



DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The geopolitical landscape shifted violently on March 9, 2026, as Iran confirmed the death of Supreme Leader Grand Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, who was eliminated in US-Israeli strikes. The immediate appointment of his son, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#), as successor signals a hardening of the Islamic Republic's stance, coinciding with Iranian missile strikes against US military assets in Qatar, the UAE, and Bahrain. This escalation has triggered a global energy crisis, with the [closure of the Strait of Hormuz](#) disrupting 20% of global oil trade and pushing Brent crude toward \$120 per barrel. G7 finance ministers have convened emergency sessions to authorize the release of strategic reserves as the specter of a broader regional war threatens to induce a global recession.

In Nigeria, the external shock of the Middle East war has collided with systemic domestic instability. Fuel prices have surged to [N1,175](#)

[per liter](#), heightening inflationary pressure even as the Dangote Refinery struggles with crude volatility. Domestically, the political order is in flux; the People's Democratic Party (PDP) has essentially collapsed following a [crushing appellate court defeat](#) and the defection of Zamfara Governor Dauda Lawal to the APC. Simmering under these crises is a staggering allegation by the Senate Public Accounts Committee that [N210 trillion is unaccounted for](#) within the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPCL) between 2017 and 2023, a development that threatens to dismantle public trust in the country's energy management during its most vulnerable hour.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

Geopolitical Escalation: The Death of Khamenei and Iranian Retaliation

- Iran confirmed that Grand Ayatollah Ali Khamenei was [killed in recent US-Israeli strikes](#), leading to a wave of international tributes and domestic mourning. [tributes and domestic mourning](#).

Global Energy Crisis and Market Volatility

- Oil prices surged past \$119 per barrel before settling near \$105 following news that the G7 would release [strategic petroleum reserves](#). [strategic petroleum reserves](#).

- The Strait of Hormuz remains effectively closed, [trapping shipments](#) and forcing the rerouting of flows through the Red Sea. [trapping shipments](#).
- Nigeria's domestic fuel prices spiked, with PMS hitting N1,175 and diesel [climbing to N1,620](#) per liter as operational costs rise. [climbing to N1,620](#).

Nigerian Political Realignment and Institutional Crisis

- The Court of Appeal dismissed a PDP appeal, upholding a ruling that restrained the recognition of its [2025 national convention](#) outcomes. [2025 national convention](#).
- Governor Dauda Lawal of Zamfara State [resigned from the PDP](#) to join the All Progressives Congress (APC), citing leadership tussles. [resigned from the PDP](#).
- Peter Obi, former Labor Party presidential candidate, officially registered as a [member of the African Democratic Congress](#) (ADC) ahead of the 2027 elections. [member of the African Democratic Congress](#).
- A fire broke out at the [Head of Civil Service building](#) in Abuja, though it was reportedly limited to a specific section. [Head of Civil Service building](#).

Security and Health Emergencies

- Security agencies [rescued 20 kidnap victims](#) in the FCT following an intelligence-driven operation that tracked suspects across state lines to Kaduna. [rescued 20 kidnap victims](#).
- A Lassa fever outbreak in Benue State has resulted in [10 deaths](#), including healthcare workers. [10 deaths](#).

NNPCL Financial Scandals

- The Senate Public Accounts Committee has summoned former and current NNPCL leadership to account for [N210 trillion in discrepancies](#) found in audited statements from 2017 to 2023. [N210 trillion in discrepancies](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Corruption & Governance The NNPCL is facing a monumental probe as the Senate Committee on Public Accounts identifies [N210 trillion missing or unaccounted for](#) across multiple years. Lawmakers described the financial statements as failing basic accounting principles, with [trillions in expenditures](#) lacking tied documentation for audit fees or specific liabilities. This is framed as a "wholesale fraud" that the current administration must now reconcile, as the figures equal several years of the [national budget](#). [national budget](#).

Energy Security Global tensions have compromised Nigeria's energy security. While higher oil prices usually provide a windfall, the nation is struggling with [surging operational costs](#) and the necessity of importing refined products like WTI from the US to keep the Dangote Refinery operational. The [refinery CEO David Bird](#) noted that global volatility and crude availability remain the

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics The Nigerian opposition is effectively splintering. The PDP's internal crisis has reached a terminal phase with [unfavorable court rulings](#) and the high-profile [defection of Governor Dauda Lawal](#). Meanwhile, the emergence of the ADC as a landing spot for Peter Obi suggests a consolidation of [third-party interests](#) ahead of the 2027 cycle, potentially altering the traditional two-party dominance. Geopolitical Power Dynamics The US-Israel-Iran war has entered a new phase of direct state-on-state combat. The strikes in Iran have [targeted oil facilities](#), schools, and energy depots, with reports of "black rain" in Tehran due to [oil storage fires](#). The US presidency's insistence on [influencing the Iranian succession](#) process highlights a highly interventionist foreign policy that allies in the UK and UAE are viewing with growing [apprehension regarding regional stability](#). Food & Water Security Iranian strikes on [desalination plants in the Middle East](#) threaten the basic life support systems of desert nations. LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Nigerian legislative activity focused on addressing systemic corruption in the oil sector and increasing social inclusion through constitutional amendments. Major hearings also addressed the economic transition to a

decarbonized economy and the management of humanitarian aid in the Northeast.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Special Seats for Women Bill:** An amendment seeking to create [reserved seats](#) for women in the National and State assemblies to address the low representation (currently below 5%). [reserved seats](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks)

- Global supply chains will feel the [shortage of fertilizers](#) from Qatar, leading to a projected [spike in food prices](#) in sub-Saharan Africa during the next harvest cycle.

- The Dangote Refinery will seek further [government support](#) to secure Nigerian crude grades to insulate itself from global volatility.

Long Term (1-5 Years)

- The succession of Mojtaba Khamenei could lead to a [prolonged period of Iranian isolation](#) or a more aggressive "balance of terror" if nuclear aspirations continue under the new leadership.
- Nigeria may move toward a [decentralized power grid](#) as federal failures in the [Siemens electricity deal](#) and privatization continue to yield dismal results.
- The shift in Nigerian politics toward [third-party coalitions](#) like the ADC could lead to a fragmented 2027 election, necessitating the first truly coalition-based government in the Fourth Republic.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **Energy Security:** Western allies must prioritize [coordinating strategic reserve releases](#) to prevent a permanent \$120+ oil floor, which would cripple emerging economies like Nigeria.
- **Diplomatic Engagement:** Reassess the policy of [demanding a say](#) in Iranian leadership succession, as this narrative is [strengthening nationalist hardliners](#) in Tehran.
- **Global Health:** Strengthen [biosurveillance and support](#) for Nigerian health agencies to contain Lassa fever and other zoonotic diseases before they reach transit hubs like Lagos or Abuja.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Diversify sourcing for [urea and fertilizers](#) immediately to avoid the expected Q3/Q4 2026 shortages stemming from the Gulf conflict.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Monitor the [NNPCL probe](#) closely; any major restructuring of the oil giant could change joint venture terms and profit-sharing models for international oil companies (IOCs).
- **Infrastructure Investment:** Opportunities exist in the [agritech sector](#), particularly AI-driven soil monitoring and [mortality tracking for livestock](#), as farmers seek to mitigate climate and resource shocks.
