OPERATION TRUE PROMISE IV:
IRAN TRANSITIONS TO TOTAL WAR
AND PROVISIONAL GOVERNANCE
FOLLOWING LEADERSHIP
ASSASSINATION

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 7, 2026, marks the eighth day of the "Ramadan War," a high-intensity regional conflict triggered by a joint U.S.-Israeli offensive that successfully assassinated the Supreme Leader of the Islamic Republic, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. Despite the loss of its paramount leader and several top military commanders, the Iranian state has maintained structural integrity under a Provisional Leadership Council established via Article 111 of the Constitution. Tehran has retaliated through "Operation True Promise IV," a multi-theater campaign involving over 26 waves of missile and drone strikes targeting U.S. and Israeli assets across the Middle East. Strategic focus has shifted toward a "war of infrastructure," with Iranian strikes hitting U.S. naval bases in Bahrain, airbases in the UAE and Qatar, and energy facilities, while the Strait of Hormuz has been effectively

closed to "hostile" commercial and military traffic.

The conflict is characterized by a massive escalation in cognitive and economic warfare. Iranian media is actively promoting narratives of U.S. desperation and "moral decay," leveraging inflammatory rumors regarding the U.S. presidency to galvanize domestic support. Economically, the closure of Hormuz has sparked a global energy shock, with oil prices surging and international markets suffering trillions in losses. Domestically, Iran is balancing a state of total mobilization with efforts to maintain civilian normalcy, even as U.S. strikes increasingly target Iranian infrastructure, including water desalination plants and oil refineries. The narrative has transitioned from "strategic patience" to an existential "war of honor," with officials declaring that the conflict will only end with the total expulsion of U.S. forces from the region.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **State Succession and Provisional Governance:** Following the martyrdom of Ayatollah Khamenei, Iran is being governed by a [Provisional Leadership Council](#) comprising President Pezeshkian, Judiciary Chief Mohseni-Ejei, and a jurist from the Guardian Council. The Assembly of Experts is under immense pressure to expedite the selection of a permanent successor to ensure long-term stability.

- **Massive U.S. and Israeli Casualties Claimed:** Iranian military authorities reported the [killing or wounding of over 220 U.S. military personnel](#) in a single day of strikes. High-value targets included the U.S. 5th Fleet in Bahrain and the Al-Dhafra airbase in the UAE. Reports also cited unconfirmed Russian data alleging the deaths of six Israeli generals and 32 Mossad agents during the first three days of the conflict.
- **Operational Escalation of True Promise IV:** The IRGC has launched over 600 [ballistic and cruise missiles](#) in 26 distinct waves. Military spokesmen emphasize that only older missile generations (Qadr, Emad) have been used thus far, with advanced hypersonic assets like the Fattah and multi-warhead Khyber-Shekan missiles reserved for future escalations.
- **Total Maritime Blockade of Hostile Assets:** The IRGC Navy has declared the Strait of Hormuz closed to any vessels affiliated with the U.S., Israel, or their allies. Multiple tankers, including the ["Lewis P" and "Prima,"](#) were targeted by suicide drones for ignoring warnings, effectively paralyzing regional maritime trade.
- **Civilian Infrastructure Targeting:** A U.S. strike on a school in [Minab reportedly killed 175 children](#), an event Tehran is using to frame the coalition as "child-killers." In retaliation, Iran has struck U.S.-linked infrastructure and warned that regional neighbors hosting U.S. bases (UAE, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain) are now legitimate targets.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Elite Politics & Succession Stability: The sudden vacancy in the Supreme Leadership

has triggered the constitutional "Provisional Council" mechanism. While the council manages daily operations and military commands, religious and political elites are calling for an [immediate selection of the "Third Vali-e Faqih"](#) to prevent a vacuum that the U.S. might exploit to incite a "regime change" from within.

Energy Security & Global Markets: The Iranian "energy card" has been fully deployed. Analysts on state media suggest oil could hit [\\$150 per barrel](#) if the Hormuz blockade persists. Domestic energy security is also under threat following a U.S. strike on the [Tehran Oil Refinery](#), though officials claim strategic reserves remain sufficient for months of high-intensity conflict.

Domestic Stability & Social Order: State media is portraying a "rally 'round the flag" effect, claiming that even citizens previously critical of the government have joined [spontaneous nightly rallies](#) to defend the nation. However, the Ministry of Intelligence has issued stern warnings against a ["Fifth Column"](#) filming strike damage for foreign media, indicating concerns over internal subversion.

Information Warfare & Cognitive Ops: Tehran is engaging in aggressive character assassination of the U.S. leadership. State media commentators have amplified bizarre and unverified rumors regarding President Trump's alleged [links to the Epstein case](#) and sensationalist claims of "flesh-eating" rituals to dehumanize the adversary and frame the war as a battle between "Humanity and the Flesh-Eaters."

Regional Power Projection & Alliances: Iran has moved to strike [Kurdish separatist bases in Iraq](#), alleging they are acting as "foot soldiers" for the U.S.-Israeli coalition.

Concurrently, the "Axis of Resistance" in Iraq and Lebanon has been activated, with Iraqi groups targeting [U.S. logistics companies like KBR and Halliburton](#).

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance during the eighth day of the war focuses on administrative flexibility and the emergency legal powers of the Provisional Council to maintain essential services and social order.

• **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Article 111 Implementation:** The legal activation of the [Provisional Leadership Council](#) to exercise the Supreme Leader's powers, including military command and judicial appointments, until a successor is named.
- **Telework and Emergency Labor Policy:** A new [Administrative Directive](#) allows provincial governors to implement teleworking for up to 70% of staff to mitigate the risk of casualties during daytime airstrikes on government buildings.
- **Medical Licensing Extension:** The Ministry of Health and the Medical Council have [automatically extended all medical licenses](#) through April 2026 to ensure the healthcare workforce remains fully active during the crisis.

• **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Presidential Address:** President Pezeshkian delivered a [televised message](#) apologizing to neighbors for regional instability but reiterating that hosting U.S. bases is an act of war against Iran.
- **IRGC Operational Briefing:** Spokesman General Nayini provided a [comprehensive report](#) on the first seven days of the war, claiming the destruction of U.S. THAAD and Patriot radar systems in Qatar, Jordan, and the UAE.
- **Ministry of Intelligence Communiqué:** A formal [warning to the "Fifth Column"](#) regarding the harsh legal penalties (Article 4 of the Law against Cooperation with Hostile States) for sharing military information via social media.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of "Strategic Patience": A dominant narrative in today's transcripts is the formal abandonment of Iran's long-standing policy of restraint. Officials argue that for years, Iran "swallowed" provocations (e.g., the Soleimani and Nasrallah assassinations) to maintain regional peace. The [assassination of the Supreme Leader](#) is presented as the "Red Line" that has moved Iran into a state of "unlimited defense." This shift signals to the international community that Iran is now willing to risk total regional collapse to secure its survival.

The Vulnerability of "Glass Palaces": Iranian rhetoric has specifically targeted the UAE and its economic model. By striking [Al-Dhafra](#) and referencing the vulnerability of Dubai's high-rises and AI data centers, Tehran

is communicating that the Arab Gulf's economic prosperity is entirely dependent on Iranian tolerance. The phrase ["glass palaces"](#) is used as a metaphor for the perceived fragility of regional states that rely on U.S. protection, contrasting it with Iran's "deep-rooted" civilization and underground missile cities.

Cognitive Warfare and Moral Dehumanization: The focus on the [Epstein scandal and bizarre rumors](#) regarding the U.S. president's behavior indicates a highly sophisticated attempt to frame the war in moral and religious terms rather than purely geopolitical ones. By characterizing the enemy as "flesh-eaters" and "abusers of children," Tehran aims to insulate its population from U.S. "soft power" and ensure that any pro-U.S. sentiment is viewed as a moral abomination.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): The primary domestic objective will be the formal selection of the next Supreme Leader. Militarily, expect an escalation in "Infrastructure for Infrastructure" strikes; if Iran's refineries continue to be hit, it will likely launch [non-reversible strikes on Aramco](#) or UAE energy hubs. The humanitarian crisis from the Minab and Tehran strikes will be used to fuel a diplomatic offensive at the UN, led by [Russia and potentially China](#).

Medium Term (1-6 Months): If the war of attrition continues, the global energy shock will likely lead to severe political instability in Western nations ahead of the U.S. November elections. Iran claims to have [stockpiled enough munitions for six months](#) of high-intensity conflict. The "Kurdish front" in Iraq may become a localized land war if separatist

groups attempt to infiltrate Iranian territory under U.S. air cover.

Long Term (1-5 Years): This conflict represents the potential end of the 1945 U.S.-led security architecture in the Persian Gulf. Regardless of the tactical outcome, the psychological barrier to striking U.S. carriers and bases has been broken. A "Strong Iran" scenario would see the [expulsion of U.S. forces](#) and a new regional order where the Arab states are forced to enter a security condominium with Tehran, potentially moderated by Beijing or Moscow.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The "Provisional Council" is currently the primary interlocutor. Diplomatic channels must be established with [President Pezeshkian and the Article 111 Council](#) to discuss de-escalation, as they currently hold the "fire" authority for the IRGC.
- The closure of Hormuz is not a "bluff." Iran has demonstrated the intent and capability to target [Marshall Islands-flagged](#) and U.S.-owned tankers with high precision.
- Monitor Russian-Iranian coordination; the Pezeshkian-Putin call indicates a [strategic alignment](#) where Russia may provide intelligence or satellite data to assist Iranian targeting of U.S. naval assets.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Shock:** With [25,000 regional flights canceled](#) and maritime routes through Hormuz and potentially Bab al-Mandab compromised, global logistics must reroute entirely around the Cape of Good Hope.

- **Energy Volatility:** The threat to [desalination plants and oil infrastructure](#) in the Gulf means that any investments in UAE or Saudi coastal industrial zones carry extreme "war damage" risk.
- **Cyber and Infrastructure Risk:** U.S. data centers in the region (e.g., [Amazon hubs in the UAE](#)) are explicitly named as potential targets for Iranian electronic or physical sabotage.
