



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THE ASSASSINATION OF IRAN'S SUPREME LEADER BY US-ISRAELI FORCES HAS TRIGGERED A HIGH-INTENSITY REGIONAL WAR, THREATENING GLOBAL ENERGY SUPPLY CHAINS AND DESTABILIZING THE NIGERIAN DOMESTIC ECONOMY.

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 4, 2026, marks a seismic shift in global geopolitics following the confirmed death of Iranian Supreme Leader **Ayatollah Ali Khamenei** in joint US-Israeli air strikes. This "Operation Epic Fury" has escalated into a multi-front conflict involving [widespread missile and drone attacks](#) across the Gulf, targeting US installations in Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Qatar, and Bahrain. The strategic objective is the total [removal of Iranian nuclear and ballistic capabilities](#). In response, Iran has effectively attempted to shut down the **Strait of Hormuz**, through which 20% of global oil flows, leading to a surge in [crude prices past \\$84](#) per barrel. The global aviation sector is in crisis, with the UAE establishing [emergency air corridors](#) as international carriers reroute to avoid combat zones.

Domestically, Nigeria faces a paradoxical "windfall and woe" scenario. While the state anticipates [strengthened external reserves](#) due to elevated oil prices, the immediate impact on the citizenry is severe. The **Dangote Refinery** has already [increased ex-depot PMS prices](#) by 100 Naira per liter, citing global crude volatility. This economic pressure coincides with heightening political tension as the National Assembly debates contentious **Electoral Act** amendments—specifically Sections 60 and 77—which opposition parties claim are designed to [institutionalize ruling party dominance](#) ahead of the 2027 elections. Security concerns have also migrated to Nigerian soil, with the US Embassy in Abuja issuing a [stay-at-home order](#) for its citizens following the regional escalation.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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#### The Decapitation of Iranian Leadership and Regional Retaliation

- US and Israeli forces executed strikes that neutralized [Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#), justifying the action as a preemptive move against an existential nuclear threat.
- The US Embassy in Riyadh was struck by [two drones](#), causing material damage but no reported casualties, while Saudi air defenses intercepted eight additional drones.
- Iran has declared all US-affiliated assets in the region as [legitimate military objectives](#), leading to strikes on facilities in the UAE, Qatar, and Bahrain.
- The US State Department has ordered the [departure of non-emergency personnel](#) from several Middle Eastern countries, including Jordan and Iraq.

## Global Energy and Maritime Supply Chain Disruption

- The **Strait of Hormuz**, a 25km wide chokepoint, is reportedly [closed by Iranian forces](#), forcing vessels to take the expensive "Cape of Good Hope" route around Africa.
- Global insurance companies have [canceled coverage for vessels](#) transiting the Gulf, exponentially increasing shipping premiums.
- Brent crude reached [\\$80.37 per barrel](#) in early trading, with analysts predicting a rise to \$1,200 per liter for PMS in Nigeria if the conflict persists.

## Nigerian Economic Response and Refinement Shifts

- The **Dangote Refinery** adjusted its ex-depot price from [774 to 874 Naira](#) per liter due to rising crude costs.
- Petroleum retail owners (PETROAN) are calling for [adequate crude supply](#) to domestic refineries to mitigate external market shocks.
- President Tinubu nominated **Taiwo Oyedele** as [Minister of State for Finance](#), signaling a move to consolidate tax reforms and fiscal management amid the crisis.

## Domestic Security and Civil Unrest in Nigeria

- Protests have erupted in [Lagos, Kano, and Sokoto](#) following the killing of the Iranian Supreme Leader, reflecting religious and ideological sympathies.
- The US Mission in Nigeria has advised its citizens to [remain in their residences](#) in Abuja, citing potential security threats from the Middle East fallout.

- A young man was arrested in connection with an [attack on ADC leaders](#) in Edo State, highlighting the growing volatility of the 2027 political cycle.

## Critical Infrastructure Vulnerability

- Nigeria's \$3.4 billion rail overhaul is [threatened by vandalism](#), neglect, and faulty design, leading to 189 derailments by the end of 2025.
- Illegal oil bunkering in Rivers State is [devastating local fishing](#) routes and ecosystem health, with calls for increased Navy patrols.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Energy Security & Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- The US-Israel alliance has transitioned from "containment" to [active destruction](#) of Iranian assets, with former naval officers noting that Israel is now effectively "dictating the terms" of the conflict.
- The **Strait of Hormuz** closure is characterized as a "chokehold" that could [stop 20% of global oil](#), impacting economies from Europe to East Asia.
- South African President **Cyril Ramaphosa** labeled the war "madness" and [offered to mediate](#), while emphasizing that Africa must stop merely exporting raw energy and start creating value.

### Statecraft & Financial Resilience

- The Nigerian **Central Bank** is expected to manage reserves prudently to avoid "Dutch Disease" as oil revenues rise, using the windfall to [block fiscal leakages](#).

- The appointment of tax expert **Taiwo Oyedele** aims to [widen the tax net](#) to include the informal sector, targeting an annual growth of 7% toward a \$1 trillion economy.

### Legal Warfare (Lawfare) & Succession Politics

- Opposition parties (ADC, YPP) are [criticizing the 2026 Electoral Act](#), particularly the mandate for direct primaries, which they argue favors the incumbent party's financial advantage.
- Debates over **Section 60** concerning [electronic transmission of results](#) continue, with critics suggesting the National Assembly is "decapitating" political competition.
- Adamawa Governor **Fintiri** has sparked controversy by [insisting power remain](#) in the South for another term, challenging Northern interests within the PDP.

### National Security & Defense Architecture

- Former Commodore **Promise Dabba** warned that Nigeria's [defense capabilities have degraded](#) over 40 years, noting a lack of missile, submarine, or anti-submarine technology to protect territorial waters.
- The Niger Police Council [ratified the appointment](#) of a new Inspector General of Police to stabilize internal security amidst the geopolitical tension.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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The Nigerian National Assembly is currently embroiled in debates regarding the **Electoral Act 2026**, with a focus on party primary regulations and digital result transparency. Concurrently, the government is moving toward a **Cashless Airport Policy** and new tax imple-

mentation frameworks for the informal economy.

The reliance on the **Dangote Refinery** highlights a transition toward domestic energy security, yet even this private entity is [tethered to global crude rates](#), limiting its ability to shield the local market. The trend is toward "competitive devaluation" and aggressive tax capture to build internal buffers [against external shocks](#).

### Democratization of Ownership vs. Lawfare

There is a stark contrast between the "democratization of economic ownership" promised by upcoming listings like **Dangote** and the "Lawfare" seen in the National Assembly. While the capital market sees [asset bubbles and recovery](#), the political landscape is being constricted. The mandate for **direct primaries** is a strategic move to [utilize financial muscle](#) to "buy members" instead of just delegates, effectively pricing out smaller opposition parties.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect extreme volatility in global energy markets and potential **fuel shortages** in Nigeria as distributors adjust to the new 874 Naira ex-depot price. Domestic **civil unrest** may escalate in North-

ern Nigeria and Lagos in solidarity with Iran. US and European citizens will likely complete evacuations from the Gulf as Iran targets "hard" assets including [consulates and CIA stations](#).

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The Nigerian government will likely implement aggressive **tax reforms** under Minister Oyedele to offset potential drops in non-oil revenue. The **Dangote listing** may be delayed if global market souring continues [to affect Nigerian equities](#). Regional Gulf nations may be forced to choose between the US alliance and "Arab brotherhood" as economies beyond oil and gas [start to crumble](#) under drone warfare.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** A permanent restructuring of **global maritime routes** may occur if the Strait of Hormuz remains a contested zone. Nigeria may face a **legitimacy crisis** leading into 2027 if the Electoral Act is perceived as a tool for a "one-party state" [without meaningful resistance](#). Structural changes to African defense will be required, moving away from "prostrate" anti-insurgency to [maritime and aerial sovereignty](#).

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Security Strategy:** Allies must prepare for **proxy escalation** in the Sahel and West Africa, as Iran may activate sleeper cells or ideological sympathizers to strike Western interests, as suggested by the [Abuja embassy alert](#).
- **Diplomatic Mediation:** Support the "neutrality" of the [UAE and Saudi Arabia](#) as they attempt to balance US security needs with regional stability to prevent a total Gulf collapse.

- **Food Security:** Address the [fertilizer supply chain](#), as 30% of global fertilizers transit the now-closed Strait of Hormuz.

#### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Logistics Risk:** Reroute all maritime cargo away from the Gulf and Red Sea immediately; anticipate **doubled journey times** and exponentially higher [insurance premiums](#).
- **Investment Opportunity:** Monitor **South Korean and Japanese defense stocks**, which have [surged by 20%](#) as the global demand for fighter jets and missile defense increases.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Prepare for the [new Nigerian tax regime](#) for the informal and small-business sectors, which will be aggressively enforced to meet the \$1 trillion GDP target.
