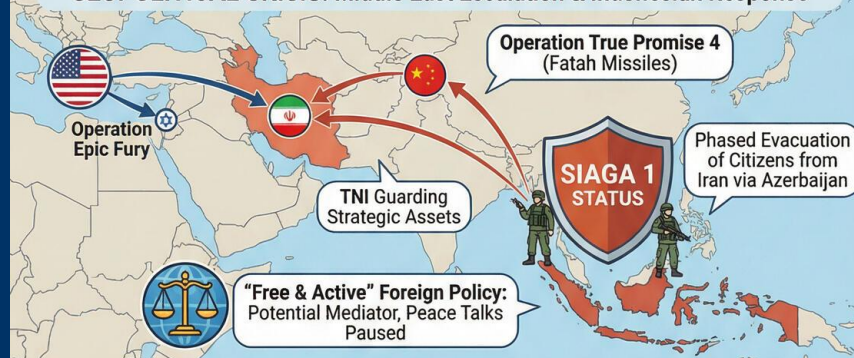

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 7, 2026, marks a critical inflection point for Indonesia as the nation navigates the fallout of a massive military escalation in the Middle East. With the United States and Israel launching "Operation Epic Fury" against Iran, the Indonesian National Armed Forces (TNI) have been placed on [Siaga 1 status](#), the highest level of readiness, to safeguard domestic stability and strategic assets. The government has initiated a phased evacuation of Indonesian citizens (WNI) from Iran via Azerbaijan, prioritizing the safety of thousands of students and workers as regional tensions threaten to spiral into a prolonged global conflict. Despite the volatility, Jakarta maintains a staunch "free and active" foreign policy, positioning itself as a potential mediator even as it halts formal peace board discussions to focus on the immediate crisis.

On the domestic front, the administration is contending with significant economic and governance challenges. Global oil prices have surged to [\\$92 per barrel](#), putting immense pressure on the national budget and energy subsidies. This coincides with a downgrade in Indonesia's debt outlook to negative by global rating agencies, though officials maintain a stance of fiscal resilience. Simultaneously, the holy month of Ramadan is being shadowed by a high-profile corruption probe as the KPK raids the offices and residence of the [Pekalongan Regent](#), Fadia Arafiq. To mitigate social unrest and fulfill campaign promises, the government is aggressively rolling out the "Free Nutritious Meal" (MBG) program and implementing controversial new social controls, including a strict mobile phone ban for children under 16 set to begin this month.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Escalation of Middle East Conflict and Indonesian Response**
 - The TNI issued a "Siaga 1" telegram ordering all units to [guard strategic objects](#) and economic centers following US-Israeli strikes on Iran.
 - Iran has retaliated with "Operation True Promise 4," utilizing [hypersonic Fatah missiles](#) against US bases in Kuwait and Iraq.
 - The Ministry of Foreign Affairs (Kemlu) has begun the [evacuation of 32 WNI](#) in the first stage of a broader extraction plan from the conflict zone.

• Domestic Corruption and Political Instability

- KPK investigators sealed four rooms at the Pekalongan Regency office and [raided the private home](#) of Regent Fadia Arafiq in connection with an undisclosed graft case.
- Vice Regent Sukirman has been appointed as Acting Regent to [ensure government stability](#) during the ongoing investigation.

• Economic Vulnerability and Infrastructure

- Global oil price hikes have triggered fears of [fuel shortages](#), leading to queues at gas stations in Jember as citizens panic-buy Peralite and Solar.
- The Ministry of Finance is [simulating budget scenarios](#) to address a widening deficit caused by energy subsidy pressures.
- Testing of the Multi-Lane Free Flow (MLFF) [toll payment system](#) has begun, with a goal of full implementation to reduce congestion during the upcoming Lebaran mudik.

• Social Policy and Public Health

- The government confirmed that a [ban on mobile phone use](#) for children under 16 will be enforced starting March 2026, requiring active parental monitoring.
- The National Nutrition Agency is accelerating the setup of 15 [kitchen centers](#) for the MBG program in remote areas like Kaur, Bengkulu, to combat stunting.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

National Security & Security Architecture

The highest level of alert (Siaga 1) reflects

deep concern that the Middle East war could trigger domestic radicalization or economic sabotage. The TNI's focus on [embassies and economic hubs](#) suggests a proactive stance against potential spillover effects. Additionally, the [seizure of 1.4 tons of cyanide](#) in Bitung highlights ongoing maritime security challenges and the illicit trade in hazardous chemicals used in illegal mining.

Economic Security & Fiscal Resilience The negative outlook from rating agencies is a significant blow to the administration's narrative of stability. While the Finance Minister downplays the shift as [global economic dynamics](#), the reality of \$92/barrel oil threatens the 2026 APBN (State Budget) targets. The government is also monitoring [staple food inflation](#), which has seen chili and meat prices rise by up to 20% ahead of the Eid holiday.

International Relations & State Foreign Policy Indonesia is attempting a delicate balancing act. It remains a member of the "Board of Peace" but has put [active discussions on hold](#) to prioritize the safety of its citizens and Umrah pilgrims. Over 14,000 pilgrims have been [successfully repatriated](#) after flight disruptions caused by the closure of Iranian and regional airspace.

Technology Policy & Digital Sovereignty

The under-16 phone ban represents an unprecedented state intervention into family life and digital habits. Education Minister Abdul Mu'ti emphasized that the policy aims to [foster responsible technology use](#), though critics point to the difficulty of age verification on platforms like Google without parental cooperation.

Disaster Management & Critical Infrastructure

Natural disasters continue to strain state capacity. Cold lava floods from

Mount Merapi have [claimed three lives](#) and left others missing, while landslides in Sukabumi have [damaged over 100 homes](#). The military's "TMMD" program is being leveraged to provide [clean air and housing](#) in rural areas, acting as a secondary disaster recovery and development arm.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Policy discussions centered on social control, nutrition, and transportation efficiency, with a heavy emphasis on executive orders and ministerial regulations rather than parliamentary debate.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Mobile Phone Restriction Policy:** A cross-ministerial directive (8 ministries/agencies) prohibiting [smartphones for minors](#) under 16, effective March 2026.
- **MBG (Makan Bergizi Gratis) Operational Guidelines:** New standards for [waste management \(IPAL\)](#) and hygiene in government nutrition centers to prevent environmental contamination.
- **MLFF Toll Regulation:** Implementation of non-stop toll payments to facilitate [mass migration \(mudik\)](#) flows, with specific exemptions for certain toll roads in late March.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Kemlu Crisis Briefing:** PLT Director Henni Hamidah detailed the [phased evacuation plan](#) for WNI in Iran, citing Azerbaijan as the primary transit point.
- **National Nutrition Agency Update:** Officials announced the [April launch date](#) for nutrition centers in "3T" (frontier, outermost, least developed) regions.

- **KPK Pekalongan Briefing:** Brief confirmation of the raid on [Regent Fadia Arafiq's](#) office, though specific charges remain under seal.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

Militarized Social Development The military (TNI) is increasingly being used as a catch-all solution for state administrative failures. From [clearing flood-damaged schools](#) to building rural infrastructure and guarding economic zones, the TNI's "TMMD" and "Siaga" roles suggest a shift toward a more securitized form of governance. The historical retrospective on [TB Simatupang](#) reinforces the ideology of the military as the "dynamicator" of national development.

Archaeological and Cultural Nationalism In the face of modern geopolitical chaos, there is a visible trend toward reinforcing national identity through the past. Massive coverage of the [Gunung Padang site](#)—claims of it being older than the pyramids of Egypt—and the promotion of "Buka Bersama" as [UNESCO heritage](#) serve to bolster domestic pride and social cohesion during the holy month.

The Vulnerability of the "Downstream" Economy While the government promotes UMKM and downstreaming (e.g., [pepper processing in Belitung](#)), the economy remains acutely sensitive to external shocks. The [oil price spike](#) and the negative outlook on debt highlights that Indonesia's "Economic Gold 2045" aspirations are currently hostage to Middle Eastern energy markets and US-Iran hostilities.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect heightened domestic security as the TNI maintains [Siaga 1 status](#) through the end of Ramadan. The evacuation of WNI from Iran will likely encounter logistical delays if regional airspace remains contested. Domestically, food prices will peak around H-7 of Lebaran, potentially requiring [market interventions](#) to prevent civil unrest.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The impact of the mobile phone ban for children will face its first major compliance test, likely leading to [friction between parents and schools](#). The MBG program's success in "3T" regions will be a bellwether for the administration's ability to deliver on core social promises amid a tightening budget. If oil stays above \$90, look for [fuel price adjustments](#) or a reallocation of development funds to cover subsidies.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Structural changes to Indonesia's energy policy may be forced by the current crisis, accelerating the shift toward domestic biofuels to mitigate Selat Hormuz risks. The megalithic research at [Gunung Padang](#) could be used as a diplomatic tool for "soft power" tourism, provided the site is protected from illegal gold mining and developmental encroachment.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Jakarta must leverage its neutral status to secure [safe passage corridors](#) for citizens in the Middle East, as traditional routes are increasingly compromised.

- The government should formalize its role as a mediator in the US-Iran conflict to prevent a [global energy crisis](#) that could derail its domestic economic targets.
- Diplomatic efforts should focus on regional neighbors (ASEAN) to maintain [market stability](#) and counteract the negative outlook from global rating agencies.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- Energy-dependent industries must hedge against [sustained oil price volatility](#) as Selat Hormuz remains a primary geopolitical flashpoint.
- Tech companies and app developers must adapt to [strict age verification](#) and parental control regulations in the Indonesian market following the under-16 phone ban.
- Opportunities exist in the "Green Economy" and [creative industries](#) (UMKM) as the government seeks to diversify the economy away from raw material exports and vulnerable energy imports.
