

COGNITIVE DISSONANCE IN
TEHRAN: US CLAIMS DECISIVE
VICTORY AMIDST EXPANDING
REGIONAL ATTRITION

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 10, 2026, marks a pivotal moment of cognitive dissonance in the ongoing conflict between the U.S.-Israeli coalition and Iran. While U.S. President Donald Trump and Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth have characterized "Operation Epic Fury" as a [resounding success](#) that is "ahead of schedule," military operations on the ground reached their [most intense level](#) to date. The U.S. administration is messaging a swift conclusion to the war to stabilize volatile global energy markets, yet the Pentagon simultaneously warned of [unrelenting strikes](#) against Iran's military-industrial base. The conflict has moved beyond a "surgical" air campaign into a broad war of attrition that has effectively [halted oil and gas exports](#) from the Gulf region, leading to a humanitarian crisis in Lebanon and rising domestic political friction in Washington.

The Iranian leadership remains defiant following the [succession of Mustafa Khamenei](#)

as the new Supreme Leader. Tehran has rejected U.S. claims of its military collapse, vowing a [proportionate retaliation](#) against civilian and energy infrastructure. This horizontal escalation has already seen Iranian projectiles strike [UAE, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, and Kuwait](#), targeting energy hubs and residential towers. In Lebanon, the conflict has intensified, forcing nearly [700,000 people from their homes](#) as the Israeli military signals a desire to expand its southern buffer zone. The international community, led by Germany and the EU, is increasingly vocal about the [lack of a joint exit plan](#), fearing an "endless war" that could trigger a global economic depression.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Escalation of "Operation Epic Fury":** Despite rhetoric of an early end to hostilities, the U.S. conducted its [most intense day of strikes](#) inside Iran, deploying record numbers of bombers and fighters to dismantle missile production and naval assets ([including B-2 and B-52 sorties](#)). The U.S. claims to have [destroyed 51 Iranian vessels](#) and reduced ballistic missile capabilities by 90%.
- **Iranian Succession and Defiance:** Mustafa Khamenei, son of the assassinated leader, has been formally named Supreme Leader, signaling [continuity of the hardline faction](#). The Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) dismissed U.S. victory claims as "nonsense," asserting that [Iran will determine](#) when the conflict stops.

- **Global Energy Gridlock:** The Strait of Hormuz remains effectively closed to commercial traffic. Saudi Arabia's Aramco warned of [catastrophic consequences](#) for world markets, as Qatar, Bahrain, and the UAE have been forced to [halt production](#) following Iranian strikes on refineries and processing plants.
- **Lebanese Front Intensification:** Israel is bombarding Beirut's southern suburbs and issuing forced evacuation orders for [villages south of the Litani River](#). Lebanese President Joseph Aoun has proposed a [four-point plan](#) for direct talks with Israel to disarm Hezbollah, a move met with [skepticism in Washington](#).
- **U.S. Domestic and Legislative Friction:** The war is deeply unpopular at home, with approval ratings [at only 27%](#). Amidst the conflict, the Trump administration is pressuring Congress to pass the [Save America Act](#), a sweeping election reform bill, while facing a [partial DHS shutdown](#) over funding disputes.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Energy Security & Infrastructure

- Iranian strikes have targeted key energy sites including the [Bapco refinery in Bahrain](#) and the [Shaiba oil field](#) in Saudi Arabia.
- Qatar has declared [force majeure](#) on LNG shipments, disrupting 20% of the world's gas supply [due to unsafe maritime routes](#).
- The U.S. is considering [naval escorts](#) for tankers, though military leaders admit the Strait of Hormuz may be [laced with mines](#).

- U.S. officials are [refusing to recognize](#) the new leadership, with the Press Secretary calling him a "radical terrorist."

Coalition Cohesion & Diplomatic Engagement

- German Chancellor Friedrich Merz expressed concern that the U.S. and Israel [lack a joint plan](#) for ending the war quickly.
- The UK has allowed the U.S. to use [RAF Fairford](#) for long-range bombing missions, despite initial resistance from PM Keir Starmer ([reversing his earlier position](#)).
- France and Greece have [visited Cyprus](#) to pledge European primacy in the Mediterranean and protect waterways, signaling a possible [pivot away from U.S.-led](#) regional security.

Economic Security

- Global stock markets [rebounded slightly](#) on Trump's "soon" victory comments, but analysts warn of [stagflation](#) if energy prices remain near \$90-\$100 per barrel.
- Pakistan and Bangladesh have [implemented fuel rationing](#) and school closures to conserve energy stocks ([Pakistan raising prices by 55 rupees](#)).
- The U.S. Treasury [waived sanctions](#) for India to purchase "already at sea" Russian oil to mitigate global supply gaps.

Statecraft & National Security

- The Pentagon confirmed [140 U.S. soldiers wounded](#) and 8 killed since the start of the conflict.
- U.S. Central Command reported [destroying 16 mine-laying vessels](#) near the Strait of Hormuz.
- Iran's UN envoy accused the coalition of targeting [nearly 10,000 civilian sites](#), including schools and hospitals.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Governance in the U.S. and Israel is being reshaped by the war through emergency budgeting and controversial domestic policy pushes. While Israel focuses on funding its "Operation Roaring Lion," the U.S. administration is leveraging the national emergency to push through significant election and social legislation.

- **BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:**
 - **Save America Act:** A 5-point U.S. legislative proposal requiring [voter ID and proof of citizenship](#), banning universal mail-in ballots, prohibiting transgender surgery for children, and [banning men from women's sports](#).
 - **Operation Roaring Lion War Budget (Israel):** An emergency [13 billion dollar](#) expansion of the Israeli defense budget to finance the Iran war.
 - **DHS Funding Bill:** Currently [stalled in the U.S. Senate](#), leading to a partial shutdown and non-payment of TSA, FEMA, and Coast Guard personnel.

• HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Senate Armed Services Committee Classified Briefing:** Democratic senators emerged [disturbed by the lack of an endgame](#), with Senator Blumenthal warning of a path toward [American boots on the ground](#).
- **Pentagon Press Briefing:** Secretary Hegseth and General Dan Kane detailed [degradation of Iranian assets](#) while maintaining that the U.S. will not engage in "democracy building."
- **White House Daily Briefing:** Press Secretary Caroline Levitt argued that the war [would result in lower gas prices](#) in the long term and defended the administration's domestic legislative agenda.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Strategy of "Horizontal Escalation"

Iran appears to have successfully shifted the conflict's gravity from a purely defensive posture to a [regional disruption strategy](#). By targeting U.S. partners in the Gulf rather than engaging solely with U.S. military assets, Tehran is testing the "pain tolerance" of the [global economy](#). The disconnect between Trump's campaign promise to end "forever wars" and the current bombardment of [eight countries](#) is being exploited by Democrats ahead of the midterm elections. To counter this, the White House is [aggressively framing](#) the war as a pre-emptive strike against an [imminent threat](#) (claiming Iran was 3 to 7 days away from striking the U.S.), despite intelligence analysts [doubting these assertions](#).

Fragmenting Global Alliances

A significant shift is occurring in European security thinking. The perception that the U.S. is [part of the problem](#) rather than the solution is driving France and Greece to assert [European primacy](#) in the Mediterranean. Concurrently, Russia is positioning itself as a [potential broker](#), with Putin offering "good services" to mediate while [profiting from rising oil prices](#) to fund its own war in Ukraine. The Gulf states, particularly Qatar, are expressing a deep sense of [betrayal by Iran](#) while simultaneously [refusing to allow U.S. bases](#) on their soil to be used for offensive strikes, leaving the U.S. reliant on distant carrier groups and UK-based bombers.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks):

- Expect a [clash of wills](#) regarding the "finish line." Trump may unilaterally [declare victory](#) to stop the oil price surge, but the IRGC is likely to [continue missile strikes](#) to ensure any U.S. exit is on Iranian terms.
- The humanitarian situation in Lebanon will reach a [breaking point](#), with registered IDPs likely exceeding [one million](#) as Israel expands its ground operations.

Medium Term (1-6 Months):

- The U.S. midterm elections will be [dominated by the cost of the war](#) (\$1 billion per day) and its impact on [domestic inflation](#).
- If the Strait of Hormuz remains contested, a [global recession](#) is almost certain, forcing drastic [interest rate hikes](#) in Japan and the EU to combat cost-push inflation.

Long Term (1-5 Years):

- The war will likely [accelerate nuclear proliferation](#). Analysts warn that Iran, having seen its conventional deterrent fail, will likely conclude that only [nuclear weapons](#) can ensure state survival.
- A structural shift in energy supply chains will occur as Asian economies [diversify away from the Gulf](#), potentially leading to a [new regional order](#) dominated by Sino-Russian interests if the U.S. presence remains destabilizing.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- Diplomatic efforts should focus on [internationalizing the mediation mechanism](#) (e.g., a P5+France/Oman model) to provide the "guarantees" Iran demands against repeated U.S. strikes.
- Security architectures in the Gulf must transition from [passive defense](#) to a collaborative model that explicitly excludes [civilian infrastructure](#) from targeting.
- The UN must address the [assassination of diplomats](#) in Beirut to prevent the total collapse of the Vienna Convention and international diplomatic immunity.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Companies reliant on Gulf-produced chemicals, fertilizers, or aluminum should [secure alternative suppliers](#) immediately, as the "ripple effect" will last [months beyond](#) a potential ceasefire.
- **Aviation/Tourism Sector:** Global carriers face a [permanent polycrisis](#) environment; ticket prices between Asia and Europe are unlikely to return to 2025 levels due to [sustained insurance premiums](#) and rerouting costs.
- **Investment Strategy:** Short-term market [rallies based on "victory" rhetoric](#) should be viewed with skepticism; real stability requires a [reliable resumption of imports](#), not just presidential social media posts.
