



DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The sixth day of the conflict between Israel, the United States, and Iran has escalated into a regional conflagration with severe global repercussions. Massive precision strikes on Tehran and Beirut have reportedly neutralized high-ranking Iranian leadership, including an Ayatollah, while the U.S. Senate has formally [supported military action](#). This geopolitical shock has sent oil prices surging toward \$90-\$93 per barrel, as major shipping firms like Maersk suspend transit through the [Strait of Hormuz](#). For Nigeria, this presents a paradoxical crisis: while export revenues may rise, the domestic economy faces immediate inflationary pressure on fuel prices, as the nation remains dependent on imported refined products despite recent refinery advancements.

Domestically, the Tinubu administration is leveraging this period of global distraction to push through fundamental shifts in Nigeria's governance and security architecture. The inauguration of a committee to implement [state policing](#) marks a historic departure from decades of centralized security, aimed at addressing systemic failure in the face of persistent terrorism and kidnapping. Simultaneously, the resolution of the 15-year OPL 245 dispute and the creation of the Grid Asset Management Company (GAMCO) signal an aggressive effort to unlock [deep-water investment](#) and stabilize the failing power sector. However, these reforms are met with significant political resistance, as the Inter-Party Advisory Council (IPAC) threatens to [boycott the 2027 elections](#) over perceived flaws in the new Electoral Act.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **US-Israel-Iran War Escalation:** On the seventh day of conflict, Israel and the U.S. launched massive air campaigns destroying Iranian regime infrastructure and command bunkers in Tehran. Over [80 Iranian sailors](#) were reportedly killed in a U.S. strike on a warship, while high-level leadership decapitation continues to complicate succession [dynamics in Iran](#).
- **Structural Security Shift in Nigeria:** The Inspector General of Police has inaugurated an eight-man committee to framework the transition to [state policing](#), following a presidential mandate to restore public trust and decentralize security functions to combat regional instability.

- **Resolution of OPL 245 Dispute:** A historic settlement between the Federal Government, Eni, and Shell has ended 15 years of legal warfare over [License 245](#), clearing the path for the Zabazaba-Etun deep-water project and a projected 150,000 barrels per day increase in production.
- **Corruption and Lawfare:** Former Attorney General Abubakar Malami and family members were granted [N200 million bail](#) each in an EFCC money laundering case, while families of military officers detained for alleged coup plotting demanded [immediate formal charges](#) or release.
- **Economic Reform and Taxation:** The Ministry of Finance introduced a 1% [presumptive tax](#) for MSMEs to simplify compliance and replace erratic informal levies, even as the CBN confirmed that [30 banks](#) have met new minimum capital requirements ahead of the 2026 deadline.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Infrastructure

- The government has established the **Grid Asset Management Company (GAMCO)** to manage assets under the National Integrated Power Project (NIPP), aiming to recover [1,600 megawatts](#) of electricity within two years.
- Global oil price volatility is affecting domestic fuel supplies, with pump prices in Nigeria jumping from [N860 to N960](#) per liter due to the Iranian conflict and reliance on refined imports.

Security Architecture and Terrorism

- The Joint Task Force Northeast (Operation Hadin Kai) successfully repelled [coordinated terrorist attacks](#) on four military locations in Borno State, though civilian abductions remain rampant in the [Ngoshe community](#).
- The state police model is being framed as a [complementary structure](#) to federal forces, intended to allow national police to focus on transnational crime while state units handle local security.

Elite Politics and Social Order

- Former Minister Rotimi Amaechi formally defected to the ADC, but his convoy was [attacked by gunmen](#) in Rivers State, highlighting the extreme volatility of regional political alliances heading toward 2027.
- IPAC has raised alarms regarding the mandatory use of **National Identification Numbers (NIN)** for party registration, claiming the 2026 Electoral Act [undermines party independence](#) and favors the ruling elite.

Technology Policy and Digital Sovereignty

- Samsung launched the **S26 series** in Nigeria, introducing "Agent AI" and privacy display technologies intended to secure [mobile financial transactions](#) against side-view surveillance.
- The Federal Ministry of Education has begun training [750 youths](#) in Taraba State on digital and technical skills to bridge the employability gap in the digital economy.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity has focused on finalizing the framework for the 2027 general elections and managing the legal fallout of Nigeria's transition to a decentralized security and energy model. Critical debates are ongoing regarding the **Special Seats for Women Bill** and the legalization of the National Decarbonization Program.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Electoral Act 2026 Amendments:** Controversy persists over Section 3, with IPAC demanding the [restoration of consensus](#) and indirect primary options, as well as the removal of restrictive NIN requirements for party members.
- **Special Seats Bill:** A proposed law to create [dedicated legislative seats](#) for women to correct gender imbalance in the National Assembly.
- **Mandatory National Decarbonization Program:** The House is seeking a [legal framework](#) to legalize presidential orders on emission reductions to avoid agricultural losses and infrastructure damage.

- **Military Wives Press Briefing:** Families of detained military officers urged President Tinubu to charge their husbands in [open court](#) rather than continuing indefinite detention without trial.
- **LCCI Security Meets Business Dialogue:** Stakeholders debated the impact of insecurity on the private sector, identifying state policing as the [most significant development](#) in recent security discourse.

- **Senate Public Accounts Committee:** Summons were issued to the former GMD of NNPC regarding [N210 trillion in alleged unremitted funds](#) and management discrepancies.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Paradox of the Energy Windfall

Nigeria's economy is currently caught in a cycle of "doomsday" energy economics. While high oil prices normally benefit the national treasury, the destruction of Iranian infrastructure has triggered a [global fuel spike](#) that negates export gains due to the continued lack of domestic refining self-sufficiency. Analysts note that even with the Dangote Refinery, the [high cost of crude oil](#) inputs linked to global markets ensures that Nigerians will continue to pay "war prices" at the pump. Decentralization as a Crisis Response

The pivot toward state policing and the unbundling of the power grid through GAMCO reflect a recognition that the federal "unitary" structure is failing to provide basic security and energy. The new [state police model](#) is an admission that the centralized NPF is unable to manage a country of 230 million people. However, critics warn of "political abuse" by governors who may turn these units into [enforcement groups](#) for personal agendas. Similar themes of decentralization are seen in the energy sector, where off-grid [solar mini-grids](#) are being funded as the national grid continues to falter.

Lawfare and Political Purges

The simultaneous prosecution of former AGF Malami and the detention of military officers for coup plots indicates a [dual-track purge](#) of the former political and security elite. While the government frames these as "rule of law" actions, the [prolonged detention](#) of military personnel without trial raises significant human rights concerns and risks deepening divisions within the armed forces. The "legal warfare" extends to the political arena, where IPAC's boycott threat suggests the 2026 Electoral Act may be used to [systemically exclude](#) minor parties through administrative hurdles like NIN requirements.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Domestic fuel prices in Nigeria are likely to exceed N1,000 per liter if the Iranian conflict remains uncontained, possibly triggering localized labor strikes. Pressure will mount on the [correctional services](#) to manage high-profile detainees like Malami, while the [IPAC-National Assembly standoff](#) could delay electoral preparations for upcoming local polls.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The establishment of GAMCO will be a litmus test for the power sector; failure to recover [1,600 MW](#) quickly will undermine the Tinubu administration's economic renewal claims. State policing legislation will likely trigger intense constitutional debates in the National Assembly, with a focus on [safeguards against governor-led](#) abuse.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The resolution of OPL 245 and the banking recapitalization program will likely result in a more [resilient but consolidated](#) financial and energy sector. However, the long-term stability of the 2027 electoral cycle depends on whether the

government addresses the ["selective prosecution"](#) and "undemocratic" exclusion narratives currently being forged by opposition coalitions like the ADC and IPAC.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Global energy markets must prepare for a prolonged [decline in Iranian output](#), increasing the strategic importance of Nigeria's deep-water reserves like OPL 245.
- The appointment of James Swan to DRC indicates a shift toward [veteran U.S. diplomacy](#) in African conflict zones, which may correlate with increased surveillance in Nigeria's [Boko Haram hotbeds](#).
- Mauritius' potential [legal action over Diego Garcia](#) could disrupt U.S. logistics in the Indian Ocean, just as the Middle East conflict necessitates higher base utilization.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- The 1% [presumptive tax](#) offers a lower-barrier entry for informal businesses to formalize, but investors should verify compliance before partnership to avoid JRB penalties.
- The transition to state policing will create new opportunities for [security technology](#) and consulting, as states will need to build infrastructure (comms, surveillance) from scratch.
- The Banking [recapitalization success](#) suggests a more liquid environment for large-scale infrastructure loans, though inflation remains the primary risk to capital preservation.
