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THE US-ISRAELI "EPIC FURY" OFFENSIVE AGAINST IRAN ENTERS ITS SECOND WEEK, PRECIPITATING A TOTAL COLLAPSE OF REGIONAL STABILITY AND SIGNALING THE DEFINITIVE TRANSITION TO A POWER-BASED INTERNATIONAL ORDER OVER THE RULE OF LAW.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 6, 2026, marks a watershed moment in the "Epic Fury" campaign as the conflict expands into a multi-front regional war with global economic consequences. The joint US-Israeli operation has achieved a [complete decapitation](#) of the Iranian leadership, including the confirmed death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei on the war's first day. While the Pentagon claims to have established [air superiority](#) over Iran, the regime continues to execute a "cost-imposition" strategy, utilizing low-cost Shahed drones and ballistic missiles to target military and civilian infrastructure across the Gulf, specifically in Kuwait, the UAE, and Qatar. The war has effectively [paralyzed the Strait of Hormuz](#), through which one-fifth of the world's oil passes, leading to immediate spikes in global

energy prices and a massive logistical redirection of shipping around the Cape of Good Hope.

The conflict is increasingly characterized by the deployment of emerging technologies, most notably the use of [artificial intelligence to generate "kill lists"](#) for targeting Iranian assets. Simultaneously, the humanitarian situation in Lebanon has reached critical levels as Israel expands its ground and air operations against Hezbollah, resulting in the [displacement of over 500,000](#) civilians in the Beirut area alone. Politically, the war is driving a wedge through European and NATO alliances; Germany has notably pivoted toward US-led "pragmatism," while Spain remains a vocal critic of the [legality of the intervention](#). This shift suggests the administration is successfully leveraging military momentum to coerce allied alignment, even as domestic skepticism in the US grows ahead of the midterm elections.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Naval and Indian Ocean Escalation:** For the first time since World War II, a US submarine [torpedoed an enemy vessel](#), the IRIS Dena, in international waters off Sri Lanka. This confirms the conflict's expansion beyond the Persian Gulf and signals the US intent to target Iranian assets globally.
- **Lebanese Humanitarian Crisis:** Israel has issued blanket evacuation orders for Beirut's southern suburbs, threatening to turn the [Dahieh district into a "wasteland"](#) similar to Gaza. Lebanese authorities report an unprecedented humanitarian disaster with hundreds of thousands sleeping in streets and cars during Ramadan.

- **Iranian Succession Crisis:** With Khamenei dead, a power struggle is emerging between his son, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#), and more moderate figures like Hassan Khomeini. The lack of a confirmed successor complicates US hopes for an "unconditional surrender."
- **The Kurdish Wildcard:** Reports suggest the CIA is [coordinating with Kurdish forces](#) (Pejak/PKK offshoots) for a potential ground offensive into northwestern Iran. Turkey has expressed extreme concern that this could revitalize Kurdish separatist aspirations across its own borders.
- **Ukraine-Hungary Conflict:** Taking advantage of the global focus on Iran, tensions between Ukraine and Hungary have escalated over the [Druzhba oil pipeline](#). Hungarian authorities seized \$82 million in gold and cash from Ukrainian security vans, leading to accusations of "hostage-taking."

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

AI and Technological Warfare:

- The Pentagon is utilizing the "Claude" chatbot by Anthropic to analyze [gazillions of terabytes of intelligence](#) data, enabling rapid target selection and "patterns of life" analysis in Iran.

- European gas prices could surge [by as much as 130%](#) if the disruption persists, as Qatar's LNG exports are blocked by the Strait's closure.
- Russia is the primary economic beneficiary, with oil prices potentially [adding \\$4.8 billion monthly](#) to the Kremlin's war chest.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics:

- German Chancellor Friedrich Merz's visit to Washington signals a [historic abandonment](#) of the "international law" rhetoric that has defined German foreign policy since the Holocaust.
- Trump has threatened to [cut off trade with Spain](#) due to its refusal to increase defense spending to 5% of GDP and its criticism of the Iran war.
- Turkey remains the only NATO capital [capable of speaking to both](#) Washington and Tehran, though its neutrality is strained by Iranian missiles encroaching on its airspace.

Cybersecurity:

- Iran is expected to launch massive [cyber retaliation](#) against Western industrial control systems, drawing on two decades of experience in targeting utilities and infrastructure.
- Hacktivist groups are currently the most active, though identifiable [state-backed Iranian activity](#) remains obscured by the nationwide internet blackout.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance activity has been dominated by executive actions and emergency diplomatic maneuvering as the administration bypasses traditional legislative oversight to prosecute the war.

- **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **War Powers Resolution:** A move in Congress to [curtail the President's authority](#) to wage war in Iran failed as enough Republicans remained loyal to the administration.
- **3.5% NATO Spending Target:** Discussions in the Oval Office regarding a [new defense spending floor](#) for NATO members, with the US pushing for 5% and punishing dissenters.

- **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Pete Hegseth Briefing:** The US Defense Secretary announced that [air dominance](#) has been established over Iran within four days, contrasting it with Russia's four-year failure in Ukraine.
- **White House Press Points:** Spokesperson Caroline Leavitt addressed [mounting criticism](#) regarding the firing of Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem and reports of arming Kurdish militias.
- **Friedrich Merz Press Point:** The German Chancellor acknowledged the ["dilemma"](#) of international law while ultimately aligning with US military objectives.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Erasure of International Law: The current conflict serves as the definitive end to

the post-Cold War era of "rules-based order." The US and Israel have dismissed questions of legality by citing "imminent danger," a [claim traditionally used](#) to bypass UN Security Council mandates. More significant is the reaction of "middle powers" like Germany. Historically the staunch defenders of international law, German leadership now views [legal adherence as a "lecture"](#) that should not be given to allies during wartime. This suggests a global shift where military might and strategic alignment are the only recognized currencies of sovereignty.

The "Cost-Imposition" War: While the US and Israel possess overwhelming conventional and technological superiority, Iran is fighting an asymmetric war designed to bleed the Western coalition. By using [cheap Shahed drones](#) to force the expenditure of expensive Patriot interceptors, Iran aims to deplete Western munitions stocks. Furthermore, by targeting Gulf civilian infrastructure, Tehran is attempting to force [US allies \(UAE, Saudi Arabia, Qatar\)](#) to pressure Washington for a ceasefire. The strategy relies on the assumption that Western "will" is more fragile than the Iranian regime's "resilience."

AI as the Primary Combatant: This war represents the first conflict where target selection is dominated by [AI-driven data crunching](#). The transition from "human-in-the-loop" to AI-recommended "kill lists" significantly accelerates the tempo of warfare but creates a legal and ethical vacuum regarding accountability for "random casualties." The [Pentagon's designation](#) of AI companies as national security risks if they refuse military cooperation underscores the total integration of the private tech sector into the modern war machine.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect an [internet blackout](#) in Iran to persist as the regime attempts to suppress internal dissent and coordinate succession. Civil unrest may spike in ethnic minority regions (Kurdistan, Sistan and Baluchestan) if reports of [US-backed militias](#) prove true.
- European energy costs will continue to climb, likely triggering [government subsidies](#) or industrial curtailments as gas storage levels hit historic lows.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The US Midterm elections will be a referendum on the war. If US casualties [continue to mount](#) and gas prices remain at \$100+ per barrel, the MAGA base may fracture, potentially leading to a [re-evaluation of the war's scope](#) by the administration.
- Ukraine may face a critical [shortage of air defense](#) interceptors as US production is diverted to protect Gulf allies and Israel from Iranian salvos.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- A permanent reconfiguration of the Middle Eastern security architecture is likely. If the Iranian regime falls, the resulting power vacuum could lead to a [protracted civil war](#) or the installation of an authoritarian military junta, rather than a democratic transition.
- Global trade may permanently shift away from geographic choke points, with heavy investment in [overland pipelines](#) in Saudi Arabia and the UAE to bypass the Strait of Hormuz.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Establish an ["off-ramp" diplomatic channel](#) via Turkey or Oman to prevent total state collapse in Iran, which would trigger a refugee crisis of millions into Europe and Turkey.
- Prioritize the [securing of LNG supplies](#) for Europe from non-Gulf sources (US, Norway, West Africa) to mitigate the loss of Qatari volumes.
- Re-evaluate [AI governance frameworks](#) to address the "accountability gap" created by AI-led targeting in high-intensity conflicts.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Resilience:** Multinational firms should prepare for a [sustained "Cape of Good Hope" route](#) becoming the new shipping standard for the foreseeable future, necessitating higher inventory levels and longer lead times.
- **Commodity Hedges:** Investors should hedge against sustained [high energy and fertilizer prices](#), as the Gulf remains the primary source for global fertilizer and petrochemicals.
- **Defense Sector Growth:** Expect a surge in demand for [low-cost fighter jets](#) (like the JF-17) and drone-interception technology as regional powers seek to militarize independently of US constraints.
