





### NIGERIA INITIATES MAJOR STRUCTURAL REFORMS AMIDST ESCALATING GLOBAL CONFLICT AND DOMESTIC ELECTORAL FRICTION

#### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

---

The March 7, 2026, news cycle is dominated by a dual-track narrative: the Nigerian administration's aggressive push for structural governance reforms and a massive escalation in the Middle East conflict. Domestically, the Tinubu administration is attempting to stabilize the nation through the inauguration of an [11-member committee](#) for the Grid Asset Management Company (GAMCO) and a decisive shift toward the implementation of [state police](#), a move framed as necessary to combat persistent insecurity. However, these reformist signals are countered by significant political friction, as the Inter-Party Advisory Council (IPAC) has threatened to [boycott the 2027 elections](#) over controversial clauses in the recently signed Electoral Act 2026. This domestic political tension coincides with government claims of a [50% crash](#) in food prices, a statistic that meets with public skepticism as the

presidency simultaneously admits to a "rough ride" in economic stabilization.

Globally, the security landscape has shifted violently with the commencement of "Operation Epic Fury," a massive US-Israeli [military strike into Iran](#) described as double the scale of the 2003 "Shock and Awe" campaign. The fallout includes widespread disruptions to global aviation, [surging crude oil prices](#), and reports of Iranian-backed retaliatory drone strikes near major hubs like [Dubai International Airport](#). Simultaneously, reports emerge of African nationals being coerced or lured into the [Russia-Ukraine war](#), highlighting the vulnerability of the continent's manpower in protracted global conflicts. Nigeria finds itself at a crossroads, attempting to leverage satellite technology and [broadband penetration](#) for domestic security and election integrity while navigating the economic shocks of a burgeoning regional war in the Middle East.

#### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

---

- **Middle East Escalation: Operation Epic Fury**
  - The US and Israel have launched [unprecedented surgical strikes](#) against Iranian ballistic missile facilities, command centers, and air defenses using B-2 and B-52 bombers.
  - Iran has responded with drone strikes in the Gulf, specifically near [Dubai](#), while apologizing to neighbors for the spillover but maintaining a right to self-defense.
  - The IMF warns that rising [crude oil prices](#) resulting from the conflict could destabilize global inflation targets.

## • Domestic Security and Human Rights Lawfare

- The debate over state police has shifted from theoretical to operational with the [inauguration of a committee](#) by the IGP to define jurisdictional boundaries.
- Civil society groups are demanding [full accountability](#) for alleged human rights violations under former Kaduna Governor Nasir El-Rufai, citing disappearances and extrajudicial killings.
- Security agencies recorded a major win with the arrest of [notorious ESN and IPOB](#) commanders in Enugu State.
- The humanitarian crisis of long-term captives continues, with Leah Sharibu marking her [eighth year in captivity](#) as reports surface of her and other girls being used as slaves by terrorist leadership.

## • Electoral Act 2026 and Political Brinkmanship

- IPAC has denounced the [Electoral Act 2026](#) as "inimical to democracy," specifically citing the removal of indirect primaries and new membership recording requirements.
- Political parties are threatening a [total boycott](#) of the 2027 elections unless the National Assembly initiates immediate amendments.
- INEC officials claim that [BVAS accreditation figures](#) remain a robust safeguard against manual result manipulation, despite network-related transmission delays.

## • Infrastructure and Energy Reform

- The Federal Executive Council approved the [incorporation of GAMCO](#) to manage the national grid and address "stranded power" issues.
- Nasarawa State has exercised new constitutional powers to establish its own [electricity regulatory commission](#), aiming for full industrialization.
- Lagos faces significant [logistical disruptions](#) due to the planned closure of the Berger access road for 4.5km of reconstruction work.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

---

### Energy Security and Grid Decentralization

- The presidency is centralizing grid oversight through the [GAMCO committee](#), led by the Chief of Staff, to attract private capital and discipline asset management.
- States like Nasarawa are moving to [generate and regulate](#) their own mini-grids, taking advantage of the Electricity Act 2023 to bypass federal transmission failures.
- The Alaoji power plant project in Abia State remains [delayed after 20 years](#), highlighting the persistent gap between infrastructure planning and delivery.

### Economic Security and Tax Reform

- The Minister of Agriculture claims food prices have [dropped by 50%](#) due to interventions, though analysts suggest many SMEs will pass [new tax burdens](#) directly to consumers.

- Confusion persists over the alignment of new [informal sector taxes](#) with existing tax laws, with experts calling for legislative harmonization to avoid "multiple taxation."
- The NGX is flagging companies for [price manipulation](#) and low "free floats," warning investors to stick to stocks with strong fundamentals.

### Technology Policy and Digital Sovereignty

- NIGCOMSAT is being positioned as a [critical tool](#) for bridging the 7% connectivity gap in remote areas for real-time election result transmission.
- The government has approved the [launch of six](#) new satellites to enhance security communications and fight poverty through data-driven insights.
- The digital economy currently contributes to a [50% broadband penetration](#) rate, with targets to reach 70% by 2025/2026 appearing increasingly ambitious.

### Rule of Law and Security Architecture

- The [State Police](#) model is being framed as "community policing" to avoid fears of state governors using forces to [oppress political opposition](#).
- A High Court in Abuja has set [stringent bail conditions](#) for military personnel accused of raiding communities, signaling a push for accountability within the armed forces.
- The "Lawfare" against former Governor El-Rufai involves [demands for prosecution](#) regarding the 2018 murder of the Agwam Adara and other high-profile disappearances.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

---

The legislative focus is currently split between finalizing the operational framework for the [Electoral Act 2026](#) and managing the unbundling of the power sector through the [Electricity Act 2023](#). There is significant friction between the executive branch and political party leaders over the restrictive nature of new electoral laws.

### • **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Electoral Act 2026:** Contains provisions that [eliminate indirect primaries](#) and mandate real-time membership recording, leading to threats of a 2027 election boycott by IPAC.
- **Electricity Act 2023:** Empowering states to [regulate their own](#) electricity markets; currently being implemented by Nasarawa and other states.
- **Single-Use Plastic Ban:** A public hearing was organized to discuss the [economic disruption](#) and environmental necessity of banning specific plastics.

### • **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **GAMCO Committee Inauguration:** The Chief of Staff [detailed the mandate](#) to fast-track grid management solutions.
- **IPAC Communique:** National Chairman Yusuf Dantalle issued a [strong warning](#) that the 2026 Act is unconstitutional and exclusionary.
- **White House Consultation:** Reverend Dr. Gideon Paramallan met with US officials to discuss [humanitarian aid](#) and the release of captives like Leah Sharibu.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

---

### The Decentralization of Authority

- A significant trend is the fragmenting of federal monopolies. The push for [state police](#) and the creation of state-level electricity commissions like [NERC \(Nasarawa\)](#) suggests the central government is acknowledging its inability to provide security and power universally. While this may improve local efficiency, it risks creating a "patchwork" republic with unequal law enforcement and energy standards.

### Accountability as a Political Weapon

- The move to investigate [Nasir El-Rufai](#) for human rights abuses, alongside the [auditing of NNPC](#) and demands for refunds, indicates a trend of "accountability lawfare." The administration appears to be using the rhetoric of justice and transparency to manage intra-elite rivalries and sideline potential challengers ahead of the 2027 cycle.

### Digital Warfare and Infrastructure Reliance

- The heavy emphasis on [satellite technology](#) for both elections and security reflects a shift toward technocratic solutions for human problems. By relying on [BVAS and NIGCOMSAT](#), the government seeks to remove "human interference," yet the persistent issues with network coverage and [transmission delays](#) continue to undermine public trust in these digital panaceas.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

---

**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect significant [traffic and economic disruptions](#) in Lagos due to road closures, potentially exacerbating public frustration. Geopolitically, the [IMF's warnings](#) on oil prices will likely manifest in higher local energy costs if the Middle East strikes continue. IPAC will likely intensify its [lobbying efforts](#) in the National Assembly to force an amendment to the Electoral Act.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The formation of [GAMCO](#) should begin to show whether private capital is willing to enter the Nigerian power market. If the [state police](#) steering committee finishes its work, we may see the first pilot programs in states with high insurgency levels, though this will face legal challenges regarding constitutional supremacy. The [Leah Sharibu](#) advocacy may gain renewed international momentum following US-based consultations.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The structural changes to the power sector and police force will define the success or failure of the Tinubu administration. A failure to fix the grid via GAMCO will likely lead to [de-industrialization](#). If the Electoral Act 2026 is not amended, the 2027 elections face a [legitimacy crisis](#) that could lead to widespread civil unrest or a shift toward a one-party state.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

---

### For International Policy:

- Diplomatic efforts should focus on mediating the [electoral law dispute](#) to prevent a total opposition boycott, which would undermine Nigeria's status as a democratic leader in West Africa.

- The recruitment of African [mercenaries for Russia](#) requires a coordinated AU response to prevent the further "hollowing out" of vulnerable populations.
- Support for [satellite-based security](#) could be a point of bilateral cooperation with the US and Israel, provided it is balanced with human rights oversight.

#### **For Private Sector/Investors:**

- Investors in the energy sector should monitor [GAMCO's regulatory framework](#) for opportunities in asset management and grid modernization.
- Stock market participants must exercise caution with [low-float stocks](#) identified by the NGX as susceptible to manipulation.
- Logistics companies should prepare for sustained [inbound/outbound delays](#) in Lagos and factor in potential fuel surcharges due to Middle East volatility.
