

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On March 5, 2026, the sixth day of "Operation Epic Fury," the conflict between the United States, Israel, and the Islamic Republic of Iran transitioned from a targeted campaign into a systemic regional war. The assassination of Iran's Supreme Leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, alongside members of his family, has fundamentally shifted the conflict into what regional observers characterize as a "holy war," unifying previously disparate factions within the Shia world. The theater of operations has expanded significantly, with an IDF ground invasion of Southern Lebanon, naval strikes in the Indian Ocean, and widespread civil unrest in Pakistan. The reported death of over 160 schoolgirls in an Iranian elementary school strike has become a central point of international condemnation and a catalyst for escalating anti-Western sentiment across the Global South.

Strategically, the day was marked by the closure of the Strait of Hormuz and a total cessation of Qatari LNG exports, precipitating an energy crisis in Europe and a realignment of energy security priorities at the United Nations. While the United States administration continues to frame the operation as a necessary move for regime change and the prevention of nuclear enrichment, critics and international adversaries argue the war is a strategic blunder that has exhausted US military resources and shattered years of diplomatic rapprochement between Saudi Arabia and Iran. Domestically, the US faces growing opposition, with nearly 70-80% of the public reportedly against the war, and violent suppression of anti-war protesters in the halls of Congress signaling deepening social fissures.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Assassination of Iran's Supreme Leader and Institutional Decapitation**
 - The US-Israeli strikes successfully assassinated Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, but the [resultant martyrdom narrative](#) has reportedly strengthened the Islamic Republic's domestic resolve.
 - The Iranian government has [postponed the funeral](#) due to security concerns and the anticipation of massive crowds, while continuous strikes hit Tehran's [intelligence and police headquarters](#).

• **Expansion of Ground and Naval Fronts**

- The IDF has deployed over [100,000 reservists](#) for a ground invasion of Lebanon, aiming to create a "sterile zone" south of the Litani River, though Lebanese sources report [fierce resistance](#) in border villages.
- A US submarine torpedoed an Iranian frigate, the **Denna**, near Sri Lanka, killing [80 sailors](#) in a move that expands the war's geography 2,000 miles from the Persian Gulf.
- Iran has declared total control over the [Strait of Hormuz](#), warning that any vessel violating their protocols will be seized or sunk.

• **Global Civil Unrest and Diplomatic Backlash**

- In Pakistan, security forces and US Marines allegedly [fired on protesters](#) at the US consulate in Karachi, resulting in an estimated 20-30 deaths and over 120 injuries.
- The Spanish government has [refused to allow](#) the US to use its airbases, with Prime Minister Sanchez citing a firm "no to the war" stance.
- Russia and China have signaled increased support for Iran, with Russia calling the US-Israeli actions a [violation of human morality](#) and international law.

• **Critical Infrastructure and Energy Disruptions**

- Qatar has [halted LNG production](#) for at least one month following strikes, threatening Europe's primary alternative to Russian gas.
- US Patriot and THAAD missile defense systems are reportedly being [outmaneuvered by Iranian missiles](#) utilizing sophisticated satellite guidance, allegedly provided by external partners like China.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Critical Minerals The UN Security Council convened a high-level session, led by the US Energy Secretary, to discuss [global resource stability](#). The US emphasized the need for more energy to lift the "global majority" out of poverty, while Russia and China criticized the [colonial logic](#) of the G7. The DRC representative highlighted how the [M23 rebel group](#) funds its expansion through illegal mining of coltan, underscoring the link between resource extraction and regional conflict.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics The conflict has effectively collapsed the [2023 China-brokered rapprochement](#) between Saudi Arabia and Iran. While Israel views this as a restoration of a unified front against Tehran, regional analysts argue it has [trapped the US](#) in a war of attrition. Russia is positioning itself as the [only true winner](#) of the energy crisis, while the Global South increasingly views the conflict as a "resource grab."

Technology Policy and Cybersecurity The efficacy of Iranian drones and missiles has sparked a debate on the obsolescence of current US defense architecture. Reports suggest that [cheap Iranian drones](#) are forcing

the US to expend millions in interceptor missiles, creating a cost-prohibitive defense scenario. Furthermore, the use of [Chinese satellite guidance](#) systems marks a new era in proxy technological warfare.

Domestic Stability and Social Order The US administration faces significant internal pressure. Protests in major cities and a [confrontation in Congress](#) where a veteran's arm was broken by security forces indicate a breakdown in the domestic consensus. The administration is accused of using the war as an "[Operation Deflection](#)" from domestic issues such as the economy and pending legal inquiries.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity on March 5 was dominated by emergency briefings on the war and a high-stakes UN Security Council session on resource governance. US lawmakers are currently debating the [necessity of ground troops](#), while international bodies are pushing for a return to diplomatic protocols.

- **Emergency War Powers Authorization:**invoked by proponents.

- **Armed Services Hearing:**Brian McGinnes protested the war for Israel, leading to his forcible removal and injury.
- **UN Security Council Session on Energy:**increased fossil fuel and nuclear investment to combat energy poverty.
- **Russian Foreign Ministry Round Table:**exposing Western strategies to divide Arab nations and prevent regional normalization.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Failure of "Surgical" Regime Change

Despite US claims that "Operation Epic Fury" would be a [short, focused war](#), the conflict has morphed into a protracted regional crisis. The assassination of the Supreme Leader failed to cause an immediate collapse of the Iranian state; instead, it [united the population](#) in a way that previous sanctions and diplomatic pressure could not. This suggests a fundamental miscalculation in US intelligence regarding the resilience of ideological states.

The Weaponization of the Global Commons

The transition of the war from land to sea, particularly with the [torpedoing of a frigate](#) in international waters near Sri Lanka, signals the end of the "high seas" as a neutral space. The US refusal to ratify the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea is now being cited by regional actors as proof that Washington [operates outside of international law](#), further isolating US maritime interests.

Resource Colonization vs. Digital Sovereignty

A recurring theme throughout the day's transcripts is the [exploitation of the Global South](#) for critical minerals. From the Navajo Nation to the DRC and Colombia, indigenous populations are framing their resistance to mining as a parallel struggle to Iran's resistance to US military hegemony. This convergence of [anti-corporate and anti-imperialist](#) narratives is creating a powerful new geopolitical bloc focused on "resource sovereignty."

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a massive retaliatory strike from Iranian proxies (Hezbollah, Houthis, and Iraqi militias) against [energy installations in the UAE and Saudi Arabia](#). The "holy war" rhetoric will likely increase volunteer enlistment across the Shia Crescent, making a quick US exit impossible. High risk of a domestic US terror event or significant cyberattack on the electrical grid.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The US will likely be forced to [deploy ground troops](#) to Lebanon or Iran to maintain objectives, as aerial bombardment shows diminishing returns. European economies will face [extreme inflationary pressure](#) due to the double loss of Russian and Qatari energy, potentially leading to the collapse of pro-war governments in France or Germany.

Long Term (1-5 Years): A structural shift toward a [post-dollar energy trade](#) is inevitable as nations like Iran, Russia, and China formalize the "BRICS energy loop." The security architecture of the Middle East will be permanently altered, with the US likely

forced to withdraw to "over-the-horizon" postures as [regional bases become untenable](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic channels must be opened through neutral third parties (e.g., Oman or India) immediately to prevent a [catastrophic regional escalation](#).
- The US must clarify its "regime change" objectives to avoid [unnecessary civilian casualties](#) that are currently fueling global anti-Western coalitions.
- International observers must address the alleged [Karachi consulate massacre](#) to prevent a total rupture in US-Pakistan relations.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** conflict-affected zones become the primary extraction points.
- **Energy Costs:** Hormuz closure is likely to be a multi-month event.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** due diligence regulations regarding "conflict-affected minerals" will impose significant compliance costs on the technology and automotive sectors.
