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THE APPOINTMENT OF MOJTABA KHAMENEI AS IRAN'S SUPREME LEADER AMID AN ESCALATING REGIONAL WAR HAS TRIGGERED A GLOBAL ENERGY SHOCK, WHILE POLITICAL PARALYSIS IN BOSNIA THREATENS TO COLLAPSE STATE INSTITUTIONS AND FORFEIT CRITICAL EU DEVELOPMENT FUNDS.

### DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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The geopolitical landscape on March 9, 2026, is dominated by the rapid escalation of conflict in the Middle East following the joint U.S.-Israeli strikes that killed Ayatollah Ali Khamenei. In a historic first for the Islamic Republic, power has transitioned dynastically to his son, **Mojtaba Khamenei**, who is perceived by analysts as a more [radical, hard-line leader](#) with deep ties to the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC). This succession occurs as the U.S. Pentagon, under Secretary of Defense Pete Hegseth, signals a shift toward a policy of "unconditional surrender" for the Iranian regime, despite growing domestic dissent over **American casualties** and the economic fallout of the

war. Global oil prices have surged past \$110-\$120 per barrel, reviving fears of a 2008-style financial crisis as the Hormuz Strait remains a primary chokepoint for energy distribution.

In Bosnia and Herzegovina, the global energy shock has manifested in fuel prices reaching the critical [3.00 KM per liter](#) mark, prompting fears of runaway inflation. The state's inability to respond is exacerbated by a **legislative stalemate** in the House of Peoples, which has blocked the suspension of fuel excise taxes and jeopardized the second tranche of the **EU Growth Plan** funds. Domestic stability is further threatened by a coordinated announcement from 23,000 state employees planning **massive protests** on March 31 over frozen wages and institutional neglect. Simultaneously, the transport sector is on the brink of collapse as regional neighbors like Serbia ban oil exports and Croatia enforces strict labor regulations on Bosnian drivers, creating a **supply chain crisis** that could see total border blockades by the end of the month.

### MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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- **Iranian Succession and Escalation:** Mojtaba Khamenei has been named the third Supreme Leader of Iran, signaling a [dynastic shift](#) in the regime's power structure. Following the transition, Iran launched significant missile and drone salvos against Israel and several Gulf states, including Qatar and the UAE, where U.S. assets were targeted.
- **Global Energy Crisis:** Oil prices have spiked over 25% in a single day, with Brent Crude approaching [150 dollars per barrel](#) in some projections. Regional reactions include Serbia's ban on oil exports and Croatia's implementation of fuel price caps to prevent a "chain reaction" of inflation.

- **Operation Midnight Hammer/Epic Fury:** U.S. Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth confirmed that the U.S. aims for the [total combat-ineffectiveness](#) of the Iranian military. However, internal reports indicate the U.S. may be investigating its own involvement in a strike on an Iranian school that killed over 160 children, a claim the administration is struggling to manage.
- **Bosnian Institutional Collapse:** The state broadcaster BHRT is facing [total shutdown](#) due to a lack of a systemic funding solution, while political blockades by the HDZ and SNSD have halted the EU's multi-million euro Growth Plan.
- **Regional Militarization:** Croatia has officially [reintroduced mandatory military service](#), with the first 800 recruits entering barracks today, marking a significant shift in Balkan security architecture in response to global instability.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Energy Security & Supply Chains

- The Hormuz Strait closure has [halted oil exports](#) from the Gulf, forcing Bosnian distributors to rely almost exclusively (73.6%) on Croatian imports via the Bijača border crossing.
- The Bosnian transport sector reports that 375 drivers are currently [sidelined from work](#) due to the Schengen 90/180-day rule, threatening 12 billion KM in annual exports.
- Federal Minister of Commerce Amir Hasičević warned that diesel consumption has [doubled to 3 million liters](#) daily due to panic buying, straining local reserves that may only last 5 to 15 days if a total cutoff occurs.

### Succession & Stability

- The appointment of Mojtaba Khamenei is viewed as a [move toward ultra-radicalization](#), as he possesses stronger ties to the IRGC than his father.
- Analysts suggest the transition circumvents traditional religious seniority (Ayatollah status) through constitutional maneuvering, potentially [weakening regime legitimacy](#) among traditionalists while consolidating military control.

### Corruption & Governance

- The Bosnian Council of Ministers is under scrutiny for distributing [3.8 million KM](#) from budget reserves for "emergency situations" without a public call or clear criteria, raising allegations of political patronage.
- Political blockades in the House of Peoples are being described as [deliberate sabotage](#) of the EU Growth Plan to maintain political leverage ahead of the October elections.

### AI & Technology Policy

- Researchers in Germany have debuted an [AI model](#) capable of predicting mortality risk and biological age with high precision via full-body MRI scans, raising ethical concerns about its use in "therapy rationing."
- Advancements in "One Health" biosurveillance are focusing on [pathogen mutations](#) in domestic pets to prevent future pandemics, though controversy remains over "gain-of-function" research risks.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Legislative activity today was defined by a critical lack of quorum and political obstructionism regarding emergency economic measures and EU-mandated reforms. The Bosnian state apparatus is effectively stalled during a period of peak regional volatility.

### BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Law on Excise Taxes:** Proposed amendments to allow the Council of Ministers to [fully suspend fuel excises](#) for up to six months remain stuck in parliamentary procedure.
- **Law on Salaries in BIH Institutions:** Legislation intended to provide [retroactive wage increases](#) for state employees is currently being blocked in the House of Peoples, fueling the upcoming March 31 protest.
- **Law on BHANSA/Civil Aviation:** Proposed reforms to transform the aviation directorate into an [independent agency](#) were defeated in the House of Representatives by a single vote, allegedly due to its impact on political patronage.
- **EU Growth Plan Reform Agenda:** A roadmap for [clean energy and education reforms](#) tied to 976 million euros in EU aid remains unadopted due to "additional consultations" between entity and state levels.

### HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Federal Ministry of Commerce Press Conference:** Minister Amir Hasičević announced that despite [price increases of 0.39 KM](#), supply remains stable but warned against panic hoarding of diesel.

- **Joint Commission for European Integration:** The session [failed to convene](#) due to a lack of quorum, preventing any progress on the EU reform agenda.
- **Hegseth Exclusive Interview:** The U.S. Defense Secretary outlined a [maximalist strategy](#) for Iran, rejecting the "remaking of society" while insisting on military victory.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Dynastic Hard-Line Shift

The rapid elevation of Mojtaba Khamenei represents more than a simple succession; it is the [militarization of the Supreme Leader's office](#). Unlike his father, who balanced clerical and political factions, Mojtaba is a veteran of the Iran-Iraq war and has spent years acting as the "black eminence" managing the IRGC's internal security apparatus. This suggests that the Iranian regime has abandoned diplomatic engagement in favor of a "steroid-enhanced" version of its previous hard-line stance, anticipating that the U.S. and Israel will not stop until the [regime is eliminated](#). The psychological effect on the Iranian population is one of forced homogenization under fire, rather than the "internal collapse" predicted by the Trump administration.

### Institutional Decay in the Balkans

Bosnia and Herzegovina is demonstrating a [dangerous decoupling](#) between executive needs and legislative capacity. While the Council of Ministers requests pre-financing for EU plans, the House of Peoples functions as a "veto machine." This trend is pushing state employees and the private transport sector toward radicalization, with **Dragan Matović** of the Border Police Union warning that the [31st of March](#) will be a "turning

point" for civil unrest. The state is effectively cannibalizing its own long-term viability— forfeiting nearly a billion euros in EU aid—to protect short-term political patronage and ethnic blockades.

### **The End of the Global Liberal Order**

The "Midnight Hammer" operation and the subsequent closure of the Hormuz Strait are being interpreted as the [final collapse](#) of the 1945 international order. Analysts note that the U.S. is increasingly acting outside the constitutional and UN-mandated frameworks, with the U.S. Defense Secretary dismissing [media reports on fallen soldiers](#) as "political vendettas." This trend suggests a move toward a **multipolar world** dominated by raw military power (U.S., China, Russia) where the UN and EU are increasingly "irrelevant" actors unable to restrain major powers or even protect their own energy interests.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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### **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):**

- Expect **fuel price surges** to continue, likely hitting 3.20 KM in Bosnia, leading to the first wave of [transport-led protests](#) at border crossings.
- The March 31st protest by 23,000 state employees will likely [paralyze government functions](#) and border operations if a wage agreement is not reached.
- U.S. casualties in the Iran theater will likely exceed [official counts](#), increasing domestic pressure on the White House to demonstrate a "win."

### **Medium Term (1-6 Months):**

- If the EU Growth Plan is not ratified by summer, Bosnia will [permanently lose access](#) to the first 976 million euro tranche, with funds likely diverted to Moldova or Albania.
- The **total collapse of BHRT** will create a media vacuum on the state level, further [fragmenting the country](#) into ethnic media silos (RTRS and FTV).
- Croatia's military service will face its first logistical hurdles as the number of "conscientious objectors" (currently only 1%) [likely increases](#) if the Middle East war draws in NATO allies.

### **Long Term (1-5 Years):**

- The shift to **Mojtaba Khamenei** could either stabilize the regime through absolute IRGC loyalty or lead to a [protracted civil-military conflict](#) within Iran if the economy collapses completely under the \$150/barrel oil paradigm.
- Bosnia may see a **re-composition of its political majority** if the "Trojka" coalition collapses under the weight of the failed EU reforms and the [premiership resignation](#) in Sarajevo Canton.

## **RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS**

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### **For International Policy:**

- Stabilization of the **Bosnian House of Peoples** must be a diplomatic priority for the EU to prevent the [Growth Plan forfeiture](#), which acts as the only remaining anchor for state-level cohesion.

- The U.S. must clarify its position on [non-combatant casualties](#) in Iran to prevent the complete alienation of remaining Gulf allies like Qatar, who feel "betrayed" by the lack of prior consultation.
- Regional security actors should monitor **Serbia's export bans** and military build-up, as global distractions may provide a [window for opportunistic escalation](#) in the Balkans.

#### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Energy Hedging:** Investors should prepare for oil to remain [above \\$120](#) for the next two quarters, significantly impacting petro-chemical and logistics-dependent industries.
- **Supply Chain Risk:** The transport sector in Bosnia is at [imminent risk of blockade](#); firms should seek multi-modal alternatives or local stockpiling before March 31.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** New **mandatory military service** laws in Croatia and potentially elsewhere will [disrupt the labor market](#) for males aged 18-27, requiring workforce planning adjustments.
