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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 5, 2026, marks a critical juncture in global stability as "Operation Epic Fury," the US-led military offensive against Iran, expands into a regional conflagration with significant maritime casualties. The conflict has triggered an unprecedented diplomatic crisis between the United States and Spain. Following President Donald Trump's threats of trade reprisals, Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez has resurrected the ["No to War" slogan](#), historically used during the 2003 Iraq invasion, to signal Spain's refusal to allow US forces to use the Rota and Morón military bases for offensive operations against Iran. The US Treasury Department has responded with vitriol, accusing Spain of [endangering American lives](#) by withholding military cooperation, while the White House issued contradictory statements claiming Spain had already relented—a claim the Spanish government has [categorically and repeatedly denied](#).

Beyond the Mediterranean, the conflict has disrupted global energy and logistics hubs. A US submarine used a torpedo to sink an Iranian warship off the coast of Sri Lanka, the first such engagement [since World War II](#), while Iran has retaliated by targeting Gulf State infrastructure and threatening nuclear research facilities in Israel. Seizing on the chaos, Russian President Vladimir Putin has threatened to [sever gas supplies to Europe](#) prematurely, citing Ukrainian "terrorism" against Russian gas tankers near Malta. Domestically, Catalonia faces a triple crisis of severe weather from Storm Regina, a protracted medical strike, and a growing humanitarian emergency regarding homelessness in Badalona, all while the 2026 Mobile World Congress concludes with a somber focus on [AI-driven defense and security](#).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Military Escalation: Operation Epic Fury

- The US Navy reported sinking the majority of Iran's naval capacity, including a warship destroyed by a submarine-fired torpedo near Sri Lanka, resulting in [approximately 180 casualties](#).
- Iran has expanded its target list to include UAE fuel depots and US embassy vicinities in Qatar, leading to [mass evacuations in Doha](#).
- Israel has issued unprecedented evacuation orders for [four entire neighborhoods in Beirut](#), signaling an imminent intensification of its air campaign against Hezbollah.

- A regional "oval of conflict" now stretches from the Caucasus to Cyprus, with Iranian drones reportedly [striking targets in Azerbaijan](#).

US-Spain Diplomatic Rupture

- Spanish PM Pedro Sánchez clarified that Spain will not be "accomplices" in a war that [violates international law](#), leading to a direct confrontation with the Trump administration.
- US Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent accused Spain of being "freeloaders" on US protection while [refusing to pay the bill](#) via military cooperation.
- The European Commission has closed ranks with Spain, asserting that any US trade sanctions against a member state [constitute a threat to the entire Union](#).
- The Iranian government has praised Spain's stance as ["responsible and ethical"](#), further complicating Spain's position within NATO.

Energy and Economic Turbulence

- Russia is leveraging the Middle East crisis to pressure the EU to reverse its 2027 gas phase-out, threatening an [immediate supply cut](#).
- Global shipping faces a "logistics chaos" as the Strait of Hormuz remains [effectively closed to traffic](#).
- China has increased its defense spending by 7% while sending a [mediator to the Middle East](#) to protect its oil interests.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

International Relations & Foreign Policy:

The day's coverage highlights a massive fragmentation of the Western alliance. While

Italy and the Netherlands maintain some level of military alignment with the US, Spain has broken away, prioritizing [international law and humanitarian ethics](#) over traditional NATO solidarity. This rift is being characterized by international observers as Sánchez positioning himself as the ["Nemesis of Trump"](#) in Europe.

Energy Security: The combination of the Hormuz closure and Putin's threats has created a "perfect storm" for European energy markets. Spain is particularly vulnerable to the [escalation of prices](#) and logistical delays affecting the automotive industry, which represents 10% of Catalan GDP [according to local reports](#).

Domestic Stability & Social Order:

Catalonia is dealing with significant social friction. In Badalona, the death of a fourth homeless individual since the closure of a municipal shelter has sparked [protests against the local government](#). Simultaneously, medical professionals have announced new strike dates for March 19-20, [demanding improved working conditions](#) and specific contracts for the collective.

Cybersecurity & AI:

As MWC 2026 concludes, the transition of technology from consumer electronics to [predictive and invisible systems](#) is noted. However, the use of AI in defense and "connected homes" is raising significant [ethical and privacy concerns](#), particularly regarding the potential hacking of humanoid robots in private residences.

Critical Infrastructure:

The Catalan rail network remains in crisis. An R2 Sud train was [trapped for two hours](#) in a tunnel between Sitges and Garraf today. Experts suggest the network has "hit rock bottom,"

requiring massive investment to reach a [stable horizon by 2030](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The Spanish government is focused on navigating the fallout of a "decree omnibus" that previously failed in Congress. Efforts are being made to [reintroduce social protections](#) by linking them to the international state of emergency. Additionally, Catalan legislators are debating the "Law of Homelessness," which seeks to [mandate municipal services](#) for the vulnerable.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Escut Social (Social Shield):** A failed national decree that included mortgage and eviction moratoriums; currently being [re-negotiated with Junts](#) under the pretext of war-time exceptionalism.
- **Law of Homelessness (Llei del Sensellarisme):** Proposed Catalan legislation to define municipal responsibilities for shelters in [towns over 20,000 residents](#).
- **Made in Europe Act:** A new European Commission proposal for industrial acceleration, requiring [minimum European manufacturing quotas](#) for public contracts in tech and green energy.
- **US Senate Resolution:** A failed attempt by US Democrats to [block the Trump administration's](#) military intervention in Iran.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Pedro Sánchez Institutional Declaration:** Formally declared Spain's ["No to War"](#) position and denied US base usage for the Iran offensive.

- **Margarita Robles Briefing:** The Defense Minister clarified that while Spain remains a "reliable partner," it will only [participate in missions](#) with international legal backing.
- **Scott Bessent Interview (ABC/CNBC):** The US Treasury Secretary outlined the logic for [economic reprisals against Spain](#).

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Trade: The Trump administration's shift toward using trade tariffs and embargoes as a primary tool for securing military cooperation represents a fundamental change in transatlantic relations. The EU's response—treating trade as a [centralized European competence](#)—sets the stage for a potential US-EU trade war that transcends the specific conflict in Iran.

Resurgence of the "No to War" Sentiment: The Spanish government is intentionally tapping into a deep-seated cultural memory of the 2003 Iraq protests. By framing the current conflict as [illegal and lacking a UN mandate](#), Sánchez is consolidating his domestic left-wing base while isolating the conservative opposition (PP and Vox), who are struggling to [balance their pro-US stance](#) with public anti-war sentiment.

Technological Sovereignty and Defense: The MWC 2026 highlights a shift toward "invisible" and "omnipresent" tech. However, the convergence of AI with defense applications is becoming the dominant investment driver. The ["Made in Europe" initiative](#) indicates that the EU is moving toward its own form of "Strategic Autonomy," seeking to decouple its industrial base from both the US and China.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect severe economic friction as US tariff threats begin to impact Spanish exports, particularly in the [automotive and food sectors](#). Storm Regina will likely cause localized flooding and agricultural damage in Girona and the Ebre regions [exceeding 100 liters per square meter](#). Domestic unrest in Spain will peak around the coordinated medical and teacher strikes on March 19-20.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The Middle East conflict will likely enter a "war of attrition" phase. If the Strait of Hormuz remains closed, the EU will be forced to activate an ["energy social shield"](#) to mitigate inflation. Spain may face increased isolation within NATO's command structure, potentially leading to a [renegotiation of the bilateral defense treaty](#) regarding the Rota base.

Long Term (1-5 Years): A permanent restructuring of European alliances is probable. Spain's current trajectory points toward a leadership role in a "Mediterranean Bloc" that prioritizes diplomacy and [civilian protection over military interventionism](#). Russia's early exit from the European gas market will accelerate the continent's transition to green hydrogen and [nuclear energy independence](#).

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic channels must prioritize clarifying the status of US bases in Spain to [prevent accidental escalations](#) or unauthorized usage by US forces.

- The EU should establish a unified legal framework to protect member states from [unilateral US economic punishment](#).
- Efforts should be made to secure maritime routes in the Indian Ocean, as the conflict has now [reached as far as Sri Lanka](#).

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Automotive and industrial firms should [diversify supply chains](#) away from the Strait of Hormuz and prepare for potential 25% US tariffs on Spanish-made components.
- Energy-intensive industries in Europe must hedge against [sudden gas supply terminations](#) from Russia before the 2027 deadline.
- Defense and cybersecurity firms should monitor the [Made in Europe Act](#) for new procurement opportunities and local manufacturing requirements.
