

NEW MILITARY DOMINANCE IN THE
WESTERN HEMISPHERE

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 7, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in the eight-day war between the United States, Israel, and Iran. The conflict has transitioned into a "Phase Two" campaign of [coercive air and maritime operations](#) aimed at degrading Iran's command and control, while the White House insists on nothing less than unconditional surrender. Despite US claims of military dominance—including the reported destruction of the Iranian Navy and 60% of its missile launchers—Tehran has successfully [externalized the costs of war](#) through a decentralized drone strategy that has paralyzed the Persian Gulf. A verified drone strike at Dubai International Airport and the partial closure of regional airspace have signaled that no "oasis of stability" remains immune to the conflict.

Simultaneously, the US administration is leveraging the global crisis to reassert an aggressive "strategic denial" policy in the

Western Hemisphere. During the "Shield of the Americas" summit in Miami, President Trump unveiled the [Dunroe Doctrine](#), a militarized successor to the Monroe Doctrine, while launching a new military coalition (A3C) to use lethal force against drug cartels. This dual-front posture—pursuing regime change in the Middle East while formalizing military interventions in Latin America—represents a historic expansion of US executive war powers and a departure from decades of multilateral diplomacy.

The economic fallout is now tangible. Global oil prices are trending toward [\\$150 a barrel](#) as production shuts down in Qatar and Kuwait, and the Strait of Hormuz remains effectively impassable for non-neutral vessels. Domestically, the UK is increasingly drawn into the theater, with the HMS Prince of Wales placed on [advanced readiness](#) and US B1 bombers using RAF Fairford as a launchpad. Amidst this geopolitical chaos, the death of notorious UK murderer Ian Huntley in prison serves as a brief focal point for domestic social order concerns, while breakthroughs in "biocomputing" and AI-driven medical research hint at a technological future that contrasts sharply with the day's violent reality.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The US-Israel Offensive and Iranian Resilience

- The conflict has entered its second week with the US and Israel striking over [3,000 targets](#) across Iran, including oil depots and the Mehrabad airport in Tehran.
- President Trump has rejected an [apology from Iranian President](#) Masud Pezeshkian, characterizing it as a sign of surrender while vowing to target "new groups of people" for "complete destruction."

- US intelligence reports suggest a [lack of cohesion](#) between Iran's civilian leadership and the IRGC, which continues to launch "pockets" of attacks independently.
- Reports indicate that Russia may be [providing intelligence](#) to Iran on US troop movements, raising fears of a broader proxy war involving major powers.

Gulf State Paralysis and Energy Security

- A drone strike near [Dubai International Airport](#) forced a temporary suspension of flights, causing widespread panic in the regional financial and tourism hub.
- Qatar and Kuwait have begun [shutting down production](#) because storage facilities are full and the Strait of Hormuz is too dangerous for tankers to transit.
- Saudi Arabia reported intercepting [eight drones](#) targeting the Sheiba oil field, highlighting the persistent threat to energy infrastructure despite intensive US air cover.

UK Military Mobilization and Domestic Discontent

- The HMS Prince of Wales has had its [notice to sail](#) reduced from 14 days to five, signaling a likely deployment to the Mediterranean or the Gulf.
- Five US B1 Lancer supersonic bombers have [landed at RAF Fairford](#) for refueling and reloading, confirming the UK's active role as a logistical hub for the offensive.
- Thousands of protesters [gathered in central London](#) to demand an end to the "illegal and unjustified" attacks, reflecting a growing divide between government policy and public sentiment.

The "Shield of the Americas" and Latin American Alignment

- President Trump announced the formation of the [America's Counter Cartel Coalition](#) (A3C), involving 17 nations committed to using military force against drug traffickers.
- The administration has formally recognized the new Venezuelan government under Delsy Rodriguez and signed a [historic gold deal](#) to facilitate mining sales.
- Trump issued an [imminent threat to Cuba](#), stating the country is "at the end of the line" and that Secretary of State Marco Rubio will handle the "negotiation" for its collapse.

Lebanon and the Third Front

- Israeli special forces carried out a [commando raid](#) in the Bekaa Valley, resulting in at least 40 deaths, reportedly in an attempt to recover the remains of a long-missing aviator.
- The Lebanese death toll has risen to [nearly 300](#) since Monday, with 450,000 people now internally displaced.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security and Economic Resilience

- The Qatari Energy Minister warned that global economies face [unprecedented risk](#) as production stops across the Gulf, with the US offering \$20 billion in [risk insurance](#) for tankers to keep the Strait of Hormuz open.
- Myanmar has begun [fuel rationing](#), requiring half of all private vehicles to stay off the roads to cope with rising costs and supply disruptions.

- The US job market showed signs of strain, [shedding 92,000 jobs](#) in February, an outcome some economists attribute to the "self-inflicted wound" of tariffs and war-related input costs.

Elite Politics and Succession

- Iran's [Assembly of Experts](#) is reportedly meeting within 24 hours to choose a successor to Ayatollah Khamenei, with significant uncertainty regarding the health and whereabouts of his son, Mojtaba.
- President Trump has explicitly stated his intent to [hand-pick](#) Iran's next leader, warning that any choice unacceptable to him would lead to another war within five years.

National Security and Technology Policy

- Ukrainian drone commanders are [advising Gulf nations](#) on using low-cost "interceptor" drones to combat Iranian Shahed drones, which are saturating regional air defenses.
- A controversial research paper, [AI 2027](#), has sparked global debate by predicting that artificial general intelligence (AGI) could lead to the eradication of humanity by 2040 if not properly aligned.
- Researchers in London and Japan are developing [biocomputers](#) that consume significantly less energy than silicon-based systems, a potential breakthrough for AI infrastructure.

Domestic Stability and the Rule of Law

- The [death of Ian Huntley](#) in HMP Frankland has raised urgent questions about prison safety and the rising levels of violence within high-security facilities.

- In Nepal, former rapper [Balen Shah](#) has defeated the established political guard to become Prime Minister, signaling a youth-led shift in South Asian politics.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Policy action today has been dominated by US executive proclamations and emergency rationing measures in secondary markets. The shift toward bilateral "deals" over formal treaties continues to define the current US administration's approach to international law.

- **America's Counter Cartel Coalition (A3C) Proclamation:** A [founding document](#) signed in Miami that commits signatory nations to the use of lethal military force against non-state narco-terrorist organizations.
- **US-Venezuela Gold Deal:** A [legal recognition](#) of the Rodriguez government coupled with a framework for the US-supervised sale of Venezuelan gold and minerals.
- **Myanmar Emergency Fuel Act:** A military decree [enforcing rationing](#) based on license plate numbers to manage the country's collapsing energy reserves.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Air Force One Impromptu Presser:** President Trump [dismissed the idea](#) of Kurds carving out an autonomous region in Iran and blamed Tehran for the Minab school bombing without providing evidence.

- **UK Chief of Defense Staff Interview:** Sir Richard Knighton [defended the UK's readiness](#) and confirmed that US bombers are operating from British bases for "defensive" missions.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Cheap Tech

The conflict highlights a fundamental asymmetry in modern warfare. Iran is using [Shahed-136 drones](#), which cost approximately \$35,000, to force regional defenders to fire \$4 million Patriot missiles. This "cost-imposition strategy" is successfully draining the interceptor stockpiles of Western allies. The resulting reliance on [Ukrainian expertise](#) to develop cheaper counter-drone tactics suggests that the future of air defense is shifting away from high-cost aerospace conglomerates toward agile, software-defined systems.

Strategic Denial and the New Interventionism

Under the "Dunroe Doctrine," the US is moving to [systematically exclude](#) Chinese and Russian influence from the Western Hemisphere. The pivot from "policing" to "lethal military force" against cartels, combined with the rapid installation of preferred regimes in Venezuela and (potentially) Cuba, indicates a return to a more aggressive, unilateral US foreign policy. This trend is causing [humiliation for European allies](#), who find themselves sidelined in a world order where "politics is at the end of the barrel of a gun."

Information Warfare and the Sovereignty of Truth

The internet blackout in Iran has created a [vacuum of information](#), where state propaganda and diaspora narratives compete for dominance. This theme extends to the UK, where artist Tracy Emin expressed fears that [AI-generated "truth"](#) is eroding the foundation of society. The day's events suggest that controlling the narrative is now as strategically important as controlling the skies, with Gulf nations [arresting hundreds](#) for spreading "rumors" during the missile alerts.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a [clash of authority](#) in Tehran as the Assembly of Experts attempts to name a new Supreme Leader while the IRGC ignores civilian calls for de-escalation.
- The UK's [notice to sail](#) for the HMS Prince of Wales suggests a naval buildup in the Mediterranean is imminent, likely to protect Cyprus or support US carrier groups.
- Oil prices will likely [breach \\$100](#) per barrel as the production cuts in Kuwait and Iraq take full effect on the global market.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- The US may begin [lethal kinetic operations](#) in Mexico or the Caribbean under the A3C framework, significantly shifting the security architecture of the Western Hemisphere.
- Iran's "mosaic defense" system may lead to a [balkanization of the country](#), with different military units controlling different provinces, making any centralized "unconditional surrender" impossible to execute.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- If the US successfully [hand-picks a leader](#) for Iran, the risk of a domestic insurgency against a "vessel" government will remain extremely high, potentially dragging the US into a decade-long stabilization mission.
- The shift toward [biocomputing and AGI](#) will create a new "tech-sovereignty" race, where nations that control biological data centers will replace those that merely control oil.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

- **For International Policy:** Diplomatic channels must bypass the Iranian central government and engage [regional IRGC commanders](#) directly, as the decentralized nature of the "mosaic defense" means the interim council in Tehran has lost operational control of the war.
- **For International Policy:** European nations should [refocus on Ukraine](#), as the US pivot to Iran and Latin America has redirected the missile interceptors and intelligence assets necessary to deter Russian aggression in Europe.
- **For International Policy:** The UN must prepare for a [mass displacement crisis](#) originating from both Iran and Lebanon, as current shelter systems are "overstretched and underfunded" following US aid cuts.
- **For Private Sector/Investors:** Supply chain managers should [seek alternatives to Gulf transit](#) immediately; despite US insurance offers, the physical security of vessels cannot be guaranteed against \$35,000 drones.

- **For Private Sector/Investors:** Mining and energy firms should monitor the [Venezuelan gold and oil sectors](#) for entry points, as the US-Rodriguez deals represent a high-risk but high-reward opening of previously sanctioned markets.
- **For Private Sector/Investors:** Tech firms must prioritize [content authentication tools](#), as the proliferation of "unreal" AI imagery during the war is making it nearly impossible for markets to distinguish between genuine infrastructure damage and psychological warfare.
