

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On March 8, 2026, the US-Israeli military campaign against the Islamic Republic of Iran, dubbed "Operation Epic Fury," entered its second week with a significant expansion of target sets to include [oil infrastructure](#). For the first time in the nine-day conflict, Israeli air strikes targeted fuel depots in Tehran, resulting in [toxic black smoke](#) blanketing the capital and the flow of burning gasoline into residential areas. This shift signals a transition from the initial "decapitation" and air defense suppression phases toward the systematic degradation of Iran's economic capacity and internal security apparatus.

Simultaneously, the Iranian regime faces an acute internal crisis following the death of Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. Reports indicate that the Assembly of Experts has [chosen Mojtaba Khamenei](#), the late

leader's son, as the successor, though a formal announcement has been delayed for security reasons. The US and Israel have responded by vowing to [target any new chief](#), maintaining a maximalist stance that seeks the total dismantling of the current clerical order. Despite the loss of leadership, the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) continues a "mosaic defense," launching waves of [missiles and drones](#) against Israel and its neighbors, including the UAE, Kuwait, and Saudi Arabia.

Internationally, the conflict is eroding long-standing legal norms and economic stability. German Chancellor Friedrich Merz's visit to Washington highlighted a growing [diplomatic dilemma](#) for European allies, as Germany appears to be de-emphasizing international law in favor of maintaining coalition cohesion with the Trump administration. Domestically, Merz's CDU suffered a [surprise election defeat](#) in Baden-Württemberg to the Green Party, led by Cem Özdemir, a result widely viewed as a rebuke of the federal government's handling of the economic and security crises. Global energy markets are bracing for a prolonged shock as the [Strait of Hormuz](#) remains effectively paralyzed.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Expansion of Target Sets to Economic Infrastructure

- Israeli strikes hit an [oil depot in Tehran](#), marking the first attack on the Republic's energy infrastructure during the war.
- The resulting fires caused [toxic fumes](#), prompting authorities to warn residents of potential eye and lung damage.
- The IRGC warned of [retaliatory strikes](#) against regional energy infrastructure if attacks on Iranian oil facilities continue.

Iranian Leadership Succession Crisis

- The clerical assembly reportedly agreed on [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the new Supreme Leader to succeed his father.
- Official confirmation is being withheld to prevent the [immediate elimination](#) of the new leader by US-Israeli strikes.
- President Trump has claimed he expects to have a [say in selecting](#) the next ruler of Iran, a claim rejected by Tehran as a violation of sovereignty.

Regional Conflict and Proxy Retaliation

- Iran launched over [120 drones](#) and missiles at the United Arab Emirates, temporarily suspending operations at Dubai's airport.
- Six US service personnel were [killed in a drone attack](#) at a command center in Kuwait, with their remains returned to Dover Airbase.
- Israeli strikes in Lebanon have killed [394 people](#), targeting IRGC commanders and Hezbollah strongholds in Beirut and Tyre.

Global Maritime and Energy Paralysis

- The Strait of Hormuz is at a [standstill](#), blocking roughly 20% of global oil flows and 15% of Europe's LNG imports.
- Major shipping giants, including Maersk and Hapag-Lloyd, have [halted passage](#) through the Suez Canal and Hormuz, rerouting around Africa.
- Brent crude oil prices have jumped [above \\$90 per barrel](#), with expectations of further increases as the conflict persists.

German Domestic Political Shifts

- The Green Party achieved a [surprise win](#) in the Baden-Württemberg state election, with Cem Özdemir set to become the first state premier of Turkish origin.
- Chancellor Friedrich Merz's CDU trailed the Greens, indicating [political instability](#) for the federal government at a time of international crisis.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security

- The total blockage of Qatari LNG exports via the [Strait of Hormuz](#) poses an existential threat to European gas storage levels, currently at historic lows.
- The US has temporarily [eased sanctions](#) on Russian oil for India to mitigate a global supply gap, highlighting the fragility of energy diplomacy.

Succession & Stability

- The Iranian regime is attempting to transition to a [hereditary leadership](#) model via Mojtaba Khamenei to maintain IRGC loyalty and clerical continuity.
- The US strategy of "regime change" remains ill-defined, with internal military reports warning that neither short nor extended campaigns are likely to [dislodge the regime](#) entirely.

International Relations & Statecraft

- Europe is deeply divided, with Spain's Pedro Sanchez [condemning the war](#) as a violation of international law, while Germany's Merz avoids such criticism to preserve ties with Trump.

- Trump has threatened to [cut off trade with Spain](#) following its refusal to support military operations and its calls for legal accountability.

National Security & Military Architecture

- The US relies on its [Ramstein Airbase](#) in Germany for logistics, though German policy remains "full cooperation" despite domestic legal debates.
- The IRGC claims to have enough [missiles and drones](#) to sustain high-intensity combat for six months.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

The conflict has triggered urgent legislative and policy debates across the globe, primarily focusing on war powers, trade tariffs, and emergency energy measures.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **US Senate War Power Resolution:** A vote is pending in the US Senate regarding the domestic legal authorization for the [ongoing war](#) in Iran.
- **German Base Stationing Agreement:** Debates continue in Germany over whether the [stationing agreement](#) with the US allows for offensive operations that may violate international law.
- **US Tariff Regime:** President Trump is seeking a new legal basis to implement [15% tariffs](#) on European goods following a Supreme Court ruling against his previous trade policies.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Collapse of the International Legal Order

A recurring theme is the perceived abandonment of international law as the primary framework for global stability. Chancellor Merz's refusal to [lecture partners](#) on legal violations suggests that even the most traditionally law-abiding states are pivoting toward "power politics." The Vulnerability of Global Supply Hubs

The war has exposed the fragility of global "choke points." The paralysis of the Strait of

Hormuz is not only spiking energy prices but is also [straining humanitarian aid](#) flows. Centers like Dubai, which serves as a vital logistics hub for global aid, have seen stocks grounded. This trend indicates that modern conflict in the Middle East is no longer regional; it is a [catastrophic blow](#) to global supply chains already weakened by previous crises like the COVID-19 pandemic and the Ukraine war.

Technological Warfare: The Asymmetry of Drones

Despite US-Israeli air superiority, the Iranian "mosaic defense" utilizes [low-cost suicide drones](#) (approx. \$30,000 each) to overwhelm sophisticated and expensive missile defense systems. This asymmetrical approach forces the US and its allies to deplete their stocks of [interceptor missiles](#), raising questions about the long-term sustainability of the campaign. The success of the "Gepard" flak tank in Ukraine has [reinvigorated interest](#) in 35mm ammunition systems as a more cost-effective counter to drone swarms.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect a continued [spike in fuel prices](#) as shipping insurance rates skyrocket and inventories are depleted. The formal announcement of Mojtaba Khamenei could trigger a fresh wave of US-Israeli strikes specifically targeting leadership bunkers. Domestic unrest in Iran may grow as the [internal security apparatus](#) is targeted, potentially encouraging ethnic minorities like the Kurds to launch insurgencies.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The US midterm elections in November will become a [critical juncture](#) for the war. If American casualties continue to rise and gas prices

remain high, the Trump administration may face a severe backlash from its "America First" base. In Europe, the [energy squeeze](#) will likely lead to emergency rationing and a potential economic recession, further straining the unity of the NATO alliance.

Long Term (1-5 Years): A permanent shift in energy logistics is likely, with increased investment in [bypass pipelines](#) in Saudi Arabia and the UAE. The "de facto" abandonment of international law by Western powers could lead to a more fragmented global order where regional powers like China and Russia consolidate influence over "unaligned" states. If the Iranian regime survives, it will likely [accelerate nuclear enrichment](#) as its ultimate insurance policy against future Western interventions.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** Allies must prepare for [hybrid warfare](#) retaliations in Europe, including potential terror attacks on Jewish or US targets, as Iran attempts to drive up the political costs of the war.
- **Diplomatic Unity:** The EU must find a [common voice](#) to prevent being divided by "court-style" diplomacy in Washington, which currently favors individual bilateral deals over collective agreements.
- **Humanitarian Protection:** Establish "safe corridors" for aid, as the [disruption of maritime routes](#) is already causing catastrophic hunger risks in East Africa and the Middle East.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Logistics & Shipping:** Firms should diversify [transit routes](#) permanently, assuming the Strait of Hormuz will remain a high-risk zone for the foreseeable future.
- **Energy Investment:** Accelerate the transition to [renewables and EVs](#), as fossil fuel markets are now proven to be precariously dependent on a few unstable geographic choke points.
- **Insurance & Risk:** Re-evaluate war risk [premiums](#) for all assets in the Gulf region, as civilian infrastructure (desalination plants, high-rises) is now considered a legitimate target by combatants.
