DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

The geopolitical landscape underwent a foundational shift on March 9, 2026, following the appointment of [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the Supreme Leader of Iran. This succession, occurring only eight days after the assassination of his father, Ali Khamenei, represents a defiant consolidation of power by the Iranian clerical establishment and the Revolutionary Guard. The transition has been met with immediate hostility from the United States and Israel, with President Donald Trump labeling the appointment [inacceptable](#) and Israeli officials designating the new leader as a primary military target. This leadership change has coincided with a dramatic escalation in regional hostilities, including Iranian missile strikes against energy infrastructure in Bahrain and the UAE, and the [interception of missiles](#) over Turkish (NATO) airspace.

Economically, the "war of the refineries" has pushed global energy markets into a state of

high-intensity volatility. Brent crude oil prices breached [\\$110](#) and peaked near \$120 before retreating slightly following news that G7 finance ministers were debating a [coordinated release](#) of strategic petroleum reserves. In Catalonia, the domestic agenda is caught between labor unrest and a looming budget crisis. While the government signed a "historic" wage agreement with major unions, the [strike remains active](#) among primary education faculty. Furthermore, the political stability of the Generalitat remains precarious as negotiations for the 2026 budget are deadlocked over demands for total [fiscal management](#) of the IRPF (income tax) by Esquerra Republicana (ERC).

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Iranian Succession and Hardline Continuity:** The Assembly of Experts has formally appointed [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as Supreme Leader, signaling a commitment to the Revolutionary Guard's influence and a rejection of Western demands for de-escalation.
 - The Revolutionary Guard has already [pledged obedience](#) to the new leader.
 - Israel responded with a new wave of [infrastructure strikes](#) against Iranian refineries.
 - The U.S. has signaled it will not recognize the [new mandate](#).

- **Global Energy Shock and G7 Intervention:** War in the Persian Gulf has disrupted supply lines, leading to a [30% spike](#) in Texas crude and over 20% in Brent.
 - The closure of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) is now a de facto reality, threatening 20% of global oil flow.
 - G7 ministers are meeting via [videoconference](#) to stabilize markets through emergency reserve releases.
 - In Catalonia, electricity prices have surged by [50%](#) in a single day.
- **NATO and Regional Escalation:** For the second time in a week, a [ballistic missile](#) was intercepted over Turkey, raising the risk of Article 5 invocation.
 - President Erdogan has issued a [severe warning](#) to Iran regarding Turkish sovereignty.
 - Emmanuel Macron has proposed a [military mission](#) to escort tankers through the Gulf.
- **Catalan Domestic Labor Standoff:** The Department of Education reached a partial agreement to increase teacher salaries by [200 euros](#) monthly.
 - The majority union (USTEC) rejected the deal as [purely ideological](#) and maintains strike calls for next week.
 - The government argues the deal moves Catalan teachers from the bottom to the [top three](#) best-paid in the Spanish state.

- **FC Barcelona Leadership Crisis:** Former coach Xavi Hernández has launched a [scathing critique](#) of President Joan Laporta just six days before club elections.
 - Xavi alleges that Laporta [blocked](#) the return of Lionel Messi and that an external advisor, Alejandro Echevarría, effectively [runs the club](#).

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession & Stability: The elevation of Mojtaba Khamenei represents a critical test for Iranian [regime stability](#) during wartime. His close ties to the military wing suggest a [militarization](#) of the Supreme Leader's office, aimed at suppressing internal dissent and projecting force abroad. However, the lack of public familiarity with Mojtaba may [undermine](#) his legitimacy among the broader Iranian population.

Energy Security: The threat of a protracted conflict has turned oil into a [weapon of war](#). The G7's focus on [emergency releases](#) highlights the vulnerability of the current global energy architecture. Beyond oil, the price of gas and [electricity](#) is creating an immediate inflationary spiral that threatens domestic social order in Europe.

Regional Influence & Power Projection: France is attempting to assert [European sovereignty](#) in the Persian Gulf through a naval escort mission, though it remains reluctant to engage in direct combat. Conversely, Turkey is caught between its [NATO obligations](#) and the risk of a spillover conflict on its borders, particularly regarding the [Kurdish issue](#) within Iran.

Economic Security & Supply Chains: The conflict is impacting high-tech sectors, as the production of [semiconductor chips](#) depends on helium gas exports from Qatar, which are

now [at risk](#) due to the instability in the Strait of Hormuz. Additionally, the [transportation costs](#) for food and consumer goods have risen by 20% due to surging diesel prices.

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics: In Catalonia, the PSC-led government is struggling with [coalition cohesion](#). ERC is leveraging the 2026 budget to demand the [transfer of IRPF management](#), a move the PSC frames as a matter of "fulfilling investment agreements" while ERC views it as a [red line](#) for stability.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance in Catalonia is currently defined by a stalemate over the **2026 Budget** and the implementation of **housing and education policies**. The government is attempting to bypass legislative blockades through sector-specific agreements, while the opposition demands structural fiscal changes. Press events today highlighted a growing divide between [administrative optimism](#) and union skepticism.

• **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**

- **Generalitat Budget 2026:** A 9-billion-euro project currently stalled. ERC is threatening a [veto](#) unless tax management is decentralized.
- **Bo Lloguer Jove (State Youth Rent Bonus):** Applications opened today for a [250-euro monthly subsidy](#) for individuals under 35 with incomes below 25,200 euros.
- **Anti-Speculation Housing Law:** A proposed ban on [speculative house flipping](#) agreed upon by PSC and Comuns, though its passage is tied to the broader budget negotiation.

• **HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:**

- **Albert Dalmau Press Conference:** The Counselor of the Presidency announced a [historic agreement](#) with UGT and CCOO unions to increase teacher salaries and reduce ratios.
- **Lluïsa Moret Interview:** The PSC spokesperson emphasized the need for [institutional stability](#) and clarified that the IRPF management transfer is already [part of the investiture pact](#).
- **G7 Finance Ministers Summit:** A digital meeting to coordinate [market stabilization](#) and potential release of oil reserves.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Weaponization of Energy and Inflation: A clear trend has emerged where the Middle East conflict is being fought as much in the commodity markets as on the battlefield. Iran's strategy appears to involve [systematic attacks](#) on Gulf refineries to force a global economic crisis that could compel Western powers to restrain Israel. The resulting inflation is already [impacting daily life](#) in Catalonia, with sharp increases in the costs of plastics, [food transport](#), and pharmaceutical packaging. This "economic warfare" is testing the [resilience](#) of European consumers and the political survival of governments already facing labor discontent.

The Fragmentation of the Left and Feminist Movement: Reports from the March 8th demonstrations in Barcelona and Madrid reveal a [deepening rift](#) within the feminist movement. The existence of "double convocations"—one supporting the [Trans Law](#) and another maintaining abolitionist stances—indicates that ideological fragmentation is

weakening the [unity of action](#) against the rise of the far-right. Furthermore, surveys suggest a [growing detachment](#) among young men from feminist ideas, viewing the movement as an [adversarial](#) rather than inclusive force.

Technological Sovereignty and the Future of Labor: The 20th anniversary of the [Mobile World Congress](#) highlights a dual-track development in labor. While Catalonia celebrates its role as a [tech hub](#) for AI and 6G, the traditional education sector is in crisis. A significant trend shows university students [abandoning faculties](#) in favor of private academies to pass difficult subjects, suggesting a [failure](#) of the public university model to provide the "mashed" (practical) knowledge students feel they need for the current job market.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect extreme [fuel price volatility](#) as markets react to G7 reserve releases. If the Strait of Hormuz remains blocked, oil could stabilize above \$130.
- The teachers' strike on [March 16](#) will proceed despite the government's partial deal, likely causing significant disruption in Catalan schools.
- The March 20 budget debate will be the "make or break" moment for the Salvador Illa administration; a failure to reach an agreement with ERC could lead to [early election](#) rumors.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- A likely [military escalation](#) in the Gulf as France and other EU nations deploy naval forces to protect trade, potentially leading to [direct clashes](#) with Iranian proxies.

- Inflationary pressures will force the [Spanish government](#) to reintroduce subsidies for fuel and basic foods, similar to the 2022 measures during the Ukraine war.
- The FC Barcelona elections will likely result in a highly polarized club, with the [Xavi-Laporta](#) feud continuing to destabilize the sporting project.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The Iranian regime will likely move toward a [military-clerical hybrid](#) under Mojtaba Khamenei, increasing the risk of regional nuclear proliferation.
- Catalonia may see a fundamental shift in [fiscal sovereignty](#) if the IRPF management is successfully transferred, altering the balance of power between the Generalitat and Madrid.
- The shift in senior living toward [co-housing](#) models will begin to impact the real estate market, potentially [releasing thousands](#) of larger family apartments back into the rental pool.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- **NATO Cohesion:** Urgent diplomatic engagement with Turkey is required to prevent a unilateral escalation following [missile incursions](#).
- **Energy Diversification:** The G7 must accelerate the [de-risking](#) of supply chains that rely on the Strait of Hormuz, particularly for essential gasses like [helium](#).

- **Humanitarian Focus:** The displacement of [over 500,000](#) people in Lebanon necessitates a coordinated EU refugee and aid strategy to prevent a new Mediterranean crisis.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Hedging:** Industries reliant on [petrochemicals](#) (plastics, fertilizers) or semiconductors must prepare for significant cost increases and [delivery delays](#).
- **Labor Relations:** The Catalan [labor agreement](#) sets a new floor for public sector wages; private companies should anticipate similar upward pressure on salaries to match inflation.
- **Investment Opportunities:** The shift toward [senior co-housing](#) and public-private housing partnerships in Barcelona presents a growth area for social-impact real estate investors.
