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## AFGHANISTAN-PAKISTAN CONFLICT ESCALATES INTO MAJOR BORDER WAR AS ISLAMIC EMIRATE LAUNCHES OPERATION RAD-UL- ZULM AMIDST REGIONAL CRISIS

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 6, 2026, marks a definitive shift in the security architecture of Central and South Asia as the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan (IEA) transitioned from border skirmishes to a coordinated, multi-province military offensive titled "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm" (Repelling Oppression). Triggered by Pakistani airstrikes that reportedly killed women and children in Khost, Paktika, and Nangarhar provinces, the IEA launched a massive counter-offensive across 28 points along the Durand Line. State media reports claim substantial tactical successes, including the seizure of 64 Pakistani military posts and seven bases over the course of a week-long escalation, culminating in high-casualty figures for Pakistani forces. This military action is being reinforced by a massive domestic mobilization campaign, with state-sanctioned rallies across nearly every major Afghan province, signaling the IEA's intent to utilize the conflict as a

mechanism for internal cohesion and nationalist fervor.

Simultaneously, the regional landscape is being reshaped by a catastrophic escalation in the Middle East. Following the reported death of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, Iran has launched widespread retaliatory strikes against Israel and United States interests across the region, including attacks on targets in Saudi Arabia, Qatar, and Azerbaijan. This broader instability provides a critical backdrop for the IEA-Pakistan conflict, with Afghan officials and commentators increasingly framing the Pakistani military regime as an "agent" of Zionist and American interests. Amidst this two-front volatility, diplomatic channels remain narrow but active, with Malaysia emerging as a primary mediator between Kabul and Islamabad, while the IEA attempts to maintain economic stability through continued railway trade with Iran and diplomatic normalization efforts in Europe, specifically Germany.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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#### Execution of Operation Rad-ul-Zulm

- The IEA Ministry of Defense reported that within a 24-hour window, Afghan forces [killed 109 Pakistani soldiers](#) and wounded 148 others during intense clashes across Kandahar, Nangarhar, Kuner, Khost, Paktia, and Paktika provinces.
- Military officials claim to have captured [14 enemy posts](#) and three bases in a single night of operations, seizing hundreds of weapons and destroying more than ten military vehicles.

- Air defense units reportedly [downed a Pakistani surveillance drone](#) in the Momand Dara district of Nangarhar, while total enemy losses for the week are cited at 64 posts and seven bases [captured or destroyed](#).
- IEA forces conducted deep strikes into Pakistani territory, reportedly [attacking the general command](#) and barracks in the Kuchlagh area of Balochistan.

### Regional Conflagration and the Death of Khamenei

- State media reports a massive expansion of the Middle East conflict, noting that Hezbollah launched operations against Israel following the [death of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei](#).
- Iran has extended its missile and drone strikes beyond Israel, targeting [luxury hotels housing US military personnel](#) in various Persian Gulf nations and Azerbaijan.
- Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi stated that Tehran is [prepared for a ground war](#) with the United States as casualties from joint US-Israeli strikes on Iran exceed 1,200 civilians.

### Diplomatic Mediation and International Engagement

- Malaysian Prime Minister Anwar Ibrahim held a high-level [telephone call with Mullah Mohammad Hassan Akhund](#), offering to mediate the IEA-Pakistan conflict through diplomatic channels.
- The IEA has successfully established a diplomatic presence in Germany, with the [consulate in Bonn](#) beginning the distribution of over 4,000 passports to Afghan residents in Europe.

- A Turkish humanitarian foundation (IHH) met with Foreign Minister Muttaqi to discuss [expanding aid projects](#) and future development programs within Afghanistan.

### Domestic Mobilization and Civil Unrest

- Thousands of citizens and religious scholars held massive [protests at the Eidgah Mosque](#) in Kabul, condemning Pakistani "war crimes" and declaring readiness for front-line deployment.
- In Ghor, Kapisa, and Logar provinces, residents participated in state-organized rallies, [pledging blood and resources](#) to defend the Islamic Emirate against foreign aggression.
- Youth groups in Paktika and Nangarhar provinces organized [front-line iftars](#) for IEA soldiers to boost morale during the month of Ramadan.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### National Security and Border Integrity

The IEA has shifted its defensive posture to an "active defense" model, asserting a "legitimate right" to strike back against cross-border aggression. The Ministry of Defense is emphasizing its [professionalism and tactical superiority](#) over the Pakistani military, contrasting its low casualty rates with significant Pakistani losses. This narrative is intended to project state capacity and discourage further Pakistani incursions. Military leaders are signaling that the conflict [will not be confined](#) to the border, threatening targets in Islamabad and other major Pakistani cities if hostilities continue.

### Economic Security and Trade Continuity

Despite the state of war, the IEA is prioritizing the continuity of trade to prevent domestic economic collapse. The Khwaf-Herat railway

remains a critical lifeline, with [94 wagons of commercial goods](#) arriving from Iran recently. Governance efforts are also focused on internal market stability; the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Commerce have [warned traders against price gouging](#) of essential goods and instructed unions to regulate house rents to protect the population during the crisis.

**International Relations and Strategic Alignment** Kabul is leveraging its independence from Western influence as a mark of sovereign legitimacy. IEA commentators are [comparing their struggle](#) to that of the residents of Gaza, portraying Pakistan as a "proxy" for the same forces (US/Israel) currently attacking Iran. This alignment suggests the IEA is positioning itself within a broader regional "resistance" bloc. Meanwhile, engagement with Kyrgyzstan and the [normalization of consular services](#) in Germany indicate a sophisticated two-track foreign policy: ideological warfare against neighbors combined with pragmatic technical cooperation with distant powers.

**Domestic Stability and Social Order** The conflict with Pakistan is being used to bridge ethnic and sectarian divides. State media highlighted the participation of the [Shia community in Kabul](#) in anti-Pakistan rallies, presenting a united front of "all ethnicities and religions" in support of the Emirate. This internal cohesion is bolstered by religious framing, with the Ministry of Hajj and Religious Affairs [dedicating Friday sermons](#) to supporting the military and the state, effectively merging religious duty with national defense.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative and policy activity on March 6 was largely focused on crisis management and the regulation of the domestic economy during wartime conditions. The IEA is using administrative decrees to prevent internal exploitation of the conflict.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Rent and Price Control Directive:** Issued by the Minister of Justice to [prevent the increase of house rents](#) and the hoarding of primary materials. The policy mandates unions to coordinate with state agencies to fix prices.
- **Consular Service Normalization (Bonn):** A policy shift allowing the [distribution of passports](#) through the Afghan consulate in Germany, marking a significant step in the administration's push for international recognition through technical services.
- **Administrative Commission Resolutions:** Led by Deputy PM Abdul Salam Hanafi, the commission reviewed [urban development and interior ministry](#) reports to ensure state functions continue uninterrupted by border hostilities.

### HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Ministry of Defense Military Briefing:** Spokesman Enayatullah Khwarazmi detailed the results of "Operation Rad-ul-Zulm," asserting [significant territorial gains](#) and high enemy casualties.
- **Kabul City Municipal Presser:** Officials announced a [35-million-AFN project](#) to install waste bins and improve city sanitation, an effort to project a sense of "business as usual" governance.

- **IEA Spokesman Trade Briefing:** Zabiullah Mujahid confirmed that trade with [Central Asian countries](#) and Iran is proceeding normally via rail, dismissing rumors of border closures affecting food supplies.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Gaza-Iran-Afghanistan Narrative Synthesis** A primary theme emerging from the transcripts is the IEA's aggressive narrative synthesis of the Gaza conflict, the Iran-Israel escalation, and the Afghan-Pakistan war. By framing Pakistan's military as a direct [imitator of Benjamin Netanyahu and Donald Trump](#), the IEA is attempting to delegitimize the Pakistani state in the eyes of the global Muslim community (the Ummah). **State Legitimacy via Defense and Public Spectacle** The IEA is successfully utilizing the conflict to reinforce its domestic mandate. The repetitive coverage of [thousands of protestors](#) across disparate provinces—including historically restive areas like Badakhshan and Ghor—suggests a highly effective state propaganda apparatus. This mobilization is not merely about defense; it is a public validation of the IEA's "security achievement." By inviting citizens to the "front lines" [under the command of the Amir al-Mu'minin](#), the state is tightening the bond between the population and the military leadership.

**Strategic Resilience in the Face of Sanctions** The IEA is signaling high economic resilience. The emphasis on [domestic investment in mining](#) and the maintenance of railway links with Iran despite regional chaos suggests the administration has contingency plans for isolation. The meeting with [Kyrgyzstan's trade attaché](#) further indicates a strategy of deepening ties with non-Western, regional neighbors to bypass traditional trade routes that may be blocked by Pakistan.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect continued high-intensity skirmishes along the Durand Line as Pakistan attempts to [retake lost posts](#). The IEA is likely to deploy "Special Forces" units (Badri 313 or similar) to hold these positions.
- Increased domestic pressure within Pakistan as political parties like the JUI-F [urge negotiations](#) to prevent a total breakdown of the Pakistani state's authority in border regions.
- Refugee flows from border districts will strain IEA resources, with [66,000 people already displaced](#) in the east.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- If the Iran-Israel conflict persists, the IEA may formalize a more overt security relationship with Tehran, potentially coordinating border security to manage [US-affiliated threats](#).
- The success of the Bonn consulate model may lead to further [technical recognition](#) in other European capitals, as the IEA demonstrates it can provide essential services to the diaspora better than the previous administration.

## Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The Durand Line may cease to exist as a functional border if the IEA maintains control of captured posts, leading to a [de facto territorial expansion](#) and a permanent shift in regional maps.
- Pakistan's internal stability could fracture significantly; as one analyst noted, the state [faces the risk of disintegration](#) if it remains in a prolonged state of "total war" with a resilient and ideologically unified Afghanistan.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- Monitor Malaysian and Turkish mediation efforts as they represent the most viable [de-escalation channels](#) that the IEA respects.
- Prepare for a massive humanitarian crisis; the closure of Pakistani markets and schools in [Khyber Pakhtunkhwa](#) and eastern Afghanistan will necessitate immediate aid intervention that bypasses the combat zones.
- Recognize the shifting center of gravity in the region; the IEA's military successes suggest that traditional assumptions about Pakistani military dominance in Central Asia [are being overturned](#).

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Diversify away from the Torkham and Chaman border crossings. The Khwaf-Herat railway is currently the [most stable logistics route](#) for moving goods into Afghanistan.

- **Energy Sector Opportunity:** The IEA is aggressively seeking solar and [renewable energy contracts](#) to offset power shortages caused by regional war; recent multi-megawatt agreements suggest an opening for resilient regional investors.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Be aware of new [price control mandates](#); firms operating in the food or real estate sectors must align with IEA Ministry of Justice directives to avoid assets being seized under wartime "anti-hoarding" laws.
