

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 7, 2026, marks a critical inflection point in global stability as the conflict in the Middle East enters its second week of high-intensity operations. The United States, under the administration of Donald Trump, has transitioned to a policy of [unconditional surrender](#) for the Iranian regime, claiming that "Operation Epic Fury" has already rendered Iran's navy and air force combat-ineffective. This aggressive stance, coupled with large-scale Israeli strikes on Tehran and key infrastructure, has triggered a historic shock to global energy markets. In Portugal, consumers face the [largest weekly increase](#) in fuel prices in history, with diesel projected to rise by nearly 20 cents per liter despite government tax interventions. The economic fallout is beginning to strain coalition cohesion in Europe, as leaders like Spain's Pedro Sánchez openly label the intervention an "extraordinary error," while Portuguese

Prime Minister Luís Montenegro attempts to maintain a precarious balance between his Atlanticist alliance with Washington and regional solidarity with Madrid.

Domestic Portuguese affairs are characterized by a significant transition of power and a high-profile governance scandal. The nation is in a state of official mourning following the [death of Nuno Morais Sarmento](#), a titan of the PSD and former minister, whose passing coincides with the final days of Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa's decade-long presidency. On Monday, António José Seguro will be inaugurated as the new President of the Republic, inheriting a landscape marred by the [exoneration of Mafalda Livermore](#), a Chega-appointed official in the Lisbon City Council. Livermore was removed following a public television investigation revealing her involvement in renting clandestine housing to immigrants and unauthorized legal practice. These developments, set against the backdrop of systemic infrastructure failures—evidenced by the ongoing investigation into the fatal Glória elevator accident—suggest a period of heightened social and political volatility as the new administration takes office.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The Middle East Conflict and "Operation Epic Fury"

- The Trump administration has officially set a timeline of [four to six weeks](#) for the completion of objectives in Iran, focusing on the systemic dismantlement of the country's ballistic missile industrial base.
- Israel has launched large-scale attacks on the Iranian capital, with over [80 fighter jets](#) targeting military installations, residential areas, and the vicinity of Mehrabad International Airport.

- Iran has shifted its diplomatic strategy, with President Masoud Pezeshkian [apologizing to neighboring Gulf states](#) for previous strikes and ordering a suspension of attacks against them to focus resources on Israel and the U.S.
- Reports indicate that Russia is actively providing [satellite intelligence](#) to Iran to assist in targeting U.S. troop locations and Israeli assets, signaling a deepening of the Moscow-Tehran axis.

Global Economic and Energy Crisis

- Portugal is experiencing a "historic rise" in fuel prices; diesel is expected to increase by [19.5 cents](#) and gasoline by 8 cents starting Monday.
- Logistics and transport sectors warn of a "brutality" in costs, with the Antram association noting that fuel now represents [30% of total transport costs](#), making price increases for consumer goods inevitable.
- The Danish shipping giant Maersk has [suspended two major links](#) between the Middle East and Europe, further threatening global supply chain stability.

Portuguese Political Transition and Internal Security

- The death of [Nuno Morais Sarmiento](#) at age 65 has unified the political class in grief, but the timing adds complexity to Monday's presidential inauguration of **António José Seguro**.
- A major ethics scandal has hit the Lisbon City Council (CML) after a Chega militant, Mafalda Livermore, was found to be operating [clandestine housing](#) for immigrants and practicing law without a license.

- Public safety concerns have intensified following revelations that the technician responsible for the fatal [Glória elevator accident](#) remains employed by a subcontractor for Carris.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Statecraft

- The Portuguese government has implemented a [temporary reduction](#) in the ISP (petroleum products tax) to mitigate the fuel price shock, though the opposition PS labels the measure "insufficient."
- Regional governments in Madeira and the Azores are considering [administrative price controls](#) to maintain a 14-cent price gap relative to the mainland.

International Relations & Bloc Politics

- A rift has emerged within the Iberian alliance; Spain has [denied the U.S. access](#) to its military bases for the Iran conflict, while Portugal remains a steadfast U.S. ally.
- The European Union has approved a strategy to [eradicate poverty by 2030](#), focusing on the 93 million Europeans currently at risk, including children and single mothers.

AI & Technology Policy

- Portugal ranks [sixth in the EU](#) for the use of Artificial Intelligence in educational contexts, prompting a national debate on the "pedagogical problem" versus the "technological tool."
- Governance experts argue that AI is "unstoppable" and that the current ten-year window will be one of [chaotic turbulence](#) as organizations adapt to automated intelligent decision-making.

Corruption & Rule of Law

- The Public Ministry is investigating [fraud and illicit legal representation](#) by political appointees in Lisbon, highlighting a breakdown in the vetting process for municipal leadership.
- Survivors of the Glória elevator crash allege [total neglect](#) by the Lisbon City Council, claiming no contact or support was offered in the six months following the disaster.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity centered on emergency economic measures to address the energy crisis and the formalization of long-term EU social goals. High-level diplomatic summits also focused on regional security and the future of Iberian-Atlantic relations.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Emergency ISP Reduction:** A government decree to [temporarily cut taxes](#) on fuel to prevent diesel from exceeding gasoline prices by a wider margin.
- **EU Global Strategy Against Poverty:** A framework document aiming to [reduce the number of poor](#) in Europe by 2030, championed by Portuguese MEP João Oliveira.
- **Azores Immigration Expansion:** A regional policy to make [immigration services available](#) on all nine islands by July 2026 via RIAC shops.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Luso-Spanish Summit in Huelva:** Prime Minister Montenegro and PM Sánchez clashed over the [merits of the Iran intervention](#), though they signed 10 memorandums on climate security.
- **White House Press Briefing:** Spokesperson Caroline Leavitt clarified that the objective of "Epic Fury" is [unconditional surrender](#), projecting a four-to-six-week operation.
- **CM Lisboa Exoneration Statement:** Mayor Carlos Moedas confirmed the [immediate removal](#) of Mafalda Livermore due to a "breakdown in institutional trust."

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The End of "Limited War" Narratives

The shift from "surgical strikes" to a demand for [unconditional surrender](#) indicates a significant escalation in U.S. foreign policy. The Trump administration is no longer seeking a return to the JCPOA or a new nuclear treaty but is instead pursuing regime change through the total destruction of [Iran's industrial and military capabilities](#). The Weaponization of Logistics and Inflation

[hike](#) is not merely an inconvenience but a systemic threat to the "cabaz alimentar" (food basket). With transportation costs rising by 16%, the [price of all consumer goods](#) is expected to follow within weeks. This creates a "double squeeze" for the Portuguese government: it must maintain fiscal discipline to satisfy rating agencies like Fitch (which recently improved Portugal's outlook to ["Positive"](#)) while facing domestic pressure to increase subsidies for a population reeling from a 30% jump in crude prices.

Governance Erosion and Municipal Fragility

The Livermore scandal and the Glória elevator investigation reveal a troubling pattern of [institutional negligence](#) in Lisbon. The appointment of an official involved in "clandestine housing" and "illicit legal practice" suggests a failure of basic background checks for sensitive municipal roles. Simultaneously, the fact that a technician involved in a fatal crash remains in the [maintenance chain](#) of the city's transport system points to a hollowed-out regulatory environment where subcontractors operate with minimal oversight. This internal decay is a growing political liability for the ruling PSD-CDS coalition in the capital.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect [widespread social unrest](#) or protests in Portugal as the historic fuel price increase takes effect on Monday, potentially leading to strikes in the transport sector.

- The inauguration of [President António José Seguro will be tested immediately by a constitutional debate over the extent of Portugal's involvement in "Epic Fury" should the U.S. request more direct support.](#)
- [Anticipate a surge in cyberattacks](#) against European financial and energy infrastructure, as warned by Europol.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- A permanent shift in [global shipping routes](#) is likely if the Gulf remains a combat zone, leading to long-term inflationary pressure on European economies.
- The Portuguese [banking sector](#), currently posting record profits (e.g., Novo Banco), may face a rise in non-performing loans as mortgage holders struggle with the energy-driven cost-of-living crisis.
- The [collapse of the Iranian regime](#) or a transition to a "third set" of leaders could create a massive refugee crisis, with the UN already estimating 330,000 displaced persons.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The [militarization of the European economy](#) will likely accelerate if the U.S. remains focused on the Middle East and East Asia, forcing the EU to develop independent strategic autonomy.
- Structural changes to [regional autonomy in Portugal](#) may occur if Madeira and the Azores are forced to permanently de-couple their energy pricing from the mainland to survive the crisis.
- The normalization of [AI-driven governance](#) in education and industry will likely result in a significant workforce shift, requiring a total overhaul of the Portuguese labor law.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Security: Portugal must urgently [increase its cybersecurity posture](#) given Europol's warnings about imminent state-sponsored attacks from Iranian proxies.
- Diplomacy: Lisbon should act as a [mediator within the EU](#) to prevent a total breakdown in cohesion over U.S. strategy in Iran, specifically bridging the gap with Spain.
- Humanitarian: Early preparation for [repatriation flights](#) for the thousands of Portuguese citizens remaining in the Gulf is critical as the conflict intensifies.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Energy: Investors should pivot toward [renewable energy assets](#) in Portugal (currently 70% of electricity), which offer the only long-term protection against Middle East volatility.
- Logistics: Companies must [diversify supply chains](#) away from the Suez/Gulf route, as Maersk's suspensions suggest a long-term disruption to maritime trade.
- Compliance: Firms must implement [rigorous ethical auditing](#) for all public-private partnerships, following the reputational damage caused by the Livermore/CML scandal.
