfare that challenges traditional Iranian defensive doctrines.

## Legal Warfare (Lawfare) & Political Stability

- Former legislator Huang Kuo-chang has been [summoned by prosecutors](#) over allegations of leaking interrogation recordings, a move he characterized as [political persecution](#). Critics have compared the case to the infamous "tail-gate" scandal of 20 years ago.
- Legislator Wang Ting-yu is mired in a [resurfaced scandal](#) involving allegations of an affair and a secret divorce, which he [claims was a mutual agreement](#) from 2024, highlighting ongoing friction within the ruling coalition.

## Biosurveillance & Public Health

- A significant flu outbreak in Tokyo is [peaking at high levels](#), posing a risk to thousands of Taiwanese fans traveling for the World Baseball Classic (WBC). Additionally, the CDC is monitoring a [rapid rise in Enterovirus](#) cases as the school semester begins, expecting a peak in June.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity centered on emergency defense funding and reacting to U.S. judicial rulings that threaten Taiwan's economic stability.

## BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Defense Special Ordinance (TWD 1.25 Trillion):** A massive military procurement and infrastructure bill aimed at bolstering domestic defense and signaling alignment with U.S. Middle East policy. The [bill passed the Procedure Committee](#) with a 10-8 vote and is set for plenary review on Friday.
- **Anti-Drug and Gun Control Amendments:** Following a [shootout in New Taipei](#) and a [drug-related threat](#) against netizens, legislators are discussing stricter penalties under the Firearms and Narcotics Control Acts.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **US Supreme Court Tariff Ruling:** Legislators held emergency inquiries after the [U.S. Supreme Court ruled](#) that certain Trump-era tariffs were illegal, leading to confusion over the validity of recent [Taiwan-U.S. trade negotiations](#).
- **Evacuation Planning:** The Ministry of Foreign Affairs briefed the legislature on "Stay in Place" orders for citizens in Iran and the [evacuation of non-essential personnel](#) from Jordan and Saudi Arabia.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Weaponization of Global Chokepoints

The conflict has transitioned from a localized strike on Iranian nuclear facilities to a systemic attack on the global economy. By targeting [Qatari energy hubs](#) and closing the Strait of Hormuz, the combatants have turned the "energy lifeline" of Asia into a primary front. This highlights the extreme

vulnerability of "just-in-time" energy importers like Taiwan, where the [cost of electricity](#) is now inextricably linked to U.S. military success in Tehran.

### Fracturing of the "Pax Americana"

France's decision to [expand its nuclear arsenal](#) and invite European neighbors to its "nuclear umbrella" is a direct response to a perceived erratic U.S. foreign policy under Trump. As the U.S. focuses on a [total war with Iran](#), European powers are moving toward strategic autonomy, fearing that U.S. resources will be depleted by "prolonged" Middle Eastern conflicts. This shift suggests that the 2026 conflict is not just a regional war but the catalyst for a new global security alignment.

### Invasive Species as a Mirror to State Capacity

While the state manages a global war, a domestic ecological crisis—the [Green Iguana invasion](#)—is overwhelming rural Taiwan. The rapid [northward migration of the species](#) into Miaoli and the failure to accurately [track agricultural losses](#) serve as a quiet indictment of state capacity. The contrast between the government's ability to discuss 1.25 trillion TWD in missiles while failing to manage invasive pests in Pingtung [red bean fields](#) illustrates a growing disconnect between elite geopolitics and grassroots governance.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect extreme volatility in Asian markets as energy prices reflect the loss of Qatari LNG. Public unrest may grow in Taiwan if [electricity price hikes](#) are announced. Cyberattacks from Iranian-aligned "hacktivists" are [projected to increase](#) against U.S. and Taiwanese critical

infrastructure as a low-cost retaliatory measure for the destruction of Iran's physical military.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The passage of the Defense Special Ordinance will likely trigger a massive shift in Taiwan's fiscal priorities, potentially starving social programs to fund [military procurement](#). European states may formalize a "Nuclear Defense Pact" led by France, marking the most significant change to NATO's internal balance since its founding.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** If the U.S. successfully installs a new regime in Tehran, a "New Middle East" trade corridor could emerge, but if the conflict stagnates, the world faces a [permanent inflationary period](#) driven by high energy costs. The precedent of "unprecedented" [private jet evacuation fees \(\\$350,000\)](#) suggests a future where safety in conflict zones is increasingly privatized and accessible only to the ultra-elite.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Accelerate "energy diplomacy" with Australia and Canada to diversify away from the Persian Gulf. The [suspension of Qatari output](#) should be treated as a permanent warning for Asian energy security architecture.
- Establish a multilateral framework for [maritime security](#) that does not rely solely on the U.S. Navy, given its current overextension.
- Monitor the [French nuclear pivot](#) for its impact on non-proliferation treaties; a "multi-polar nuclear" Europe is now a baseline scenario.

## For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Diversify Tech Holdings:** While [AI and semiconductor stocks](#) are resilient, the [crash in memory and panel stocks](#) indicates high sensitivity to energy costs and shipping logistics. High-energy manufacturing in Taiwan faces an existential risk.
- **Supply Chain Redundancy:** Companies relying on components from the Middle East or transit through the Gulf must shift to [land-based Caucasian routes](#) (via Azerbaijan) or the Cape of Good Hope, despite the increased cost and time.
- **Security Compliance:** Heightened [cybersecurity protocols](#) are mandatory for firms in the U.S. and Taiwan, as low-level "nuisance" attacks on financial and utility networks are expected to follow the kinetic war.
