

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 5, 2026, marks a significant inflection point in global security as the conflict in the Middle East expands into a regional war with direct implications for European and Asian stability. The reported transition of power in Iran to **Mojtaba Khamenei**, son of the Supreme Leader, occurs amidst devastating [Israeli and American airstrikes](#) targeting Tehran's nuclear infrastructure. In response, Iran has initiated **retaliatory strikes** against U.S. allies in the Persian Gulf, including [attacks on Qatar and the UAE](#), while threatening to completely close the Strait of Hormuz to oil traffic. ## The Russia-Ukraine War: Strategic Shifts and Stalemate

- A major POW exchange involving [500 prisoners from each side](#) was conducted via Geneva-brokered negotiations, indicating that limited diplomatic channels remain open despite escalating rhetoric.
- President Zelensky has confirmed that [peace negotiations are currently paused](#) due to the shifting global focus toward the Iranian theater.

## Central Asian Social and Environmental Crisis

- Severe winter weather ("Dzhut") in Kazakhstan has led to [mass mortality of livestock](#), threatening food security and the livelihoods of rural populations.
