

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## LITHUANIAN NATIONAL SECURITY UNDER PRESSURE AMID GLOBAL ENERGY VOLATILITY AND MIDDLE EAST ESCALATION

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 6, 2026, marks a critical juncture for Lithuanian national security as the release of the annual threat assessment coincides with a destabilizing week-long war in the Middle East. The State Security Department (VSD) and military intelligence have identified a broadening spectrum of hybrid threats from Russia, Belarus, and China, including the unprecedented targeting of Lithuanian minors for recruitment into extremist activities. Domestically, the government is navigating a high-profile corruption scandal within the ruling Conservative party, leading to the resignation of a Member of Parliament, while simultaneously managing the complex evacuation of nearly 200 citizens from the conflict zone in the Middle East.

The escalating conflict between Israel and Iran has triggered a global energy shock, with oil prices surpassing \$90 per barrel due to the blockade of the Strait of Hormuz. This crisis is inadvertently benefiting Russia, which is

seeing increased demand for its energy resources and is reportedly providing intelligence to Tehran to target U.S. and allied assets. Within the European Union, a sharp diplomatic and economic rupture has emerged between Hungary and Ukraine, characterized by the seizure of assets and threats to energy transit, further complicating the Western coalition's unity as the geopolitical focus shifts toward the Persian Gulf.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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#### • National Security Threat Assessment Released

- The 11th annual assessment by the VSD and AOTD highlights Russia and Belarus as the primary existential threats, with a new focus on China's increasing espionage targeting Lithuanian travelers and residents. [Lithuanian citizens](#) are being warned of rising security risks when visiting China due to retaliatory intelligence gathering over Taiwan relations.
- Intelligence officials noted a shift in Russian tactics toward [hybrid attacks](#) and sabotage rather than immediate large-scale conventional warfare, citing the use of "low-cost" recruitment of local citizens for destabilization.

- **Russian Hybrid Warfare and "Parcel Bomb" Plot**

- Authorities have partially completed an investigation into a Russian-backed "terrorist group" that sent [incendiary devices](#) via DHL and DPD to various countries. Five individuals have been charged in Lithuania, including citizens of Ukraine, Russia, and Lithuania.
- The group's activities extended beyond logistics to attempted arson, including a plot targeting an IKEA store in Lithuania.

- **Middle East Conflict and Global Energy Crisis**

- Israel has entered a new phase of its military campaign, conducting [intense air strikes](#) against regime infrastructure in Tehran and Hezbollah targets in Beirut.
- The blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has sent oil prices over \$90, forcing U.S. President Trump to grant [temporary waivers](#) for countries like India to continue importing Russian oil to stabilize global markets.
- Russia is allegedly providing Iran with intelligence on U.S. naval and aviation targets to prolong the conflict and exacerbate the global economic burden.

- **Hungary-Ukraine Diplomatic Rupture**

- Hungary has seized approximately \$80 million in cash and gold from Ukrainian bank employees in transit, alleging [money laundering](#), while Kyiv maintains the funds were part of a legal bank transfer and labels the act "state banditry."
- Prime Minister Viktor Orban has threatened to block all energy and cargo transit to Ukraine unless Kyiv restores Russian oil flow through the Druzhba pipeline.

- **Domestic Political Corruption and Resignation**

- Conservative MP Kazys Starkevičius has resigned his mandate after being questioned as a [special witness](#) in a corruption probe involving the State Plant Service.
- Starkevičius has also suspended his party membership, claiming he wishes to defend himself as a private citizen without the shield of parliamentary immunity.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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### **National Security & Intelligence Operations**

- The recruitment of minors as young as 13-14 for [right-wing extremist](#) and nihilistic neo-Nazi groups has become a primary concern for Lithuanian counter-intelligence.
- The Moscow Patriarchate has been identified for the first time in an annual report as a potential channel for [hostile influence](#) and intelligence gathering within Lithuania.

- Lithuania is actively participating in the evacuation of Baltic citizens from Dubai, utilizing EU-funded flights as regional airspace remains restricted. [Evacuation efforts](#) have successfully repatriated most vulnerable citizens, though logistics remain strained.

### Energy Security and Economic Stability

- The Middle East war has caused a 20-cent per liter jump in [fuel prices](#) in neighboring countries like Germany within 24 hours, leading to a surge of "fuel tourism" to Poland where prices remain lower due to different tax structures.
- Lithuanian officials warn that the current [energy price shock](#) could trigger broader inflation, affecting electricity costs and supply chains if the Hormuz blockade persists.

### Demographics and Military Readiness

- A significant decline in youth health is impacting conscription, with 45% of potential draftees found [unfit for service](#). The primary causes are musculoskeletal issues from sedentary lifestyles and mental health disorders, specifically depression.
- Physical fitness levels among students have dropped by 20% over three decades, leading to calls for daily physical education in schools, though [funding shortages](#) and curriculum constraints hinder implementation.

### Technology and Information Warfare

- The Lithuanian government is debating the [criminalization of disinformation](#) to combat aggressive propaganda, though officials emphasize the need for a "precise mechanism" to avoid infringing on free speech.

- Research indicates that Lithuanians are the most susceptible among the Baltic states to [emotional messaging](#) and are the least likely to verify the information they read.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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The upcoming spring session of the Seimas is expected to be dominated by controversial amendments regarding the governance of the national broadcaster (LRT) and regional defense infrastructure. Additionally, significant constitutional debates are underway regarding the expansion of the franchise in local elections.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **LRT Governance Reform:** Amendments to the law governing the national broadcaster continue to face criticism, with the [Venice Commission](#) signaling that past legislative maneuvers in the Seimas were problematic.
- **16-Year-Old Voting Rights:** The Seimas Committee on Legal Affairs has approved a constitutional amendment to allow [16-year-olds](#) to vote in municipal elections, a move supported by a broad coalition across the political spectrum.
- **Disinformation Criminalization:** Proposals are being discussed to classify the intentional spread of [hostile disinformation](#) as a criminal offense, particularly when it serves the interests of foreign intelligence services.
- **Kapčiamiestis Military Training Ground:** The establishment of a new [training ground](#) in Kapčiamiestis remains a point of friction within the governing coalition, with some partners openly opposing the project despite the Prime Minister's claims of consensus.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **VSD Annual Briefing:** Intelligence chiefs presented the 2026 National Security Threat Assessment to the Seimas, emphasizing the [recruitment of minors](#) and the role of the Moscow Patriarchate in hybrid operations.
- **Government Evacuation Briefing:** The Ministry of Foreign Affairs detailed the [repatriation flights](#) from Dubai and provided updates on citizens remaining in the Persian Gulf conflict zone.
- **Kaziukas Fair Opening:** Local officials marked the opening of the traditional [Kaziukas Fair](#) in Vilnius, highlighting its economic importance for small traders despite regional tensions.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Weaponization of Logistics and Trade

A prominent theme today is the use of civilian logistics networks for kinetic and political ends. The investigation into [parcel bombs](#) sent via DHL/DPD demonstrates how Russian intelligence is exploiting global delivery systems to bypass traditional security perimeters. Similarly, the Hungary-Ukraine dispute over [armored bank vehicles](#) and oil transit shows that cross-border logistics are no longer viewed as neutral infrastructure but as high-stakes bargaining chips in regional power plays. This trend suggests a future where private logistics companies may be forced to implement state-level security screening for all cross-border shipments.

### Youth Vulnerability as a Strategic Weakness

Lithuanian intelligence and health officials are sounding the alarm on a dual-front crisis regarding the younger generation. On one hand, minors are being targeted for [radicalization via social media](#) and gaming platforms by foreign actors. On the other, a "sedentary lifestyle" has rendered nearly half of the youth population [physically unfit](#) for military service. This combination of cognitive vulnerability and physical fragility presents a long-term threat to the "total defense" model that Lithuania aims to maintain against Russian aggression.

### Geopolitical Advantage via Prolonged Chaos

There is a growing analytical consensus that Russia is the primary beneficiary of the Middle East conflict. By reportedly providing [intelligence on U.S. targets](#) to Iran, Moscow is ensuring that Washington remains distracted and economically strained by rising energy costs. This strategy is working: the U.S. has been forced to ease sanctions on Russian oil (via waivers) to prevent a total global economic collapse. The transcripts suggest that the "America First" policy under Trump is struggling to balance isolationist rhetoric with the hard reality of a global energy market that still [depends on Russian stability](#) during Middle Eastern upheaval.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect heightened security at Baltic parcel sorting centers and logistics hubs as more details of the DHL plot emerge. In the Middle East, the humanitarian crisis in Lebanon will likely peak as [evacuation orders](#) displace thousands more, potentially triggering a secondary migration wave toward Europe. Domestic politics in Lithuania will remain volatile as the

Conservative party attempts to contain the fallout from the [Starkevičius resignation](#) before the spring legislative session begins.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The debate over criminalizing disinformation in Lithuania will likely result in new [legal frameworks](#), potentially setting a precedent for other Baltic nations. Global oil prices will likely stabilize only if the U.S. can successfully pressure a "regime change" or "unconditional surrender" from Tehran, as Trump's [rhetoric suggests](#). If the Hormuz blockade remains, Lithuania may face a significant budget deficit as energy subsidies or social payouts are adjusted to combat inflation.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The structural health issues among Lithuanian youth will force a [re-evaluation of conscription](#) standards or the introduction of a hybrid service model that includes cyber or non-physical roles. The diplomatic rift between Hungary and Ukraine could lead to a permanent re-routing of energy infrastructure in Eastern Europe, with Ukraine [bypassing Hungary](#) entirely for transit if relations do not normalize. The Moscow Patriarchate's influence in the Baltics will likely face severe legal restrictions as it is increasingly viewed as a national security threat rather than a religious institution.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Allies must coordinate a unified response to the [Hungary-Ukraine dispute](#) to prevent Russia from exploiting cracks in the EU's energy and financial policy.

- NATO should establish a specialized task force to monitor and secure [civilian logistics chains](#) (DHL, DPD, etc.) against state-sponsored incendiary and biological threats.
- Diplomatic pressure should be applied to China to clarify its intent regarding the [targeting of foreign residents](#) for intelligence gathering, as this directly threatens international business and academic exchange.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Volatility:** Investors should hedge against prolonged [high energy prices](#) as the Persian Gulf conflict shows no signs of rapid de-escalation; the blockade of Hormuz remains a catastrophic tail risk.
- **Supply Chain Risk:** Companies relying on transit through Hungary or Ukraine must diversify [logistics corridors](#) immediately, as the risk of "state-led asset seizure" or transit blockades has increased significantly.
- **Youth Resilience Markets:** There is a growing investment opportunity in private fitness and [youth health programs](#) in the Baltics, as state capacity fails to address the physical readiness gap required for national security.
