AFGHANISTAN ESCALATES BORDER CONFLICT WITH PAKISTAN AMIDST REGIONAL TURMOIL AND THE REPORTED DEATH OF IRAN'S SUPREME LEADER

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 5, 2026, marks a critical inflection point for the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) as it transitions from localized border skirmishes to a sustained military campaign dubbed "Rad-ul-Zulm" (Repelling Oppression) against Pakistani military forces. Following Pakistani airstrikes that allegedly targeted civilians in Khost and Paktika, the IEA has launched broad retaliatory strikes across the Durand Line, claiming significant territorial gains and the [destruction of 12 Pakistani military outposts](#). This escalation is being leveraged domestically to foster a unified national identity, with state media broadcasting widespread "spontaneous" rallies in provinces like Takhar and Herat where citizens are [volunteering for frontline combat](#) against what they term the "Punjabi regime."

Simultaneously, the regional security architecture is facing a historic shock

following reports of the death of Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei and subsequent US-Israeli strikes on Iranian territory. The IEA leadership, while embroiled in its own conflict, is positioning itself as a stable regional actor, engaging in high-level diplomacy with China and Russia to mediate the Pakistani crisis. Russia has notably [offered to act as a mediator](#) between Kabul and Islamabad, while the IEA continues to exploit Pakistani internal instability—specifically the Baloch and Pashtun grievances—to undermine Islamabad's strategic depth. The convergence of a hot war with Pakistan and the power vacuum in Iran suggests a period of extreme volatility for Central and South Asian security.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Execution of Operation Rad-ul-Zulm

- The IEA Ministry of Defense claims to have transitioned to a professional, tactical border war, reporting [41 Pakistani soldiers killed](#) and 53 wounded in the last 24 hours.
- Retaliatory strikes targeted Pakistani positions in Nangarhar, Kunar, Paktika, and Kandahar, with specific claims of [capturing two posts and heavy weaponry](#) in the Shorabak district of Kandahar.
- The IEA air force and special operations units allegedly conducted strikes as deep as the [Kachlagh area of Balochistan](#), targeting a military headquarters and barracks.
- State media highlights the [downing of three Pakistani surveillance drones](#) by Afghan forces, signaling improved anti-air capabilities.

Regional Fallout from the Reported Death of Ali Khamenei

- Deputy PM Hanafi and Foreign Minister Mutaqi visited the Iranian embassy in Kabul to offer condolences for the [passing of Seyed Ali Khamenei](#).
- The IEA officially condemned US and Israeli military actions against Iran, characterizing them as a [threat to regional stability](#) that targets civilian infrastructure.
- Despite the conflict in Iran, IEA officials claim the [Khaf-Herat railway remains operational](#), with trade shipments continuing to enter Afghanistan from Iran.

Domestic Mobilization and Nationalism

- Thousands of residents in Takhar province held rallies [condemning Pakistani "aggression"](#) and declaring support for the IEA security forces.
- In Panjshir, over [4,000 youth reportedly registered](#) to join the fight against Pakistan, a significant development given the province's history of resistance to the IEA.
- The IEA is utilizing Islamic rhetoric to frame the conflict as a [legitimate jihad against a "mercenary" regime](#) serving Western interests.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Regional Influence

- The IEA is actively projecting power by framing Pakistan as a "failing state" plagued by political and economic crises. Analysts in Kabul argue that [Pakistan's military is holding its own government hostage](#), leading to its eventual disintegration.

- The IEA is leveraging the "Durand Line" dispute as a unifying nationalist cause, with officials claiming the [line is an artificial British imposition](#) and that Afghan territory extends to the Indus River.

Diplomatic Engagement

- Russia's Special Envoy Zamir Kabulov met with IEA representatives to express concern over [violations of Afghan airspace](#) and offered Moscow's services as a neutral mediator.
- The IEA continues to court China, with Minister Mutaqi emphasizing that [respect for Afghan sovereignty](#) is the only path to regional progress and security.
- The consulate in Bonn, Germany, has [commenced passport distribution](#), a move seen as a victory for the IEA's efforts to gain administrative legitimacy in Europe.

Economic Security & Critical Infrastructure

- Despite the border war, the IEA reports a [significant increase in overflight traffic](#) as international airlines avoid Iranian and Pakistani airspace, providing a windfall in transit fees.
- The Ministry of Transport and Aviation claims all [international and regional airports](#) are operating normally, with no disruptions to civilian flight paths despite the kinetic environment.
- A crackdown on market hoarding is underway, with the Kabul Municipality threatening to [shutter businesses that manipulate prices](#) during the Ramadan period and current security crisis.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance during the crisis has focused on military mobilization, price controls during Ramadan, and bureaucratic normalization in the diaspora.

- **Passport Distribution Policy:** The Ministry of Foreign Affairs finalized the protocol for the [resumption of passport services in Germany](#), targeting approximately 4,000 applicants in the initial phase.
- **Market Regulation Decrees:** The Ministry of Commerce and the Kabul Municipality issued joint directives for [enforcement of price lists](#) on essential goods (flour, oil, pulses) to prevent war-related inflation.
- **Judicial Oversight:** The Ministry for the Promotion of Virtue and Prevention of Vice reported resolving [127 cases related to women's rights](#) and the arrest of 12 individuals for "witchcraft" as part of a broader social order campaign.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Proxies and Internal Unrest

A recurring theme is the IEA's tactical shift toward supporting, or at least vocally encouraging, internal dissent within Pakistan. State media consistently highlights the [resistance of Baloch and Pashtun groups](#) against the Islamabad government. By framing the Pakistani military as an "occupying force" in its own borderlands, the IEA is positioning itself as the de facto leader of a regional anti-colonial movement, successfully pivoting away from its previous

image as a parochial militant group to a nationalist vanguard.

Strategic Use of International Neutrality

The IEA is attempting a sophisticated "balancing act" between major powers. While it militarily engages Pakistan, it uses [Russian and Chinese diplomatic channels](#) to portray itself as the aggrieved party. The reporting suggests the IEA believes it can isolate Pakistan internationally by emphasizing civilian casualties—claiming [110 non-combatants killed](#)—while maintaining trade relations with China, Turkey, and a crisis-stricken Iran.

Exploitation of Regional Airspace Instability

The conflict between Iran, Israel, and the US has created a vacuum that the IEA is economically exploiting. As regional carriers shift paths, the [increase in transit flights through Afghan space](#) provides the IEA with a resilient revenue stream that is independent of border trade with Pakistan. This reduces Islamabad's leverage over Kabul's economy, which was historically dependent on the port of Karachi and border transit points.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect an intensification of "tit-for-tat" strikes along the Durand Line. The IEA is likely to conduct more [rocket attacks on Pakistani Ranger vehicles](#) and outposts to maintain domestic momentum.

- Civilian displacement in eastern Afghanistan will increase; the IEA and UN estimate [8,400 families have already been displaced](#), which may lead to a humanitarian localized crisis in Kunar and Nangarhar.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- If the power transition in Iran remains unstable following Khamenei's death, the IEA may attempt to [strengthen its security posture on the western border](#) to prevent spillover from US-Israeli strikes.
- Pakistan's internal political stability is at severe risk. Continued losses on the Afghan front could embolden TTP and Baloch insurgents, potentially leading to [fragmentation of military control](#) in the tribal areas.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The formalization of IEA relations with China and Russia may accelerate as these powers look for a stable partner to secure Central Asian trade routes. This would [shift the regional balance of power](#) permanently away from Pakistan.
- The IEA may move to formally renounce the Durand Line, seeking international recognition for a "Greater Afghanistan" as part of its long-term sovereignty project.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Security: Monitor the transfer of advanced weaponry (drones, night vision) from the IEA to regional proxies. The IEA has claimed significant [seizures of night vision and heavy weapons](#) from Pakistani forces.

- Diplomatic: Engagement with Kabul on humanitarian corridors for the [66,000 displaced persons in the east](#) is urgent to prevent a refugee surge into Central Asia.
- Stability: Observe the IEA's reaction to the Iran-Israel conflict; a further radicalization of the IEA's stance against "Zionist-American" interests could threaten remaining Western NGOs in the country.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Supply Chains: The [Khaf-Herat railway is currently the most stable artery](#) for Central Asian goods; however, its proximity to the Iranian conflict zone makes it high-risk.
- Aviation: Increased overflight revenue is a boon for the IEA, but insurers should be skeptical of the "normalcy" claims for Afghan airports given the [violation of Afghan airspace](#) by Pakistani drones and jets.
- Logistics: Businesses operating in the region should prepare for prolonged [closures of the Khyber Pass and Spin Boldak](#) crossings as the military conflict persists.
