





DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 5, 2026, marked a seismic shift in global security as a massive U.S.-Israeli military operation, "Epic Fury," targeted the heart of the Iranian regime, resulting in the reported death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei. This decapitation strike has triggered a regional conflagration, with Iran launching retaliatory missile and drone swarms against Israel, U.S. bases in Kuwait and Iraq, and energy infrastructure in the Gulf. The immediate closure of the Strait of Hormuz has sent Brent crude oil prices surging past \$80, sparking fears of a global inflationary spiral and energy shortages. In the Balkans, this crisis has forced emergency evacuations of hundreds of citizens from Dubai, Israel, and Iran, while simultaneously heightening domestic security postures against potential spillover effects and extremist threats.

Domestically, Bosnia and Herzegovina (BiH) faces a convergence of political and social

crises. The Sarajevo Cantonal Government is on the brink of dissolution following the resignation of Prime Minister Nihad Uk, amidst intensifying youth-led protests over public safety and systemic corruption. Nationally, the "European path" remains stalled as the ruling coalition struggles to pass critical judicial reforms and anti-money laundering laws, risking a return to the "Grey List" of non-compliant jurisdictions. These geopolitical and internal pressures are further exacerbated by rising labor tensions, as judicial workers and industrial unions threaten strikes over stagnant wages and proposed reductions in social benefits, creating a volatile environment for governance and stability.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Regional War in the Middle East and Iranian Leadership Collapse

- U.S. and Israeli forces launched "Operation Epic Fury," a wide-scale aerial campaign that reportedly targeted and [killed Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei](#) and other high-ranking Iranian officials.
- Iran responded with a "19th wave" of missile and drone attacks [targeting Israel and U.S. assets](#), with explosions reported in Tel Aviv, Bahrain, Qatar, and near the Erbil airport.
- Reports emerged of a potential [Kurdish ground offensive](#) into Iranian territory, supported by U.S. air cover, as the Iranian Revolutionary Guard effectively blocked the Strait of Hormuz to Western shipping.
- The U.S. Senate narrowly [upheld Trump's war powers](#), defeating a resolution that would have required Congressional approval for continued hostilities against Iran.

Sarajevo Cantonal Government Crisis and Civil Unrest

- The Assembly of Sarajevo Canton is set to vote on the [resignation of PM Nihad Uk](#) and the dissolution of the current government cabinet.
- Youth-led protests continue under the banner "Hoće li ta promjena," demanding [accountability for public transport safety](#) following a fatal tram accident and broader systemic reforms.
- Environmental groups are sounding alarms over a "temporary" decision to [reduce water protection zones](#) in Sarajevo Field by three times, alleging favoritism toward the construction lobby.

Stalled Judicial Reforms and EU Integration Obstacles

- Justice Minister Davor Bunoza emphasized the urgency of [adopting 12 laws](#) in the House of Peoples, including the Law on the High Judicial and Prosecutorial Council (VSTV) and the Law on Courts, to maintain the country's EU momentum.
- BiH faces a deadline in May to pass laws on [asset forfeiture and anti-terrorism financing](#) to avoid being placed on the Manival "Grey List."

Regional Energy Warfare and Monopolistic Disputes

- Hungarian Moll and Slovak Sloznaft have filed a [formal complaint with the EU](#) against Croatia's JANAf, alleging abuse of a monopolistic position and unfair transit pricing for non-Russian oil.

- Croatia's Minister of Economy dismissed the claims, asserting that [JANAf has sufficient capacity](#) and that the dispute is a political maneuver to justify continued use of discounted Russian oil.

Labor Tensions and Social Welfare Debates

- Judicial administration employees in the Federation of BiH (FBiH) are [threatening a general strike](#) over low wages and the lack of a unified law on salaries in judicial institutions.
- A proposal by the business community to [reduce paid sick leave](#) from 42 to 15 days is being met with fierce resistance from unions, who call it socially irresponsible.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has created an immediate [spike in global oil](#) and gas prices. Balkan states are scrambling to secure reserves; the FBiH government claims it can [release oil reserves](#) to stabilize the market, while the Republika Srpska (RS) is considering limiting fuel purchases per customer to prevent panic buying.

National Security & Terrorism Security agencies in BiH have [raised threat levels](#) to a higher tier due to the Middle East escalation. This includes increased surveillance of potentially vulnerable facilities and diplomatic missions. In RS, police have introduced [enhanced security measures](#) to prevent potential terrorist incidents, citing the risk of "spillover" from the regional conflict.

Rule of Law The integrity of the judiciary remains a central governance challenge. The [check on assets](#) for judges and their families,

mandated by the 2023 VSTV law amendments, is the first step in a broader reform that remains contested by some in the legal profession who view the requirements as too stringent compared to European standards.

Critical Infrastructure The safety of Sarajevo's public transport has become a focal point of civil unrest. Protesters are demanding a [comprehensive audit of GRAS](#) (public transport operator) and transparent reporting on vehicle safety following revelations that [video surveillance was non-functional](#) during a fatal accident.

Succession & Stability In Iran, the death of the Supreme Leader has created a power vacuum. While the constitution provides for a [leadership council to oversee](#) the transition, the chaos of "Operation Epic Fury" has made the selection process nearly impossible, raising the specter of total regime collapse or internal factional warfare.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity today focused heavily on crisis management and judicial alignment required for international standing. Policy debates ranged from judicial salary standardization to emergency school conduct regulations in Croatia.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Law on the High Judicial and Prosecutorial Council (VSTV):** A key EU requirement currently [waiting in the House of Peoples](#); it aims to standardize judicial appointments and asset transparency.
- **Law on Asset Forfeiture and Anti-Terrorism Financing:** Urgent legislation needed by May to [avoid the Manival "Grey List"](#).

- **FBiH Law on Salaries in Judicial Institutions:** Proposed by unions to [address wage disparities](#) and prevent a general strike in the judiciary.
- **Sick Leave Amendments (FBiH):** A proposal to [reduce employer-funded sick leave](#) from 42 to 15 days; currently stalled by union opposition.
- **Croatian School Conduct Code:** New regulations [banning mobile phone use](#) in primary schools and increasing sanctions for drugs and alcohol.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **FBiH Council of Ministers Session:** Approved 800,000 KM for [charter flights to evacuate](#) citizens from the Middle East.
- **Sarajevo Security Commission:** Issued seven conclusions [urging the Prosecutor's Office](#) to update the public on the tram accident investigation.
- **Trump Administration Address:** Former VP Mike Pence praised the ["guts" of the President](#) in launching the Iran strike, framing it as the end of a 47-year war.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of "Strategic Patience" and the Return of Decapitation Strikes The launch of "Operation Epic Fury" represents the definitive end of the doctrine of strategic patience toward Iran. The U.S. and Israel have shifted to a high-risk, high-reward strategy of direct decapitation, betting that the [regime's complex structural layers](#) will fail without the central figure of the Supreme Leader. This trend toward "Maximum Pressure 2.0" suggests a new era where regional sovereignty is secondary to the removal of perceived existential threats.

The "Grey List" Loom and the Failure of Compromise BiH's governance is characterized by a "near miss" syndrome. While Minister Bunoza notes the country is ["so close" to continuing](#) its EU path, the persistent failure to pass laws against money laundering and terrorism financing indicates that internal political consensus remains elusive. The looming "Grey List" is a symptom of a deeper inability of the ruling coalition to prioritize national survival over localized ethnic or partisan interests.

Weaponization of Transit and Energy Infrastructure The JANAF-Moll dispute and the Hormuz blockade reflect a broader global trend where transit routes are as critical as the resources they carry. The Balkan energy market is becoming a proxy [battleground between EU solidarity](#) (moving away from Russian oil) and the pragmatic economic interests of individual states (securing cheaper, sanctioned energy). This friction threatens the cohesion of the Adriatic-Central European energy corridor.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect immediate inflationary spikes in the Balkans. Fuel prices at the [pumps will rise](#) within 3-5 days as distributors pass on global costs. Civil unrest in Sarajevo will likely peak around the Assembly vote, potentially forcing a broader reconfiguration of the "Trojka" coalition if a new government is not quickly named. High security alerts will remain in place as regional powers monitor for Iranian "sleeper cell" activities or retaliatory strikes against Western targets in Europe.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The power vacuum in Iran may lead to a civil war or a radical military junta taking control, which

could [accelerate their nuclear development](#) as a survival mechanism. In BiH, the failure to pass the VSTV and anti-terror laws by May will lead to a [Manival Grey Listing](#), damaging the country's investment climate and complicating international banking transactions. FBiH labor unions will likely proceed with strikes if the sick leave amendments are forced through, further stalling industrial output.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The death of Khamenei could lead to a permanent restructuring of the Middle East, potentially resulting in a "pro-Western" or fragmented Iran, which would shift the [global energy balance](#) back toward the U.S. and its allies. For BiH, the current social unrest signals the rise of a new generation (the "post-war children") who are less motivated by ethnic nationalism and more by [systemic functionality and justice](#), potentially leading to a fundamental shift in the country's political landscape in the 2026-2030 period.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The EU must prepare for a massive [economic and security shock](#) originating from the Hormuz blockade, necessitating a rapid acceleration of alternative energy routes (like the Southern Interconnection in BiH).
- Western diplomats should focus on stabilizing the BiH coalition to ensure [anti-money laundering laws](#) are passed, as a "Grey Listed" BiH would become a primary conduit for illicit financing in a chaotic global environment.

- International monitoring of the Kurdish-Iranian border is vital to prevent a [mass refugee crisis](#) that could overwhelm regional states and eventually impact European borders.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Transportation and logistics firms should expect [severe border delays](#) and increased costs due to energy spikes and potential security-related border closures.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Investors in BiH must hedge against [banking disruptions](#) if the country fails its Manival assessment, potentially requiring the movement of capital to more stable jurisdictions.
- **Energy Transition:** There is a massive [investment opportunity](#) in local renewable and alternative energy projects (like the proposed wind/solar expansions) as Balkan states seek to reduce dependency on volatile global oil markets.
