

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 7, 2026, marks a pivotal escalation in global instability as the joint U.S.-Israeli military campaign against Iran, dubbed "Operation Epic Fury" (Epski bijes), enters its sixth and seventh days. The conflict has transitioned from targeted strikes to a broader aerial campaign, resulting in significant civilian casualties—including a [strike on a Tehran school](#) that killed 165 students—and a total internet blackout across Iran. The Trump administration has articulated a shifting set of objectives, ranging from the elimination of nuclear and ballistic threats to an explicit desire for regime change, drawing controversial parallels to recent political transitions in Venezuela. The ripple effects are being felt acutely in Europe and the Balkans, where energy prices have surged by [30% within days](#), and diplomatic relations are fraying under the weight of U.S. and Israeli pressure on sovereign states to sever ties with Tehran.

Regional dynamics are further complicated by a breakdown in European Union cohesion. While the Trump administration threatens trade sanctions against dissenters like Spain, the Israeli diplomatic corps has moved to an aggressive posture, with Ambassador Gary Koren demanding that Croatia [sever all diplomatic relations](#) with Iran and investigate alleged "sleeper cells" within its borders. Simultaneously, the Balkan region faces its own internal disruptions: Kosovo's assembly has been dissolved following a failure to elect a president, and Serbia has issued a provocative "traffic light" travel advisory that classifies [Croatia as a high-risk zone](#). This convergence of a major Middle Eastern war, energy insecurity, and aggressive diplomatic realignment suggests a rapid decomposition of the post-WWII international legal order, replaced by a "might makes right" paradigm that analysts warn is a [prelude to global conflict](#).

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### The Middle East Conflict: Operation Epic Fury

- The U.S. and Israel continue a massive aerial campaign targeting central Tehran and various military installations, with the [U.S. Navy sinking](#) an Iranian drone carrier and a regular ratcheting up of strikes on Hezbollah assets in Beirut.
- The Pentagon has officially [denied responsibility](#) for the strike on the Tehran school, asserting that U.S. forces do not target civilian sites, even as local reports confirm over 4,000 structures destroyed across the country.

- Iran has rejected all calls for a ceasefire, with military leaders claiming their [missile arsenals remain filled](#) with advanced weaponry yet to be deployed in the conflict.

### **Balkan Diplomatic Crisis**

- Israeli Ambassador Gary Koren's demand for Croatia to close the Iranian embassy and vet local staff for "Revolutionary Guard spies" has sparked a constitutional row, with President Zoran Milanovic [branding the demands unacceptable](#) and a violation of national sovereignty.
- Serbia has introduced a "travel semafor," placing Croatia in the "orange zone" alongside war-torn regions, a move seen by observers as a [political tool](#) rather than a purely security-based assessment.
- In Kosovo, President Vjosa Osmani [dissolved the assembly](#) and called for early elections after a failure to reach a consensus on the presidency, plunging the state into renewed political uncertainty.

### **Global Energy and Economic Shockwaves**

- The closure or threat to the Strait of Hormuz has led to an immediate [increase in energy costs](#), prompting governments in the Balkans to consider activating strategic oil reserves.
- The U.S. Treasury has issued a [30-day "stop gap" exemption](#) for India to purchase Russian oil currently stranded at sea, illustrating the desperate measures being taken to manage global supply volatility.

## **KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS**

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### **Energy Security & Critical Infrastructure**

- Bosnia and Herzegovina is facing extreme vulnerability due to its total reliance on Russian gas and is being pressured to fast-track the [Southern Interconnection](#) to import U.S. LNG via Croatia.
- Hungary continues to spar with Ukraine over oil transit, with Prime Minister Orban demanding the restoration of flows through the [Druzhba pipeline](#) while refusing to use the Croatian JANAF alternative for Russian crude.

### **International Relations & Bloc Politics**

- The Trump administration is actively seeking to fracture EU consensus on Iran, specifically [threatening Spanish Prime Minister](#) Pedro Sanchez with severed trade ties over his opposition to the strikes.
- Turkey is pursuing a [balancing act](#), condemning the strikes to prevent a refugee influx of millions while maintaining its role as a regional mediator between the West and Russia/Iran.

### **Corruption & Rule of Law**

- In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the procurement of [election scanners](#) is mired in controversy, with opposition leaders alleging that contracts are being funneled to firms linked to ruling parties SNSD and HDZ to facilitate, rather than prevent, electoral fraud.
- Serbia's judiciary is seeing a [purge of independent prosecutors](#)—such as those investigating major drug seizures and high-level corruption—due to the controversial "Mrdic's Laws" which force their return to lower offices.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity today focused heavily on crisis management, judicial restructuring, and local governance adjustments in response to regional instability. High-profile "security laws" in Serbia and administrative shifts in the Sarajevo Canton dominated the domestic agendas.

- **Mrdic's Laws (Serbia):** These regulations have begun causing a [mass exodus of prosecutors](#) from the Office for Organized Crime, effectively stalling investigations into government-linked corruption and large-scale narcotics cases.
- **Vacant Property Fee (Sarajevo Canton):** A new draft law introduces a [lump-sum fee for unused objects](#), shifting the tax burden away from simple square footage to incentivize property utilization.
- **Legalization of Illegal Construction (Sarajevo Canton):** Legislation aimed at [legalizing buildings constructed without permits](#) has been sent for a 20-day public hearing.
- **Femicide Legislation (North Macedonia):** Regional analysts highlighted the 2024 Macedonian law that [classified femicide](#) as a top-tier crime punishable by life imprisonment as a model for neighboring states.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Weaponization of Diplomatic Status

A disturbing trend is emerging where diplomatic missions are no longer acting as bridges but as enforcement arms for aggressive foreign policies. The actions of the Israeli Ambassador in Croatia and the U.S.

threats against Spain signal a shift toward **coercive diplomacy**. By labeling a sovereign EU member's capital as a potential [nest for "sleeper cells"](#) and "spies," the Israeli mission is effectively bypassing traditional state-to-state channels to influence domestic security policy through public alarmism. This mirrors the Serbian "traffic light" travel advisory, where [security assessments](#) are being used as punitive measures against neighbors.

### The "Apocalyptic" Geopolitical Narrative

Analysts are increasingly identifying "apocalyptic" ideological drivers behind the current Middle East escalation. Internal military reports suggest that elements within the U.S. command structure are framing the conflict through the lens of ["Christian Zionism,"](#) while Israeli hardliners pursue a "Greater Israel" agenda and Iranian leaders invoke the "Return of the Absent Imam." This [clash of theological visions](#) complicates traditional rational-actor models of diplomacy, as parties view the conflict not merely as a territorial or political dispute, but as a predestined civilizational struggle.

### The Fragility of the "Normalcy" Facade

Despite massive air strikes, reports from inside Tehran describe a [bizarre state of normalcy](#) where shops remain open and fruit is well-stocked, even as "thick black smoke" billows over the city. This suggests either a high degree of state-controlled narrative management or a civilian population that has become entirely desensitized to kinetic warfare. However, the [internet blackout](#) suggests the Iranian state is preparing for a transition to more desperate defensive measures or expects internal unrest that it must hide from the global eye.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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### Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a **dramatic spike in fuel prices** across Europe as the "three-week lag" of tankers from the Persian Gulf concludes and the reality of the Hormuz blockade hits European ports. [Strategic reserves](#) will likely be tapped by mid-March.
- The **evacuation of foreign nationals** from the Gulf region will accelerate; Bosnia has already [allocated 800,000 KM](#) for charter flights to retrieve its citizens.

### Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- A **massive migration wave** is anticipated. If the Iranian regime begins to destabilize, millions could move through Turkey and into the "Balkan Route," potentially triggering the [radicalization of right-wing parties](#) in Europe and placing immense pressure on Croatian and Bosnian borders.
- Regional elections (Bosnia, Kosovo) will be **contested under high-tension conditions**, with technical failures in [scanning technology](#) potentially serving as a pretext for civil unrest or disputed results.

### Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The **collapse of International Law** as a governing mechanism is likely to be permanent. States will move toward [total individual rearmament](#), as the "myth of international protection" has been dispelled by the Gaza and Iran conflicts.

- Structural shifts in energy will see the **permanent decoupling** of Western Europe from Middle Eastern and Russian sources, favoring North American and Mediterranean LNG hubs at significantly higher price points.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy

- **Sovereignty Protection:** EU member states must establish a unified protocol to handle aggressive "extradiplomatic" demands from foreign missions to prevent individual nations from being bullied into [unilateral policy shifts](#).
- **Crisis Mediation:** Support for Turkey's "balancing policy" is essential; if Turkey's economy fails under the weight of [millions of new refugees](#), the security of the European continent cannot be guaranteed.
- **Regional Stabilization:** Immediate attention is needed for Kosovo to ensure that [early elections](#) do not become a flashpoint for ethnic tension during a period of global distraction.

### For Private Sector/Investors

- **Supply Chain Diversification:** Companies relying on components from the Middle East or energy-intensive manufacturing in the Balkans should **audit their resilience** to a 30-50% energy cost increase.
- **Digital Sovereignty:** The [internet blackout in Iran](#) serves as a reminder of the fragility of digital infrastructure; firms should ensure local data redundancy for all critical regional operations.

- **Market Research Evolution:** As Gen Z consumers demand [authenticity and purpose](#), brands should avoid "fake" digital engagement (e.g., performative TikToks) which are increasingly being "canceled" by a more skeptical, war-weary youth demographic.
