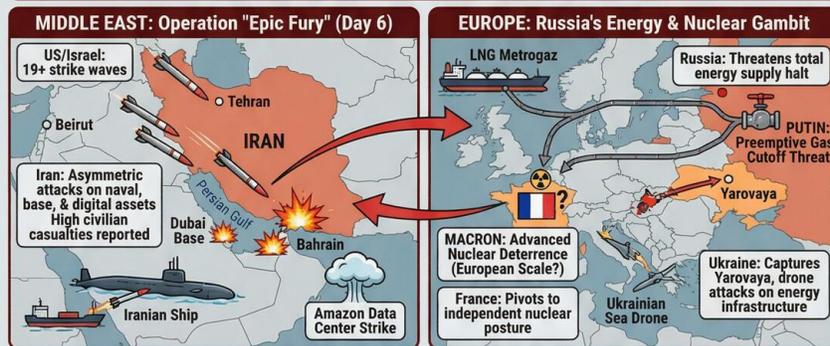

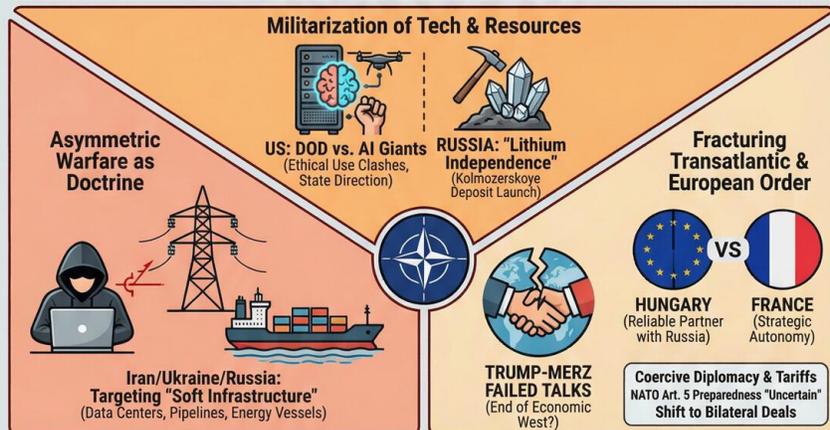

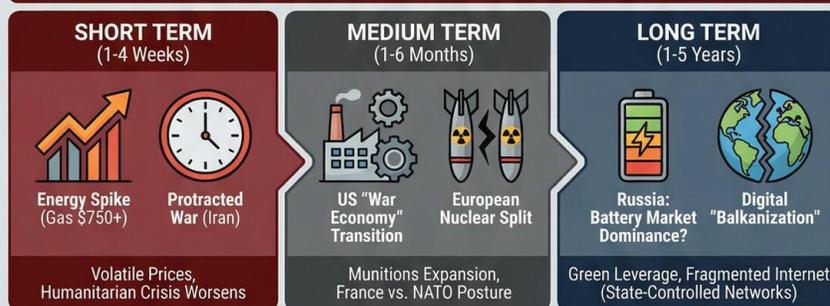

THE GLOBAL SECURITY ARCHITECTURE FACES AN UNPRECEDENTED CRISIS AS THE UNITED STATES INTENSIFIES ITS "EPIC FURY" CAMPAIGN AGAINST IRAN WHILE RUSSIA THREATENS A TOTAL ENERGY DECOUPLING FROM EUROPE.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 5, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in the shift toward a multipolar, high-kinetic global environment. The United States and Israel have entered the sixth day of a massive military operation against Iran, codenamed [Epic Fury](#), characterized by heavy bombardment of Tehran and strikes on critical infrastructure. Iran has responded with asymmetric strikes against U.S. naval assets, regional bases in Bahrain and Dubai, and a major [Amazon data center](#) in the Persian Gulf. This escalation is driving global energy prices to record highs, with gas reaching \$700-750 per thousand cubic meters, further strained by President Putin's suggestion that Russia may preemptively [cease all gas exports](#) to the European Union before the EU's planned April restrictions.

In the European theater, the "Special Military Operation" in Ukraine continues with Russian forces capturing the strategic settlement of [Yarovaya](#) in the Donetsk region, while a significant prisoner exchange of 200 for 200 was successfully completed. Diplomatic tensions are peaking within the West as German Chancellor Friedrich Merz's visit to Washington was characterized by [subservience to President Trump](#), while French President Emmanuel Macron announced a pivot toward "advanced nuclear deterrence," potentially offering a French nuclear umbrella to a Europe increasingly skeptical of U.S. security guarantees under the Trump administration.

Technologically, the day's reports highlight a growing "militarization of everything." The U.S. Department of Defense is clashing with domestic AI giants like Anthropic over the [ethical use of autonomous weapons](#), while Russia celebrates its impending "lithium independence" with the launch of the [Kolmozerskoye deposit](#) in Murmansk. These developments suggest a world rapidly de-globalizing into armed blocs, where critical minerals, energy supplies, and AI sovereignty are being prioritized over international trade norms.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Escalation of Operation "Epic Fury" in the Middle East

- The U.S. and Israel have conducted [nineteen waves](#) of strikes against Iranian military and civilian infrastructure, including the Ministry of Defense in Tehran and the airport in Beirut.

- The U.S. Navy utilized a submarine-launched torpedo to [sink an Iranian ship](#), the first such instance since World War II.
- Iran claims to have [killed 100 U.S. Marines](#) in a strike on Dubai and destroyed American bases in Iraqi Kurdistan.
- The conflict has resulted in significant civilian casualties, including reports of [170 girls killed](#) in an airstrike on a school in Minab.

Russia's Energy Leverage and Preemptive Decoupling

- President Putin has directed the government to study the feasibility of [halting gas supplies](#) to Europe immediately, rather than waiting for the EU's April deadline.
- Hungary and Slovakia remain "reliable partners," with Russia promising to maintain [stable energy prices](#) for Budapest despite the global crisis.
- A Russian LNG carrier, the Arctic Metrogaz, was reportedly [attacked by Ukrainian sea drones](#) in the Mediterranean, an act Putin labeled a "terrorist attack."

European Security Realignment and Nuclear Ambitions

- President Macron announced France will [increase its nuclear arsenal](#) and stop reporting its exact numbers, moving toward a "European scale" of deterrence.
- German Chancellor Merz's visit to Trump failed to secure the [cancellation of 15% tariffs](#), signaling a breakdown in traditional transatlantic economic cooperation.
- NATO Secretary General Mark Rutte indicated the alliance is prepared to [invoke Article 5](#) in support of the U.S. against Iran, though specific plans remain "uncertain."

Developments in the Ukraine Conflict

- Russian forces captured the town of [Yarovaya](#), establishing a bridgehead for further advances toward Krasny Liman.
- A major POW exchange involving [400 soldiers](#) (200 from each side) was facilitated by the UAE and the USA.
- Zelensky reportedly [threatened physical retribution](#) against Hungarian PM Viktor Orban if he continues to block EU aid to Ukraine.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

AI & Technology Policy

- U.S. Defense Secretary Hegseth (referred to as Hexit) has [threatened to destroy Anthropic](#) after the AI company expressed concerns about its technology being used in autonomous weaponry.
- U.S. agencies are being ordered to [cease cooperation](#) with AI firms that do not comply with military requirements, signaling a new era of state-directed technology development.

Critical Minerals & Supply Chains

- Russia has entered [test production](#) at the Kolmozerskoye lithium deposit, aiming for full technological independence for its battery and defense industries.
- U.S. defense analysts reveal that despite public reports of shortages, the U.S. has [surreptitiously expanded](#) its production of interceptor missiles to 70 units per month.

Energy Security

- The blocking of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) and attacks on Qatari LNG facilities have destabilized Asian and European energy markets.
- Hungary is considering [maritime transport](#) of oil if the Druzhba pipeline remains blocked by Ukraine.

Military Governance & Civil Unrest

- The U.S. Senate [voted against](#) a resolution that would have restricted Trump's power to wage war in Iran without Congressional approval.
- A U.S. Marine veteran was [forcibly removed](#) from a Senate hearing after protesting the war, highlighting growing domestic polarization over foreign interventions.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity today was dominated by the U.S. Senate's refusal to curb executive war powers and European debates on shifting to a "war economy." These proceedings indicate a move toward expanded state authority and the sidelining of traditional diplomatic norms.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **U.S. War Powers Limitation Resolution:** A failed attempt by Democratic senators to [restrict Trump's ability](#) to strike Iran without a formal declaration of war.
- **EU "Rearm Europe" Strategy:** A proposal by Ursula von der Leyen to allocate [800 billion euros](#) for a massive military buildup across the European Union.

- **EU 20th Sanctions Package:** Currently [blocked by Hungary](#) due to energy security concerns.

- **U.S. Senate Intelligence Briefing on Iran:** Senators Elizabeth Warren and Ed Markey emerged from a [closed-door briefing](#) to warn that the administration has "no exit plan" for the Iranian conflict.
- **Putin-Siarto Meeting:** A high-level meeting in the Kremlin where Russia guaranteed [Hungarian energy security](#) despite the regional wars.
- **Hegseth Press Conference:** The U.S. Secretary of Defense declared the Iran operation could [last 100 days](#) or more, contradicting initial "four-day" estimates.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of Transatlantic Economic Integration

The failure of Chancellor Merz to secure tariff relief from President Trump [signal the end](#) of the "economic West." The U.S. administration is increasingly treating its European allies as competitors rather than partners. Trump's threats to [cut off all trade](#) with Spain over its refusal to provide bases for the Iran war marks a new era of "coercive diplomacy" within NATO. Asymmetric Retaliation as Global Doctrine

By striking an [Amazon data center](#) and oil tankers, Iran is targeting the "digital and energetic nervous system" of the global economy. This asymmetric approach is mirrored by Ukraine's [sea drone attacks](#) on Russian gas vessels and Russia's potential use of the "energy tap" to induce an [economic collapse](#) in Europe. The trend is toward targeting "soft infrastructure" rather than solely engaging in battlefield combat.

The Militarization of Corporate Technology

The confrontation between the U.S. government and Anthropic over [AI weaponization](#) indicates that private sector companies will no longer be allowed to maintain ethical autonomy during "existential" conflicts. The U.S. administration is effectively [nationalizing technology policy](#), using supply chain risk designations to crush dissent within the tech industry. This parallels Russia's state-led push for [lithium sovereignty](#), suggesting that in the near future, major technological breakthroughs will be exclusively geared toward state survival and military projection.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a significant [spike in European energy prices](#) as Russian gas flows likely diminish following Putin's "thoughts aloud" directive. In the Middle East, the Iranian conflict is likely to transition from a "surgical" air campaign to a [protracted war of attrition](#), with the U.S. potentially activating Kurdish proxies along the Iranian border to spark domestic unrest. The humanitarian crisis in the region will

worsen, potentially triggering a [new wave of migration](#) toward Europe.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The U.S. administration will likely use the Iran war as a [justification to transition](#) the American economy to "war rails," expanding munitions production and ignoring WTO norms. Within Europe, a [split in the nuclear order](#) will emerge as France begins to position its arsenal as a counter-weight to Russia, while Germany remains caught between its pacifist constitution and its deteriorating alliance with Washington.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Russia's development of the [Kolmozerskoye lithium deposit](#) will likely make it a dominant player in the global battery market, potentially rivaling China and providing it with a "green" leverage over Europe's eventual reconstruction. The global internet could fragment further as states target [private data centers](#) as military assets, leading to a "Balkanization" of the digital world into hardened, state-controlled networks.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** The potential [invocation of Article 5](#) over a Middle Eastern conflict will fundamentally test NATO's cohesion. Non-U.S. members must prepare for a scenario where they are coerced into regional wars they do not support.

- **Diplomatic Engagement:** Middle-power states (Spain, Hungary, Turkey) are emerging as [critical disruptors](#). Policy should focus on bilateral deals with these "swing states" rather than relying on multilateral blocs like the EU or NATO.
- **Nuclear Non-Proliferation:** Macron's move to [increase the French arsenal](#) effectively ends the era of disarmament, signaling a return to high-stakes nuclear brinkmanship across Europe.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Exposure:** Companies with exposure to European industrial sectors should [hedge against a total cutoff](#) of Russian gas before the end of March. Prices are expected to remain volatile and decoupled from historical norms.
- **Tech Regulatory Risk:** AI and tech firms must prepare for [state intervention](#) in their business models. Refusal to cooperate with national security mandates will result in being labeled a "supply chain risk," leading to immediate loss of government contracts and market access.
- **Supply Chain Resilience:** Russia's push for [lithium independence](#) suggests that critical mineral supply chains are becoming localized. Investors should prioritize projects within friendly or sovereign jurisdictions as the "global" mineral market continues to fragment.
