Iran Weaponizes Energy Transit; US Seeks Latin American Military Coalition.

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

On March 10, 2026, global stability is increasingly threatened by the eleventh day of "Operation Epic Fury," a high-intensity military campaign led by the United States and Israel against Iran. Following the death of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei on February 28, the swift succession of his son, Mojtaba Khamenei, has solidified a hardline Iranian response characterized by asymmetric warfare and the effective closure of the Strait of Hormuz. This blockade has triggered a severe energy shock, with Brent crude reaching \$108 per barrel and global supply chains for fertilizers and liquefied natural gas (LNG) facing unprecedented disruptions. While the U.S. claims to have neutralized over 500 targets, the resilience of Iranian defense systems and its regional proxies suggests a

prolonged conflict that the United Nations appears powerless to mediate.

Simultaneously, U.S. President Donald Trump is leveraging the "Shield of the Americas" summit in Florida to propose a military coalition aimed at intervening directly against Mexican cartels, which he compares to the Islamic State. This has created a significant diplomatic rift with Mexican President Claudia Sheinbaum, who continues to reject any entry of U.S. forces while citing domestic gains in reducing homicides by 44% compared to historical peaks. The day's events underscore a fragmenting international order where traditional diplomacy is being replaced by bilateral pressure and technological warfare, leaving European allies like Spain and France increasingly skeptical of Washington's regional objectives.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

- **Escalation of Operation Epic Fury:**

- The U.S. Pentagon and Israel have intensified strikes against [500 Iranian targets](#), focusing on missile arsenals and naval assets.
- The campaign has seen 140 U.S. soldiers wounded and significant damage to Iranian underground [launch facilities](#) in the south.
- Iran has retaliated with over 571 missile launches during the conflict, targeting U.S. [regional bases](#) and infrastructure in Bahrain and Kuwait.

- **Energy Crisis and the Strait of Hormuz Blockade:**

- Global oil prices have surged, with Brent crude rising to [\\$108 per barrel](#) due to the halt in transit through the Persian Gulf.
- The blockade has reduced daily tonnage through the Strait of Hormuz from 10 million to [practically zero](#), impacting 25% of global oil transit.
- Severe shortages of fertilizers and LNG are threatening [food security](#) in India, Thailand, and several African nations.

- **The "Shield of the Americas" Initiative:**

- President Trump met with 12 right-wing regional leaders in Florida to announce a [new military coalition](#) to eradicate criminal cartels.
- Trump identified Mexico as the "epicenter" of cartel violence and signaled his intent to [intervene directly](#) if necessary.

- **Mexican Domestic Security and Sovereignty:**

- President Sheinbaum has categorically rejected the [entry of U.S. forces](#), emphasizing that Mexican military and police will handle internal operations.
- The Security Cabinet reported a reduction of [38 daily homicides](#) compared to September 2024, representing a significant decline in violence under the current administration.

- **Lebanese Humanitarian Catastrophe:**

- Israeli bombardment of Lebanon has resulted in [570 deaths](#) and displaced 760,000 people, with 100,000 fleeing in a single 24-hour period.
- The WHO reports that a [fifth of the casualties](#) are children, as strikes increasingly target urban centers like Beirut.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Succession & Stability: Following the death of Ali Khamenei, the Assembly of Experts named his son, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#), as the new Leader, ensuring continuity for the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC). This "dynastic" succession is viewed as a defensive measure to maintain regime cohesion during the U.S. offensive. [Russian President Vladimir Putin](#) was among the first to congratulate him, signaling strong bloc alignment.

Energy Security: The conflict has exposed the extreme vulnerability of the European and Asian energy markets. The UK is reported to have only [one and a half days](#) of gas remaining, while Brazil faces a critical shortage of fertilizers usually imported from Qatar and Oman. Trump has dismissed these costs as a [small price to pay](#) for national security, despite domestic U.S. opposition to the war reaching 70%.

National Security & State Capacity:

Mexico's Secretary of Security, Omar García Harfuch, detailed the "National Strategy Against Extortion," which has led to [907 arrests](#) across 24 states. Mexico is increasingly relying on the "National Intelligence System" to coordinate defense, naval, and civilian intelligence to build [legal cases](#) against criminals, moving away from

simple arrests toward dismantling financial structures.

International Relations & Diplomatic Engagement: European unity is fracturing. Spain has forbidden U.S. military planes from using its bases for [attacks against Iran](#), citing the "errors of the past" (2003 Iraq War). Meanwhile, French President Emmanuel Macron has deployed the [carrier Charles de Gaulle](#) to the Mediterranean to assert European interests, even as the UN remains sidelined, with analysts calling for an ["Amber Alert"](#) for Secretary-General Antonio Guterres due to his total absence from the debate.

Critical Minerals: Venezuela has passed a new [Organic Mining Law](#) in its first reading, aiming to open its vast gold and rare earth reserves to U.S. companies. This is a strategic move to counter Chinese dominance in the sector, leveraging current influence over the Caracas administration.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity focused on electoral reform in Mexico and the expansion of mineral extraction rights in Venezuela, reflecting shifts in regional political control and resource management.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **Mexican Electoral Reform:** Proposed by President Sheinbaum, this initiative seeks to [reduce election costs](#), shorten campaign times, and eliminate plurinominal seats. It reportedly has over 80% public approval.
- **Venezuelan Organic Law of Mines:** Legislation designed to [attract foreign investment](#), specifically targeting U.S. mining firms for gold, bauxite, and coltan extraction.

- **Mexico Labor Reform:** Senator Malu Micher discussed reforms to [reduce the work week](#) and incorporate men into the "care economy" as part of a broader gender equality push.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **The "Mañanera" Security Report:** Secretary Harfuch presented data showing a [31.1% decrease](#) in vehicle theft with violence and a 57.6% drop in kidnappings during the first bimester of 2026.
- **Shield of the Americas Summit:** Trump's announcement of a [military coalition](#) for Latin America, focusing on designating cartels as terrorist organizations.
- **UN Independent Commission on Ukraine:** Denounced the [forcible deportation](#) of over 1,200 Ukrainian children to Russia as a crime against humanity.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Asymmetric Energy War: Iran has pivoted from traditional naval confrontation to an asymmetric strategy that targets the global economy. By mining the Strait of Hormuz and utilizing [hypersonic missiles](#), Tehran has forced U.S. aircraft carriers to move further into the Indian Ocean, effectively ceding tactical control of the Gulf's entrance. The result is not just a military stalemate but a global "logistics convulsion" where the cost of [maritime insurance](#) has spiked by 500%, a burden transferred directly to consumers.

The Crisis of International Law: Analysts observe the "death of international law" as established eighty years ago. The UN's inability to intervene in the U.S.-Iran conflict

has created a [vacuum of authority](#) that Trump is filling with "Epic Fury" and "Shield of the Americas." The shift toward a "law of the strongest" among three poles—China, Russia, and the U.S.—is disrupting traditional alliances, as seen in [Spain's refusal](#) to support military operations and the rise of "capricious annexation" schemes by various global leaders.

Technological Warfare and "Surgical Brutality: While the U.S. promotes "surgical strikes," regional reports indicate [massive civilian displacement](#) and the destruction of non-military infrastructure. The use of [artificial intelligence](#) in target selection and advanced missile defense (Patriot systems) has turned the Middle East into a testing ground for 21st-century combat, yet it has failed to achieve the political objective of [collapsing the Iranian government](#).

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

- **Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Domestic unrest in Europe is likely as [electricity rates](#) skyrocket due to gas shortages. In Mexico, diplomatic tension will peak as the "Shield of the Americas" coalition begins planning regional patrols, potentially infringing on Mexican [sovereignty](#).
- **Medium Term (1-6 Months):** Trump may face a [hostile Congress](#) in the November 2026 elections if the war's 70% unpopularity holds. Iran will likely maintain the Strait of Hormuz blockade until the U.S. suffers enough [economic damage](#) to force a negotiated retreat, potentially leading to a new "Petrodollar" crisis.

- **Long Term (1-5 Years):** A permanent shift toward "bloc politics" will see Russia, China, and Iran form a tighter [economic and military alliance](#). Mexico may seek to diversify its energy exports to Asia to capitalize on high prices, while the U.S. moves to [militarize supply chains](#) for critical minerals in South America.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The marginalization of the UN requires the development of alternative multilateral forums to prevent a total collapse of global maritime [trade order](#).
- NATO members must navigate the risk of being drawn into the conflict via [Article 5](#) if Iranian missiles continue to strike Turkey's border or radar systems.
- Regional powers in Latin America must define their stance on the "Shield of the Americas" to avoid [direct military intervention](#) by U.S.-led forces under the guise of anti-cartel operations.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** Manufacturers reliant on fertilizers or industrial gases should expect [long-term shortages](#) and should diversify sourcing toward the American continent.
- **Energy Costs:** European industrial businesses face a risk of [factory closures](#) as electricity rates increase five to six times current levels.

- **Investment Opportunity:** The Venezuelan mining sector presents a high-risk, high-reward opportunity as the [new mining law](#) targets U.S. investment to bypass Chinese influence.
