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IRGC HARDLINERS CEMENT POWER  
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APPOINTMENT AMID US-ISRAELI  
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AND REGIONAL ESCALATION

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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The ninth day of the conflict between Iran and the US-Israeli coalition marked a critical turning point as the Iranian domestic political vacuum was abruptly filled by the [appointment of Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the third Supreme Leader. This hereditary succession, announced late in the evening by the Assembly of Experts, signals a consolidation of power by the IRGC's "hard core" and the intelligence apparatus, effectively sidelining moderate factions like those led by Masoud Pezeshkian. The appointment directly defies warnings from US President Donald Trump, who asserted that any leader chosen [without US approval](#) would not survive long, and Israeli threats to liquidate the Assembly of Experts if they convened.

Simultaneously, the coalition shifted its targeting strategy toward critical non-military infrastructure, [decimating oil storage facilities](#)

in Shahran, Fardis, and Aghdasieh. These strikes have plunged Tehran and Alborz provinces into an environmental and logistical crisis, characterized by toxic "black rain," severe air pollution, and immediate fuel rationing. While the Iranian government claims strategic reserves are sufficient for 10-12 days, independent analysts suggest the destruction of distribution hubs could lead to a near-total collapse of urban services and electricity generation within a fortnight.

The regional dimension reached a "boiling point" as the IRGC Aerospace Force, now under direct command of the new leadership, intensified its "tit-for-tat" strikes against Gulf neighbors. Attacks on [water desalination plants in Bahrain](#), fuel tanks at Kuwait's international airport, and residential areas in Tel Aviv demonstrate a "madman strategy" intended to force a diplomatic exit by spiking global oil prices and endangering coalition allies. President Trump has responded by entertaining the [possibility of redrawing Iran's map](#), suggesting that the nation's territorial integrity is no longer a US priority.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Hereditary Succession Formally Established:** Following the reported death of Ali Khamenei and his immediate family in coalition strikes, the Assembly of Experts named Mojtaba Khamenei as Supreme Leader. The move is seen as a survival tactic by the IRGC's security-intelligence wings, particularly the ["Habib Battalion" network](#), to maintain command cohesion during the war.

- **Decimation of Urban Energy Infrastructure:** Coalition airstrikes successfully [destroyed five major fuel depots](#) serving the capital region. The resulting fires have created an atmospheric disaster, with health officials warning citizens to avoid "acidic vapors" while the government slashed daily fuel quotas from [30 liters to 20 liters](#).
- **Strategic Retaliation Against Neighbors:** Iran launched a wave of drone and missile attacks targeting non-combatant economic hubs in the Gulf. This included an [impact on a government building](#) in Kuwait and residential casualties in Saudi Arabia, prompting the UAE and Saudi Arabia to release combat footage of interceptions as a warning to Tehran.
- **Trump's "Map Change" and "Approval" Doctrine:** In high-level interviews, President Trump refused to guarantee Iran's territorial integrity, stating that the [map of Iran](#) would likely change post-war. He also demanded that the next Iranian leader be "approved" by Washington to ensure stability, a condition the new leadership in Tehran has already rejected.
- **Internal Regime Fragmentation:** A profound rift emerged within the temporary leadership council. While President Pezeshkian [publicly apologized](#) to neighbors for "fire-at-will" military actions, Chief Justice Ejei and IRGC commanders overrode him, insisting that attacks on countries hosting US bases [would continue with intensity](#).

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Succession & Stability

- The appointment of Mojtaba Khamenei represents the [final collapse](#) of the Islamic Republic's anti-monarchical pretenses, shifting to a dynastic model to ensure the survival of the IRGC-dominated "deep state."
- The Assembly of Experts reportedly conducted the vote under extreme duress, with many members meeting in [secret or non-physical sessions](#) to avoid Israeli airstrikes targeted at the selection committee.

### Critical Infrastructure & Energy Security

- Tehran is facing a [distribution crisis](#) rather than a production crisis. While refineries remain functional, the destruction of transfer hubs in Tehran and Alborz makes the movement of fuel nearly impossible under wartime conditions.
- Global oil markets reacted sharply to the succession news, with prices [climbing 18%](#) to approximately \$108 per barrel in early Asian trading sessions.

### Geopolitical Power Dynamics

- Trump's rhetoric suggests a shift from "regime change" to [territorial fragmentation](#). By discussing the possibility of redrawing maps and withdrawing support for a centralized Kurd intervention, he is signaling a willingness to accept a weakened, divided Iran.
- Israel's strategy is increasingly focused on [structural paralysis](#), targeting the "tent poles" of the regime—the leadership, the oil revenue, and the aerospace command centers.

## Digital Sovereignty & Information Control

- Internet connectivity remains below [1% of normal levels](#). The regime is using a "white list" system to allow only state-approved entities access, while the general population relies on high-risk tools like Starlink or localized mesh networks.
- Evidence suggests [Chinese technical assistance](#) has been pivotal in creating this "digital blackout," facilitating the surveillance and suppression of urban dissent during the air campaign.

## Domestic Stability & Social Order

- Tehran residents are experiencing [extreme psychological trauma](#), characterized by "apocalyptic scenes" of fire and toxic smog. Despite this, some neighborhoods have reported [anti-regime chants](#) during bombings, indicating that the conflict has not unified the public behind the government.
- Rationing and the potential collapse of the food supply chain due to fuel shortages are expected to trigger [urban service failures](#) in the coming week.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Governance in Iran has shifted to an emergency footing, with the temporary leadership council issuing contradictory decrees. US policy is being dictated via executive interviews rather than formal Congressional action, though mid-term election pressures are beginning to influence the Trump administration's messaging on the war's duration.

## POLICIES AND DECREES DISCUSSED:

- **Fuel Rationing Decree:** The Governor of Tehran [implemented a reduction](#) in daily personal fuel quotas from 30L to 20L, citing the destruction of regional depots.
- **Public Health Warnings:** The Environmental Protection Organization and Red Crescent issued a [stay-at-home order](#) for Tehran residents due to the toxicity of the air following oil fires.
- **US "Approval" Policy:** President Trump articulated a [new foreign policy doctrine](#) stating the US would not recognize or allow the survival of any Iranian leader not vetted by Washington.

## HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Trump ABC News Interview:** The President discussed [sending ground troops](#) to secure enriched uranium in Isfahan and admitted that Iran's map might change.
- **Pezeshkian's Video Message:** The Iranian President [apologized to neighboring states](#) for IRGC strikes, an apology that was immediately undermined by the IRGC command.
- **Assembly of Experts Briefing:** Members announced they had [reached a "consensus"](#) on the new leader, later confirmed to be Mojtaba Khamenei.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Dynastic Gambit

The rapid elevation of Mojtaba Khamenei is more than a simple succession; it is a [strategic entrenchment](#) by the security apparatus. By placing a figure with deep ties

to the intelligence services and the IRGC Aerospace Force at the helm, the regime is signaling that it will prioritize military survival over diplomatic compromise. This makes the "Pezeshkian-Larijani" diplomatic channel [functionally obsolete](#). Mojtaba, who has no formal executive experience but massive "behind the curtains" power, now inherits a war he helped architect via his support for the IRGC's regional proxies.

### **The "Madman" Regional Strategy**

Iran is no longer attempting to win a conventional war against the US or Israel. Instead, it is employing a [regional sabotage strategy](#). By striking desalination plants in Bahrain and fuel hubs in Kuwait, Tehran aims to make the war too expensive for the global economy. The logic is that \$200 per barrel oil will [force the US](#) to the negotiating table before the Iranian military is totally annihilated. The irony is that this strategy is driving Gulf nations like Saudi Arabia and Azerbaijan closer to active military participation against Iran.

### **Infrastructure as the New Battlefield**

The shift from targeting missile silos to [urban oil depots](#) marks a move toward "structural paralysis." The goal is to make life in the capital untenable, hoping to trigger an internal collapse of the social order. The "black rain" in Tehran is a potent symbol of this; it is not just an environmental hazard but a [psychological weapon](#) designed to show the population that the regime cannot even protect the air they breathe or the water they drink.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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### **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):**

- Expect an immediate attempt by Israel or the US to [liquidate Mojtaba Khamenei](#) to validate Trump's "not for long" warning. This would leave Iran in a state of total decapitation.
- Tehran will likely face a [complete stoppage](#) of public transportation and private vehicle movement as fuel distribution fails, leading to potential food riots or mass displacement from the capital.

### **Medium Term (1-6 Months):**

- Pressure on the Trump administration will mount as [US military casualties](#) (currently at 7) rise and domestic gas prices hit record highs. Trump may feel forced to either escalate to a ground invasion to "finish the job" or declare a premature victory.
- Ethnic peripheral regions, particularly Kurdistan and Khuzestan, may see [armed incursions](#) or autonomy declarations if the central government's "state capacity" continues to erode at the current rate.

### **Long Term (1-5 Years):**

- The "Map of Iran" is unlikely to return to its pre-war state. Even if the regime survives, [territorial concessions](#) to the UAE over disputed islands or the emergence of autonomous zones in the north and south are highly probable structural outcomes.
- The environmental damage from the [destruction of desalination](#) and oil infrastructure will lead to a long-term public health crisis and a permanent shift in regional water security dynamics.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Security:** Neutralize the "fire-at-will" regional command structure by identifying and striking decentralized IRGC nodes that are operating independently of the fractured central government [in Tehran](#).
- **Economic:** Prepare for a prolonged disruption of the Strait of Hormuz; Trump's "few weeks" timeline for [normalizing traffic](#) appears overly optimistic given the IRGC's remaining drone and mine capacity.
- **Diplomatic:** Establish contact with the "technocratic" layers of the Iranian bureaucracy who are [alienated by Mojtaba's appointment](#) to prepare for an eventual transition of power once the "hard core" is eliminated.

### For Private Sector / Investors:

- **Energy Supply Chains:** Assume a high-risk environment for all Gulf-based energy infrastructure. The ["eye for an eye" strategy](#) means that Bahraini and Kuwaiti assets are now as much at risk as Iranian ones.
- **Logistics:** Regional air travel and shipping will remain [severely restricted](#); the reopening of Tel Aviv's airport is a localized success but does not reflect the broader regional volatility.
- **ESG and Health Risks:** Corporations with personnel in the region should monitor [acid rain and toxic smog](#) trajectories, as atmospheric pollution from oil fires is spreading across borders, posing a long-term liability and health risk.
