AFGHANISTAN-PAKISTAN CONFLICT ESCALATION: "OPERATION RAD-UL-ZULM" & REGIONAL VOLATILITY



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AFGHANISTAN-PAKISTAN CONFLICT ESCALATES INTO "RAD-UL-ZULM" OPERATION AMID REGIONAL VOLATILITY AND IRANIAN LEADERSHIP TRANSITION

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 4, 2026, marks a significant escalation in the military confrontation between the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) and Pakistan, characterized by the formalization of "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" (Repelling Oppression). The IEA claims substantial tactical successes, including the [seizure of 40 Pakistani outposts](#) along the Durand Line and the elimination of 150 Pakistani military personnel. This military activity is being framed domestically as a defensive "Jihad" against a "mercenary" Pakistani regime that the IEA alleges is acting at the behest of Western interests. State media is saturated with reports of "spontaneous" mass rallies across nearly every province, indicating a total state effort to mobilize public sentiment and recruit volunteers for a potential "long war."

Simultaneously, the IEA is navigating a complex regional environment following the

reported death of Iranian leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. High-ranking IEA officials have engaged in intense [diplomatic visits to the Iranian embassy](#) in Kabul, while also seeking to solidify ties with China and Russia to counterbalance Pakistani aggression. Economically, the IEA is attempting to demonstrate resilience by highlighting a [77% surge in exports](#) to Central Asian states and the continued operation of the Khwaf-Herat railway, signaling a strategic pivot away from Pakistani trade routes. The convergence of border warfare, regional leadership voids, and the threat of broader Middle Eastern conflict suggests a period of extreme instability for the South Asian security architecture.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Formalization of "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm":** The Ministry of Defense has transitioned from border skirmishes to a named offensive, claiming to have [killed 150 Pakistani soldiers](#) and wounded 200 more. The IEA reports capturing dozens of outposts and significant quantities of weaponry, framing the conflict as a total rejection of Pakistani territorial incursions.
- **Aerial Warfare and Drone Interdiction:** IEA air defense units claim to have neutralized Pakistani incursions by [downing five unmanned aerial vehicles \(UAVs\)](#), including military and reconnaissance drones, in Nangarhar, Pervan, and Logar provinces.
- **High-Level Diplomatic Realignment:** Amid the conflict, the IEA is seeking external mediation and support. Foreign Minister Amir Khan Mutti met with the Chinese Ambassador to discuss "mutual respect," while the IEA's envoy in Moscow discussed [Russian mediation efforts](#) regarding the Durand Line violations.

- **Reaction to Iranian Leadership Change:** Deputy Prime Minister Abdul Salam Hanafi led a delegation to the Iranian embassy to offer condolences following the [death of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#), while condemning US and Israeli strikes on Iranian and Lebanese targets that have intensified regional anxieties.
- **Mass Domestic Mobilization:** A massive state-orchestrated propaganda campaign has triggered rallies in Kabul, Kandahar, Takhar, Ghor, and Panjshir. In Panjshir alone, officials claim over [4,000 youth have registered](#) as volunteers for the front lines against Pakistan.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Regional Power Dynamics

- The IEA has adopted a "Long War" doctrine, with spokesmen asserting they are [prepared for a protracted conflict](#) to protect territorial integrity. This includes a shift in rhetoric, labeling the Pakistani military as "mercenaries" of the "Great Satan" (USA).
- The IEA is leveraging the UN Security Council's upcoming special session to frame Pakistan as the primary aggressor, citing [110 civilian deaths](#) and 123 injuries resulting from Pakistani airstrikes over the past week.

Economic Security & Trade Supply Chains

- A strategic shift toward Central Asia is underway. Trade with Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, and Turkmenistan saw [imports reach \\$2.39 billion](#) in 2025, a 43% increase, as the IEA attempts to decouple from the Port of Karachi.

- The Khwaf-Herat railway remains a critical lifeline; despite the war, [42 wagons of cement](#) arrived from Iran, with 900 more reportedly in transit.
- Domestic price controls are being enforced aggressively in Kabul to prevent wartime inflation during Ramadan, with [municipal authorities closing shops](#) found to be engaging in "self-willed" price hikes.

Infrastructure & Technology

- The Directorate of Economic Affairs announced the completion of [1,500 new telecommunication sites](#) over the last four years, focusing on remote highways and border regions to enhance state connectivity and surveillance.
- New investment plans were discussed for [solar power and energy storage](#) systems in Farah, Daykundi, and Ghor provinces to improve local energy self-sufficiency.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity focused on emergency military measures, trade regulations, and the enforcement of Islamic law in commercial sectors. There were no formal legislative bills, but several high-level policy directives were issued via the Ministry of Defense and the Ministry of Commerce.

- **Ministry of Defense Press Conference:** Mufti Enayatullah Khwarazmi detailed the military successes of [Operation Rad-ul-Zulm](#), formally establishing the military's current rules of engagement regarding cross-border fire and drone interdiction.

- **Price Control Mandate:** The Ministry of Industry and Commerce, alongside the Kabul Municipality, issued a [strict directive to traders](#) and shopkeepers forbidding price increases during the current military crisis and the month of Ramadan.
- **Prison Reform/Labor Policy:** The Prisons Administration reported on the expansion of [vocational training \(tailoring\)](#) in Pul-e-Charkhi prison, aiming to make the prison system self-sustaining through inmate labor.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Narrative of "Islamic Solidarity vs. Mercenary Collaboration"

A core theme of the day's broadcasts is the aggressive delegitimization of the Pakistani state. IEA scholars and officials are no longer treating Pakistan as a "brotherly Islamic neighbor" but as a [hypocritical "pro-Zionist" entity](#) that prioritizes Western funding over Islamic solidarity. By linking Pakistan's actions to those of Israel and the US, the IEA is attempting to monopolize the "defender of Islam" narrative in the region. This theme is crucial for internal cohesion, as it allows the IEA to frame the border conflict as a holy struggle (Jihad) rather than a mere territorial dispute.

The "Central Asian Pivot" as Economic Warfare

The data showing massive growth in trade with Central Asian republics is presented as a counterpoint to Pakistani "bullying" at transit points. The IEA is signaling that the [opening of new European and Russian markets](#) via Central Asia has rendered Pakistani transit routes (like Torkham and Spin Boldak) less

relevant. This economic diversification is being used as a tool of statecraft to demonstrate that the IEA can survive a total breakdown in relations with Islamabad.

Militarized Environmentalism

Unusually, the state is combining its war narrative with an environmental campaign. The "National Tree Planting Campaign" (19 million trees) is being [framed as "Sadaqah Jariyah"](#) (ongoing charity). This serves a dual purpose: projecting an image of "normalcy" and long-term governance to the international community while encouraging citizens to take "ownership" of the land they are currently being asked to fight for.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a continued intensification of kinetic engagements along the Durand Line. The IEA's "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" will likely focus on consolidating gains in Paktika and Nangarhar. The UN Security Council meeting will likely result in a stalemate, which the IEA will use as further [proof of the UN's "loss of credibility"](#). Domestic recruitment will likely hit peak levels as the "Jihad" narrative takes hold.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The Iranian transition following Khamenei's death could lead to a temporary vacuum that the IEA may exploit to strengthen its border security or, conversely, face new refugee pressures if Iran destabilizes. Trade through the Khwaf-Herat line will become the primary economic indicator for Afghan stability. If Pakistan maintains its blockade, the [reliance on Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan](#) will lead to permanent shifts in Afghan supply chain infrastructure.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The Durand Line dispute is transitioning from a "frozen conflict" to an active war. This may lead to a formal IEA move to renounce the "imaginary line" entirely and seek a [redefinition of the Af-Pak border](#) based on tribal and religious affiliations rather than colonial treaties. This would fundamentally alter the regional map and likely involve China and Russia as primary power brokers in the absence of Western influence.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The international community should prepare for a major humanitarian crisis if the "Rad-ul-Zulm" operation expands, as [8,400 families have already been displaced](#).
- Diplomatic channels should prioritize engaging with the IEA via the "Moscow Format" or Chinese mediation, as Western influence appears negligible in the current Af-Pak climate.
- Monitoring of Pakistani drone technology and IEA counter-UAV capabilities is critical to assessing the technical escalation of the conflict.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Alert:** Transit via Pakistan should be considered high-risk/unreliable. Logistics firms should prioritize [routes through Uzbekistan \(Termez\)](#) or the Iranian railway system.
- **Energy Sector Opportunity:** The IEA's push for solar and battery storage in outlying provinces indicates a [decentralized energy policy](#) that may offer niches for off-grid technology providers.

- **Agricultural Resilience:** The massive tree-planting and irrigation efforts (26 million AFN in [Ghor water projects](#)) suggest a priority on food security, providing potential openings for ag-tech and water management consultancy.
