





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IRAN ESCALATES "WAR OF

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 6, 2026, marks a pivotal escalation in what Iranian state media has termed the "War of Ramadan," a multi-front conflict involving direct strikes between the Islamic Republic, Israel, and the United States. Following the recent martyrdom of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei—reported to have occurred roughly five days prior—the Iranian military has launched waves 22, 23, and 24 of "Operation True Promise 4." These operations involve heavy missile barrages, including the first use of the Khorramshahr-4 with two-ton warheads and Fattah hypersonic missiles, targeting Tel Aviv, Haifa, and several U.S. regional bases in Kuwait, Jordan, and the UAE. The military command claims to have successfully degraded U.S. and Israeli radar capabilities, reducing warning times for intercepts to less than two minutes.

Domestically, Iran is navigating a high-stakes transition of power. The Assembly of Experts

has convened a historic session to determine the next leader, utilizing the 1989 succession process as a procedural blueprint. This transition occurs against a backdrop of intense mourning and a humanitarian crisis centered on the "Minab School Massacre," where 167 to 180 children were reportedly killed in a U.S./Israeli missile strike. The government is leveraging this tragedy to solidify national unity, while the police have been granted shoot-on-sight orders against looters to maintain order during the conflict. Meanwhile, the global economy is reeling from the effective closure of the Strait of Hormuz, with oil prices surging toward \$100 per barrel and Western analysts warning of an impending "protracted war" that the U.S. may not have the capacity to end on its own terms.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Escalation of Operation True Promise 4

- The IRGC launched Wave 22 and 23 of its offensive, utilizing [Khorramshahr-4 and Fattah missiles](#) against targets in Tel Aviv and Haifa.
- Iranian military officials claim the destruction of [U.S. THAAD radar systems](#) in Jordan, significantly degrading regional missile defense.
- Strikes were confirmed on [U.S. bases in Kuwait](#) (Camp Adairi, Ali Al-Salem) and naval targets in the Persian Gulf.
- Hezbollah joined the offensive, launching [missile and drone strikes](#) on Israeli naval headquarters in Haifa and sites in the Golan Heights.

The Minab School Massacre and Humanitarian Impact

- State media reported the deaths of [167 to 180 children](#) at the Shajareh Tayyibeh elementary school in Minab, attributed to U.S. missile fire.
- Thirteen hospitals have reportedly been bombed, including [Gandi Hospital in Tehran](#), leading to widespread civilian displacement.
- UNICEF and the UN have been formally petitioned by Iran to investigate these [alleged war crimes](#) against non-combatant infrastructure.

Supreme Leadership Succession and Political Transition

- The Assembly of Experts is in a [critical session](#) to elect a successor to Ayatollah Khamenei, with debates centering on individual vs. council leadership.
- Official statements clarified that Khamenei left [no specific successor mandate](#), placing the full responsibility on the Assembly's Committee of Inquiry.
- The government reacted fiercely to U.S. President Trump's claims that the U.S. should [have a role](#) in choosing the next leader.

Global Energy and Economic Shock

- Brent crude prices have spiked to [nearly \\$91 per barrel](#), with analysts predicting a rise to over \$100 if the Strait of Hormuz remains contested.
- Dozens of oil and gas tankers are [reportedly stranded](#) in the Persian Gulf as insurance companies cancel maritime coverage.

- Domestic economic measures include the activation of [1 million toman food coupons](#) for citizens and the extension of all legal tax deadlines.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession and Stability The death of the Supreme Leader has triggered the most significant test of the Islamic Republic's governance structure since 1989. The Assembly of Experts is emphasizing [constitutional adherence](#) to prevent a vacuum of power. While historical archives are being aired to educate the public on the transition process, the current council must navigate the added pressure of an active war. High-ranking members have dismissed the possibility of a "temporary" leader, seeking a [permanent appointment](#) to project strength to foreign adversaries.

National Security and Domestic Order Internal security has been heightened to prevent civil unrest or "fifth column" activities during the succession. General Radan, the national police chief, issued a [direct shoot-to-kill order](#) for looters attempting to exploit the chaos. Simultaneously, the Ministry of Intelligence has asked citizens to report [suspicious movements](#) or foreign drone sightings to the 113 hotline, indicating concerns over domestic infiltration and sabotage.

Geopolitical Power Dynamics The war has created a rift between the U.S. and its regional allies. Reports suggest [Saudi Arabia and the UAE](#) are pressuring Washington to halt the conflict due to the unsustainable economic costs and the threat to their own infrastructure. Conversely, Iran is strengthening its "Axis of Resistance," with the Iraqi resistance attacking U.S. bases in

[northern Iraq and Syria](#) in coordination with Tehran.

Cognitive Warfare and Social Cohesion A significant portion of the state narrative is dedicated to "cognitive defense." Intellectuals like Dr. Bijan Abdolkarimi warned against the [artificial reality](#) of social media, claiming that "robotic" dissent in the virtual world does not reflect the "reality of the streets." The state is promoting a narrative of "sacred anger," where the death of children and the Leader has supposedly [unified even those](#) who were previously critical of the government.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative and quasi-legislative activity is currently dominated by emergency decrees and the Assembly of Experts' deliberations on the nature of the state's highest office. The normal legislative calendar of the Majlis has been superseded by war-time administrative orders and succession committee meetings.

- **Succession Committee Deliberations:** The Assembly of Experts is reviewing the "Inquiry Committee" findings to vet candidates for the [Supreme Leadership](#) based on religious and political merit.
- **Tax Deadline Extension:** The Tax Organization announced a [blanket extension](#) of all legal deadlines for businesses and individuals due to the state of war.
- **Judiciary Contingency:** The Chief of the Judiciary, Mohseni-Ejei, has mandated [24-hour judicial shifts](#) in all districts to ensure legal services and internal security are maintained without interruption.

- **Subsidy Activation:** The Ministry of Cooperatives activated the [March electronic coupon](#) system earlier than scheduled to stabilize the domestic food market.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Transition to a "Protracted War" Strategy Iran has abandoned the concept of short-term de-escalation in favor of a [long-term war of attrition](#). The military leadership claims to have prepared for a "decades-long" conflict if necessary, aimed at permanently altering the regional security architecture. This is evidenced by the methodical targeting of [U.S. radar and surveillance](#) nodes rather than just civilian or symbolic targets, suggesting a sophisticated plan to "blind" Western forces in the Middle East.

Sacralization of the Conflict The timing of the war during Ramadan and the death of the Leader has allowed the state to frame the struggle in [highly religious terms](#). By naming the current campaign the "War of Ramadan" and using religious code words like "Ya Hossein," the regime is successfully mobilizing its core base. The narrative of "martyrdom" is being applied not just to soldiers but to the [children of Minab](#), creating a powerful emotional barrier against domestic criticism of the war's costs.

Economic Weaponization of the Strait Tehran is using its control over the Strait of Hormuz as a strategic lever to force global intervention on its terms. By allowing [tanker insurance to fail](#) and oil prices to skyrocket, Iran aims to make the war too expensive for the U.S. electorate and European economies. This "energy lawfare" is intended to divide the Western-led coalition, as evidenced by

[Spanish Prime Minister Sanchez's](#) reported dissent against the legality of the U.S. strikes.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect the Assembly of Experts to finalize a successor or a temporary leadership council to maintain continuity. The military will likely continue Wave 24 and 25 of Operation True Promise 4, with a focus on [closing U.S. airbases](#) in the region through persistent drone and missile harassment. Global oil prices are likely to hit \$110-120 per barrel as the Strait of Hormuz remains a "red zone" for commercial traffic.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): Iran will likely face significant supply chain shortages in non-essential goods, but state-led food and medicine reserves will be used to [prevent large-scale famine](#). The new Supreme Leader will face the challenge of transitioning the country from an emergency war footing to a sustainable "siege economy." If U.S. domestic pressure grows due to energy costs, a ceasefire brokered by [Oman or Qatar](#) may emerge, but only if it includes a formal U.S. withdrawal from certain regional bases.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The conflict is likely to lead to a permanent shift in the regional security architecture. Iran's successful use of [hypersonic and heavy-payload missiles](#) will likely trigger a regional arms race. If the regime survives this "triple shock" (Leader death, war, and economic siege), it will emerge as a battle-hardened regional hegemon with a more centralized, military-aligned leadership.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic channels must shift from "nuclear-only" discussions to a [comprehensive regional de-escalation](#) framework, as the current war has rendered previous JCPOA-style agreements moot.
- The humanitarian crisis in Iran, particularly the [strikes on schools and hospitals](#), will likely become a major focus for UN sanctions against the U.S. and Israel in the Global South.
- Allies of the U.S. in the Persian Gulf (KSA/ UAE) will likely pivot toward [greater neutrality](#) to protect their domestic economic infrastructure from Iranian "punishment" strikes.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Maritime transport through the Persian Gulf and potentially the Red Sea should be considered [uninsurable and highly dangerous](#) for the foreseeable future.
- **Energy Volatility:** Investors should hedge for long-term oil price instability. The era of "cheap energy" is over as long as the [Strait of Hormuz](#) remains a theater of active combat.
- **Compliance and Sanctions:** Companies must prepare for a new, more restrictive layer of "war-time" sanctions that may target third-party countries [mediating or facilitating](#) Iranian energy exports.
