## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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The geopolitical landscape of the Middle East underwent a seismic shift on March 5, 2026, as the Islamic Republic of Iran faced the sixth day of a devastating multi-front war with the United States and Israel. The conflict has reached a critical inflection point following the confirmed [assassination of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei](#), whose planned state funeral was abruptly cancelled due to "security infrastructure" concerns and internal instability. US and Israeli forces have asserted [complete control of Iranian airspace](#), systematically dismantling the regime's strategic depth by targeting missile silos, naval assets, and elite command centers from Tehran to the Kurdish highlands.

Succession dynamics have entered a period of volatile uncertainty. While a [temporary leadership council](#) consisting of President Masoud Pezeshkian and Judiciary Chief Gholam-Hossein Mohseni-Ejei has assumed interim duties, US President Donald Trump

has publicly asserted that he [must have a personal role](#) in selecting the next leader. Trump has explicitly rejected the candidacy of Mojtaba Khamenei, citing his perceived weakness and the need for a "Venezuela-style" transition that shifts power to a figure willing to surrender the nuclear and missile programs in exchange for regime survival.

Regional spillover has accelerated as Iran employs a "distribution of risk" strategy, launching retaliatory strikes against [neighbors including Azerbaijan, Qatar, and Bahrain](#) to coerce them into pressuring Washington for a ceasefire. Simultaneously, the prospect of a ground war has emerged via Kurdish proxies. Despite official denials, reports of [US contacts with a new six-party Kurdish coalition](#) and Trump's verbal support for a Kurdish ground incursion suggest a shift toward utilizing indigenous armed groups to seize territory in Western Iran, further threatening the country's territorial integrity.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Assassination of Ali Khamenei and Successor Disputes:** The death of the Supreme Leader has created a power vacuum that the regime is struggling to fill. The cancellation of his funeral highlights fears of [mass unrest or further precision strikes](#) on high-value targets during the ceremony. Disputes between hardline IRGC elements and the temporary leadership council are reportedly stalling the selection of a permanent successor, with names like Hassan Rouhani and Mojtaba Khamenei [facing significant internal and external opposition](#).

- **Systematic Degradation of Military Infrastructure:** US and Israeli forces have moved into a "paralysis phase," focusing on command-and-control nodes. A major milestone was the [destruction of the 12,000-seat hall at Azadi Stadium](#), which Israeli intelligence claimed was being used as a staging ground for regime forces. Additionally, US submarines successfully [sunk the Iranian destroyer Dena](#) in the Indian Ocean using torpedoes—the first such action against a hostile vessel since WWII.
- **Kurdish Proxy Mobilization:** A new "New Coalition of Kurdish Parties" has been formed, bringing together six major groups including Komala and the PDKI. While leadership claims they have [not yet crossed the border](#), President Trump has stated he [would support a ground attack](#) by these groups, raising the specter of a civil war or ethnic fragmentation in the western provinces.
- **Regional Retaliation against Neighbors:** Seeking to internationalize the cost of the war, Iran launched drone and missile attacks on [Azerbaijan's Nakhchivan airport](#), a school in a nearby village, and [energy infrastructure in Bahrain and Qatar](#). This has forced regional states to evacuate civilian areas around US diplomatic facilities and declare states of emergency.
- **Failure of US Legislative Restraints:** In Washington, Senate Democrats failed to pass a resolution [limiting Trump's war powers](#). The 53-47 vote effectively grants the administration a 60-day window to continue "Operation Epic Rage" without further congressional authorization, emboldening the White House to pursue maximalist objectives.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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**Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics** The regime has transitioned to a [temporary leadership council](#), but real power appears to have shifted to "those who pull the trigger," specifically the IRGC commanders managing the missile retaliation. Internal divisions are deep; while figures like Ali Larijani are rumored to be seeking channels for negotiation, [hardliners are reportedly prepared to fight](#) until the complete exhaustion of Iran's "strategic patience" and missile stockpiles.

**Energy Security** The war has caused an immediate crisis in global energy markets. Qatar has [suspended gas production](#) due to Iranian threats, while Iran has claimed responsibility for hitting a [tanker near Kuwait](#) and a Bahraini refinery. The IRGC has reiterated that in a state of war, it holds [sovereign control over the Strait of Hormuz](#), threatening a total blockade of maritime oil transit.

**National Security & Security Architecture** The US strategy involves "outsourcing" the ground component of the conflict. By considering the [arming of Kurdish and Baluchi groups](#), Washington aims to pin down remaining IRGC ground forces without risking US boots on the ground. However, this has triggered [intense domestic anxiety in Iran](#) regarding "Syrianization" and the potential for long-term ethnic conflict.

**State Capacity & Social Order** State capacity is buckling under the weight of a [120-hour internet blackout](#) and severe fuel shortages. While supermarkets and banks remain open, schools and government offices are closed indefinitely. The regime has resorted to [loudspeaker propaganda in city streets](#) to project an aura of control, even as

100,000 residents were reported to have fled Tehran in the first 48 hours of the war.

### **Cybersecurity & Information Sovereignty**

The total internet shutdown has created an "information darkness." The regime is utilizing [Chinese-provided surveillance technology](#) to monitor offline communications and has threatened citizens with a ["shoot-on-sight" order](#) for anyone caught filming or photographing damage to military or government installations.

## **LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP**

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Legislative activity centered on the US Congress's inability to restrain the executive branch and the Iranian regime's emergency delegation of constitutional powers to a non-elected body.

### **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **US War Powers Resolution (Iran):** A bipartisan proposal led by Senators Tim Kaine and Rand Paul intended to force a [withdrawal of US forces](#) if no formal war declaration was issued. The resolution failed to reach a floor vote due to GOP procedural blocks, ensuring [uninterrupted military funding](#) for the current operations.
- **Iranian Constitutional Amendment (Emergency):** The Expediency Council has reportedly [transferred the Supreme Leader's powers](#) regarding war, peace, and the appointment of military commanders to the Temporary Leadership Council, effectively bypassing the Assembly of Experts for the immediate future.

## **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **White House Press Briefing (Caroline Leavitt):** Confirmed that the US is [not seeking a long-term occupation](#) but aims to ensure Iran never achieves a nuclear weapon. She notably referred to the Persian Gulf as the ["Arabian Gulf,"](#) signaling a shift in diplomatic posture toward regional allies.
- **CENTCOM Operational Briefing (Admiral Brad Cooper):** Stated that the initial 24 hours of "Operation Epic Rage" involved [twice the scale of strikes](#) seen during the 2003 invasion of Iraq.

## **DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES**

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**The "Venezuela Model" and the End of Ideology** The US administration appears to be moving away from "Democracy Promotion" toward a pragmatic, authoritarian-lite transition. President Trump's reference to [Delcy Rodriguez and the Venezuela transition](#) suggests he is looking for a regime insider who can act as a "liquidator" of the Islamic Republic's revolutionary assets. This indicates a belief that the current [ideological framework of the regime](#)—rooted in Khamenei's anti-Western theology—cannot survive his death and that a "moderate" military or technocratic leader could be coerced into a settlement.

**The "Ring of Fire" Reverses** For decades, Iran projected power through regional proxies. Now, that strategy is being used against it. The US and Israel are [targeting Hezbollah positions in Beirut](#) simultaneously with strikes in Iran, preventing the proxy from providing meaningful relief. This has left Tehran isolated, forcing it to use its [own conventional missiles](#) to hit regional targets,

which in turn is destroying its remaining diplomatic goodwill with neighbors like Azerbaijan and Turkey.

**Psychological Fragmentation and Collective Trauma** The Iranian populace is experiencing a [profound state of collective trauma](#), characterized by a mix of "celebration and terror." While many are relieved at the death of Khamenei, the [constant sound of explosions](#) and the fear of a ground war have induced widespread panic. The regime's inability to even hold a funeral for its leader serves as a [potent symbol of state collapse](#), further eroding the "wall of fear" that has maintained social order for 47 years.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a definitive IRGC decision on succession or a formal military takeover. If the [hardline faction consolidated power](#), a massive "final" missile salvo against Israel and US bases is likely. Ground skirmishes between Kurdish groups and the 1st and 2nd Armies in Western Iran will likely escalate if US air support is provided to the [armed Kurdish coalition](#).

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The total collapse of the Iranian Rial and the exhaustion of food stockpiles will likely trigger a [humanitarian crisis](#), forcing a massive migration wave toward Turkey and Europe. If a "Venezuela-style" leader is not installed, the US may be forced to [broaden targets to include civilian-use infrastructure](#) (power grids, water) to force a surrender.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The likely outcome is a "failed state" or a fragmented federation. The destruction of the [regime's central bureaucracy](#) and the empowerment of ethnic armed groups suggest that any future Iranian state will be [militarily weak and internally](#)

[divided](#), effectively ending the "Iranian threat" to Israel but creating a permanent zone of regional instability.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- **Security:** NATO must prepare for a "Southern Front" as [missiles continue to hit member states like Turkey](#) and US bases in Mediterranean countries like Cyprus.
- **Diplomatic:** The UN and regional bodies must establish a "Succession Oversight" group to prevent a [nuclear custody crisis](#) if command-and-control over the 60% enriched uranium stockpiles is lost.
- **Humanitarian:** A coordinated refugee response is required for the [millions of anticipated IDPs](#) fleeing the destruction of major Iranian urban centers.

### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- **Supply Chains:** Maritime insurance rates for the Persian Gulf should be considered "prohibitive" for the foreseeable future; [alternate energy routes](#) (pipelines via Central Asia or Africa) must be accelerated.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Sanctions will likely transition from "targeting the regime" to "total embargoes" on all [transit through Iranian territory or airspace](#).
- **Investment Opportunity:** Post-conflict reconstruction in the Middle East will require [massive capital investment in energy infrastructure](#) in non-combatant states like Saudi Arabia and the UAE to compensate for the loss of Iranian and Qatari output.
