## DAY-AT-A-GLANCE

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March 10, 2026, marks the eleventh day of "Operation Epic Fury," a US-Israeli military campaign against the Islamic Republic of Iran that has rapidly escalated into a regional multi-front conflict. Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth and top US military officials have signaled that today will be the [most intense day](#) of strikes to date, utilizing a record number of fighters and bombers to degrade remaining Iranian military assets. Despite this aggressive posture, President Donald Trump has concurrently characterized the war as a [short-term excursion](#) that could conclude "very soon," an apparent effort to manage soaring global energy prices and quell mounting dissent within his Republican base over the violation of his "no new wars" campaign promise. The conflict has already resulted in the death of Iranian Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei, who has been succeeded by his son, [Mojtaba Khamenei](#), a

move the US administration has publicly dismissed as unacceptable.

The economic consequences of the war are manifesting in extreme market volatility. Oil prices, which surged to nearly \$120 per barrel on Monday, retreated to approximately \$90 following [Trump's optimistic messaging](#), though the Strait of Hormuz remains effectively closed by Iranian threats and the Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) vows to prevent even "one liter" of oil from leaving the region if attacks continue. Regionally, the conflict has engulfed Lebanon, where Israeli ground and air operations against Hezbollah have displaced over 700,000 people, and has strained the neutrality of states like [Oman](#). Domestic pressures in the US are intensifying as the death toll of American service members rises and public approval for the strikes remains low, with only one in four citizens [approving the operation](#).

## MAJOR DEVELOPMENTS

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### Kinetic Escalation and Military Objectives

- Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth announced that Tuesday would involve the most refined intelligence and [intense day of strikes](#) inside Iran, specifically targeting naval and missile capabilities.
- US General Dan Kane identified the total [destruction of Iran's navy](#) as a top priority; President Trump claimed 51 Iranian ships have already been sunk.
- Speculation is mounting regarding a potential ground operation to seize [Kharg Island](#), Iran's primary oil terminal, which handles 90% of its crude exports.
- The US military released footage of [Tomahawk missile](#) launches as part of the ongoing "Operation Epic Fury."

## Iranian Leadership Succession and Response

- The Iranian Assembly of Experts appointed [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) as the third Supreme Leader following the killing of his father, Ali Khamenei, by US-Israeli strikes.
- Iran's Revolutionary Guard (IRGC) has adopted a "mosaic defense" doctrine, decentralizing command to [local military commanders](#) to ensure continued resistance.
- The IRGC issued a direct threat to [close the Strait of Hormuz](#) completely if US and Israeli aggression continues.

## Regional Spillover and Alliances

- Israel launched a significant offensive in [Lebanon](#) against Hezbollah, leading to hundreds of deaths and a massive humanitarian crisis.
- Turkey neutralized an [Iranian ballistic missile](#) near Gaziantep, prompting President Erdogan to warn Tehran against damaging bilateral relations.
- A UK military base in [Cyprus](#) was targeted by Iranian drones, drawing the European Union further into the security crisis.
- German Foreign Minister Johan Valdepul visited Israel to show [solidarity](#), while Chancellor Friedrich Merz criticized Israel's West Bank annexation plans as a "big mistake."

## Energy and Economic Volatility

- Global oil prices hit [benchmark highs of \\$100](#) per barrel for the first time since 2022, before fluctuating based on US diplomatic signaling.

- EU and G7 finance ministers reached a broad agreement to [release oil reserves](#) to mitigate supply disruptions caused by the conflict.
- Strategic risk analysts warn that the effective closure of the [Strait of Hormuz](#) is impacting supply chains for fertilizers, helium, and LNG.

## KEY GOVERNANCE TOPICS

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### Elite Politics and Succession

- The appointment of [Mojtaba Khamenei](#) signals a hardline continuation of the Islamic Republic's policies, despite US hopes for a more "amenable" figure.
- President Trump's public [disappointment](#) with the succession choice suggests a failure of the "decapitation" strategy to induce regime moderation.

### Energy Security and Critical Infrastructure

- The vulnerability of [Kharg Island](#) highlights the fragility of Iran's economy; analysts suggest ground troops may be required to secure the facility without destroying it.
- Regional desalination plants and [energy depots](#) have become targets, threatening basic survival necessities for civilian populations in the Gulf.
- Data centers for major firms like Amazon have been [struck by drones](#) in the UAE and Bahrain, highlighting risks to digital sovereignty and services.

## Domestic Stability and Civil Unrest

- Trump faces a "rebellion in Magaland" as prominent conservatives like [Tucker Carlson](#) and Marjorie Taylor Greene reject the war as a betrayal of "America First" principles.
- In Iran, despite massive strikes, [large rallies](#) have been reported in support of the new Supreme Leader, contradicting US narratives of an imminent popular uprising.
- Evidence has emerged of a brutal [crackdown on protesters](#) within Iran in late 2025, involving internet blackouts and mass killings by security forces.

## Technology Policy and Environmental Impact

- Hyperscale AI data centers are facing scrutiny for [massive water consumption](#); a Google facility in Oregon reportedly used one-third of the city's water supply.
- Research indicates that [electric vehicles](#) produce 20-30% more tire wear particles than internal combustion engines due to increased weight, contributing to microplastic pollution.
- EU's [Euro 7 standards](#) will soon include tire wear limits for the first time to address non-exhaust emissions.

## LEGISLATIVE ROUNDUP

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Governance activity today focused on the executive use of military force, the coordination of international energy reserves, and the regulation of industrial emissions. US Secretary of State [Marco Rubio](#) and Defense Secretary Hegseth defended the administration's war goals, while European leaders debated the legality of the strikes under international law.

## DEEP DIVE: TRENDS AND THEMES

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### The Paradox of "Short-Term" Excursions

A central theme of the day is the tension between the military's plan for [intensifying strikes](#) and the President's rhetoric of a nearing conclusion. This strategic ambiguity may be intended to keep Tehran off-balance, but it has created a "yo-yo" effect in [energy](#)

[markets](#) and confusion among allies. Analysts suggest Trump is desperate to "take the win" and exit before the conflict necessitates a politically disastrous ground intervention or causes a permanent spike in domestic gas prices. However, the appointment of Mojtaba Khamenei suggests the regime is [not near collapse](#), potentially forcing the US into a longer war of attrition than the administration has publicly acknowledged.

### **Erosion of International Law and Coalition Fissures**

The conflict is exposing deep rifts in the transatlantic relationship. While Germany and the UK have provided varying levels of [military support](#) or base access, countries like Spain and France have questioned the [legality of the strikes](#) under international law. Chancellor Merz's rare and public [rebuke of Israel](#) regarding West Bank annexation suggests that even staunch allies are unwilling to provide a blank check for regional restructuring. The US's failure to inform European leaders of the initial strikes until minutes before they occurred has further damaged the perception of the EU as a [partner on equal footing](#).

### **The Industrial-Environmental Crisis of the "Green" Transition**

Beyond the Middle East, reports on [tire wear](#) and AI data center cooling reveal a brewing crisis in the green and digital transitions. The revelation that EVs may be [heavier polluters](#) in terms of microplastics than traditional cars, combined with the [massive water footprint](#) of AI models like GPT-5, suggests that governance is lagging behind technological adoption. The shift toward "direct-to-chip" and "immersion cooling" is an industry response to the reality that traditional cooling is [unsustainable](#) at the hyperscale level.

## **STRATEGIC FORESIGHT**

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**Short Term (1-4 Weeks):** Expect a peak in kinetic activity as the US attempts to fulfill its "epic fury" objectives before a self-imposed deadline. The risk of [special forces operations](#) to secure nuclear materials or target Mojtaba Khamenei is high. Markets will remain extremely sensitive to Trump's social media activity. Domestic protests in the US against the war are likely to grow as casualty reports from the [rising US death toll](#) circulate.

**Medium Term (1-6 Months):** The focus will shift to the [US midterm elections](#) in November. If gas prices remain elevated, the Republican party may face significant losses. In the Middle East, the "mosaic defense" of the IRGC could lead to a [prolonged insurgency](#) even if conventional Iranian forces are "decimated." Lebanon's government may face a [dual crisis](#) of massive displacement and internal pressure to disarm a weakened Hezbollah.

**Long Term (1-5 Years):** The structural stability of the Iranian regime will be tested; if it survives, it will likely be [far more hardened](#) and incentivized to pursue a nuclear deterrent. Alliances in the Gulf will be permanently altered, with states like [Oman](#) potentially losing their "Switzerland" status. Globally, the [India-China rivalry](#) will intensify as India attempts to capitalize on supply chain shifts, though its success remains hindered by a lack of "human capital" and persistent [wealth inequality](#).

## RECOMMENDATIONS & IMPLICATIONS

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### For International Policy:

- **Security Architecture:** NATO must urgently address the vulnerabilities of member states like [Turkey](#) and partners like Cyprus to Iranian retaliatory strikes to prevent a broader alliance-wide war.
- **Diplomatic Engagement:** The EU should leverage its [naval assets](#) and humanitarian aid to secure a "safety of passage" agreement for commercial shipping, independent of the US-Iranian kinetic theater.
- **Legal Warfare:** The international community must define the **legal threshold** for "preemptive strikes" on nuclear facilities to avoid setting a precedent for unprovoked [acts of aggression](#).

### For Private Sector/Investors:

- **Supply Chain Diversification:** Firms reliant on Gulf exports (helium, LNG, fertilizers) must accelerate [diversification strategies](#) to bypass the Strait of Hormuz, which remains a high-risk choke point regardless of the war's outcome.
- **Technology Investment:** Data center operators should prioritize [immersion cooling](#) and water-independent technologies to stay ahead of upcoming municipal restrictions on utility usage.
- **Regulatory Compliance:** Automotive manufacturers should prepare for [weight-based taxation](#) and strict tire wear standards as the environmental cost of heavy EVs becomes a mainstream policy priority.
