

DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

March 10, 2026, represents a critical juncture in the convergence of Middle Eastern kinetic conflict and Russian systemic decay. In Iran, the formal transition of power to [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the third Supreme Leader occurs under the shadow of a devastating U.S.-Israeli air campaign that has reportedly cost Washington \$6 billion in its first ten days. While President Donald Trump has publicly claimed the war is "practically finished," his administration simultaneously threatened [twenty-fold escalations](#) if oil transit through the Strait of Hormuz is obstructed, revealing a high-stakes strategy of maximum pressure intended to force a total Iranian capitulation. This geopolitical shock has sent oil prices into extreme volatility, peaking near \$120 before a temporary correction following Trump's rhetoric.

Domestically, the Russian Federation is accelerating its transition toward a neofeudal,

China-dependent state. The consolidation of power within the "neonobility"—exemplified by the [Patrushev clan's](#) extensive offshore and agribusiness holdings—contrasts sharply with the collapse of the domestic small business sector, where one-third of entrepreneurs are [considering closure](#) due to tax hikes and the loss of Western markets. This economic void is being rapidly filled by Chinese entities, which have seen a ten-fold increase in market presence since 2021. Concurrently, the Kremlin is intensifying its biopolitical control through the launch of a [federal pregnancy registry](#), while the expiration of the START III treaty has left the world's two largest nuclear arsenals without formal limitations for the first time in half a century, signaling an unconstrained return to global nuclear competition.

MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

The Hegemony of the Mojtaba Khamenei Era

- The Iranian Council of Experts officially named [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the successor to his father, a move reportedly backed by the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) to ensure continuity amidst foreign aggression.
- The U.S. and Israel have conducted over [3,500 strikes](#) against Iranian infrastructure, including a controversial hit on a school in Minab that resulted in 168-180 casualties, which the U.S. attributes to an Iranian interceptor malfunction.
- Trump has refused to recognize the new leadership, labeling the younger Khamenei a ["non-entity"](#) and demanding a role in selecting Iran's future government.

Russian Economic "China-fication" and Regional Collapse

- Companies with Chinese participation in Russia have [increased ten-fold](#) since late 2021, with Chinese firms now controlling up to 80% of specific sectors like specialized machinery and electronics.
- Regional budgets are facing catastrophic deficits; the Vologda region has [slashed healthcare](#) salary spending by 99% to prioritize war-related expenditures.
- The Moscow Mayor's office announced plans to [cut 15%](#) of the city's civil service workforce by June 2026 due to revenue shortfalls from the falling tax base.

Post-START III Nuclear Architecture

- Following the [expiration of START III](#) on February 5, 2026, U.S. and Russian strategic forces are operating without formal caps, with the "Doomsday Clock" moving closer to midnight.
- Experts warn that the U.S. could rapidly [triple its warhead](#) count on Minuteman III missiles, while Russia focuses on the survivability of its Yars and Bulava systems.

Expansion of Russian Totalitarian Surveillance

- The Ministry of Health has launched a [digital registry](#) for all pregnant women, tracking every pregnancy from conception to "outcome" (birth or abortion), including personal data like SNILS and fertilization methods (IVF).
- The "Vesna" youth movement trial saw prosecutors demand [13-year sentences](#) for participants, signaling a zero-tolerance policy toward any youth political mobilization.

KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

Elite Politics & Leadership Dynamics

- The profile of [Dmitry Patrushev](#) reveals the emergence of an "FSB nobility," using state-linked banks to fund massive agribusiness empires and offshore retreats in Cabo Verde.
- The Patrushev clan's influence is cemented through a [neofeudal grant](#) of nobility from the Romanov house and a network of "trustees" holding multi-billion ruble real estate assets.

Energy Security

- Global oil markets were destabilized by Iranian threats to [block all oil](#) exports from the Middle East if strikes continue, prompting a temporary U.S. "30-day waiver" for [India to purchase](#) sanctioned Russian oil to prevent a global recession.
- The Druzhba pipeline remains a point of contention, with Slovakia threatening to [block EU loans](#) to Ukraine unless transit is restored.

AI & Technology Policy

- Artificial Intelligence has reached a milestone in archaeology, with researchers using [machine learning](#) to read 2,000-year-old Herculaneum scrolls charred by Vesuvius.
- AI models are now being deployed in [real-time earthquake](#) prediction, reportedly achieving 70% accuracy in identifying magnitude and location before tremors occur.

Lawfare and Political Repression

- The Russian judiciary is processing a surge in "[state treason](#)" and "financing of extremism" cases, including a 13-year sentence for a woman who donated 7,000 rubles to the Ukrainian military.
- In Central Asia, [Meta \(Facebook/Instagram\)](#) is being accused of facilitating government censorship by deleting content critical of Kazakhstan's constitutional referendum following coordinated "copyright" complaints.

LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

Legislative activity focuses on tightening domestic control and responding to the financial pressures of the prolonged conflict in Ukraine.

BILLS DISCUSSED/DEBATED:

- **The Federal Pregnancy Registry (Decree):** Effective March 1, 2026, mandating the [personal tracking](#) of every pregnant woman in Russia, ostensibly for demographic monitoring but criticized as a tool of reproductive surveillance.
- **Military Payout Protection Bills:** Two bills introduced in the Russian Duma aim to [exclude war payouts](#) from marital property divisions and criminalize "fictitious marriages" used to obtain survivor benefits.
- **Kazakhstan Constitutional Referendum:** A controversial project to overhaul the [national constitution](#), which has sparked widespread digital censorship and activist arrests.

- **Hungarian Anti-Ukraine Resolution:** The Hungarian parliament adopted a resolution [rejecting Ukraine's EU membership](#) and any further financing of the war.

HEARINGS & PRESS EVENTS:

- **Trump Press Conference (Florida):** The President asserted that the war in Iran is [nearly over](#) but warned of catastrophic consequences if the Strait of Hormuz is closed.
- **Trump-Putin Teleconference:** A one-hour call where Putin reportedly offered [mediation with Iran](#) in exchange for concessions, which Trump rebuffed, telling Putin to focus on ending the war in Ukraine.
- **Slovak-EU Negotiations:** Prime Minister Robert Fico met with Ursula von der Leyen to state that Slovakia would [continue blocking loans](#) to Ukraine if Hungary's Viktor Orban loses power or if the Druzhba pipeline remains closed.

DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

The Rise of the "Neonobility"

The investigation into [Dmitry Patrushev](#) underscores a fundamental shift in the Russian state toward a hereditary kleptocracy. Unlike the oligarchs of the 1990s who built empires from privatized industry, this new class—the "neonobility"—leverages deep ties to the security services (FSB) and state-run banks to cannibalize the agricultural and energy sectors. Their wealth is shielded by the "Russian Federation" [anonymization in property](#) registries and complex offshore schemes, some of which are allegedly linked to historical [drug trafficking](#) routes in Cabo

Verde. This class is insulated from the economic sanctions that are currently decimating the Russian middle class.

The Digital Panopticon: Reproductive and Political

The Kremlin's dual focus on demographic crisis and youth dissent has birthed a new era of digital surveillance. By equating pregnancy with ["medical conditions"](#) requiring state oversight, the government is creating a database that serves as a biosurveillance tool. This coincides with the "Vesna" trial, where youth activists are being [prosecuted as terrorists](#) for organizing peaceful anti-war protests, and the use of AI to monitor social media for "extremist" sentiment. In Central Asia, this trend is echoed by governments [manipulating Meta's](#) automated moderation systems to silence dissenters under the guise of intellectual property protection.

The Geopolitical "Hormuz Trap"

The escalation in Iran has created a precarious "Hormuz Trap." Iran's threat to [choke global oil](#) supply serves as its only remaining leverage against total collapse. The U.S. response—granting a temporary [waiver for Russian](#) oil to enter India—demonstrates the limits of Western sanctions. The war is being fought as much in the global commodities markets as on the ground, with the "30-day pause" signaling a desperate attempt by the Trump administration to prevent an energy-driven domestic political backlash before the November elections.

STRATEGIC FORESIGHT

Short Term (1-4 Weeks): Expect heightened volatility in oil prices as the IRGC tests Trump's "20x strike" threat in the Persian Gulf. In Russia, the [April 8 verdict](#) in the

"Vesna" trial will likely set a precedent for mass sentencing of youth activists. Small business closures in Russia will accelerate as the new tax regimes take full effect, likely leading to localized labor unrest.

Medium Term (1-6 Months): The Iranian transition under Mojtaba Khamenei will either stabilize into a "siege economy" or fracture into internal power struggles between the IRGC and clerical moderates. The Russian [regional budget crisis](#) will reach a breaking point, forcing the Kremlin to either provide massive bailouts or risk the collapse of essential services in regions like Vologda and Novosibirsk. China will likely demand greater equity in Russian resource firms in exchange for continued financial support.

Long Term (1-5 Years): Without the START III framework, the [global nuclear balance](#) will shift toward a three-way race between the U.S., Russia, and a rapidly modernizing China. Russia's "Pomorization"—exemplified by the dying village of [Kolezhma](#)—will become the default state for much of the Russian interior as resources and people are drained to support the military and the neofeudal elite in Moscow.

RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

For International Policy:

- The expiration of nuclear caps necessitates a [new multilateral](#) arms control framework that includes China, as the bilateral U.S.-Russia era has functionally ended.

- The use of [automated moderation](#) by authoritarian regimes in Kazakhstan and Russia to censor critics requires a diplomatic push for "digital sovereignty" protections for activists on Western social platforms.
- International recognition of the [deportation of Ukrainian](#) children as a "crime against humanity" should be used to expand universal jurisdiction cases against Russian civil and military officials.

For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Risk:** The persistent threat to the [Strait of Hormuz](#) makes any reliance on Middle Eastern energy or transit through the Persian Gulf a high-risk gamble; diversified sourcing is mandatory.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Investors must scrutinize Russian agribusiness and banking partners for links to the [Patrushev neonobility](#), as these entities are likely targets for the next wave of "deep state" sanctions.
- **Investment Opportunity:** The successful application of [AI in earthquake](#) prediction and archaeology suggests a maturing market for specialized AI models in civil engineering and cultural heritage management.
