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THE ESCALATION OF THE US-ISRAELI CONFLICT WITH IRAN TO A REGIONAL WAR COINCIDES WITH SYSTEMIC INSTITUTIONAL PURGES AND POLITICAL INTIMIDATION ACROSS THE WESTERN BALKANS.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 7, 2026, marks a critical inflection point as the conflict between the US-Israeli coalition and Iran enters its second week of high-intensity warfare. Following the death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, the coalition has shifted its objectives toward total regime change and the "demolition" of Iranian military infrastructure. This has resulted in a massive regional spillover, with strikes hitting Tehran's international airport and British sovereign bases in Cyprus, while the blockade of the Strait of Hormuz has paralyzed global energy markets. To mitigate a global economic collapse, the United States has paradoxically authorized a 30-day waiver for major oil consumers like India to purchase Russian crude, highlighting the desperate measures taken to stabilize energy prices.

In the Western Balkans, the geopolitical chaos is providing cover for significant domestic

"lawfare" and political restructuring. In Serbia, the government is utilizing a controversial set of judicial reforms—referred to by critics as "Mrdić's Laws"—to purge independent prosecutors investigating high-level corruption, including the "Nadrišnica" (Roof Collapse) case involving former ministers. Concurrently, President Vučić has unveiled a "Strategy 2030-2035" that emphasizes artificial intelligence and robotics, a move analysts decry as a "skok u depresiju" designed to distract from failing infrastructure and the violent intimidation of student-led political movements in local elections. In Bosnia and Herzegovina, systemic deadlock in the House of Peoples persists, while the Sarajevo Canton government faces collapse following civil unrest triggered by a fatal tramway accident.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Regional War and Regime Change in Iran:** The US and Israel have transitioned from targeted strikes to a campaign of "total demolition" following the death of Khamenei. Operations have expanded to include [carpet bombings of Tehran](#) and strikes on the [Tehran International Airport](#). The coalition's stated goal is now the [unconditional surrender](#) of the Iranian regime.

- **The Judicial Purge in Serbia (TOK):** Using the newly implemented "Mrdić's Laws," the High Prosecutorial Council (VST) has removed key prosecutors from the Prosecution for Organized Crime (TOK). This includes those investigating the [Nadrišnica case](#) involving former ministers and the "Balkan Cartel" drug case. Critics note the [suspicious abstention](#) of key council members that facilitated this "decapitation" of independent investigations.
- **Violence and Intimidation in Kula Elections:** Local elections scheduled for March 29 in Kula have become a flashpoint for political violence. Student candidates from the "Glas Mladih" list have faced [death threats](#) and digital harassment. The use of "phantom lists" and [paramilitary-style intimidation](#) on the streets has drawn comparisons to the most restrictive periods of Serbian political history.
- **Global Energy Crisis and Strategic Waivers:** The closure of the Strait of Hormuz by Iran has trapped over [300 oil tankers](#), causing prices to spike. In response, the US has granted [sanction waivers](#) to India for the purchase of Russian oil, a move that undermines long-standing Western policy to prioritize immediate energy security over the isolation of Moscow.
- **Human Rights Violations at Mint Factory:** A Chinese whistleblower who exposed illegal labor practices at the Mint factory in Loznica was allegedly [beaten by Serbian police](#) and deported. The case highlights the "extraterritorial" influence of foreign investments and the apparent [collusion between local authorities](#) and foreign corporate interests.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security: The war has caused a [25% spike in oil prices](#) in a single week. Analysts warn that if the Strait of Hormuz remains closed, prices could reach [100 dollars per barrel](#) by next week, directly impacting fuel costs in Serbia and the broader region.

Corruption & Governance: The removal of prosecutors Barac and Miladinović from the [Nadrišnica investigation](#) is seen as a direct intervention by the executive to protect political figures. Furthermore, the [loss of connection with EuroJust](#) due to the VST's failure to appoint a representative threatens over 200 international criminal cases.

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty: President Vučić's "Serbia 2035" strategy heavily promotes [humanoid robotics](#) and AI factories. However, private sector leaders argue that without [education and healthcare reform](#), these capital-intensive projects primarily serve as promotional tools for "people close to the government."

Diplomatic Engagement: A significant rift has emerged between Israel and Croatia. The Israeli ambassador's call for [Croatia to sever ties](#) with Iran and vet embassy staff for "sleepers" was met with a [formal rebuke](#) from President Milanović, who asserted that Croatia is not a "protectorate."

Domestic Stability & Social Order: In Bosnia, the [resignation of the Sarajevo Canton government](#) has failed to quell protests. Citizens view the move as a ["political theater"](#) designed to reset the administration before the 2026 elections rather than addressing systemic safety failures in public transport.

Rule of Law: The conviction of an SNS election official in Mionica for [falsifying election results](#) is a rare precedent. However,

the light sentence (six months suspended) and the fact that it required "[heroic acts](#)" from a whistleblower suggests that systemic electoral fraud remains a high risk.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The day was marked by the practical implementation of controversial judicial and administrative laws, alongside paralyzed state-level legislative processes in Bosnia.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Mrdić's Judicial Laws (Serbia):** These laws were the mechanism used to [reassign prosecutors](#) investigating high-level corruption back to their home districts, effectively stalling active investigations.
- **European Media Freedom Act (Croatia):** Passed with [78 votes](#) after a controversial political realignment involving "Zurovček," an MP who reportedly traded his vote for [rail infrastructure projects](#) in his city.
- **Law on Salaries and Remuneration (BiH):** Blocked in the House of Peoples due to a [lack of quorum](#) orchestrated by HDZ and SNSD delegates.
- **Strategy Serbia 2030-2035:** An executive economic roadmap presented by Vučić, focusing on [capital investments and AI](#) without formal parliamentary debate.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **VST Session (Serbia):** A closed-door session that resulted in the [refusal to extend terms](#) for four key TOK prosecutors.
- **Sarajevo Canton Assembly:** A chaotic all-day session [debating the resignation](#) of Premier Nihad Uk, marked by the expulsion of opposition members.

- **Vučić Press Conference:** A 2.5-hour event [presenting "Serbia 2035"](#) alongside a robot named "Lumi."

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Decapitation of the Judiciary: A clear trend has emerged in Serbia where legislative "reforms" are strategically used to dismantle the Prosecution for Organized Crime (TOK). By preventing the [renewal of mandates](#) for prosecutors like Irena Bjeloš and Aleksandar Barac, the state is creating a vacuum in cases involving [five tons of marijuana](#) and high-profile construction disasters. This "lawfare" is increasingly sophisticated, using [procedural maneuvers](#) and the deliberate abstention of council members to achieve outcomes that favor the ruling elite while technically adhering to new, weakened legal frameworks.

Escalation toward Total Regional War: The conflict in Iran is no longer a surgical operation. The [assassination of Khamenei](#) has not led to a collapse but to an Iranian strategy of [maximum resistance](#). The attack on the [British base on Cyprus](#) indicates that the "European space" is no longer a sanctuary. The coalition's [reliance on air power](#) alone is being questioned, with analysts suggesting that without a [ground invasion](#), which Trump dismisses as a "waste of time," the regime change goal remains unattainable, potentially leading to a protracted and bloody stalemate.

The "Kula Model" of Political Intimidation: Local politics in Kula are serving as a laboratory for national-level election tactics. The combination of [fake "student" camps](#) designed to create a "living wall," the use of [over 800 police officers](#) to suppress a town of 35,000, and [death threats](#) against young activists signifies a shift toward

overt authoritarianism. This model relies on "phantom lists" to [dilute opposition votes](#) and a total media blackout for any voice not aligned with the state.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a significant increase in Serbian fuel prices as global [market shocks](#) reach local pumps. The judicial purge will likely lead to the [freezing of high-profile corruption trials](#) as new, potentially "loyalist" prosecutors take months to review massive case files. In Kula, the environment will likely [turn violent](#) as the March 29 election approaches.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The US strategy of [waiving sanctions on Russian oil](#) for India will create a new, fragile geopolitical triangle that may weaken the overall sanctions regime against Moscow. Iran may attempt to [weaponize its Kurd population](#) or other ethnic minorities as a counter-proxy strategy if the coalition continues its air campaign.

Long Term (1-5 Years): The "Serbia 2035" plan's focus on [AI and high-tech factories](#) risks creating an "archipelago of excellence" that is entirely disconnected from the [failing basic infrastructure](#) (sewage, hospitals) of the rest of the country. This growing inequality between the tech-elite and the general population will likely become the primary driver of future civil unrest in Serbia.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The European Union must reassess its [solidarity principles](#) as Cyprus becomes a front-line territory in the Iran-US conflict.
- The "decapitation" of the Serbian Prosecution for Organized Crime should trigger an immediate [Rule of Law review](#) by the Council of Europe, given the impact on EuroJust cooperation.
- Diplomatic pressure is needed to ensure the [safety of student activists](#) in Serbia, as local intimidation tactics are likely to be scaled up for national elections.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** The [Hormuz blockade](#) is no longer a temporary threat; logistics firms should prepare for a medium-term disruption in energy and trade routes to Asia.
- **Operational Risk in Serbia:** The [Mint factory case](#) indicates that foreign investors may find themselves complicit in human rights violations or target of whistleblower actions if they rely on "state protection" over international standards.
- **Tech Opportunity:** While the "Serbia 2035" plan is ambitious, investors should scrutinize the [actual infrastructure](#) (energy and sewage) supporting proposed AI and robotics hubs before committing capital.
