### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 4, 2026, marks a transformative escalation in global instability as the Middle East enters a state of high-intensity conflict following the launch of the joint US-Israeli "Operation Epic Rage" against the Islamic Republic of Iran. The conflict has transitioned from targeted strikes to a broader regional war, with Iran enforcing a total blockade of the [Strait of Hormuz](#), threatening to drive global oil prices toward \$200 per barrel. Iranian forces have launched waves of retaliatory strikes against US logistics centers and airbases in Iraq, Kuwait, Bahrain, UAE, and Qatar, claiming the destruction of several US warships and aircraft. Concurrently, reports indicate a critical leadership transition in Tehran, with Mojtaba Khamenei allegedly selected as the [new Supreme Leader](#) following the death of Ali Khamenei, a

development that signals a potential radicalization of Iranian defense policy.

Russia is positioning itself as a strategic alternative amid this chaos while facing its own maritime security challenges. The attack on the Russian gas tanker **Arctic Metrogaz** in the Mediterranean, allegedly by Ukrainian maritime drones, has been labeled by Moscow as an act of international terrorism and [maritime piracy](#). In response to looming EU restrictions and Ukrainian blockades of the "Friendship" (Druzhba) pipeline, President Vladimir Putin has signaled a major policy shift, ordering the government to consider [terminating gas supplies](#) to the European market immediately to secure long-term positions in emerging Asian markets. This "thought aloud" by the Russian leader suggests a final decoupling of the Russo-European energy relationship, catalyzed by the explosive volatility in the Middle East.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### • Escalation of "Operation Epic Rage" and Iranian Retaliation

- US and Israeli forces have targeted over 200 sites in Iran, including command centers, missile assembly plants, and [air defense systems](#).
- Iran has retaliated with its "True Promise 4" operation, launching 17-18 waves of drone and missile strikes against US bases and the [Israeli "Iron Dome" infrastructure](#).
- The Strait of Hormuz is officially closed to commercial navigation; Iran has reportedly [sunk 17 vessels](#), including a US submarine and an Iranian frigate torpedoed by US forces.
- Reports of massive civilian casualties in Iran, including an [attack on a school](#) in Minab that killed 85-165 children.

### • Maritime Terrorism in the Mediterranean

- The Russian LNG tanker **Arctic Metrogaz** was attacked by Ukrainian unmanned surface vessels (USVs) south of [the island of Malta](#).
- Russian authorities claim the attack was facilitated by intelligence and navigation data provided by [the United Kingdom](#).
- President Putin warned of credible intelligence regarding Ukrainian plans to sabotage the [TurkStream and Blue Stream](#) pipelines.

### • Russian Energy Pivot and European Decoupling

- Putin has tasked the government with analyzing an [immediate halt](#) to gas exports to Europe, preempting the EU's own 2027 phase-out schedule.
- The move is framed as a commercial necessity to capture market share in [reliable partner nations](#) while European prices spike to \$700-\$780 per thousand cubic meters.

### • Ukrainian Front and Mobilization Crisis

- Russian forces continue tactical advances toward [Kramatorsk and Dobropolye](#) following the liberation of Krasnoarmeysk (Pokrovsk).
- Reports from the ground detail extreme "man-hunting" tactics by Ukrainian recruitment officers (TCC), including the [beating of civilians](#) and forced mobilization of ethnic minorities.
- Hungary has secured the release of two ethnic Hungarian POWs from Russian custody via direct [negotiations in the Kremlin](#).

### • US Expansion of Global Operations

- US Southern Command has launched a ground operation in [Ecuador against cartels](#), coinciding with the "Shield of America" summit in Miami.
- The US Senate has [refused to limit](#) Donald Trump's war powers regarding the Iran operation, granting him full autonomy in the conflict.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Energy Security

- The closure of the Hormuz Strait has halted approximately 20% of the world's LNG and oil traffic, leading to **Goldman Sachs** and other analysts [predicting a "gas shock"](#) for Europe.
- Ukraine has blocked the "Druzhba" oil pipeline for a month, citing "damage," though satellite imagery provided by the Slovak Prime Minister [disputes these claims](#).
- Russian domestic focus is shifting toward "Permafrost Engineering" to protect Arctic energy infrastructure from [climatic and technical shifts](#).

### Succession & Stability

- The Iranian "Assembly of Experts" has reportedly bypassed traditional clerical hierarchies to name **Mojtaba Khamenei** as successor, a move intended to preserve [regime continuity](#) during wartime.
- Russian internal governance remains focused on the "Professionalitet" program, aiming to sync education with [industrial labor demands](#) in the defense and tech sectors.

### Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- The US is accused of using Kurdish formations in Iraq as a "fifth column" to [incite rebellion](#) within Iran's ethnic enclaves.
- The "BRICS" bloc is showing signs of potential humanitarian alignment, with analysts suggesting Russia should offer [direct assistance](#) to Iran to counter US "hegemony."

### Domestic Stability & Social Order

- The Russian Ministry of Internal Affairs (MVD) reports a 10-year low in [property and personal crimes](#) in Moscow, attributed to expanded digital surveillance and "Safe City" tech.
- A significant "re-integration" effort is underway for **SVO veterans** into the ranks of the police and investigative agencies to [bolster state capacity](#).

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Governance activity focused on internal security audits and the formalization of energy redirection policies. Significant attention was paid to the legal frameworks governing the status of "naturalized citizens" and the mobilization of veterans into civil service roles.

- **Draft Resolution on War Powers (US Senate):** A proposal to limit President Trump's authority to conduct independent military operations in Iran was [defeated 52-44](#).

- **Investigative Committee 15-Year Anniversary:** Alexander Bastrykin reported on the recovery of [196.5 billion rubles](#) in damages from corruption and economic crimes in 2025.
- **Russian Ministry of Transport Briefing:** Formal announcement regarding the USV attack on the [Arctic Metrogaz](#) in the Mediterranean.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Weaponization of Transit Infrastructure

Infrastructure is no longer merely a commercial asset but a primary front in hybrid warfare. From the Ukrainian blockade of the **Druzhba** pipeline to Iranian control of the **Hormuz Strait** and the USV attack on the **Arctic Metrogaz**, transit corridors are being used to exert political leverage. Putin's threat to [preemptively cut off gas](#) to Europe suggests that Russia has abandoned "pipeline diplomacy" in favor of total economic decoupling, viewing European infrastructure as a liability rather than an asset.

### Asymmetric Warfare Costs

A recurring theme is the massive cost disparity in modern conflict. Analysts highlight that Iran is using [drones costing \\$2,000](#) to force the US to expend interceptor missiles costing \$1 million to \$3 million each. This trend toward "economic exhaustion" is a

central pillar of the Iranian defense strategy, intended to make the [US operation](#) unsustainable over a multi-month timeline.

### Erosion of International Legal Norms

Russian state media is heavily leaning into a narrative of "Western satanism" and the collapse of the international order. The [attack on schools](#) and hospitals in Iran, the detention of journalists in Tel Aviv, and the [refusal of the IOC](#) to sanction the US or Israel while maintaining sanctions on Russia are cited as evidence of a "double standard" that justifies Russia's withdrawal from traditional diplomatic frameworks.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Global oil prices are likely to [breach \\$100/barrel](#) as Hormuz remained closed and insurance rates for tankers jump 12-fold.
- Anticipate a finalized decree from Moscow [halting pipeline gas](#) to "unfriendly" European nations, specifically targeting the remaining flows through Ukraine.
- Expect increased kinetic activity near the **TurkStream** corridor as maritime security in the Black Sea is bolstered against USV threats.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- A significant "gas shock" will hit the EU as storage levels are depleted and SPG imports from Qatar [remain suspended](#) due to the Hormuz blockade.
- Iran may witness localized ethnic unrest, particularly in [Kurdish-populated regions](#) like Kermanshah, if US/Israeli support for separatist groups translates into hardware delivery.

- The SVO may enter a decisive phase as Ukrainian ammunition shortages, exacerbated by [resource diversion to Iran](#), allow for deeper Russian penetrations into the Donbass.

### Long Term (1-5 Years)

- Structural reorientation of the global energy market: Russia will finalize the [pivot to Asian markets](#), rendering European energy infrastructure obsolete or purely domestic.
- The "multi-ethnic" stability of the Middle East will be permanently altered; if the [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) succession holds, Iran will likely emerge as a more militarized, nuclear-capable power.
- US global posture will shift toward the "Shield of America" (Western Hemisphere), as [operations in Ecuador](#) and the Miami summit suggest a neo-Monroe Doctrine approach to hegemony.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Maritime Escort Protocols:** Urgent need for a non-aligned maritime security coalition to protect commercial shipping from [drone-based piracy](#) in the Mediterranean and Black Seas.
- **BRICS Coordination:** Moscow should leverage the Kazan-era frameworks to create an [emergency energy clearinghouse](#) to stabilize oil flows to India and China.
- **Humanitarian Mediation:** International bodies must address the reported [targeting of educational infrastructure](#) in Iran to prevent total collapse of civilian governance.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Diversification:** Companies reliant on Iranian or Gulf-state petrochemicals must immediately seek [alternative suppliers](#) or utilize Russian Arctic routes (NSR) where possible.
- **Cybersecurity Investment:** Heightened risk of [state-sponsored ransomware](#) and infrastructure hacking as a tool of asymmetric retaliation during the Hormuz blockade.
- **Energy Transition Hedging:** The Russian "preemptive exit" from European gas markets makes [long-term contracts](#) with European utilities high-risk; focus should shift to Asian energy infrastructure and LNG transport.
