

## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 9, 2026, marks a pivotal moment in the ten-day-old conflict between the United States, Israel, and Iran, characterized by a jarring disconnect between high-level political rhetoric and the tactical reality on the ground. While U.S. President Donald Trump has characterized the conflict as a [short-term excursion](#) that is already "very complete," the Middle East has descended into a widening regional war. The conflict reached a critical juncture with the appointment of [Mujtaba Khamenei](#) as Iran's new Supreme Leader, replacing his father who was assassinated in the opening wave of the war. This transition, occurring under constant bombardment, signals a defiant consolidation of the Iranian state and its security apparatus, specifically the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), rather than the collapse sought by Washington and Jerusalem.

The economic consequences of the war have become acute, with global oil prices [surging above \\$100](#) per barrel for the first time since 2022 following the effective closure of the Strait of Hormuz. Iran has shifted its retaliatory strategy toward "deterrence through chaos," increasingly [targeting the energy infrastructure](#) of Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) nations like Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and Bahrain. This has forced major energy producers to declare force majeure on shipments, rattling Asian and European markets. Despite the administration's insistence that the war is wrapping up, the Iranian military continues to launch heavy [missile volleys into central Israel](#), and Hezbollah has opened a significant second front in Lebanon, leading to the displacement of over 500,000 people.

Domestically, President Trump is leveraging the war to pressure Congress on a hardline legislative agenda, vowing not to sign any legislation until the [Save America Act](#)—a bill focused on voter ID and restrictive social policies—is passed. However, public support for the war remains low, with only [27% of Americans](#) approving of the strikes. The disconnect between the White House's declaration of "mission accomplished" and the rising death toll of U.S. service members suggests a looming political crisis for the administration as it approaches the November midterm elections.

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Succession of Mujtaba Khamenei:** Following the assassination of Ayatollah Ali Khamenei and his family, the Assembly of Experts appointed his son, Mujtaba, as the [third Supreme Leader](#) of the Islamic Republic. Analysts note that while the succession appears dynastic, it represents a [consolidation of power](#) by the IRGC during an existential crisis. [Russia has congratulated](#) the new leader, while the U.S. and Israel have labeled him a continued target for assassination.
- **Operation Epic Fury and Infrastructure Destruction:** President Trump claims U.S. and Israeli forces have sunk [51 Iranian ships](#) and degraded 90% of Iran's missile launch capabilities. However, recent strikes have expanded to [civilian infrastructure](#), including oil storage depots in Tehran, resulting in toxic "acid rain" and a massive blanket of smoke over the capital that has put [millions at risk](#).
- **Regional Retaliation against GCC:** Iran has abandoned "strategic patience" in favor of a "strategy of chaos," launching missiles and drones at [civilian and energy targets](#) in Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE. Bahrain's [Bapco oil refinery](#) was hit by a drone strike, leading the company to declare force majeure, further choking global supply.
- **Economic Turmoil and Market Volatility:** Asian markets, particularly in [South Korea and Japan](#), fell sharply (up to 8%) as crude oil prices breached the \$110 threshold. South Korea has responded by [imposing a price cap](#) on domestic fuel for the first time in 30 years to mitigate the shock of the Strait of Hormuz closure.

- **Escalation in Lebanon:** Israel has intensified its air campaign in Beirut and southern Lebanon, targeting [financial institutions](#) affiliated with Hezbollah. Human Rights Watch has accused the Israeli military of [unlawfully using white phosphorus](#) in populated areas, as the displacement crisis in Lebanon nears 700,000 people.
- **U.S. Casualties and Public Dissent:** The U.S. military confirmed the [seventh combat death](#) of a service member since the start of the war. Despite the administration's optimistic messaging, internal [U.S. polling](#) indicates that a majority of Americans see the conflict as an "unnecessary war" of choice.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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**Energy Security and Critical Infrastructure** The global energy market is facing a structural crisis. The Strait of Hormuz, which facilitates [20% of global oil](#) and LNG flows, is effectively closed due to Iranian threats. Qatar Energy and Bahrain's Bapco have both [declared force majeure](#), untangling themselves from contractual obligations as their facilities come under fire. President Trump has offered [political risk insurance](#) to tankers, yet insurers are already canceling coverage or surging premiums.

**Elite Politics and Leadership Dynamics** In Iran, the transition to Mujtaba Khamenei signifies the [dominance of the "Deep State"](#) and the IRGC. In the U.S., President Trump is operating outside traditional interagency processes, making major [policy announcements via social media](#). Meanwhile, Secretary of State Marco Rubio is being positioned as a key negotiator for a [potential "friendly takeover"](#) of Cuba, indicating a

broader administration focus on regime change across multiple theaters.

**Succession and Stability** The rapid appointment of a new Supreme Leader in Iran was intended to [guarantee continuity](#) and prevent the state collapse desired by Israel. While some analysts suggest Mujtaba could eventually [transform the regime](#) due to his unique legitimacy, the immediate effect is a "rally around the flag" sentiment among supporters, despite [deep social polarization](#) and past unrest.

**International Relations and Foreign Policy** Traditional alliances are under strain. Qatar's Prime Minister expressed a [deep sense of betrayal](#) by Iran, given Doha's past mediation efforts. Simultaneously, the U.S. is facing [unprecedented criticism](#) from U.N. experts who label the strikes an "illegal act of aggression" violating Article 2 of the U.N. Charter. France and the G7 are [discussing the release](#) of strategic oil reserves, but have not yet reached a consensus.

**Economic Security** The threat of "stagflation"—rising inflation coupled with stagnant growth—has [re-emerged as a major risk](#). The global fertilizer market is also collapsing, with [prices nearing \\$680 a ton](#) because 33% of the world's fertilizer passes through the blocked Strait. This poses an immediate threat to global food security, particularly for major agricultural exporters like Brazil.

## **LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP**

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The U.S. legislative environment has been frozen by executive mandate. President Trump has declared a [legislative moratorium](#), refusing to sign any bills—including those for Department of Homeland Security (DHS) funding—until his priority election and social

legislation is passed by the House Republican majority.

## **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Save America Act:** A rebranded version of the "Save Act," this five-point bill requires [voter ID and proof of citizenship](#), bans mail-in ballots (with narrow exceptions), prohibits transgender "mutilization" of children, and bans men from participating in women's sports. Trump claims it is the [easiest thing](#) to pass due to high polling, though it faces a Senate filibuster.
- **Trump Accounts:** A policy aimed at giving every American child a [head start on the American Dream](#), involving significant private sector contributions, notably from the Dell family.
- **Auto Loan Interest Deductibility:** A proposal to make interest on auto loans [fully deductible](#), provided the vehicle is manufactured in the United States.

## **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Miami/Doral Republican Address:** President Trump addressed the House Republican majority, celebrating a record [\\$20 million fundraising haul](#) and outlining the "Epic Fury" military successes.
- **Iranian Foreign Ministry Press Conference:** Spokesperson Ismail Baghai [torpedoed the possibility of diplomacy](#), stating talks are "irrelevant" while aggression continues and accusing the U.S. of seeking to [partition Iran](#) to seize its oil.
- **Israeli Military Briefing:** The IDF confirmed it is targeting the [armed branch of Hezbollah](#) in Beirut while maintaining a blackout on the location of Iranian missile impacts within Israel.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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**The Strategy of Attrition vs. The "Short-Term Excursion" Narrative** There is a fundamental strategic mismatch between the U.S. and Iran. The Trump administration is attempting to [narrate a quick, decisive victory](#) to satisfy domestic political needs. Conversely, Iran is engaging in a [war of attrition](#), decentralizing its command via a "mosaic defense" to ensure that even if the central leadership is destroyed, local commanders can continue to [inflict regional pain](#). Iran's goal is to make the cost of the war so high for U.S. allies and the global economy that Washington is forced to withdraw before achieving regime change.

**The Global Erosion of International Law** This conflict represents a significant collapse of the post-WWII international order. U.N. experts and former diplomats describe the U.S.-Israeli campaign as a [war of aggression](#), the "worst crime" under the Nuremberg Tribunal. The U.S. President has openly stated that his [own moral compass](#) is the only restriction on his power, signaling a move toward a "pure power" geopolitical model where Article 2 of the U.N. Charter is treated as irrelevant.

**Information Warfare and Media Polarization** The war is being fought through a [divided media lens](#). The White House is utilizing [social media savvy "meme ready" messaging](#) to target younger Americans, while the Pentagon has imposed restrictions so severe that many legacy journalists have [returned their credentials](#). In Israel, military censorship is [strictly controlling](#) information on missile damage to maintain a narrative of invulnerability, even as citizens are [arrested for posting videos](#) of impact sites.

**Nuclear Proliferation as a Defensive Response** A dangerous new trend is emerging as U.S. allies lose faith in the American security umbrella. Analysts suggest this war is [accelerating nuclear proliferation](#), with France vowing to increase its warheads and countries like Japan, Germany, and Saudi Arabia reconsidering their nuclear options. The killing of Khamenei, despite his [fatwa against nuclear weapons](#), may lead the new Iranian leadership to conclude that only a nuclear deterrent can guarantee survival.

## STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a continued spike in [gasoline prices in the U.S.](#), potentially reaching \$5.00-\$8.00 in high-tax regions like California. The G7 is likely to formalize a release of strategic petroleum reserves to [stabilize markets](#). In the theater of war, the risk of a [miscalculation leading to a direct clash](#) between Iran and a NATO member (like Turkey) is high, especially as Iranian missiles continue to be [intercepted over Turkish soil](#).

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The U.S. midterm elections will likely revolve around [affordability and inflation](#) driven by energy costs. If the war persists, the U.S. may be forced to choose between [putting "boots on the ground"](#) to secure oil infrastructure or declaring a premature "victory" and leaving a [failed state in Iran](#). A global food crisis is possible as [fertilizer shortages](#) from the Gulf impact the spring planting season in the Northern Hemisphere.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** A permanent shift in regional power dynamics is underway. Middle Eastern nations may [pivot toward China and Russia](#) for security and trade, viewing the U.S. as an unstable partner. Iran, if it survives, will

likely pursue a [covert or overt nuclear capability](#) with high popular support. The "Venezuela model" of regime change—installing an internal successor—is unlikely to work in a deep, [decades-long revolutionary system](#) like Iran's.

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** NATO and GCC allies must establish a clear "deconfliction" protocol to prevent Iranian retaliatory strikes from [triggering Article 5](#) or a wider continental war.
- **Diplomatic Off-Ramps:** Neutral mediators (Oman, Switzerland) should prioritize a ["Strait for Ceasefire"](#) deal to reopen global trade before economic damage becomes irreversible.
- **Humanitarian Oversight:** International bodies must demand an [independent investigation](#) into the Minab school strike and other civilian massacres to maintain the thin remaining threads of international humanitarian law.

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Fragility:** High-tech manufacturers (semiconductors) must diversify away from [Gulf-produced raw materials](#), such as helium, which is critical for chip production and currently at risk.
- **Energy Hedging:** Corporations should brace for [prolonged energy price volatility](#) and look for alternative logistics routes that bypass the Eastern Mediterranean and the Persian Gulf.

- **Political Risk:** Investors in the Gulf "haven" states must re-evaluate their [risk premiums](#), as the precedent of targeting neutral civilian and business infrastructure in Qatar and the UAE has been set.
