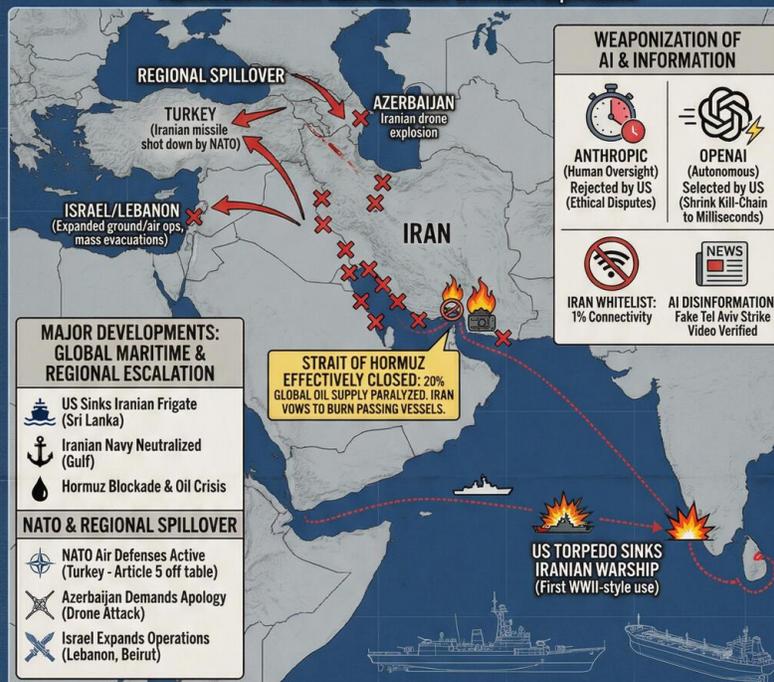

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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The conflict in the Middle East reached a critical inflection point on March 5, 2026, transitioning from targeted strikes into a broader regional war with global economic and maritime implications. The United States, under "Operation Epic Fury," has shifted toward a policy of total degradation of Iranian assets, evidenced by the [torpedoing of an Iranian warship](#) as far away as the coast of Sri Lanka. Simultaneously, the US administration has moved beyond military objectives toward explicit political intervention, with President Donald Trump stating his intent to [personally choose the next leader](#) of the Iranian people. This unilateralism is causing friction with traditional allies, notably Spain and the UK, as Washington leverages trade threats and "gut instincts" to drive its campaign.

Canada is attempting to maintain a "middle power" balance, with Prime Minister Mark

Carney backing the initial strikes while calling for a [return to diplomacy](#). However, Carney has refused to categorically rule out future military participation, noting that Canada will stand by its allies if the conflict spreads to NATO territory. Domestic Canadian governance is simultaneously grappling with the fallout of the war, including [rising fuel prices](#) and a mass repatriation effort for over 2,000 citizens. On the technological front, the war has become a testing ground for automated kill-chains, as the Pentagon shifts its AI reliance from Anthropic to OpenAI to [shorten target processing](#) to milliseconds.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Global Maritime Escalation and the Sinking of the Iranian Navy

- The US Navy utilized a torpedo to [sink an Iranian frigate](#) in international waters off Sri Lanka, the first such use of the weapon against an enemy ship since World War II.
- The US claims to have destroyed [more than 20 Iranian vessels](#), effectively neutralizing the regime's traditional naval presence in the Arabian Gulf and the Gulf of Oman.
- Iran has retaliated by effectively [closing the Strait of Hormuz](#), vowing to set fire to any vessel attempting passage, which has paralyzed 20% of the world's oil supply.

NATO Involvement and Regional Spillover

- NATO air defenses [shot down an Iranian missile](#) over Turkey for the first time, though the Secretary General emphasized that Article 5 remains off the table for now.
- Azerbaijan has demanded an apology from Tehran after [four Iranian drones](#) entered its airspace, causing an explosion near a domestic airport.

- Israel has expanded its ground and air operations in [southern Lebanon and Beirut](#), ordering mass evacuations as it targets Hezbollah command centers.

The Weaponization of Artificial Intelligence and Information

- US media reports indicate "Claude AI" was used during the opening strikes on Iran, though the Pentagon is [switching to OpenAI](#) following ethical disputes with Anthropic over human oversight in the "kill chain."
- The Iranian regime has implemented a "whitelist" internet blackout, reducing [connectivity to 1%](#) to suppress dissent and control the flow of strike information.
- Sophisticated AI-generated disinformation is circulating on social media, including a [fake video of missiles](#) hitting Tel Aviv that was erroneously verified by AI chatbots.

Canadian Domestic and Economic Fallout

- Gas prices in Canada have [risen by 10 cents](#) per liter since the escalation, with experts warning of a potential global recession if oil stays above \$100 per barrel.
- New federal rules capping Temporary Foreign Workers at 10% are causing [labor shortages in Quebec](#), threatening tens of millions in manufacturing orders.
- A rare [meteor fireball over BC](#) and Washington caused a sonic boom, initially sparking fears of war-related explosions among populated areas.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

AI & Technology Policy

- The US Secretary of War is removing Anthropic from future contracts because the firm demanded [human review for kills](#), opting instead for OpenAI's systems.
- Canadian Digital Affairs Minister Solomon has demanded that OpenAI establish a [Canadian safety office](#) to assess domestic threats after the company failed to flag the "Tumbler Ridge" shooters.

Energy Security

- Canada's Energy Minister noted that while Canada is a safe producer, it [cannot replace Gulf oil](#) today due to a lack of pipeline infrastructure to tidewater.
- President Trump has proposed providing [US military escorts](#) and financial insurance for tankers to break the blockade of the Strait of Hormuz.

Labor & Industry

- Quebec's hospitality and manufacturing sectors are "scrambling" as [two-year TFW permits expire](#), with the federal government refusing to renew them to force local hiring.
- In Ontario, hundreds of students [protested grant-to-loan changes](#) at Queen's Park, citing a "breaking point" for affordable education.

Succession & Stability

- The funeral for Ayatollah Ali Khamenei has been [postponed indefinitely](#) as the regime struggles to select a successor while under constant bombardment.

- President Trump has dismissed potential successor Jhamani's son as a ["lightweight"](#) and insisted on US oversight of the appointment.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative action today focused on curbing executive military authority in the US and controversial education funding shifts in Ontario. In the US, a bipartisan effort to reassert congressional control over the war in Iran met significant resistance from the executive-aligned majority. In Canada, provincial movements toward time-zone sovereignty and language enforcement continue to advance despite expert warnings.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **War Powers Resolution (US):** A bipartisan bill to require [congressional approval for future military actions](#) against Iran. It was blocked in the Senate (48-52) and faces a similar fate in the House.
- **Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) Framework:** New provincial rules [flipping the grant-to-loan ratio](#), resulting in higher student debt, which sparked mass protests and arrests in Toronto.
- **BC Permanent Daylight Saving Time:** BC has moved independently to [adopt permanent daylight time](#), despite waiting for Washington and Oregon to synchronize.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **White House Press Briefing:** Press Secretary Caroline Levit defended the "gut instinct" for the war and threatened [trade cuts against Spain](#) for refusing base access.

- **Prime Minister Carney Australian Address:** Carney advocated for [middle-power collaboration](#) on critical minerals and AI as the "old world order breaks down."

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Doctrine of "Gut Instinct" Diplomacy

A notable shift has occurred in the US justification for war. While early strikes were linked to specific nuclear facility developments, the administration is now citing ["feelings based on fact"](#) that Iran was planning to strike US assets. This subjective threshold for kinetic action, combined with threats of trade retaliation against NATO allies like Spain, suggests a breakdown in traditional evidentiary diplomacy. The US is moving toward a "maximum pressure" model that ignores [principles of sovereignty](#) in favor of rapid, unilateral regime decapitation.

Technological Dehumanization of the Kill Chain

The transition of US military AI contracts from Anthropic to OpenAI represents a strategic pivot toward [uninterrupted automation](#). By removing the requirement for human review of every target, the military can "shrink the kill chain to milliseconds." This development, coupled with the first combat use of [torpedoes in 80 years](#), indicates a return to high-intensity, peer-state warfare where speed is valued over ethical deliberation. Simultaneously, the rise of AI-generated "war porn" on social media platforms is complicating public perception of the conflict's reality.

Canadian Fragility in the New World Order

Canada is facing a "scissors crisis" of foreign and domestic pressures. Externally, the Carney government is being [criticized for incoherence](#) by the opposition for simultaneously supporting US strikes while calling for a ceasefire. Internally, the government's attempt to protect the local labor market via TFW caps is [strangling its own industry](#) during an economic shock. The reliance on "middle power" trust, as Carney pitched in Australia, appears increasingly fragile as the US and Iran bypass international institutions entirely.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect extreme volatility in energy markets as US military escorts attempt to [break the Hormuz blockade](#); any direct engagement between US and Iranian "fast boats" could trigger a \$150+ oil price spike.
- Mass repatriation logistics will likely fail in Lebanon as [Israel begins a ground incursion](#), forcing Canadians to attempt dangerous road exits to Syria or Jordan.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- Internal Iranian fractures may emerge if the [revolutionary guard factions](#) begin back-channeling with the US to preserve their economic interests amidst regime collapse.
- The Canadian government will face a "recession alert" as [fuel-driven inflation](#) hits the logistics and food supply chains.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- A permanent shift in global shipping routes may occur if the Persian Gulf remains a ["high risk" zone](#), benefiting North American and Russian energy exporters but devastating Asian manufacturing hubs.
- The normalization of AI-directed warfare will lead to a new arms race in "counter-AI" and [cyber-resilient infrastructure](#) across NATO.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** NATO members must prepare for the possibility of [Turkey invoking Article 4 or 5](#) if Iranian missiles continue to land in its southern provinces.
- **Regime Succession:** Diplomats should prioritize identifying [secular-democratic factions](#) in Iran before the US-led "Board of Peace" model, currently being criticized in Gaza, is imposed on Tehran.
- **Digital Sovereignty:** Allies must align on AI "kill chain" ethics to prevent a [fragmentation of the alliance](#) where some members use fully autonomous systems and others do not.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Diversification:** Companies relying on maritime trade through the Strait of Hormuz must secure [alternative insurance backstops](#) as commercial firms exit the region.
- **Labor Risk:** Canadian manufacturers must automate or relocate as the [TFW cap at 10%](#) is unlikely to be reversed, despite orders being unfulfilled.

- **Energy Strategy:** Investors should pivot toward [North American pipeline infrastructure](#) projects, as Canada looks to leverage the Gulf's instability to finalize tidewater access.
