



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GLOBAL ESCALATION FOLLOWS THE ONE-WEEK MARK OF THE US-ISRAEL-IRAN WAR AS OIL PRICES SURGE AND DIPLOMATIC RIFTS WIDEN BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND EUROPEAN ALLIES.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 7, 2026, marks the end of the first week of a full-scale regional war in the Middle East, characterized by a massive intensification of aerial operations by the United States and Israel against the Islamic Republic of Iran. The conflict has transitioned into a "total war" footing, with U.S. forces claiming to have [struck 3,000 targets](#) within seven days. Operations have shifted from tactical military targets to critical national infrastructure, including the [bombing of Mehrabad International Airport](#) and deep-penetration strikes against command-and-control bunkers beneath the presidential complex in Tehran. President Donald Trump has escalated his rhetoric, demanding nothing less than [unconditional surrender](#) from the Iranian regime, while dismissing previous diplomatic overtures as "too late."

The economic repercussions are immediate and severe, with global energy markets bracing for a potential supply collapse. Oil prices have [surged 28% in one week](#), with analysts warning that a total blockade of the Strait of Hormuz could drive crude to \$150 per barrel. In Catalonia, the regional government is leveraging the crisis to force domestic political concessions, with President Salvador Illa framing the [approval of regional budgets](#) as a necessary "social shield" against global instability. Meanwhile, a major ethical schism has emerged in the technology sector, as the AI firm Anthropic [severed ties with the Pentagon](#) over the use of its systems in kinetic operations, allowing rival OpenAI to secure a monopoly on wartime military contracts.

On the domestic front, Catalonia is struggling with a convergence of crises. Severe weather from "Storm Regina" has caused widespread infrastructure damage, including [major landslides on the N-260](#) and the disappearance of a citizen in Llinars del Vallès. Concurrently, a biosecurity threat has emerged near Barcelona, where the discovery of [African Swine Fever in wild boars](#) has triggered strict lockdowns of natural parks and forests, adding to the sense of a region under multi-dimensional siege.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Expansion of the Middle East Air Campaign

- Israel and the U.S. have intensified strikes on Tehran, utilizing "bunker-buster" munitions to target a [five-story underground complex](#) beneath the presidency, where the successors to the Supreme Leader were reportedly meeting.

- The Israeli Air Force deployed 50 aircraft to neutralize [80% of Iran's air defense systems](#), allowing for nearly uncontested operations over the capital.
- Iran has retaliated with waves of drones and missiles targeting Tel Aviv and Jerusalem, though [interception rates remain high](#) due to the regional "umbrella" provided by U.S. assets.

Global Energy Crisis and Economic Contagion

- Brent crude has surpassed \$93 per barrel following warnings from Qatar that Gulf exporters may [halt production entirely](#) within days.
- Logistics and transport sectors are reeling as diesel prices increased by [20 cents in six days](#), leading to demands for emergency "professional fuel" subsidies and tax relief.
- Catalan industrial leaders warn that SMEs cannot be the [weakest link](#) absorbing these shocks, advocating for immediate price controls and liquidity guarantees.

The AI Ethical Schism in Warfare

- Anthropic's decision to walk away from Pentagon contracts just before the Iran strikes has sparked a [civilian-military crisis](#) in the tech sector.
- OpenAI has reportedly filled the vacuum, with its systems now integrated into operations previously [credited with capturing Nicolas Maduro](#) and managing drone swarms.
- The controversy has triggered a mass user migration, with Anthropic [gaining 1.5 million users](#) from ChatGPT as "ethical AI" becomes a market differentiator.

Spanish Diplomatic and Domestic Friction

- Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez has denounced the war as an [extraordinary error](#), reviving the "No to War" slogan and accusing opposition parties (PP and Vox) of "servility" to the Trump administration.
- The Spanish government is deploying the frigate Cristóbal Colón to Cyprus, but insists its mission is limited to [civilian evacuations](#) and regional security rather than offensive participation.

Catalonia Infrastructure and Biosecurity Emergencies

- Storm Regina has pushed internal water basins to [98.6% capacity](#), forcing emergency preventative discharges and resulting in the disappearance of a driver in [Linars del Vallès](#).
- African Swine Fever (ASF) has been confirmed in boars in Sant Just Desvern and Esplugues de Llobregat, leading to the [closure of Collserola Park](#) to the public to prevent agricultural contagion.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Geopolitical Power Dynamics & Security Architecture

- The Gulf monarchies are increasingly reliant on the [U.S. defensive umbrella](#) to intercept Iranian drones, despite domestic pressure regarding the use of their bases against another Muslim nation.
- The shift in U.S. policy toward demanding "unconditional surrender" suggests a move toward [regime change](#) rather than containment, a stance that has alienated NATO allies like Spain.

Economic Security & Statecraft

- Catalonia has formed a [permanent crisis committee](#) involving unions (UGT, CCOO) and employers (Foment, PIMEC) to monitor energy costs and prevent mass layoffs.
- The regional government is explicitly linking [budget passage](#) to the state's capacity to respond to the war's "inflationary tsunami."

AI & Technology Policy

- The Pentagon is imposing sanctions on military suppliers that continue to [work with Anthropic](#) following their contract withdrawal, signaling a "with-us-or-against-us" approach to digital sovereignty.
- Legal warfare is escalating as Anthropic prepares a [lawsuit against the U.S. government](#) over these punitive measures.

Biosurveillance & Food Security

- The expansion of ASF zones near Barcelona represents a [grave risk to the livestock industry](#), though no cases have yet been detected in commercial farms.
- Regulatory restrictions now prohibit access to [forests and riverbanks](#) in affected municipalities, impacting local tourism and recreation.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity today focused heavily on emergency fiscal measures and the strategic use of budgetary policy to address wartime inflation. The Catalan executive is moving to codify new "Crisis Management Committees" while facing pressure to index public contracts to rising energy prices.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED

- **Catalan Regional Budget 2026:** Currently in parliament with only support from the Comuns. President Illa made a public plea for the PSC and ERC to [approve the accounts](#) to provide a "social shield" against the war.
- **Professional Fuel Tax Credits:** Proposed by agricultural and transport unions to create a [professional diesel rate](#), simplifying bureaucracy to provide immediate pump-side discounts.
- **European Trade Blockade Protections:** Catalan business leaders are calling for [EU-coordinated responses](#) to protect against potential U.S. commercial retaliation for Spain's anti-war stance.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS

- **Social Dialogue Council Meeting:** An extraordinary session at the Palau de la Generalitat where the [permanent crisis workgroup](#) was announced to handle geopolitical fallout.
- **Donald Trump Press Statement:** President Trump addressed arms manufacturers, [demanding increased production](#) and stating he is indifferent to whether the future Iranian regime is democratic as long as it "treats the U.S. well."
- **Pedro Sánchez Press Conference:** Held alongside the Portuguese PM, where Sánchez confirmed he will [appear before Congress](#) to justify Spain's distance from the U.S. military strategy.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Budgetary Politics

A clear trend has emerged where the Catalan government is utilizing the regional "fear" of the Middle East war to break a legislative deadlock. By framing the [refusal to pass budgets](#) as a threat to national security and social stability, the administration is attempting to move the debate from fiscal policy to existential protectionism. This "war-time governance" model is being mirrored in Madrid, where the "No to War" rhetoric is being used to [mobilize the progressive electorate](#) against the "Trumpist" right.

The Privatization of Military Ethics

The conflict has exposed a deep rift in Silicon Valley. The emergence of Anthropic as an "ethical hero" for refusing military contracts, and the subsequent [punitive response from the Trump administration](#), suggests that AI companies are now acting as sovereign-like entities with their own foreign policies. The fact that OpenAI has secured these contracts indicates a narrowing of the market where [contractual loyalty to the Pentagon](#) is becoming a prerequisite for participation in the high-stakes AI sector.

The "Invisible" Human Toll and Economic Lag

While the news focus is on "3,000 targets," a secondary narrative is emerging regarding the 1.5 million people [displaced in Lebanon](#) and the 1,300 dead in Iran. In Europe, the lag between the start of the war and its impact on the supermarket shelf is closing. Transport companies warn that while crude is down 36% from 2022 levels, [pump prices are identical](#), suggesting immediate price gouging or "asymmetric" market behavior where "prices rise like a rocket and fall like a feather."

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Expect a [peak in oil prices](#) as the threat of production halts in Qatar and Kuwait materializes. This will likely trigger the first wave of national strikes in the European transport sector.
- The search for the [missing person in Llinars](#) will likely conclude, potentially fueling criticism of infrastructure resilience under extreme weather conditions.

Medium Term (1-6 Months)

- If Trump continues to demand [unconditional surrender](#), the conflict will likely expand into a prolonged occupation or insurgency phase, necessitating a massive increase in U.S. munitions production.
- Spain faces a significant diplomatic crisis with Washington; expect [punitive tariffs](#) on Spanish exports if Sánchez continues to lead the European anti-war faction.
- The Pope's visit to [Montserrat in June](#) will serve as a major diplomatic nexus for "peace statecraft," potentially becoming the first venue for mediation between the U.S. and regional actors.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The [Anthropic-Pentagon lawsuit](#) could set a precedent for the "Conscientious Objector" status of technology companies, leading to a fragmented AI landscape divided by ideological and ethical alignments.
- Structural changes to the [global energy supply chain](#) will be permanent as Europe seeks to completely decouple from Middle Eastern volatility, accelerating the transition to nuclear and green hydrogen.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy

- Allies must prepare for a [protectionist U.S. stance](#) where commercial relations are tied directly to military alignment in the Iran conflict.
- Establish "Ethical AI" frameworks that allow for civilian tech use while insulating companies from [state-level retaliation](#) when they refuse military engagement.
- Coordinate a Mediterranean-wide [evacuation and refugee plan](#) as the displacement from Lebanon reaches critical levels.

For Private Sector/Investors

- **Energy Hedging:** Investors should brace for [\\$150 oil](#) and prioritize investments in logistics firms with "professional fuel" subsidies or alternative propulsion fleets.
- **Supply Chain Diversification:** Catalan firms should follow government advice to [seek safer markets](#) like Australia to mitigate the risk of a U.S.-EU trade war.
- **Biosecurity Risk:** The agricultural sector in Southern Europe must increase [surveillance for ASF](#), as the proximity of wild boar cases to urban transport hubs increases the likelihood of human-mediated transmission to domestic pigs.
