





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VENEZUELA LEVERAGES GLOBAL ENERGY INSTABILITY AND A U.S.-LED WAR IN IRAN TO ACCELERATE DOMESTIC RE-LEGITIMIZATION AND ECONOMIC REOPENING.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 5, 2026, marks a pivotal shift in Venezuelan statecraft, defined by the "New Political Moment" wherein the acting administration of Delcy Rodríguez is aggressively pivoting toward pragmatic cooperation with the United States. This rapprochement is catalyzed by the catastrophic outbreak of war in the Middle East following the death of Iranian Leader Ali Khamenei. As the U.S. and Israel pursue [total air control](#) over Iran, the resulting threat to the Strait of Hormuz—which carries [20% of global oil](#)—has forced Washington to re-evaluate Venezuela as a critical, stable energy alternative. The high-level visit of U.S. Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum to Caracas to discuss [mining and energy](#) investments signals a de facto recognition of the current administration's control, despite the continued imprisonment of Nicolás Maduro in the United States.

Domestically, the government is attempting to synchronize this economic reopening with a narrative of national reconciliation and administrative modernization. The implementation of the [Amnesty Law](#), which has seen over 7,000 requests for liberation, is being framed as a "healing of wounds" necessary to court foreign capital. Simultaneously, the National Assembly is debating a [law for administrative celerity](#) to dismantle the "poisonous" bureaucracy that hinders investment. However, this transition is under pressure from a burgeoning public health crisis, specifically a [Yellow Fever outbreak](#) that has already claimed lives and triggered a regional vaccination alert, and a persistent failure of basic infrastructure, notably the [electricity crisis in Zulia](#).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **High-Level U.S.-Venezuela Energy and Mining Summit:** U.S. Secretary of the Interior Doug Burgum led a delegation of [two dozen U.S. companies](#) to Caracas, focusing on mining licenses and hydrocarbon production. The administration is proposing an [expansion of the 1999 Mining Law](#) to mirror the successful private-participation models of the new Hydrocarbons Law.
- **The Shell and ExxonMobil Pivots:** Acting President Delcy Rodríguez presided over the signing of [agreements with Shell](#) for gas and oil production in the Karito-Piritital field. Simultaneously, ExxonMobil has signaled a [readiness to return](#) to Venezuela, pending stable investment conditions, a stark reversal from previous years of litigation.

- **Global Impact of the U.S.-Iran War:** Conflict in the Middle East has entered a "total war" phase, with the U.S. and Israel targeting [Iranian command centers](#). This has pushed global oil prices toward \$80, providing Venezuela with [extraordinary revenue opportunities](#) as a secure, non-combatant supplier.
- **Domestic Legislative Overhaul:** The National Assembly is moving to "nationalize" politics through the [simplification of bureaucracy](#) and a push for [alternability in power](#). Key leaders like Jorge Rodríguez are now publicly framing permanent stay in power as an error.
- **Public Health Emergency:** A confirmed [Yellow Fever death](#) in Lara state has exposed systemic weaknesses in vaccine coverage, which currently stands at [only 56% nationwide](#), far below the 90% required for herd immunity.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Geopolitical Power Dynamics The war in Iran has redefined Venezuela's role in the global energy security architecture. While the U.S. maintains a [rhetorical stance](#) of considering Venezuela an "unusual threat," the physical presence of high-level officials and the authorization for [American Airlines to resume flights](#) indicate a strategic prioritization of oil flow over regime change. Venezuela is being repositioned as a ["safe haven" hub](#) for energy investment in the Western Hemisphere.

Biosurveillance & Public Health The state's capacity is being tested by the [Yellow Fever and Measles](#) alerts. The Ministry of Health has prioritized 22 parishes across four states (Lara, Portuguesa, Barinas, Aragua) for emergency vaccination. Analysts point out

that the resurgence of these [preventable diseases](#) is a direct indicator of a deficient national vaccination system over the preceding year.

Economic Security & Investment Climate

The Caracas Stock Exchange reports a massive [1600% increase](#) in its index, reflecting a speculative but intense interest in local assets. The banking sector remains [98% digital](#), though the lack of a formal "dollarization" policy and high reserve requirements continue to stifle credit. Private sector leaders are calling for [free convertibility](#) of currency to manage the "multi-currency" reality of the streets.

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics The "New Moment" is underpinned by the [emergence of a "third polo"](#) or bridge leadership. Figures like Enrique Márquez are being positioned as [credible interlocutors](#) for both the government and the international community, potentially providing a path toward [electoral normalization](#) that bypasses the most radical factions of the opposition.

Critical Minerals & Supply Chains The U.S. interest in Venezuela has expanded beyond oil to [critical minerals](#). The proposed mining law aims to invite U.S. expertise to develop minerals that are [essential for new technologies](#), potentially decoupling Venezuela from exclusive reliance on Chinese or Russian mining partnerships.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The National Assembly is currently focused on creating a legislative framework that supports the economic "opening" while attempting to resolve the legal fallout of the post-2024 political crisis.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Organic Law for the Acceleration and Optimization of Administrative Procedures:** A 13-article project designed to [eliminate bureaucratic delays](#), mandate digital transformation, and establish "ventanillas únicas" (single windows) for investors. It grants the Presidency broad powers to [suspend or simplify](#) requirements to favor celerity.
- **Expansion of the Mining Law of 1999:** A proposed reform to integrate [modern investment models](#) and technology into the mineral sector, allowing for greater private equity participation.
- **Implementation of the Amnesty Law for Democratic Coexistence:** Already in effect, this law is being used to [re-incorporate exiled politicians](#) and release thousands of detainees as a prerequisite for international diplomatic progress.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **U.S.-Venezuela Energy Roundtable:** Secretary Doug Burgum and Acting President Delcy Rodríguez discussed [new business models](#) and mining licenses at Miraflores.
- **National Assembly Plenary Session (March 5):** Discussion on [Article 6](#) of the Celerity Law and the naming of delegates to international parliamentary forums.
- **Commission for Peace and Democratic Coexistence:** Meeting between Ernesto Villegas and Attorney General Larry Devoe to [accelerate amnesty requests](#) and re-institutionalization.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

Venezuela's rhetoric has shifted from anti-imperialism to being a ["safe haven"](#) for Western energy interests, effectively trading ideological solidarity with Tehran for economic survival and [re-integration with the U.S. dollar](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a massive [Yellow Fever vaccination campaign](#) to be used

as a vehicle for demonstrating state presence. High-profile political figures may return from exile under the [amnesty framework](#) to participate in the "New Moment" dialogue. Global oil volatility will likely keep Venezuelan baskets [above \\$70](#), easing the domestic liquidity crisis.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The National Assembly will likely finalize the [Celerity Law](#), significantly reducing the time for mineral and oil contract approvals. American Airlines will likely [re-establish direct routes](#) to Caracas and Maracaibo, facilitating the return of U.S. technical teams. Local stock and real estate prices may see a [speculative boom](#) as "normalization" takes hold.

Long Term (1-5 Years): A structural shift toward a [state-capitalist model](#) is probable, where the government maintains political control but cedes significant operational management of energy and mining to Western multinationals. The political landscape may move toward a [managed democracy](#) with periodic alternability between moderate factions, permanently marginalizing the radical "zero-sum" politics of the 2010s.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Leverage Energy Dependence:** The U.S. should use the current window of [energy desperation](#) to codify the administrative and legal reforms currently being debated in Caracas, ensuring they are not easily reversible.

- **Monitor the Health Crisis:** The [Yellow Fever death](#) and Measles alert suggest a collapse in public health biosurveillance that could easily cross borders; international aid should focus on vaccine distribution.
- **Clarify Recognition Status:** The de facto recognition of the [Rodríguez administration](#) via the Burgum visit needs a clear diplomatic framework to avoid legal conflicts over future contracts signed by the "Acting Presidency."

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **First-Mover Advantage in Mining:** The proposed [Mining Law expansion](#) represents a rare opening in a sector long dominated by state opacity. Early due diligence is recommended for critical minerals.
- **Operational Risks Remain:** Despite the "New Moment," infrastructure like [water \(Parque Caiza\)](#) and [electricity \(Zulia\)](#) remains in a state of decay; investors must plan for self-contained power and water solutions.
- **Legal and Compliance Nuances:** The [OFAC "case-by-case" evaluation](#) policy for licenses means that despite the general thaw, specific prohibitions regarding [Russian and Chinese entities](#) remain a high-stakes compliance minefield.
