
### OPERATION EPIC FURY: Regional War & Global Energy Crisis Triggered by Hormuz Blockade

A Multi-Front Escalation Following US/Israel Strikes & Iran's Strait of Hormuz Closure.







#### DEEP DIVE: TRENDS & THEMES



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THE UNITED STATES AND ISRAEL HAVE EXPANDED OPERATION EPIC FURY INTO A MULTI-FRONT REGIONAL WAR, TRIGGERING A GLOBAL ENERGY CRISIS FOLLOWING IRAN'S CLOSURE OF THE STRAIT OF HORMUZ AND TARGETED STRIKES ON GULF INFRASTRUCTURE.

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 4, 2026, marks a definitive escalation in the Middle East as "Operation Epic Fury," the joint U.S.-Israeli offensive against Iran, enters its fifth day. What began as a targeted strike against nuclear facilities and the Iranian leadership—resulting in the [death of the Supreme Leader](#) on Day 1—has metastasized into a regional conflict involving nearly a dozen nations. The U.S. Secretary of War, Pete Hegseth, has declared that the coalition is winning the war, citing the first [sinking of an enemy vessel](#) by torpedo since the Second World War. However, Iran has responded with a highly effective asymmetrical strategy, successfully [shutting down the Strait of Hormuz](#), through which 20% of the world's oil flows, and launching

drone and missile barrages against U.S. allies in the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia, and Qatar.

Domestically, Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney is attempting to navigate a "realistic" foreign policy that supports U.S. objectives to prevent a nuclear Iran while simultaneously [expressing regret](#) that the initial strikes likely violated international law. This nuanced—and widely criticized—position coincides with a growing Canadian push for "food independence" and energy self-sufficiency, as the conflict drives [oil prices toward \\$100](#) a barrel and highlights the vulnerability of global supply chains. At home, security concerns are mounting following a [targeted shooting at a Toronto synagogue](#) and a coroner's inquest into a [mass shooting in Tumbler Ridge, BC](#), reflecting a broader sense of global and domestic instability.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### Regional Contagion and the Opening of the Northern Front

- The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) have launched a [ground invasion of southern Lebanon](#), establishing positions in five outposts to push back Hezbollah militants who have been firing rockets into northern Israel. [Mass evacuation orders](#) have been issued for large swaths of southern Lebanon, with over 30,000 civilians displaced.
- U.S. and Israeli air strikes have [flattened the Assembly of Experts](#) building in Tehran, the body responsible for choosing the next Supreme Leader, in a clear attempt to decapitate the regime's succession mechanism.

- The Iranian Red Crescent reports that the death toll in Iran has [surpassed 780](#), including at least 150 children killed in a [strike on a girls' school](#) in southern Iran on the first day of the war.

### **Weaponization of Global Energy Choke Points**

- Iran has effectively [closed the Strait of Hormuz](#), with the Revolutionary Guard vowing to set fire to any vessel attempting transit. Dozens of tankers are [stalled on either side](#) of the waterway as insurance companies withdraw coverage.
- U.S. President Donald Trump has proposed a [financial insurance backstop](#) for tankers and suggested naval escorts to break the blockade, though analysts remain skeptical of the feasibility of protecting slow-moving commercial vessels from "kamikaze" drones.
- The conflict has caused [gas prices in Canada to rise](#) by approximately 10 cents per liter since Saturday, with experts predicting a further 5-10% increase if the Hormuz blockade persists.

### **Canadian Pivot Toward Strategic Self-Sufficiency**

- In response to Trump's tariff threats and the global instability, Canadian businesses are investing millions in [pursuit of food independence](#). Projects include an \$85 million can-manufacturing facility in Ontario and a \$52 million expansion of vertical farming for leafy greens.
- Canada's Energy Minister reports an [increase in inquiries](#) from nervous nations seeking Canada as a safe, values-based producer of energy and critical minerals to replace Middle Eastern and Russian supplies.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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### **Energy Security and Financial Resilience**

- The U.S. is leveraging its status as the [world's top oil producer](#) to mitigate market shocks, though a prolonged Hormuz closure is expected to trigger a global recession.
- The Canadian government is promoting [new pipeline plans](#) as a matter of global security, framing Canada as a stable "energy superpower" amid the chaos.

### **AI and Information Warfare**

- The war has seen the first major [AI-generated misinformation crisis](#) on social media platforms like X, where an AI chatbot (Grock) incorrectly confirmed fake footage of missiles hitting Tel Aviv as authentic.
- Iran is maintaining a [near-total internet blackout](#), with connectivity at just 1%, effectively weaponizing the "kill switch" to control the flow of information and suppress domestic dissent.

### **Coalition Cohesion and Diplomatic Relations**

- Friction is emerging within the Western alliance; President Trump has [insulted UK PM Keir Starmer](#) and threatened to cut off trade with Spain over their reticence to be drawn further into the conflict.
- France and the UK have [deployed naval assets](#) to the Mediterranean to protect Cyprus and British bases from Iranian drone retaliation.

## Domestic Stability and Social Order (Canada)

- Security around Jewish and Muslim places of worship has been [increased across the GTA](#) following a targeted shooting at Temple Emmanuel synagogue.
- Student protests are escalating in Ontario as [hundreds walk out of classes](#) to oppose the Ford government's cuts to OSAP grants.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Governance activity today centered on war powers, immigration reform in Quebec, and the permanent adoption of Daylight Saving Time in British Columbia. Legislators are grappling with the tension between emergency responses to the Middle East war and long-standing domestic policy shifts.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **U.S. War Powers Act:** The U.S. Senate is [debating legislation](#) that would require the President to seek congressional approval for further military action. Passage is deemed unlikely due to the Republican majority.
- **Quebec Skilled Worker Selection Program (PSTQ):** The provincial government is [defending the replacement](#) of the fast-track PEC program with a points-based system prioritizing labor shortages outside Montreal.
- **BC Daylight Saving Time Reform:** British Columbia has [officially adopted permanent daylight saving time](#), aligning with the Yukon and ending the bi-annual time change.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **U.S. Oval Office Press Briefing:** President Trump defended [Operation Epic Fury](#), claiming he "forced Israel's hand" to prevent an "imminent" Iranian attack, though no evidence was provided.
- **Secretary of State/War Briefings:** Marco Rubio and Pete Hegseth [briefed lawmakers on Capitol Hill](#), emphasizing the destruction of 80% of Iran's drone and missile stockpiles.
- **Prime Minister Mark Carney Sydney Address:** Carney [reaffirmed support](#) for the U.S. mission while signaling that Canada's endorsement is "not a blank check."

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Collapse of the "Rules-Based Order"

Prime Minister Carney's rhetoric signals a pragmatic, if somber, shift in Canadian statecraft. By acknowledging that the U.S. strikes [likely violated international law](#) yet supporting them anyway, Carney is signaling the end of the post-WWII liberal order in favor of a "realistic" engagement with the world as it is. This is mirrored by Trump's open [threats against NATO allies](#) like Spain, suggesting that strategic alignment is now purely transactional.

### Asymmetrical Attrition

Despite coalition claims of "aerial superiority," the cost-benefit analysis of the war favors Iran's asymmetrical approach. Iran is launching ["kamikaze" drones](#) costing \$20,000-\$50,000, which the coalition is intercepting with \$4 million Patriot missiles. This strategy of attrition is designed to

[deplete coalition magazines](#) and exert maximum economic pressure through the Hormuz blockade.

## Information Sovereignty and the Blackout Model

Iran's [sophisticated internet blackout](#) represents a new frontier in authoritarian survival. By "white-listing" only approved government services, the regime is preventing citizens from [verifying strike damage](#) or coordinating protests. This "kill switch" model is being watched closely by other authoritarian states as a template for digital sovereignty during kinetic conflict.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect an intensification of the blockade in the Strait of Hormuz. If a U.S. naval escort [leads to a direct clash](#) with the Iranian Revolutionary Guard, oil prices will likely exceed \$120. In Canada, domestic security will remain at a "high alert" status as the [Toronto synagogue investigation](#) continues to assess links to regional tensions.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The Canadian government will likely [fast-track energy infrastructure approvals](#) (pipelines and LNG) under the guise of national security. The U.S. Senate will struggle to [curtail the President's war powers](#), potentially leading to "mission creep" and the deployment of "boots on the ground" in Iran, an option Trump has pointedly [refused to rule out](#).

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** Structural decoupling from the U.S. economy may become a permanent Canadian policy trend. The [food independence movement](#) seen in the manufacturing and vertical farming sectors today suggests a shift toward a more autarkic

economic model to buffer against U.S. protectionism and global regional wars.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Prioritize the creation of a **maritime "blue corridor"** for energy transit, potentially involving non-aligned powers like China or India to pressure Iran into reopening the Strait.
- Establish an **independent international tribunal** to investigate civilian casualties, specifically the [strike on the girls' school](#), to maintain some semblance of international law.
- Coordinate a **multilateral response to AI misinformation** to prevent deepfakes from triggering unintended military escalations between NATO and regional actors.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Diversification:** Investors should pivot toward [Canadian-based manufacturing and agri-tech](#) as domestic production becomes a "national security" priority with government subsidies.
- **Energy Hedging:** Companies with high fuel exposure must prepare for [extended triple-digit oil prices](#), as the Hormuz blockade is unlikely to be resolved through purely kinetic means in the near term.
- **Cyber Resilience:** Firms operating in the Gulf must prepare for [targeted cyber-kinetic attacks](#) against data centers (as seen with the Amazon center strike in Dubai) and other critical digital infrastructure.
