



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DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The conflict between the United States, Israel, and Iran has entered a decisive and more violent phase on its seventh day, as the Trump administration shifts its war aims from the degradation of nuclear and missile facilities toward a totalizing objective of [unconditional surrender](#) and regime transformation. Following the earlier assassination of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, the Israeli military has intensified its "regime infrastructure" strikes, most notably targeting an [underground military bunker](#) in Tehran with 50 fighter jets. While the US claims the Iranian Navy has been decimated and its missile capability reduced by 90%, Tehran continues to project power through a "maximum disruption" strategy, successfully halting traffic through the [Strait of Hormuz](#) and launching wide-scale drone and missile

salvos against Gulf states hosting US forces, including Qatar, Bahrain, and Kuwait.

The economic consequences of the war have escalated from a regional crisis to a global threat. Qatar's energy minister has warned that the conflict could [bring down the world's economies](#), with oil prices potentially reaching \$150 per barrel as Gulf producers face production shut-ins. In a desperate bid to stabilize markets, the US has issued a [30-day waiver](#) allowing India to purchase Russian oil currently at sea, marking a radical reversal of previous sanction policies. Domestically, the Trump administration is grappling with bad news as US job figures show an [unexpected contraction](#), and the president has moved to consolidate his hardline immigration stance by replacing Homeland Security Secretary Christie Noem with Senator Markwayne Mullin following controversies over domestic raids.

Simultaneously, a second front in Lebanon has reached a humanitarian breaking point. Israel has issued unprecedented evacuation orders for [half of Beirut](#), displacing an estimated 300,000 people as it attempts to permanently dismantle Hezbollah's military infrastructure. The convergence of these events—a high-intensity air war in Iran, a ground incursion in Lebanon, a global energy supply shock, and a domestic shift toward "peace through strength" militancy—suggests that the administration is betting its political future on a swift, "Venezuela-style" collapse of the Iranian state before the US midterm elections in November.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Shift to Total War Aims in Iran:** The Trump administration has abandoned rhetoric regarding limited surgical strikes, with the President declaring that negotiations are over and only [unconditional surrender](#) is acceptable. The US Defense Secretary warned that firepower over Iran is about to [surge dramatically](#) as the operation moves to dismantle the entire regime structure.
- **Global Energy Crisis and the Hormuz Blockade:** Brent crude has surged past \$90, with warnings of [\\$150 per barrel](#) as 300 tankers remain stuck at an impasse in the Strait of Hormuz. The US is attempting to mitigate this by permitting India to buy [Russian oil](#) and seeking increased supplies from a now-aligned Venezuela.
- **Lebanese Humanitarian Emergency:** Israel has launched its [26th wave of strikes](#) on Beirut's southern suburbs (Dahye), a Hezbollah stronghold. Lebanese authorities report over 200 killed and a massive exodus of civilians sleeping on streets and beaches with [nowhere to go](#).
- **Iranian Retaliation Against Gulf Allies:** Despite US claims of air superiority, Iran has maintained steady pressure on the Gulf, with the UAE intercepting [131 drones](#) and six missiles in a single day. Targeted sites include the Al-Udeid Airbase in Qatar and the [Prince Sultan Airbase](#) in Saudi Arabia.

- **US Domestic Policy Realignment:** President Trump has replaced Homeland Security Secretary [Christie Noem](#) with Markwayne Mullin, following criticism of her handling of immigration raids that killed two US citizens. Simultaneously, the administration met with defense contractors to [quadruple production](#) of high-tier weaponry.
- **International Intelligence Warfare:** Reports indicate that [Russia is providing Iran](#) with targeting information to strike US forces, while Ukraine is offering drone-intercept expertise to [Gulf countries](#) to help them combat Iranian Shahed drones.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession & Stability: The Iranian regime is currently navigating a chaotic succession process following the death of Ali Khamenei. While the [Assembly of Experts](#) is rumored to have selected the son, Mojtaba Khamenei, President Trump has publicly [rejected him as a "lightweight"](#) and demanded a say in the appointment of a "great and acceptable" leader, drawing parallels to the recent political transition in [Venezuela](#).

Energy Security: The global supply chain is facing a "supply web" failure as the Strait of Hormuz remains effectively impassable due to [Iranian asymmetric threats](#) (fast boats and drones). The Danish shipping giant Maersk has suspended services from the [Middle East to Europe](#), and insurance costs for tankers have doubled in a week, forcing the US to consider military escorts under [Operation Earnest Will-style](#) protocols.

National Security & Terrorism: The conflict has spilled into the UK, where counter-terrorism police arrested [four men](#) (one Iranian, three dual nationals) for allegedly

surveilling Jewish communities in London on behalf of Iranian intelligence. In Cyprus, the UK has updated its [travel advice](#) to warn of potential terrorist attacks against British interests as Iran lashes out at sovereign UK bases used for [defensive drone-cap](#) operations.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics: A divergence is emerging between US and Israeli goals; while Trump seeks a "deal" with a moderate regime figure, Israel reportedly wants the [complete removal](#) of the Islamic Republic. Meanwhile, China is reportedly negotiating [safe passage](#) for its own vessels through the Strait of Hormuz, highlighting its unique leverage as a primary buyer of Iranian oil.

State Capacity & Industry: In the US, the "Arsenal of Freedom" initiative is being tested. Trump met with defense executives to address [potential scarcity](#) of air-defense interceptors (Patriots and THAAD) as the war consumes munitions faster than they can be produced. In the private sector, [Anthropic is suing the Pentagon](#) after being labeled a supply chain risk for refusing unrestricted military access to its AI tools.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on the limitations of executive war powers and the prioritization of national security over social welfare. In the US, the [Save America Act](#) has been expanded to include bans on gender-affirming surgeries for minors, which the administration frames as a "common-sense" priority alongside military funding. Internationally, Somalia's parliament passed [major constitutional changes](#) amidst significant opposition boycotts.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **War Powers Act Resolution:** House and Senate votes to require [congressional approval](#) for the Iran conflict both failed along party lines, granting Trump continued executive discretion for the air campaign.
- **Save America Act:** Proposed legislation to fund national security while [restricting social policies](#) related to transgender healthcare and women's sports.
- **Somali Constitutional Amendments:** Approved changes moving the country toward a [one-person, one-vote](#) system and extending presidential terms to five years, though critics claim it lacks a quorum.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **NSC Friday Briefing:** White House officials confirmed that the military operation has [exceeded the scale](#) of the initial Iraq invasion and emphasized that "long-term wars can be fought successfully."
- **Prime Minister Starmer's Press Conference:** Defended the decision to allow [US use of UK bases](#) while maintaining that the UK is not an active participant in offensive strikes.
- **Senate Committee on Homeland Security:** Christie Noem faced [intense pressure](#) over a \$200 million ad campaign and the deaths of citizens during immigration raids before her removal.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The "Venezuela Model" as a Foreign Policy Blueprint

The administration is now justifying [high-intensity involvement](#) by framing it as the only "America First" path to removing "malign" threats. This shift is meeting resistance among [60% of Americans](#) who disapprove of the war, yet the administration is doubling down, suggesting that only a total military victory will vindicate the pivot. The replacement of Noem with Mullin further signals a transition toward a [hardline security state](#) both at home and abroad.

Asymmetric Warfare vs. Conventional Dominance

A tactical theme of the day is the failure of conventional "air superiority" to secure the maritime commons. While the US and Israel have achieved dominance in the skies over Tehran, they have failed to neutralize the [coastal defense batteries](#) and small-boat swarms that keep the Strait of Hormuz closed. This demonstrates a growing disconnect between the ability to destroy "regime infrastructure" and the ability to protect [global energy flows](#), which remain vulnerable to low-cost, decentralized Iranian assets.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect oil prices to test the [\\$150 threshold](#) if Saudi Arabia or Kuwait production remains shut-in. The US may begin unilateral naval escorts for tankers, potentially leading to [direct combat](#) between US destroyers and Iranian fast-boats. Domestically, the US midterm campaign will likely center on the [jobs report contraction](#), putting pressure on Trump to deliver a "Mission Accomplished" moment by early April.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The legitimacy of the next Supreme Leader will be the primary flashpoint. If Mojtaba Khamenei takes power against US wishes, expect a shift from air strikes to [economic infrastructure](#) destruction (refineries and power grids). In Lebanon, the displacement of 300,000 people will likely result in a [permanent "sterile zone"](#) in the south as Israel aims to prevent a return to the 2024 status quo.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The "New Middle East" envisioned by Israel and the US may lead to either a secular-leaning, resource-rich bloc including [Venezuela and a reformed Iran](#), or a fragmented region of failed states. The heavy reliance on Russia/China by the pre-collapse regimes may lead to long-term [munitions exhaustion](#) for the US, potentially emboldening China in the Asia-Pacific as US interceptor stocks remain depleted.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** NATO and non-NATO allies must urgently [ramp up production](#) of interceptor missiles, as the US capacity to provide air defense to Gulf allies is currently being outpaced by Iranian drone swarms.
- **Diplomatic Engagement:** European leaders should maintain [independent diplomatic channels](#) with Tehran's interim council to avoid a "Syria-style" fragmentation of the country, which would trigger massive refugee flows toward Europe.
- **Humanitarian Relief:** Immediate aid is required for Lebanon to prevent a [total collapse](#) of state services as public shelters exceed capacity.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Resilience:** Companies reliant on Asian or Middle Eastern manufacturing should pivot toward [non-Hormuz routes](#), such as Singapore or Chinese direct-to-Europe rail/air cargo, as regional hubs like Dubai face ongoing missile alerts.
- **Energy Hedging:** Investors should anticipate high volatility in [jet fuel and shipping costs](#), which have doubled in a week, potentially forcing airline cancellations through the summer.
- **AI & Compliance:** Tech firms should monitor the [Anthropic vs. Pentagon](#) case as a bellwether for future government-industry relations regarding "dual-use" technologies in times of war.
