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

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 5, 2026, marks a critical juncture where the intensifying international armed conflict in the Middle East, dubbed "Operation Epic Fury," has begun to exert significant pressure on global energy markets and African trade routes. As the United States and Israel escalate strikes against the Iranian regime—allegedly targeting the leadership directly—global oil prices have surged, with [Brent crude rising over 3%](#) to exceed \$83 per barrel. This geopolitical volatility is compounded by claims of strikes on diplomatic and intelligence assets in the Gulf, forcing regional actors like the UAE to assert neutrality while simultaneously intercepting Iranian projectiles. The conflict is no longer a localized skirmish but an [international armed conflict](#) with immediate implications for African supply chains and inflation projections.

Domestically, the Tinubu administration is attempting a dual-track strategy of aggressive fiscal reform and political consolidation. The appointment of tax expert [Taiwo Oyedele as Minister of State for Finance](#) signals a commitment to formalizing Nigeria's informal economy and expanding the tax base. However, this reformist agenda is shadowed by a staggering corruption investigation as the Senate [summons former NNPC leadership](#) over an alleged 210 trillion naira in unaccounted funds. Simultaneously, the administration is backtracking on certain "cashless" policies at airports due to severe implementation failures that caused widespread gridlock and public outcry, illustrating the friction between technocratic ambition and state capacity.

Politically, the landscape is fracturing as the 2027 general elections loom. The [defection of Senator Seriake Dickson](#) from the PDP to the newly formed Nigerian Democratic Congress (NDC) highlights the ongoing collapse of traditional opposition structures. In the North, the Kano State House of Assembly has [initiated impeachment proceedings](#) against the Deputy Governor over alleged fund diversion, while former Kaduna Governor Nasir El-Rufai faces intensifying legal and investigative scrutiny. These developments suggest a high-stakes realignment of elite interests as the ruling APC consolidates power through consensus congresses across multiple states.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### The Middle East Conflict: Operation Epic Fury

- The conflict has entered a "new stage" intended to [weaken the Iranian leadership](#) and degrade its military strength through intensified drone and air strikes.
- The UK has deployed [four fighter jets to Qatar](#) to strengthen defensive operations and has commenced repatriation flights for citizens.
- Reports indicate a devastating strike on a [primary school in Minab](#), Iran, resulting in numerous child casualties and highlighting the humanitarian toll on civilians.
- Iranian retaliatory strikes have allegedly hit the [U.S. consulate in Dubai](#) and a CIA station in Saudi Arabia, according to unconfirmed claims from regional actors.

### NNPCL \$210 Trillion Naira Audit Scandal

- The Senate Public Accounts Committee has summoned former GCEO [Mele Kyari and other top officials](#) to explain the disappearance of 210 trillion naira between 2017 and 2023.
- The committee has threatened [warrants of arrest](#) if the former officials fail to appear and account for the audit findings.

### Tinubu Cabinet Reshuffle and Tax Reform

- President Tinubu has nominated [Taiwo Oyedele as Minister of State for Finance](#), transitioning him from his role as the head of the tax reform committee.

- The government has officially [formalized the presumptive tax framework](#) for the informal sector, targeting market traders, artisans, and POS agents to increase revenue.
- A significant [backtrack on cashless airport payments](#) was ordered by the President, returning to a hybrid system after the initial rollout caused chaos.

### Regional Security and Communal Conflict

- The aftermath of the Amasiri-Oso Edda communal clash has seen allegations of [systemic genocide and military misconduct](#), with infants reportedly dying due to restricted hospital access.
- In Kebbi State, gunmen [attacked a police border checkpoint](#), killing two officers and burning their facility in a growing trend of border insecurity.
- The eight-member [implementation committee on state police](#) has been inaugurated with a mandate to deliver a framework within four weeks.

### Environmental and Industrial Disasters

- In the DRC, a massive [landslide at a mining site](#) in Rubaya has killed more than 200 people, including 70 children.
- The site is reportedly [controlled by the M23 rebel group](#), complicating rescue and aid efforts in the conflict-torn North Kivu province.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Corruption & Governance

- The [sanctioning of 17 lawyers](#) by the Body of Benchers for professional misconduct and the EFCC's prosecution of 100+ senior lawyers for fraud indicates a deep rot in the legal profession.
- The Kano State Deputy Governor is [facing impeachment for alleged diversion](#) of local government funds, a move that critics suggest is politically motivated.

### Economic Security & Financial Resilience

- The CBN has successfully [boosted foreign reserves with refined gold](#), bringing total holdings to \$3.5 billion to diversify away from currency volatility.
- Business confidence in Nigeria hit a [record high of 117.2 points](#) in February, despite the external shocks from the Middle East war.

### Energy Security

- President Tinubu has proposed the establishment of a [Grid Asset Management Company](#) to fix the persistent transmission failures in the power sector.
- Escalating Middle East tensions have forced [Iraq to cut output](#) by 1.5 million barrels a day due to the lack of safe export routes.

### Rule of Law & Civil Liberties

- The discharge and acquittal of [suspended DCP Abba Kyari](#) in a non-declaration of assets case has sparked debate about the strength of prosecution in high-profile corruption trials.

- A heated debate continues over [Sharia Law in the Nigerian Constitution](#), with legal experts arguing its presence does not violate the secular status of the federation.

### Critical Infrastructure

- The Federal Executive Council has granted [approval for the demolition and reconstruction](#) of the Carter Bridge in Lagos with a budget of 5.6 billion naira.
- Idle rail corridors have [suffered significant vandalism](#), leading to 189 train derailments by the end of 2025 due to neglected security.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity today focused on constitutional amendments, the formalization of tax regimes, and the designation of the Central Bank as the primary oversight body for the burgeoning Fintech sector. The National Assembly is also grappling with the Special Seats for Women Bill, which has gained significant institutional momentum.

- **Electoral Act 2026 (Amended):** Continues to face public protests and [constitutional storms](#) regarding transmission of results and the abolition of indirect primaries.

- **Kano House Plenary:** Formal [presentation of the impeachment notice](#) against Deputy Governor Abdul Salam.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Fragmentation of the Political Opposition

The Nigerian opposition is in a state of terminal decline or forced metamorphosis. The [launch of the Nigerian Democratic Congress \(NDC\)](#) by Seriake Dickson is a direct indictment of the PDP's "intensive care unit" status. High-profile figures like Shehu Sani are questioning the [credibility of current opposition actors](#), suggesting that without a coherent alternative, the nation risks sliding into a one-party state. This fragmentation allows the ruling APC to consolidate power through "consensus" arrangements, as seen in [Kogi and Delta](#), effectively neutralizing dissent before the 2027 cycle.

### The High Cost of "Empathy-Driven" Policy Reversal

The Tinubu administration is learning the limits of rapid digitalization. The suspension of the [cashless system at federal airports](#) is a tactical retreat necessitated by poor infrastructure and a lack of "customer journey" mapping. While framed as empathy for suffering Nigerians, it reveals a pattern of

[policy implementation without adequate testing](#). This trend of "reform-then-revert" risks eroding public trust and suggests that state capacity is struggling to keep pace with executive ambition.

### Diaspora as a Strategic Economic Engine

A new narrative is emerging that positions the Nigerian diaspora not just as a source of remittances, but as a critical [driver of cross-border trade](#) and public leadership. The success of Nigerians in [Canadian municipal governance](#) and the British film industry is being leveraged by Nidcom to attract specialist expertise back to the domestic healthcare and tech sectors. This "diaspora network" is increasingly viewed as a tool for national transformation that operates independently of traditional state structures.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect [further spikes in petrol prices](#) as the Middle East conflict continues to disrupt supply, potentially triggering fresh domestic protests.
- The Kano impeachment process [will likely lead to civil unrest](#) if supporters of the Deputy Governor perceive the move as a purely political purge.
- The [summons of NNPC's former leadership](#) could lead to significant legal fireworks and potentially expose further tiers of institutional corruption.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The [launch of the National Single Window](#) on March 27 will be a litmus test for Nigeria's ability to streamline trade and reduce port congestion.

- Implementation of the [presumptive tax regime](#) will cause friction with informal sector operators, requiring extensive public advocacy to avoid mass non-compliance.
- State police committees [will face constitutional hurdles](#) as they attempt to define the limits of governor-controlled security forces.

### Long Term (1-5 Years)

- Structural shifts in global trade routes [away from the Red Sea](#) will permanently increase logistical costs for African exporters, necessitating investment in the Atlantic-facing maritime infrastructure.
- The emergence of parties like the [NDC](#) could lead to a three-way or four-way split in 2027, making a run-off election a realistic possibility for the first time in Nigeria's history.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Security Convergence:** Western allies should monitor the [recruitment of Africans into the Russia-Ukraine war](#), which indicates a vulnerability in domestic social contracts that foreign adversaries are exploiting.
- **Energy Diplomacy:** There is an urgent need to [negotiate Middle East de-escalation](#) to prevent a global environmental catastrophe if nuclear facilities in Iran or Israel are targeted.
- **Trade Routes:** Exporters must [recalibrate for the Cape of Good Hope route](#) as the Red Sea remains compromised by the "Axis of Resistance."

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Regulatory Risk:** Investors in Fintech should prepare for [stricter CBN oversight](#) and compliance requirements as the government moves to "clean up" the sector.
- **Infrastructure Opportunity:** The [Carter Bridge reconstruction](#) and the proposed Grid Asset Management Company offer opportunities for firms in the construction and energy sectors, provided they can navigate the "unaccounted funds" environment.
- **Succession Planning:** As noted by Meristem, family-owned SMEs [must prioritize succession structures](#) to survive the current economic volatility and AI-driven industrial shifts.
